The act features Bob Grifford and Kate Bishop. Grifford, a native Chicagoan, has spent most of his professional life either in New York City or touring the country. He completed his eighth national tour as a featured artist with the Claude Kipnis Mime Theatre. The tour was

highlighted by a command performance for President Ford at the White House. Grifford is also a mime instructor at the new Forum Theatre School in New York City.

Kate Bishop, a native of Cleveland, began her career on stage. She studied at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York City and acted in an ensemble production of "The Birds" at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.

Kate is an accomplished dancer, choreographer and mime instructor at the new Forum Theatre School.
