



RECRUITING CONSORTIUM ORGANIZED. The Evansville Higher Education Recruiting Consortium has been organized as a cooperative venture of Indiana State University Evansville, Indiana Vocational Technical College, and University of Evansville in order to better serve recruiters for midwest companies and school corporations. A brochure has been compiled which cites the variety of skills available in Evansville through

the three institutions. Through the brochure, companies and school corporations can be made aware of the fact that visits to three different institutions, each having something unique to offer, can be coordinated in one trip or phone call. The Consortium will provide broader placement service and wider exposure of personnel needs to prospective employers as well as to Evansville students. The program was developed by Ralph Kent, Director of Career Placement and Alumni Affairs; Daniel Schenk, Coordinator of Student Development, Ivy Tech; and Edward Susat, Director of Placement, U of E.

ISUE PROF PUBLISHES BOOK. Robert Mays, Director of Student Teaching and Associate Professor of Education, has recently published a book entitled Opening the Public School Curriculum. Dr. Mays organized and developed the book in an effort to influence the reader's own "becoming" in the direction of greater openness. An outstanding collection of recent publications on openness, the book is designed for use in a variety of undergraduate and graduate courses focusing on education; for use as a personal reference; for use in college libraries; and for use in professional libraries of both public and private school systems. Opening the Public School Curriculum will be used at ISUE in the fall semester. Other universities using the text include Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Wright State University, and North Texas State University. Several other colleges have also requested copies of the book for examination and evaluation. Copies are available in the ISUE Bookstore.

CHANGES IN TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT RATES. The 1976 Indiana General Assembly authorized the State Budget Agency to make the following changes in travel reimbursement rates effective July 1, 1976:

Mileage Was: 13¢ per mile
 Now: In-State Mileage Rate. Mileage reimbursement for official travel within the State of Indiana shall be paid at the rate of 14¢ per mile when the use of personal car is authorized.

Out-of-State Mileage Rate. Mileage reimbursement for official travel outside the State of Indiana for one person shall be as follows:

- 14¢ per mile for the first 500 miles
- 7¢ per mile for the next 2,500 miles
- 4 1/2¢ per mile for all additional over 3,000 miles

If two or more Indiana State University personnel are in one car, the out-of-state mileage reimbursement will be 14¢ per mile.

The in-state and out-of-state mileage rates include all expenses incident to such transportation. No repairs, gas or oil, storage, parking, tolls, ferry charges, car washes, or other expenses may be reimbursed.
