### H. Ray Hoops, *President*



H. Ray Hoops became the second president of the University of Southern Indiana in July 1994. During his tenure, he has forged important community partnerships and has overseen dramatic growth in the University's enrollment, facilities, and academic programs.

A native of Illinois, Dr. Hoops received his undergraduate degree from Eastern Illinois University and master's and doctoral degrees in Audiology and Speech Sciences from

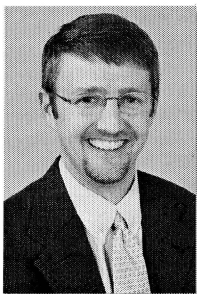
Purdue University. He also completed an M.B.A. at Moorhead State University.

His career as a scientist and educator has included a faculty appointment jointly at the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

He published extensively and was nationally recognized for his contributions in the areas of rehabilitation of post-surgical patients with cancer of the larynx and in the analysis of language dynamics resulting from brain damage. Among his numerous publications in a variety of behavioral and medical journals was the report on a study which received the National Research Award, the highest honor of the American Speech and Hearing Association. Dr. Hoops also was named Fellow of the Association.

His administrative appointments included the directorship of the Division of Marketing in the U.S. Department of Health, Education,

### Jon Mark Hall, *Director of Athletics*



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002. He moved into the position after spending seven years as the assistant director of athletics. He is the second director of athletics that USI has had.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and is the host of the 2004 NCAA Division II Cross Country national championships.

In addition to his duties as director of athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, no one did it better in the GLVC than Hall. He was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns and set a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

and Welfare. He received two national service awards for that work. He also was a Senior Fulbright-Hayes Research Scholar in the College of Medicine at the University of the Philippines. Other appointments included dean of the Graduate College of the University of Northern Iowa, associate vice chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Oregon State System of Higher Education, vice president for Academic Affairs at North Dakota State University, and president of South Dakota State University.

In the six years prior to becoming the president of the University of Southern Indiana, Dr. Hoops served as the vice chancellor for Academic Affairs at the University of Mississippi. While at Ole Miss, Dr. Hoops received the National Council of State Governments Association Award for his pioneering work on Project '95, a blueprint for the reform of education in the state of Mississippi. He also received the Peterson's Guide Award for contributions to the education of minority students in the innovative and highly successful graduate participation initiative.

President Hoops serves on the Deaconess Hospital Board of Directors, the Welborn Foundation Board of Directors, the Metropolitan Evansville Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, and the WNIN Board of Directors. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves as the chair of the Indiana Conference of Higher Education.

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after a tenure at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotion activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife Patti reside in Evansville and have two sons, Nathan and Garland, and daughter Mary Claire.

### Location

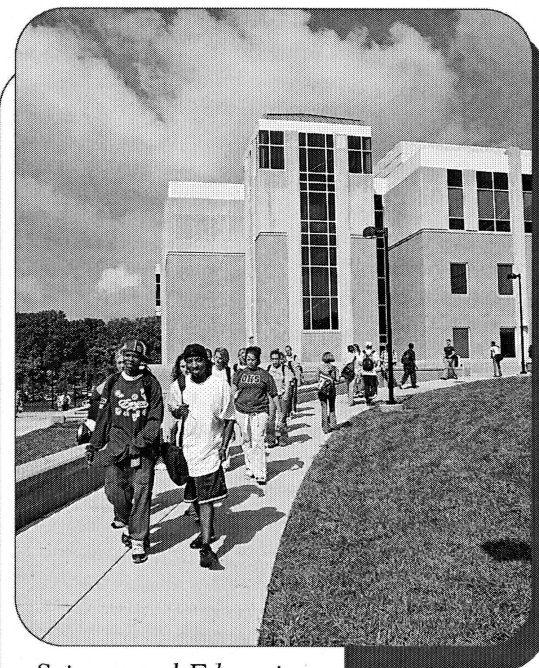

**...A CITY with urban attractions and hometown friendliness**

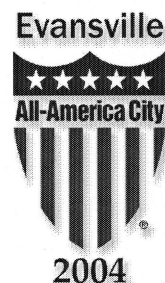


Situated on the banks of the Ohio River, Evansville is a mid-sized city that welcomes USI students and offers them plenty of things to do. Roberts Stadium and the Victory Theatre attract students to concerts by entertainers like Nelly, Aerosmith, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, and Josh Groban. Traveling Broadway shows and feature performances come to The Centre. For a relaxing walk or invigorating run, the downtown riverfront features a greenway with a wonderful view of the changing river traffic and the Evansville skyline. # SEASON OUTLOOK

## 2005-06 Women's Basketball

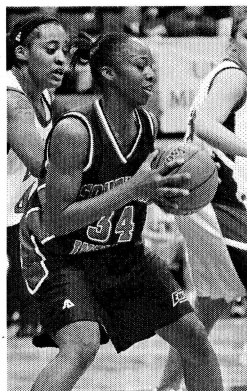


**H**ead Coach **Rick Stein** leads the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team into action for the seventh season after becoming the second winningest coach in the program's 30-year history.

