Jon Mark Hall, Director of Athletics



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002, after seven years as the assistant director.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and host of the 2004 and 2009 NCAA Division II Cross Country National Championships.

In addition to his duties as director of Athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, Hall was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular-season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns, and had a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after his appointment at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotional activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife, Patti, reside in Evansville and have four sons, Nathan, Garland, Ty, and Owen, and a daughter, Mary Claire.

USI is a vibrant campus with modern facilities and an exciting pace of growth. The face of the campus has continued to change with an entrance roundabout, an addition to the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center that doubled its size, and a Business and Engineering Center to open next fall. The University Center renovation will open in the spring of 2011. USI provides the most up-to-date facilities for academics, housing, and student life.



Computer Services

Computer labs are located throughout campus and in the housing areas. A wireless service is available in all main buildings and the surrounding courtyards.

All residence life areas are equipped with network jacks for Internet access. A wireless network also is available throughout the housing areas.

Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

The Campus

The Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, Education Center, and Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, University Center, Liberal Arts Center, Technology Center, and Business and Engineering Center (now under construction) form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,800 students who live on campus.



Academic Life

The University enrolls 10,516 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education, including a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

Campus Life

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

Residence Life

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular with students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

Financial Assistance

USI provides families with an affordable way to a higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.

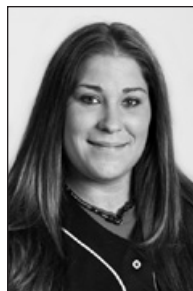

Situated on the banks of the Ohio River, Evansville is a mid-sized city that welcomes USI students and offers them plenty of things to do. Roberts Stadium and the Victory Theatre attract students to concerts by entertainers like Nelly, Aerosmith, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, and Josh Groban. Traveling Broadway shows and feature performances come to The Centre. For a relaxing walk or invigorating run, the downtown riverfront features a greenway with a wonderful view of the changing river traffic and the Evansville skyline. • ABOUT the GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE •

The 15-member Great Lakes Valley Conference has made its name throughout the last 31 years as a power in NCAA Division II basketball. In the last few years, however, the GLVC has seen success in many sports, and the league can now claim itself as one of the nation's top in all NCAA Division II athletics.

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools - Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine and Indiana State University at Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana) - began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, the University of Indianapolis and Saint Joseph's College expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools - along with Ashland University - united to become the GLVC.

In 2009, Maryville University and the University of Illinois at Springfield became the newest members of the league. The schools are two of 13 institutions that have joined the league since its formation. Those members include: Lewis University (1980), Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne (1984), Northern Kentucky University (1985), Kentucky State University (1989), Quincy University (1994), Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (1994), University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994), University of Missouri-St. Louis (1995), Drury (2005), Missouri S&T (2005), Rockhurst (2005), Illinois-Springfield (2009) and Maryville (2009). Ashland and Kentucky State left the conference after the 1994 season, IPFW left the league following the 2000-01 academic year and SIU Edwardsville exited the league following the 2007-08 academic year.

The conference headquarters are located in downtown Indianapolis, one of the many Midwest major media markets in which the league maintains a presence. The GLVC has schools in Milwaukee/Northern Illinois (UW-Parkside), Chicago (Lewis), Indianapolis (Indianapolis), Cincinnati (Northern Kentucky), Louisville (Bellarmine), Evansville (Southern Indiana), Springfield, Mo. (Drury), Owensboro (Kentucky Wesleyan), Kansas City (Rockhurst) and St. Louis (Maryville, UM-St. Louis).

The conference sponsors 17 championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, indoor and outdoor track and field, and tennis for men and basketball, cross country, softball, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, golf, and volleyball for women.

GLVC institutions have won 11 national championships in basketball. Kentucky Wesleyan leads all Division II institutions with eight men's basketball titles, while Southern Indiana won the men's crown in 1995. Northern Kentucky's women won the school's first-ever basketball national championship in 2000 and followed with a national title in 2008. In addition, SIU Edwardsville became the first GLVC school to win a national championship in softball in 2007.

In 2001, the league announced the creation of the GLVC Hall of Fame, with the first class being inducted in 2002. The GLVC annually presents the Richard F. Scharf Paragon Award to the top male and female student-athlete in the league, and the Bertram Award to a distinguished alum who both succeeded while a GLVC student-athlete and excelled in accomplishments after graduation.

The GLVC strives to adhere to the NCAA Division II Strategic Platform and has introduced several initiatives in recent years including the GLVC Sportsmanship Award which acknowledges the institution that exemplifies sportsmanship in the view of its peers.

The league continually maintains an effort to combine academic and athletic excellence and the hard work put forth by the student-athletes has been evident on the playing fields and in the classrooms.

