**REGIONAL WOMEN'S YEAR CONFERENCE TO BE HELD ON CAMPUS.** The regional meeting of the International Women's Year Conference, authorized by the U.S. Congress and the National Commission on the Observance of International Women's Year, will be held at ISUE on May 21 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Eleven other cities in Indiana will be holding similar conferences simultaneously and developing resolutions for discussion at the July 15-16 state meeting at the Indiana Convention Exposition Center in Indianapolis. These resolutions will be finalized by delegates, including 32 elected delegates from Indiana, at the November 18-21 national meeting in Houston, Texas.

The Evansville meeting will begin at 12:30 p.m. for refreshments. At 1:00, Dr. Lee Ellen Ford, attorney, former editor and administrative assistant to Governor Bowen, will deliver the keynote address of "International Women's Year--Past, Present, and Future." At 2:00, separate seminars will be held in classrooms, and area leaders will present the following topics:

- "Women as Volunteers" by Diana L. D'Onofrio
- "Women in Politics" by Beulah Evans and Betty Lou Jerrel
- "Credit and Business Opportunities for Women" by Elizabeth L. Geiss
- "Lifelong Learning Opportunities for Women" by Judy Hanefeldt
- "Employment Practices: by Kathleen K. McCoy
- "Pension and Social Security Problems of Older Citizens" by HELEN SANDS, ISUE Associate Professor of Communications
- "Legal Status of the Homemaker" by Martha Provenzale