For the Screaming Eagles to bounce back from an injury-plagued season that saw them post a 14-14 overall record, 7-13 in the GLVC, in 2004-05, Stein needs to mix a strong cast of seven returnees with seven newcomers.

Leading the list of returnees are senior forwards **Sabrina Brandon** and **Ashley Green**. Brandon is USI's leading returning scorer after finishing second on the squad a year ago with 12.1 points and 5.2 rebounds per game, while Green, who became a scoring threat from outside as a junior, is USI's top returning rebounder after averaging a team-best 5.6 rebounds per outing in 2004-05.

Senior point guard **Tiara Brown** averaged 8.7 points and 4.2 assists per contest in her first season with the Eagles and gives the squad a strong presence and leadership in the backcourt. Her assists ranked third in the GLVC.



Senior forward **Sabrina Brandon** averaged a team-best 12.1 ppg and was second on the squad with 5.4 rpg in 2004-05.

Junior guard **Leah Stormont** also saw a lot of action as USI's point guard a year ago. Stormont, who averaged 1.5 points and 2.2 assists per game in 2004-05, provided the Eagles a lot of speed and hustle on the defensive end of the court and will be looked upon to do the same this season.

One of the biggest hits the Eagles took last season was the loss of freshman forward **Jessica Minnick** to injury. Minnick averaged 14.6 points and 5.0 rebounds per game before a season-ending knee injury sidelined her five games into the season. Minnick received a medical red-shirt for 2004-05 and will be a major asset to the squad in 2005-06.

One player with a ton of athletic talent who should help the Eagles out in 2005-06 is sophomore guard/forward **Marshay Jolly**. Jolly struggled at times during her rookie season, but has the ability to be an outstanding player. She averaged 14.0 points in USI's first two contests, putting in a season-best 15 points against Purdue University-Calumet.

With the graduation of last season's leading scorer, Jamie Truitt, the Eagles will need additional contributions from sophomore guard **Nicole McDonald**. McDonald averaged 1.5 points per game as a freshman, but showed the capability to hit a long-range shot in key situations.

USI's list of newcomers includes five transfers and a pair of freshmen. Junior guard/forward **Michelle King** and junior guard **Katie Thiesenhusen** will give the Eagles versatility in the back court, while junior forward/center **Sarah Buldtman** and sophomore forward **Megan Kreider** will give the Eagles needed size in the post.

King averaged 11.5 points, 3.0 steals, and 4.2 assists per game as a sophomore at Chattanooga State Technical Community College last season, while leading CSTCC to a 25-3 overall record and a NJCAA Division I ranking of 16th. Thiesenhusen averaged 12.2 points and 3.6 rebounds per contest in helping Jefferson College to a 28-4 record in 2004-05 and the second round of the NJCAA I Tournament. She averaged 13.2 points and 3.5 rebounds per game as a freshman.

Buldtman may be one of the best steals of the recruiting season. She averaged 5.0 points and 4.9 rebounds per game as a sophomore for John A. Logan College after an elbow injury limited her to just



Senior guard **Tiara Brown** led USI with 4.2 assists per game last season. She also averaged 8.7 points per contest as a junior in 2004-05.

22 games in 2004-05. She averaged 9.5 points and 6.7 rebounds as a freshman in 2003-04.

Kreider is a walk-on to the squad after spending her freshman season at Glen Oaks Community College where she averaged 10.5 points and 5.4 rebounds per game in 2004-05.

The Eagles also are excited about the addition of sophomore forward **Jasmine Baines**. Baines comes to USI from Indiana University/Purdue University-Indianapolis where she was named to the Mid-Continent Conference All-Newcomer Team. She averaged 5.0 points and 4.9 rebounds in 27 games as a freshman, but put up some big numbers as a starter, averaging 8.2 points and 8.3 rebounds per outing in 15 starts.

USI added to its frontcourt as well as its backcourt with its freshman signings. Guard **Keisha Collins** averaged 11.0 points and 3.6 steals per game as a senior at tradition-rich Marian Catholic High School (Chicago Heights, Illinois) and will make an immediate impact at the point guard position. She earned IBCA honorable mention All-State honors and was the *Illinois Times* Player of the Year last season.

