JILL M. CHONODY TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Dr. Jill M. Chonody '95 M'97

The speaker for the Commencement ceremony for Graduate Studies is Dr. Jill M. Chonody '95 M'97, associate professor with the School of Social Work at Indiana University Northwest. She is a graduate of the University of Southern Indiana with a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's degree in social work.

Starting her career in social work and mental health, Chonody worked as an outpatient psychotherapist with individuals, couples, and families. She also worked at Evansville Psychiatric Associates and Deaconess Cross Pointe and as an adjunct professor at the University of Southern Indiana, Oakland City University, and Ivy Tech Community College.

After obtaining her doctorate in philosophy and social work from Florida State University in 2009, she began teaching at Temple University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She then spent three years teaching at the University of South Australia in Adelaide, Australia, where she is now research fellow for the School of Psychology, Social Work, and Social Policy. She also is an associate professor at Indiana University Northwest where she teaches research and practice courses. Areas of research interest include ageism and aging, social justice issues for oppressed populations, participatory photography as a research methodology, and scale development and psychometrics.

Chonody has extensive research background with peer-reviewed publications over the last five years. Her new book, *Community Art: Creative Approaches to Practice*, is expected to be published this summer. The book is an exploration of creative approaches to practice for professionals.

Her community involvement includes the Community Visitor's Scheme in Adelaide, South Australia; East Falls Village; Student Awards Committee at Temple University; The University Community Collaboration of Philadelphia; Generational Appreciation Philadelphia; Southwestern Indiana Planning Group for HIV/AIDS; and the Knox County Association for Retarded Citizens.

She also has been involved with professional and academic associations including International Student Cultural Experience group; Graterford research subcommittee for the national Inside Out Exchange Program; research officer for The Best Day of My Life (So Far); and the Indiana Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.

Chonody lives in Greenwood, Indiana.

TONYA HEIM TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Tonya Heim M'03, '08, M'09

The 2014 Commencement speaker for the College of Nursing and Health Professions is Tonya Heim M'03, '08, M'09. She is vice president of Patient Services and chief nursing officer for Memorial Hospital and Health Care Center in Jasper, Indiana, where she also is leading a nursing and administrative team in pursuit of Magnet designation. Most recently, she completed LEAN Six Sigma Green Belt Certification.

Heim earned three degrees from the University of Southern Indiana, a master's degree in health administration, a bachelor's degree in nursing, and a master's degree in nursing. Prior to attending USI, she earned a diploma in nursing from Deaconess Hospital School of Nursing in 1969 and a bachelor's degree in organizational management from Oakland City University in 2001.

Her career in healthcare began as an emergency room surgery and obstetrics staff nurse before becoming a supervisor and director of those areas. She later led efforts for training and direction in the areas of corporate compliance and infection control, as well as quality services.

Heim's administrative roles began at Gibson General Hospital when she served as assistant administrator of Patient Services before becoming vice president and chief nursing officer. Her greatest accomplishment at Gibson General Hospital, outside of leading patient care and support services, was serving as the lead for the \$5.1 million dollar emergency room addition and renovation project.

She serves on the USI Nursing Program Advisory Council, the Southern Hills Counseling Center (Jasper, Indiana) Board of Directors, Hildegard Board of Directors, Vincennes University Nursing Program Advisory Council, and the Rotary Club of Jasper, where she also is past president. She has previously been involved with Ivy Tech Community College, Princeton Rotary Club, United Way of Gibson County, and other organizations.

Heim and her husband of nearly 45 years, Jim, reside in Holland, Indiana. They have two grown children, son Brian in Cincinnati, Ohio, and daughter Andrea in Cicero, Indiana.

CATHLIN S. GRAY TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Dr. Cathlin S. Gray '85 is the speaker for the 2014 Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Commencement ceremony. She is currently the associate superintendent for Family, School, and Community Partnerships with the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation (EVSC), the third largest school district in Indiana.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, she holds a bachelor's degree in education from the University of Southern Indiana. She also earned a master's degree in Education in 1990, an education specialist degree in 2000, and a doctorate in philosophy in 2006, all from Indiana State University. She has dedicated her professional career to education with a kindergarten through sixth-grade teaching license and a Superintendent and School Administrator's License.

She began her career teaching kindergarten for six years before becoming the principal of Cedar Hall Elementary School in Evansville, Indiana. She led the charge for developing the first full-service school program in the district. Those leadership skills led her to roles including supervisor of staff development, assistant superintendent of federal projects, and her current role with community partnerships.

