ENERGY CONSERVATION EFFORTS. As we all are aware, Southern Indiana Gas & Electric Company is facing a critical shortage of coal supplies and emergency measures to conserve energy are being imposed in Evansville. We are being asked, individually and collectively, to do everything possible to save energy. The following efforts are currently being implemented in order to keep instructional activities functioning as effectively as possible.

1. Reduce room temperature to 65°. (Sweaters and layers of clothing may be advisable.)
2. Keep doors closed at all times.
3. Reduce lighting levels in all areas. Turn off lights when you leave a room.
4. Minimum security lights will be maintained in parking lots.
5. Restrict use of laboratory hoods, kilns, welders and other high energy consuming equipment.
6. Reduce use of media equipment.
7. Suspend intramurals and open recreation.
8. Close Recreation Room at night.
9. Consolidate day care operations into one room.
10. Curtail use of 9200 Xerox machine to Tuesdays and Thursdays.
11. Close Library on Saturday.
12. Cover large window areas with plastic.
13. Restrict use of elevators to handicapped and disabled.
14. Move Playhouse activities to lecture halls or Forum.

Further curtailment may necessitate the following actions as greater reductions are mandated.

1. Adjustments in scheduling of athletic and other events.
2. Closing of campus on weekends.
3. Move all food-service activities to snack bar area.
4. Eliminate use of hoods, kilns, welders and other high energy consuming equipment.
5. Close Library at 6:30 p.m.

6. Adjust instructional schedules.
7. Reschedule Spring Break.