Expectations are high as usual for the University of Southern Indiana softball team entering the 2010 season.

Despite a tough outing in 2009, the Screaming Eagles expect to bounce back into Great Lakes Valley Conference title contention this season as it returns a plethora of players from a year ago.

One of the reasons the Eagles feel they can accomplish that goal was their play against some of the nation's top teams last spring. The Eagles, who won nine of their last 12 games, posted wins over NCAA II World Series participant Le Moyne College and the University of Indianapolis, as well as a victory over NCAA II Midwest sub-Regional Tournament host Ashland University.

Led by ninth-year Head Coach **Sue Kunkle**, the program's all-time winningest coach, the Eagles have seven position starters and its top two pitchers returning from last-season's squad. In addition to 12 returning players, Kunkle also has six newcomers that could all play big roles this season.

Competition on this year's team will be intense throughout the preseason as Kunkle expects to see several position battles. Kunkle expects offensive performance to play a factor in those

battles and believes the depth of USI's offensive lineup will be a huge asset going into the season.

USI's three seniors—designated player **Sara Loete**, catcher **Tara McConnell**, and outfielder **Lindsay Raikes**—will be counted on to lead the Eagles into 2010.

Loete, who earned All-America honors in 2008 after hitting .405 with 10 home runs and 54 RBIs, hit .241 with five home runs and 27 RBIs a year ago. McConnell hit .226 with a pair of home runs and nine RBIs last season, while Raikes hit .231 with a home run and 10 RBIs in 2009.

The Eagles' roster features eight juniors—outfielder **Reva LeDune-Bourgasser**, infielder **Amanda Brendel**, third baseman **LeAnn Collins**, first baseman **Brittany DeWeese**, infielder **Dani Finkelstein**, pitcher **Dawn McClellan**, utility player **Dani Monks**, and outfielder **Heather Swarts**.

Brendel earned All-GLVC honors a year ago after hitting .307, with seven home runs, 10 doubles, and 26 RBIs, while DeWeese hit .323 with 12 doubles, four home runs, and 24 RBIs. Finkelstein, who will compete for the starting shortstop position left open by the graduation of Allyn McKinley, racked up a .244 batting

average, seven doubles, two home runs, and 13 RBIs last season.

McClellan returns to the pitching circle after posting an 8-13 record with a 3.04 ERA last season. The right-hander showed signs of good things to come as she won her last three starts, posting a 1.17 ERA and a .190 opponent batting average in 18 innings of work. She also helped herself from the plate, where she hit .250 with six doubles, two home runs, and 11 RBIs.

Both Monks and Swarts saw a lot of action in the outfield a year ago. Monks, who hit .206 in 35 trips to the plate, will compete with Raikes in leftfield, while Swarts, who was the Eagles' top off defensive outfielder in 2009, will compete with LeDune-Bourgasser in centerfield. Swarts hit .217 with a home run and six RBIs during her sophomore season.

LeDune-Bourgasser is looking to get on the field for the first time since 2008 after sitting out the 2009 campaign. LeDune-Bourgasser hit .150 with a home run and eight RBIs as a freshman at Indiana State University.

Collins also will be making her first appearance in a USI uniform this spring after a stellar career at Wabash Valley Junior College. Collins hit .488 with 16 home runs and 79 RBIs as a

sophomore in 2009 after hitting .438 with six home runs and a school-record 83 RBIs in 2008. Wabash Valley was 91-10 during Collin's two-year career.

An NJCAA I All-Region performer, Collins will have competition at third base as sophomore infielder **Kristen O'Haver**, a transfer from the University of Kentucky, will also see time at the hot corner. O'Haver, who also will see time in the pitching circle, played in 16 games as a freshman for the Wildcats, hitting .250 with two RBIs in 20 trips to the plate.

O'Haver, who is one of three sophomores on the Eagles' roster this season, was a two-time All-State performer at North Davies High School (Elnora, Indiana) after hitting a combined .500 with 17 doubles, nine home runs, and 66 RBIs in 2007 and 2008.

Another reason the Eagles are excited about their 2010 season is the return of sophomore pitcher **Hadley Clark** and sophomore catcher/first baseman **Alexandra Dunfee**.

Clark became USI's top pitcher toward the end of 2009 after going 3-2 with a 1.46 ERA throughout the last two weeks of the season. She did not give up an earned run in five of her last six outings and held NCAA II Midwest Region champion Indianapolis to just two hits in her final start of the season.

Clark, who also hit .381 with a double and five RBIs in 21 at-bats, finished the season with a 5-8 record and a team-best .255 opponent batting average.