Forward/Center **Brittany Neuman** averaged 11.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game as a senior at Southridge High School a year ago and will provide much-needed size and depth to the post position. She scored 873 points and brought down 707 rebounds during her career at SHS and was a member of two sectional and Pocket Athletic Conference championship squads.

The Eagles start their season earlier than normal when they compete in the Disney Division II Tip-Off Classic November 4-6 in Orlando, Florida. USI opens the three-day tournament with Columbus State University, a school that defeated the Eagles in the 2001 NCAA II Elite Eight.

USI opens its home schedule with Brescia University November 15 and opens GLVC play on the road against the University of Missouri-Rolla December 1. UMR is one of three newcomers to the league this season. Rockhurst University and national-power Drury University join UMR in its inaugural season in the GLVC and will be part of a seven-member West Division that features USI, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Quincy University, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

The Eagles will play each member of the West Division twice in 2004-05, while they will see the East Division once a year. Members of the GLVC's East Division include Bellarmine University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Lewis University, Northern Kentucky University, Saint Joseph's College, the University of Indianapolis, and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

This year's Homecoming is scheduled for February 11 against Rockhurst, while Senior Day is slated for February 25 against the Missouri-St. Louis. The GLVC Tournament is March 2-5 at Roberts Stadium in Evansville, Indiana, and the

NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament is slated for March 10-13. The NCAA II Elite Eight is March 22-25 at the Hot Springs Convention Center in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

## USI Head Coach Rick Stein



Rick Stein enters his seventh season at the helm of the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball program after reaching his 100th career victory last year.

Stein, who is the second winningest coach in the program's history, led the Screaming Eagles to a 14-14 overall

record, 7-13 in the GLVC, and to the GLVC Tournament last season despite his team being hampered by multiple injuries.

In 14 seasons as an assistant coach and head coach for USI women's basketball, Stein has been a part of 271 victories (64.7 percent of USI's all-time wins), four conference championships, three GLVC Tournament titles, all seven of USI's NCAA II Tournament appearances, and two NCAA II Elite Eight appearances.

In 2003-04, Stein led the Eagles to a 20-10 mark and a 12-8 record in the GLVC. His Eagles returned to the NCAA II Tournament for the first time since the 2001-02 season.

Despite a rough 2002-03 campaign, Stein and his coaching staff brought in a strong recruiting class that set the stage for a return to national competitiveness. In 2003-04, USI had the sixth-best turnaround in Division II, with USI improving by 12 wins from the previous year.

In 2002-03, Stein and the Eagles were forced into a rebuilding year after losing five seniors and more than 60 points and 25 rebounds per game from the 2001-02 squad. With only one returning starter, Stein and his staff had a young team competing for a spot in the GLVC Tournament late in the season and finished the year with an 8-19 overall record.

The 2001-02 season saw Stein's Eagles win a second straight GLVC Championship and an NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional appearance with a 27-6 overall record and a 16-4 GLVC record. Stein also has led the Eagles into the national spotlight with his squad being ranked nationally for 37 consecutive weeks between December of 2000 and December of 2002.

In just his second season with the Eagles, Stein led USI to a 28-4 record and the biggest season-to-season turnaround in school history (+13 wins). Stein, who earned GLVC Coach of the Year honors, directed the Screaming Eagles to the Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship, GLVC Tournament Championship, the NCAA Division II Tournament appearance, and second NCAA II Elite Eight appearance.

In his first season, Stein went 15-12 overall, tying the record for most victories for a rookie head coach and setting the record for best winning percentage for a rookie coach (.556). Stein's overall winning percentage is the best in USI women's basketball history.

Stein is a 1992 USI graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. He joined the Eagles program in 1991-92 as a graduate assistant under former Head Coach Chancellor Dugan. He was promoted to head assistant coach in 1994 and promptly helped Dugan and the Eagles to their best season as a varsity sport at USI.