She's been actively involved in numerous professional organizations, most notably, the National Leaders for Today and Tomorrow Advisory Council, the National District Leaders Network on Family and Community Engagement, the National Coalition for Community Schools Steering Committee, and the Bill Goodling National Foundation Advisory Board.

Gray has been recognized with awards like the National Milken Award, the Indiana Congress of Parents and Teacher Lifetime Achievement Award, Heart of St. Vincent "Caring for Kids" Honoree, Athena Award Winner, Leadership Evansville Individual Award in Education and Business in Education Award, and the USI Distinguished Alumni Award. Most recently, she was awarded an Indiana Torchbearer Award in 2014.

Her commitment to the Evansville community is evident in her volunteer engagements with Habitat for Humanity, and the Glenwood Community Revitalization Initiative. She has served as board chair for United Way of Southwestern Indiana, vice chair for the Early Childhood Development Coalition Board, the YMCA Board of Directors, St. Mary's Medical Center Foundation Board of Directors, the Mayor's Education Roundtable, and as chairperson of discharge planning for the Mayor's Commission on Homelessness.

She has been a member of ASCD (formally known as Association of Supervision and Curriculum Development), Leadership Evansville, Phi Delta Kappa, Evansville Area Reading Council, A Network of Evansville Women (ANEW), and the Indiana Staff Development Council and Coalition for Community School Urban Infinity Network.

She and her husband David '74 reside in Evansville and are the parents of two grown children, Casey Michael and Cathlin.

MICHAEL L. GOOD TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Michael L. Good '97 is the 2014 commencement speaker for the College of Liberal Arts. He earned his bachelor's degree in communication from USI, and holds a master's degree in business administration from Anderson University.

Good is vice president of strategic accounts and business development for Walker Information in Indianapolis, Indiana, where, over the last seven years, he has focused on strategic customer consulting initiatives with industry leading clients such as Intel, McAfee, ExactTarget, and others. He works with clients to leverage customer perspectives to drive business performance, develops and closes new business opportunities, and presents findings to boards and corporate executives. He also is an adjunct professor at Anderson University, teaching both marketing strategies and business plan development in the MBA Program.

Prior to his employment at Walker, Good co-founded TerraGraphiX Inc, a software development firm specializing in commercial real estate and public safety software applications. He was first the COO, then later the CEO. TerraGraphiX Inc. later became TGX Medical Systems, LLC, a software development firm specializing in asset management healthcare solutions. He was CEO and chairman of this venture-backed organization until 2007, and remains a co-owner.

He has been recognized for his leadership receiving multiple awards, including the Techpoint Mira Award and the Innovation Award from Indiana University Kelly School of Business. He also was recognized as one of Indy's Best and Brightest in 2010, named Indiana Innovator by the *Indianapolis Star* in 2005, and nominated for the "Best Chance for Success" award by the Indiana Venture Conference.

Good is committed to the Indianapolis-area community, serving on the board of directors for Connect2Help 2-1-1 (A United Way Agency), Artomobilia, and Colby & Cate's Charities, Inc. He has formally served as vice president and fundraising chairman for the Art with a Heart board of directors.

While at USI, Good was president of the American Advertising Federation and a member of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity.

He and his wife, Heather, live in Westfield, Indiana, with their three children.

DONALD R. BREIVOGEL, JR. TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Donald R. Breivogel, Jr. '83

Donald R. Breivogel, Jr. '83 is the speaker for the 2014 Romain College of Business and the Division of Outreach and Engagement Commencement ceremony. In 2013, Breivogel became senior vice president and chief financial officer at Atlas World Group, Incorporated, after serving in the same position at Springleaf Financial for 11 years.

He holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of Southern Indiana. He began his career at the accounting firm Gaither Koehler Roffert and Luckett, where he specialized in tax. He moved to Springleaf Financial Services (then American General Financial Services) in 1988 as an accounting manager for credit card operations. In the early 1990s he began working directly for the CFO and was responsible for finance operations in the United States and Puerto Rico. Around 1992, he was promoted to director of financial analysis and was responsible for the forecasting and financial analysis of all legal entities. In 2000, he was promoted to vice president and treasurer and, in 2001, to senior vice president and CFO.

His responsibilities included corporate accounting, insurance accounting, financial reporting, business analysis, and tax, in addition to treasury and financial analysis. He later added human resources to his responsibilities and headed a staff of more than 200 employees.