Dunfee, who will see increased playing time behind the plate and at first base, also showed a lot of offensive and defensive potential in 2009. Dunfee, who made six starts behind the plate, hit .361 with three RBIs in 36 at-bats. She also threw out 3-of-8 base runners (.375).

Kunkle also brought in four freshman—utility player **Samantha Barbee**, outfielder **Katherine Belsito**, infielder **Stephanie Bittner**, and utility player **Jessica McCullough**.

Barbee graduated from North Central High School (Farmersburg, Indiana) where she hit .449 with seven doubles, three home runs, and 13 RBIs as a senior in 2009. She finished her senior year with a .987 fielding percentage in 158 chances.

Belsito helped lead Center Grove High School (Greenwood, Indiana) to a 33-3 record and the IHSAA class 4A state championship as a senior in 2009. The second-team All-State performer also helped CGHS to three conference and four county titles during her prep career.

Bittner, who will compete for the starting nod at shortstop and second base, hit .324 as a senior and .419 as a junior at Mater Dei High School (Evansville).

McCullough, who will compete for time in the outfield, hit .277 with two home runs and 14 RBIs during her junior and senior seasons at Reitz High School (Evansville).

The Eagles begin the 2010 season February 19-21 at the University of Alabama-Huntsville

Charger Chillout in Decatur, Alabama. USI opens its home schedule with its GLVC-opener March 6 when it hosts Missouri University of Science & Technology.

Other key dates on USI's regular season schedule include home doubleheaders against defending GLVC Tournament champion Northern Kentucky University (March 27), Indianapolis (March 28), and Lewis University. The Eagles also visit NCAA Division I foe Indiana University/Purdue University-Indianapolis (March 2) and defending GLVC regular-season champion University of Missouri-St. Louis (March 31).

The GLVC Tournament returns to East Peoria, Illinois, May 7-9, while the NCAA II Midwest Region Tournament is May 14-16. The NCAA II Midwest Super Regional is May 21-22, while the NCAA II Championship is May 27-31 in St. Joseph, Missouri.

Sue Kunkle, Head Coach



Sue Kunkle has the University of Southern Indiana softball program looking to get back to the top of the GLVC standings and into the NCAA II Tournament as she enters her ninth season at the helm of the Screaming Eagles.

Kunkle's squad finished the 2009 season on a strong note after starting the year with 11 straight losses. Her team, however, showed how good they could be when they swept the eventual NCAA II Midwest Region champion University of Indianapolis to close out the campaign.

During the 2009 season, Kunkle's squad defeated NCAA II World Series participant Le Moyne College as well as NCAA II Midwest sub-regional host Ashland University.

In 2008, Kunkle led USI to a 31-23 overall record, 14-10 GLVC, and had the Eagles on the brink of an NCAA II Tournament berth. Despite missing the NCAA post-season, Kunkle became USI's all-time winningest softball coach and enters 2009 with a 215-145-1 (.597) overall record.

Two years ago, USI overcame injuries to post a 31-24-1 overall record, 13-10-1 GLVC, finishing fourth in the GLVC. Like most of Kunkle's squads, the 2007 version had a strong finish as it went 9-4-1 in the final 14 games, just missing a berth in the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament.

In 2006, Kunkle guided her Eagles into the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament for the first time since 1998. Her squad went 39-18, 17-5 GLVC, finishing third in the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament. Kunkle was named the GLVC Coach of the Year after USI's second-place finish in the GLVC during the regular season.

Under Kunkle, the Eagles have consistently been at the top of the GLVC—one of the top conferences in Division II softball—during the last eight years. USI has posted one second-place finish in the GLVC Tournament as well as two third-place finishes and two fourth-place finishes in the league's post-season tournament.

In addition, Kunkle has seen her student-athletes garner one All-America honor, 21 All-Region awards, and 32 All-GLVC accolades. USI also has gotten the job done in the classroom under Kunkle, with her players earning 11 Academic All-District V awards and 60 Academic All-GLVC honors.

In 2005, Kunkle's squad overcame a rough start before winning 30 of its last 42 games to finish with a 30-20 record, including a 10-8 mark in GLVC play. In the process of their strong finish, the Eagles set a school record for consecutive victories, stringing together 18 consecutive wins on the heels of an 0-8 start.

Despite an up-and-down conference season, Kunkle's squad rebounded to win three straight elimination games in the GLVC Tournament before falling to the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

In 2004, Kunkle's Eagles battled some of the top teams in Division II and jumped out to an 8-0 start in conference play before finishing the campaign with a 26-24 overall record and an 11-7 mark in the GLVC.