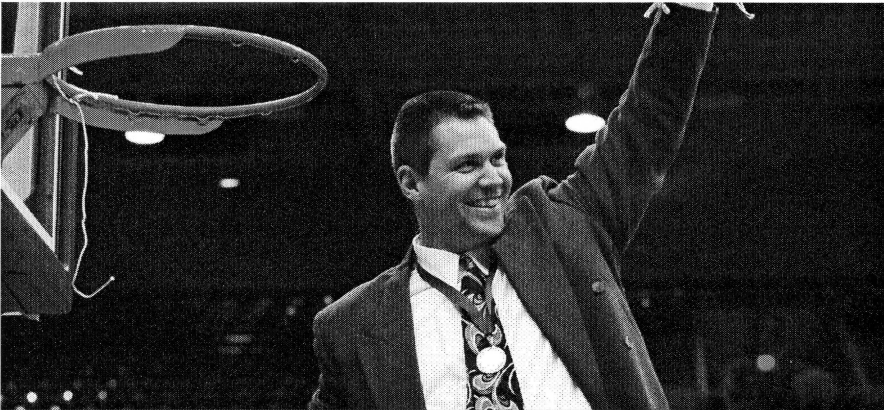
In his eight seasons, Stein helped Dugan amass a 159-73 record with four straight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances (1994-95 to 1997-98) and three Great Lakes Valley Conference titles. The Eagles were the NCAA II Tournament finalist and produced the only perfect season in GLVC history (20-0) in 1997.

A native of Crete, Illinois, Stein was a two-year starter on the Southern Indiana men's basketball team from 1989-91. During his tenure as a player, Stein helped USI to an appearance in the NCAA Division II South Central Regional in 1989-90 and a win over Division I University of Wisconsin in 1990-91. Before joining USI's team, he played basketball at Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois, and earned an associate degree. Parkland finished as the NJCAA Division II runner-up in 1988 and fourth nationally in 1989.

A member of the WBCA, Stein and his wife Kari have a son Alex and a daughter Mallorie.

In 2001-02, Head Coach Rick Stein led the Screaming Eagles to their second straight Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title.

In 14 seasons with the USI women's basketball team, eight as an assistant and five as head coach, Stein has been a part of 271 Eagle victories, seven NCAA II Tournament appearances, four regular-season GLVC titles, and a record three GLVC Tournament championships.

Stein has been a part of 64.7 percent of USI's all-time victories.

In just his second season, Stein was voted the GLVC Coach of the Year after leading USI to a 28-4 record and both the GLVC regular-season and tournament championships.

Stein, who led USI to its second NCAA II Elite Eight appearance in 2000-01, ranks second all-time at USI with 112 career victories and is just the third coach in the program's history to reach the 100-win plateau.





### Randa Gatling, Assistant Coach



A 1999 USI graduate with a bachelor's degree in social work, assistant coach **Randa Gatling** returns for her seventh season with the Eagles. Gatling assists with game scouts, recruiting, player assessment, and on-the-court skill work with the guards.

In addition to her coaching duties, Gatling is the senior women's administrator and an instructor in physical education. She also is the coordinator for USI's Eagle Math program.

A native of Evansville, Indiana, Gatling started her career at Evansville Central High School. She served as the head coach for the first-ever Central girl's freshman basketball team and was instrumental in its creation.

During her playing days at USI, Gatling was a member of the 1997 NCAA Division II national finalist team. Her play helped the Eagles to NCAA II Tournament appearances in 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998 as well as GLVC championships in 1995, 1997, and 1998. She was the team captain in 1997-98.

The Eagles were a dominating 100-16 (.862), including an amazing 67-9 (.881) in the GLVC, during Gatling's four years in an Eagle uniform.

**Casey Nations** enters her third season as assistant women's basketball coach. Nations assists in all facets of the women's basketball program.

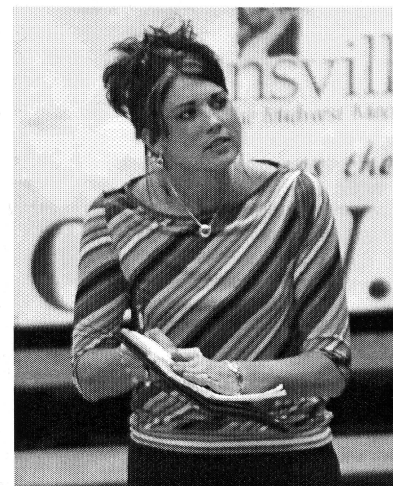
In addition to her coaching duties, Nations is an instructor in physical education.

## Soaring through the years of success

The University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team enters the 2005-06 campaign seeking its eighth NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 12 seasons. The last 11 seasons have not only produced seven NCAA II Tournament appearances, but have seen the Screaming Eagles make it to the NCAA II Sweet Sixteen three times and to the Elite Eight twice. USI finished as the runner-up in 1997.

