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"Motivated Teachers Motivate Students" will be the theme Saturday, April 15, when the Student Education Association at the University of Southern Indiana and Kappa Delta Pi sponsor a Southern Indiana Educators' Conference open to Tri-State students, teachers, administrators, and others interested in effective teaching.

Conference speakers, discussing topics for which area educators and pre-professionals have expressed an interest, will include:

* Patricia Douglas, education consultant, Center for School Improvement and Performance, Indiana Department of Education; more than 20 years' experience as an educator; licensed reading specialist. She will speak at 10:15 a.m. and 12 noon concurrent sessions on "ISTEP: the Future."

* Dr. John E. Felton, assistant professor of psychology, University of Evansville; supervisor of field experiences and clinical therapy practice; part-time private practice in clinical psychology. His topic at the 9 a.m. opening session will be "Motivating and Building Self-Esteem in Students."

* Brenda Meyer, associate director of Acute Services, Southwestern Mental Health Center; previous work with child sexual abuse cases. She will discuss "Stress Management" at 10:15 a.m., 12 noon, and 1:15 p.m. concurrent sessions.

* Dr. C. Thomas Pickering, dean of the USI School of Education and Human Services; formerly an elementary teacher, school psychologist, and chairman of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, University of Mississippi. He will speak on "Improving Parent and Teacher Relations" at 10:15 a.m. and 1:15 p.m. concurrent sessions.

* Barbara Stainbrook, director of professional development, Indiana State Teachers Association; ISTA staff member for 10 years; 18 years' experience as a first-grade teacher. She will discuss "The Intern/Mentor Program" at 12 noon and 1:15 p.m. concurrent sessions.