In 2012, USI's Romain College of Business and the Accounting Circle presented him with the Distinguished Accountant Award recognizing his professional achievement, service to the region and the University, and service to the accounting profession.

At USI he has been a member of the Romain College of Business Board of Advisors, a charter member of the Accounting Circle, and he established a scholarship for accounting students.

Civic involvement and professional organizations are important to Breivogel. He has been a member of the Deaconess Foundation, Association for Financial Professionals, American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Indiana CPA Society, and the Institute of Management Accountants. He also is a graduate of American Bankers Association's National School of Bank Card Management.

He and his wife, Susan, reside in Evansville, Indiana, with their three sons, Donnie, Josh, and Adam.



USI BESTOWS TWO HONORARY DEGREES FOR

Today's honorary degree recipients are well-known in the University of Southern Indiana community. They have influenced countless students, alumni, faculty, and staff. One has contributed to the historic growth in academic programs, and the other has contributed to care and expansion of the University's collections in New Harmony.

Dr. Robert L. Reid will receive an honorary Doctor of Laws degree and Christa C. Thurman Sala will receive an honorary Doctor of Arts degree. Both will be bestowed during the Graduate Ceremony.

Christa C. Thurman Sala is a 2014 Honorary Degree recipient for the University of Southern Indiana. Mrs. Thurman Sala will receive an Honorary Doctorate of Art during the Graduate Ceremony on Friday, May 2, 2014.

Born in Germany, Thurman Sala obtained her bachelor's degree from Finch College in New York and a Master of Arts from the Institute of Fine Arts, New York University. She was the assistant curator of textiles at the Cooper-Union Museum in New York for seven years, and later became chair and curator of the Department of Textiles for the Art Institute of Chicago, where she spent 42 years of her career. She was named curator emerita of the Art Institute in April 2010, a title the Institute has used only once previously.

During her tenure at the Art Institute of Chicago, Thurman Sala was honored with the Charles F. Montgomery Prize, the College Art

Association /Heritage Preservation Joint Award for Distinction in Scholarship and Conservation, and was elected honorary fellow of the American Craft Council. In 2004, she received a research fellowship from the J. Paul Getty Museum. She curated more than 80 exhibitions at the Art Institute, held leading positions with the Centre Internationale d'Etude

des Textiles Anciens (CIETA), and was involved in national and international textile organizations. She continues to work as an independent textile historian, consultant, author, lecturer, and volunteer.

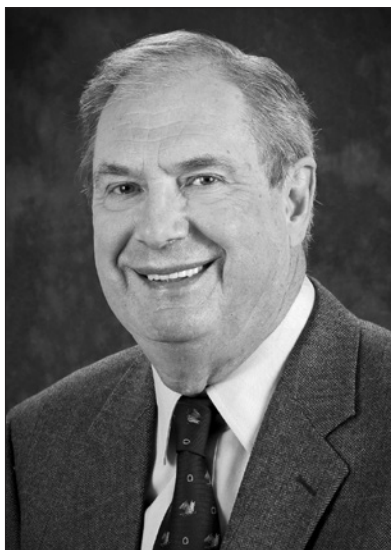
Thurman Sala was married to Dr. Lawrence Thurman, the first curator of the Harmonie Society's final home at Old Economie in Pennsylvania. She has been assisting the University analyze and care for its collections in New Harmony, Indiana, for nearly as long as USI has been involved there. Through her work, a significant textile collection from New Harmony has been built at the Art Institute of Chicago. She also served on Historic New Harmony's Collections Review Committee and worked on the development of a collections management policy. Her substantial monetary investment in the University will continue to support USI's work in New Harmony well into the future.

DISTINGUISHED AND EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE

Dr. Robert L. Reid is receiving an Honorary Doctorate of Law at the 2014 Graduate Commencement Ceremony for the University of Southern Indiana. Reid is provost emeritus and professor of history emeritus at the University of Southern Indiana.

For more than three decades, Reid's leadership of a committed faculty and academic administration established the academic base of the University, as well as the University's commitment to excellence in teaching. He led the shaping of academic policy, identified and developed quality academic programs, established assessment and quality improvement procedures, and was a strong proponent of the University's mission.