In addition to its NCAA II Tournament success, USI also has been a powerhouse in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. The Eagles have won four GLVC regular-season titles since 1995 and have won the GLVC Tournament a record three times. In six trips to the GLVC Tournament, the Eagles are a conference-best 10-3.

*Note: Since 1994, the Eagles have had five players earn All-America honors.*

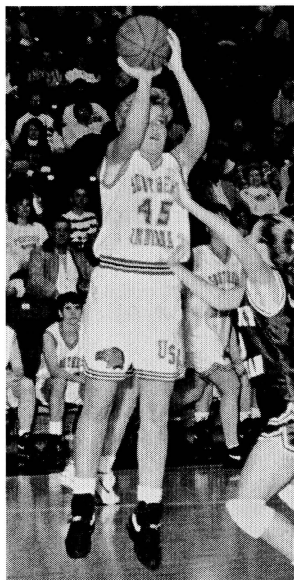
After beginning the 1996-97 season with a 1-1 record, the Eagles won 29 straight games as well as the GLVC and NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship. USI went on to win its first two games in the NCAA II Elite Eight before falling in the national championship game to North Dakota. USI also became the first and only team in GLVC history to go 20-0 in conference play. USI finished the season with a school-record 30-2 mark and finished second in the national rankings.

After missing out on the NCAA II Tournament in 1999 and 2000, the Eagles exploded back onto the national stage in 2001. The Eagles finished the 2000-01 season with a 28-4 mark and won a share of the GLVC regular-season title. The Eagles went on to win the GLVC Tournament championship as well as the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship for the second time in school history.

**Quick fact:** *The Eagles have hosted the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament twice. However, the two times the Eagles have gone to the Elite Eight, they have won the regional tournament in the state of Michigan.*



### All-American Trends



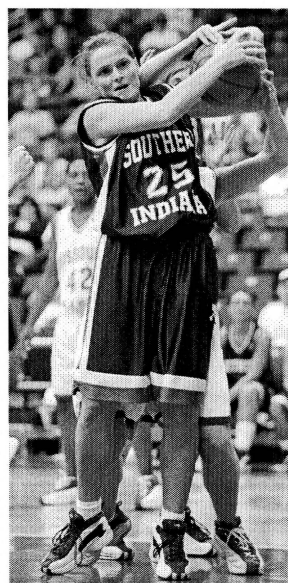
**Kathy Lauck** was the first of five USI players to earn All-America honors since 1994. Lauck averaged 20.1 points and 9.2 rebounds per game as a senior and led the Screaming Eagles to their first winning season in eight years. USI finished the season with a 17-10 mark and a 12-6 record in the GLVC. Lauck, who is third all-time at USI in career scoring with 1,573 points, earned GLVC Player of the Year honors in 1994 and was a two-time All-GLVC selection. She was recognized by three publications for All-America honors.



In 1995, **LeAnn Freeland** became the second player in school history to earn All-America honors. Freeland, USI's all-time leading scorer with 2,269 points, finished her career at USI as a three-time All-American. However, her sophomore campaign in 1994-95 stood out as she became the first player in school history to earn National Player of the Year honors. During the 1994-95 season, Freeland averaged 24.4 points and 9.2 points per game. She finished her career as USI's all-time leader in six statistical categories, including rebounds (961). The two-time GLVC Player of the Year holds 16 school records and was a three-time Academic All-American.



**Eileen Weber** was recognized by two organizations for All-America honors in 1996-97. She also earned All-America honors for her efforts during the 1997-98 season. In 1996-97, Weber helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a 30-2 record and the NCAA II National Championship game. She started her career at USI by earning GLVC Newcomer of the Year honors and ended it by earning GLVC Player of the Year honors. Weber is second all-time at USI in career points (1,847) and career rebounds (842). She averaged 17.8 points and 8.0 rebounds per game as a senior in 1997-98 and 15.4 points and 6.4 rebounds as a junior in 1996-97.



After a quiet first three seasons, **Elizabeth Prewett** broke out as a senior during the 2000-01 season. She averaged 15.0 points and 9.2 rebounds per game to lead USI to a 28-4 record and its second trip to the NCAA II Elite Eight. Her efforts landed her first-team All-GLVC and All-Region honors. She also was selected GLVC All-Tournament Team and was named the MVP of the 2001 NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament. Prewett is ranked 14th all-time at USI in career scoring (837) and eighth all-time at USI in career rebounds (589). In 2000, she helped the USI volleyball team to a share of the GLVC regular-season title.

Since the first campus building (Wright Administration Building) opened in 1969, the face of the campus has continued to change, providing the most up-to-date facilities for academics, housing, and student life.