Kunkle directed the Eagles to a 27-18 overall record and a 13-7 mark in the GLVC in 2003. That squad produced six All-GLVC and four All-Great Lakes Region performers.

A four-year starter at California, Kunkle became the winningest pitcher in school history with a career record of 54-12 from 1990-94. The Vulcans earned PSAC West Championships in Kunkle's last three seasons, and were the conference's overall champs in 1991. An All-Region pitcher as a junior, she earned All-Conference and All-Regional Tournament honors as a senior, while leading her team to a regional championship and California's first-ever appearance in the Division II College World Series.

Kunkle, who resides in Evansville with her daughter Morgan, earned a bachelor's degree in education from California-Pennsylvania in 1994. She received her master's degree in sports science and coaching at Akron in 2001.

During her first season, Kunkle led the Eagles to a second-place finish in the GLVC Tournament and to within an eyelash of a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament. Kunkle also set the USI record for wins by a first-year coach with a 31-18 overall record, 10-7 in the GLVC.

She also has coached two USA Athletes International squads. Kunkle led her first squad to a first-place finish in Holland in the summer of 2005 and her second squad to a third-place finish in Australia in 2006.

Kunkle took over the USI softball program in 2001 after a tenure at the University of Akron. In addition to her coaching duties, Kunkle teaches in the USI Physical Education Department.

Kunkle helped develop some of Akron's best hurlers, including 1998 UA Female Athlete of the Year Shelby Howell (1995-1998). She was responsible for recruiting and coordinating the team's travel arrangements as well as organizing the Zips camps and clinics, the Dugout Club, and alumni relations.

Kunkle began her coaching career as a volunteer assistant at California University of Pennsylvania. She gained a year of coaching experience at Morehead State University before being named assistant coach at Bethel Park.

Dean played four seasons with the University of Wisconsin-Parkside Rangers, amassing a .294 career batting average and more than 175 career hits. She also racked up more than 50 RBI and scored more than 100 runs, while earned second-team All-GLVC honors as a sophomore in 2003.

During her career, Dean played and started in nearly 200 games, helping UW-Parkside to 113 victories and 42 GLVC wins.

After completing her eligibility in 2005, Dean broke into the coaching ranks as a student assistant at UW-Parkside.

A native of South Elgin, Illinois, Dean earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from UW-Parkside in 2006 and has spent the last year working in the University of North Texas intramural program. She also worked with the city of Denton, Texas, athletic programs since February of 2008.

Dean will be pursuing a master's degree in public administration while at USI.

Jessica Huff, Assistant Coach



Jessica Huff M'09 is entering her fourth season with the USI softball coaching staff, assisting Head Coach Sue Kunkle in all facets of the USI softball program.

Huff, who was the head coach at Bosse High School prior to joining USI's coaching staff, was a two-time Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and a two-time Easton All-American at the University of Evansville. She hit

.375 with 11 doubles, four triples, four home runs, and 29 RBIs during her senior year.

Huff, who was inducted into the UE Hall of Fame in April of 2008, set nine career marks at UE and was a three-time All-MVC and All-Region selection during her four seasons with the Purple Aces.

She finished her collegiate career as the MVC's all-time leader in hits (254) and doubles (56). Huff also finished second all-time in the MVC in RBIs (145), third all-time in home runs (23), and fifth all-time in runs scored (134).

Her success on the diamond translated into the coaching ranks where she led BHS to its best record in 10 years.

"Coach Huff has demonstrated her ability to succeed in the coaching world and provides a lot of experience and knowledge to this staff," Kunkle said. "She was a tremendous catcher and an outstanding offensive player during her college career and that experience has added a lot of improvements to our offensive game."

A native of Evansville and a graduate of North High School, Huff is a member of NHS's Hall of Fame. She was an All-Metro Player of the Year in 1996 and 1997.

Huff graduated from UE in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in accounting and earned her master's degree in education from USI in May 2009. She resides in Evansville with her daughter, Kylie.

USI rebounded from an 0-5 start to finish with a 39-18 overall record and a 17-5 mark in the GLVC. The Eagles' performance in the regular season earned them their first NCAA II Tournament appearance since 1998. USI, which won its first two games of the NCAA II Tournament, finished third following a heart-breaking loss to Northern Kentucky and a tough setback to SIU Edwardsville.

1998

The Eagles posted their best record in school history when they finished 48-17 overall and 22-6 in the GLVC. USI, which was third in the GLVC during the regular season, went on to win the GLVC Tournament and advance to the NCAA II Tournament for the second time in the program's history.

1995

USI posted a 38-19 record and was 8-0 in league play as it won the GLVC Tournament for the second time in the program's history. The Eagles advanced to the NCAA II Tournament for the first time in 1995.