While at USI, Reid led by example, building bridges between faculty and community during the University's formative years. Under his leadership, partnerships were first developed between area hospitals and healthcare organizations, K-12 schools and regional community colleges, as well as cooperative programs with other state universities

and the Indiana Higher Educational Telecommunications System. He was an early proponent of collaboration between the University of Southern Indiana and Crane Naval Surface Warfare Center. He was a trustee of the Indiana Historical Society and chaired the Indiana Humanities Council, the Vanderburgh County Historical Society, and the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra. Currently he serves as president of the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library Board of Trustees.

Reid represented USI in regional and national academic organizations, including senior leadership roles in the North Central Association Higher Learning Commission (HLC). He also served the HLC as a consultant/evaluator for more than 30 years.

Reid earned a Bachelor of Arts from St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota, and a Master of Arts and Doctorate from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. Early in his career, he was assistant dean of Arts and Science at Miami University and also served as assistant director of programs for the Illinois Board of Higher Education. Reid was dean of Social Science at University of Illinois at Springfield before coming to USI in 1975.

Reid has published several books on local and North American history including *Pilgrims On the Ohio: The River Journey and Photographs of Reuben Gold Thwaites, 1894*; *Picturing Texas: The FSA-OWI Photographers in the Lone Star State, 1935-1943*; and *A Good Neighbor: The First Fifty Years of Crane*.

Honorary degrees are awarded for distinguished and extraordinary service consistent with the mission of the University. That service may be to the University itself, and/or to local, statewide, national, or international communities. Individuals selected to receive an honorary degree exemplify the highest ideals of integrity, service, and dedication to learning.

Candidate applications for honorary degrees from the University of Southern Indiana are reviewed by a committee defined by the honorary degree award policy. Recommendations are submitted to the president for approval by the USI Board of Trustees. Such a degree is the highest form of recognition granted by USI.

KENT W. SCHELLER TO RECEIVE DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR AWARD

Dr. Kent W. Scheller, associate professor of physics, is the 2014 recipient of the Distinguished Professor Award at the University of Southern Indiana. He is being recognized for his teaching, scholarship, and service. He will receive the award during the Commencement ceremony for the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education.

Since his arrival at USI in 1999, Scheller has taught at all levels in the physics curriculum—from Physics 101 for non-majors to upper-level physics offerings to majors. He has an uncanny ability to make physical science relevant, even to non-majors, and his courses have been a favorite for many students. He was recognized in 2007 with the H. Lee Cooper Core Teaching Award for the creativity and success of his teaching. Students often seek his knowledge and advice and are always greeted with encouragement, humor, and patience.

Dr. Paul Doss, USI professor of geology, said, “The student evaluations of his teaching clearly describe a teacher with enthusiasm, the ability to conceptualize physics concepts for a range of student backgrounds, and the development of a strong rapport with his students.”

In 2011, Scheller was selected through a competitive process by Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels to serve a two-year term as the faculty representative on the 14-member Indiana Commission for Higher Education. As the faculty appointee, he represented the interests of all faculty at publicly-supported institutions of higher education in Indiana. He was an active member and served with distinction, providing the voice of one who knows and understands the challenges and expectations of faculty in higher education today, and immediately gained the respect of fellow commissioners and university colleagues throughout the state.

He has published journal articles and presented papers on a multitude of topics including nuclear energy, radiation, and nuclear astrophysics, as well as education-related topics for instructional development. His current research is focused on the presence and nature of environmental radon in Southwestern Indiana. He also has served as keynote speaker for the Gibson Southern High School building dedication, the USI Honor Student Symposium, and the EVSC-USI Middle School Inquiry Conference.

In his nomination of Scheller, Dr. James Bandoli, USI professor

of biology, said, “It is important to recognize those who embody the spirit of this award in everything they do. Kent Scheller is such a professor.”

Scheller is active in his local community of Haubstadt, Indiana. He has served as president of the South Gibson School Board of Trustees and the Haubstadt Chamber of Commerce; chair of the Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church Finance Committee, School Board, and Parish Council; co-chair of the Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church capital campaign, raising more than \$4 million to enhance the parish; as well as coach of multiple youth athletic teams.

In 1988, he received his bachelor’s degree in science from the University of Evansville graduating *summa cum laude*. He then continued his education at the University of Notre Dame, obtaining his master’s degree in physics in 1991, and a doctorate in nuclear physics in 1994.

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA: IN TRANSITION FROM 1965 TO TODAY



President Linda L. M. Bennett became the third president of the University of Southern Indiana in 2009. In her inaugural address, she referenced the University's founding in 1965 and said, "Service to a greater good was a primary reason the University of Southern Indiana was created. It is our touchstone, and years after our founding and emergence as a separate state University, there is little doubt that USI is delivering on the promise of its founding."

