ECONOMICS COURSE FEATURES COMMUNITY LEADERS

The Department of Economics at ISUE will offer a five week course entitled The Economics of Urban Problems during its summer session, June 11 through July 17. The class will meet daily from Monday through Friday at 12:00 noon and will combine formal theoretical discussion with weekly lectures featuring community leaders with expertise in the areas of housing, education, transportation, poverty, pollution, urban planning and financing.

28% WOMEN FACULTY AT ISUE

A detailed analysis of women in full-time university positions at ISUE indicates that 28% of faculty positions are held by women faculty members. This figure can be compared to the proportion of women completing degree programs in graduate schools to prepare for faculty positions. Women account for 22.7% of the terminal degree completions in graduate schools.