USI began as a regional campus administered by Indiana State University. During the initial 20 years, the institution experienced enrollment growth and developed under an administration led by President David L. Rice with faculty dedicated to teaching and serving the community. Dr. Rice's vision of public higher education led to the modern, thriving institution we know today.

The institution started with 412 students and increased steadily to 2,420 students by 1985. In the next two decades, growth continued as the institution's name changed to the University of Southern Indiana and the student population grew to more than 10,000 students by 2004. More buildings opened including student apartments, residence halls, a fitness, wellness, and recreation center, an Education Center and Torrington Science Center wing, and Rice Library, named in honor of the University's first president.

The impact of USI's focus can be seen most dramatically in the rise in regional college-going attendance, from 33 percent of public high school graduates in 1985 when USI was established as a separate state institution, to 84 percent in 2011. These gains outpace both state and national averages and speak to the strong partnership USI established with P-12 educational programs, other higher education institutions, and business and industry.

From 1994 to 2009, President H. Ray Hoops led institutional growth with new construction, continued academic program development, and an ever-increasing, diverse student population coming from counties throughout Indiana, the Midwest, and around the world. Throughout his presidency, Dr. Hoops positioned USI to be an agent for workforce and economic development. He encouraged USI faculty to be of service as consultants to industry, education, healthcare, business, and other fields important to Indiana.

Academic offerings also increase

USI's academic offerings in business, liberal arts, nursing and health professions, and science, engineering, and education are available in four colleges. In addition to undergraduate programs, master's degrees in multiple areas and a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) are offered in graduate programs. Traditional-aged students and adult students continue to enroll in these programs and business development and continuing education classes offered at USI.

More than 34,500 alumni have been awarded diplomas from the University of Southern Indiana. USI graduates are renowned surgeons, bank executives, artists, leaders in K-12 education, accounting executives, lawyers, nurses, hospital administrators, college professors, and elected officials—and they are involved in their communities.

A Business and Engineering Center and an iconic 92'-tall Cone in the University Center complete the ring of structures around the quadrangle on campus. The Applied Engineering Center, with state-of-the-art equipment, opened in fall 2013. The new teaching theatre will open in fall 2014.

USI will celebrate its 50th anniversary in 2015. The mission of the University continues to be one of access and quality education for the region and beyond.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, this medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

The University of Southern Indiana Presidential medallion signifies the authority invested in the president. The medallion's obverse carries, at its center, a three-inch reproduction of the University seal and, surrounding the seal, a half-inch rim. On the reverse appear the names and dates of appointment for the University's presidents. The president wears this medallion for all formal academic ceremonies. During the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Ceremony, a replica of the Presidential medallion will be presented to Jordan K. Morrison. This is the highest honor given to a graduating senior.

Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; typically deans or department heads act as gonfaloniers. Here gonfalon colors derive from traditional hues associated with each college's academic disciplines. Our commencement gonfalons come as a gift from the USI Campus Store.

University Seal

The University seal, designed by Nussmeier Engraving, bears the University's colors—red, white, and blue—with gold. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance. Between the two banners displaying the University's name appear a band and an open book bound together by the torch of knowledge. In the band, rays of light emanate simultaneously from a rising sun, symbolizing the young

University, and from the torch, symbolizing the light of knowledge and the passion for scholarship. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral Southern Indiana setting but also life, growth, and continuity.

Beneath this band, an open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the people, for the people. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inch-tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874; and through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University seal. The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen, and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

Academic Regalia

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet. Retired members of the University faculty and administrative staff can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white, and blue cords worn with their regalia.

Hooding Ceremony

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement. During the Graduate Ceremony, doctoral and master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees.

Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with the highest scholarship index is graduated *summa cum laude*. Baccalaureate students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher are graduated *magna cum laude*.

Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 are graduated *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement Exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in doctoral and master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade-point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in the Commencement ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in each ceremony are receiving alumni lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association. Organized with the first graduating class in 1971, the association commemorated 40 years in 2011.

Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer will take a photo of each graduate as he/she receives his/her diploma on stage. A second photograph will be taken as the graduate departs from the stage. Graduates will receive proofs of the photos from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony may do so from their seats. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.

Commemorative DVD

In response to requests from graduates and families, a commemorative DVD is being produced by the USI Office of Information Technology in cooperation with the USI Alumni Association.
