

#### 1993-94 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

#### WHATEVER IT TAKES!

That's right. This is the battle cry of the USI women's basketball players, who have a chance to put it all together for a winning season and a shot at the Great Lakes Valley Conference championship.

In two seasons, Head Coach **Chancellor Dugan** has taken a team which was 22 games under .500 in 1990-91 to a .500 record in 1992-93. The Lady Eagles finished with a 15-15 record, the best season since 1985-86. They fell just one game short of tying the school record for season wins. The squad set USI school records with nine wins in the GLVC, six straight wins, and 217 three-point field goals made.

The Lady Eagles, six games over .500 at one point last season, return 12 players (six seniors) and four starters from the 1992-93 team.

Second team All-GLVC **Kathy Lauck**, a 5-11 senior center, will lead the team. Lauck led the team in scoring and rebounding for the second straight year, averaging 15.9 ppg and 7.0 rpg. The 1992-93 fifth-ranked scorer and tenth-ranked rebounder in the GLVC is within striking distance of four career records: most points, most rebounds, most field goals made, and most field goals attempted.

Joining Lauck in the frontcourt for a third year will be the Elkin twins, Jeanette and Annette. The three players led the Lady Eagles in establishing a team record 1,375 rebounds in 1992-93. Between the trio, they averaged 18.8 rpg or 41 percent of the rebounds.

Last year, **Annette Elkin** averaged 7.2 ppg and 6.4 rpg, and was the team leader in blocked shots (12), while **Jeanette Elkin**, who was an Academic All-GLVC student/athlete, averaged 8.3 ppg and 5.4 rpg and was second in blocks (6).

The frontcourt can look to a solid bench for support. Returning are 5-10 senior forward **Sheri Kaiser**, 5-9 junior forward **Danielle Slaughter**, 5-11 sophomore forward **Deb Pope**, and 5-11 sophomore forward, **Michelle Scott**.

Kaiser was named to the Academic All-GLVC team twice last season — once for basketball and once for volleyball. She averaged 7.5 ppg and 3.7 rpg off the bench. In her career at USI, she has averaged 9.0 ppg and 5.1 rpg in three seasons and could challenge for one of the starting spots.

Scott saw action in 29 of the 30 games last season for Dugan's Lady Eagles and averaged 4.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg. The sophomore was second on the team in offensive rebounds with 76.

Slaughter and Pope saw action in key situations last season, giving Dugan depth on the bench.

**LeAnn Freeland**, a 6-0 freshman forward/center, is the only newcomer to the USI roster. She averaged 26.1 ppg and 10.0 rpg and was named to the All-State team and was Southern Illinois Player of the Year at Wayne City High School (III.).

The Lady Eagles are just as experienced in the backcourt as in the frontcourt. The team returns four guards who combined have 10 seasons of experience at the college level.

The returning starter is 5-5 senior guard **Lisa Wells**, who was honorable mention All-GLVC in 1992-93. Wells, who transferred to USI from junior college last season, averaged 9.7 ppg and 3.3 rpg last season, but led the team with 109 assists and 66 steals.

Part-time starters from last season, who will be competing for the second starting spot, will be 5-6 senior guard **Laura Perek** and 5-7 junior guard **Glenna Bower**.

Perek, who was named to the Academic All-GLVC team for basketball and softball for the second straight season, averaged 5.5 ppg, 1.7 rpg, and was third in assists with 44 last season. She started 14 of the 30 games last year for the Lady Eagles, splitting the starting spot with Charlene Tinner, who graduated last spring.

Bower, who missed most of last season due to injuries and illness, averaged 10.3 ppg and 2.3 rpg in only 16 games in 1992-93. She will be looking to regain her freshman form when she started 25 of 28 games, averaged 13.6 ppg and 3.1 rpg, and set the school single season and career records for three-point field goals made.

Off the bench, the Lady Eagles have 5-5 junior guard Missy Hart and 5-7 sophomore **Stacey Roby**.

In Hart, the Lady Eagles have a long-range shooter. Hart played in all 30 games last season, averaged 3.9 ppg and 1.4 rpg off the bench, and hit 26 three-point field goals. She had four games with three or more field goals from beyond the arc.

One of the reasons for the resurgence of the Lady Eagles last season was the team's proficiency at hitting the "three." As a team, the Eagles ranked third nationally in three-point field goals made with 7.2 per game. In the 623 attempts taken by the Lady Eagles last season, they hit 217 (34.8 percent to rank 34th nationally).

This season, the Lady Eagles will have the top four three-point shooters in the history of USI women's basketball. Bower is the all-time leader with 67 career three-point field goals; Perek is second with 58, Kaiser is third with 53, and Jeanette Elkin is fourth with 49.

The Lady Eagles will open 1993-94 with an exhibition game on Sunday, November 21, before starting the regular season with a long road trip. The squad will play its first eight games on the road, including a trip to Florida, a tough Division II tournament hosted by Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, a tougher Divison I tournament at Middle Tennessee State University, and a GLVC game at Northern Kentucky University. USI will not play a regular season home game until the last week of December when it takes on Indiana/Purdue-Indianapolis.

## **HEAD COACH CHANCELLOR DUGAN**

The GLVC has taken notice of the great improvements in the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team over the past two seasons. The reason for this upward trend in the program is the hard work and enthusiasm of Chancellor Dugan, the USI women's basketball coach and assistant athletic director.

In her second season, Dugan has led the women's program into the upper division of the GLVC. In 1992-93, she coached the Eagles to a school record nine wins in the GLVC and fell one game short of tying the school record for wins in a season with 15 victories. With four returning starters and 12 returning letter winners, Dugan's team will challenge the contenders for the GLVC's championship only three years after her arrival.

In her first season Dugan led the women's basketball team to more wins in the regular season (8) and in the Great Lakes Valley Conference (3) than the Screaming Eagles had in the previous two years combined.

Dugan, a native of Louisville, Ky., graduated from EKU in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and received a master's degree in physical education in 1989 from Morehead. While an undergraduate at EKU, Dugan was a three-year starter and finished her junior and senior years as the team's leading rebounder and second-leading scorer.

After graduating from EKU, she took the head coaching job at George West High School in George West, Tex., where she guided the team to a 56-30 record in three years.

NANCY WINSTEL, NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S HEAD BASKETBALL COACH ON DUGAN: "Chancellor has done an excellent job over the last couple of seasons. She has brought USI into the upper division of the GLVC and will contend for the championship in a short time. A lot of the improvement can be a credit to her coaching."

**KEITH FREEMAN, ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE WOMEN'S HEAD BASKETBALL COACH ON DUGAN:** "Chancellor is one of the best young coaches around. She has the women's program at Southern Indiana definitely on the rise in the GLVC."

## ASSISTANT COACH KELLY BOYD

Kelly Boyd begins her third year as an assistant coach with USI women's basketball. She is responsible for on-the-floor coaching, individual player assessment, and game scouting.

Before joining Dugan at USI, Boyd was a graduate assistant coach at EKU, where she earned a master's degree in physical education/sports administration. She received a bachelor's in physical education/health from Northeast Missouri State University, where she played varsity basketball two seasons (1987-89). She played basketball and softball for two season (1985-87) at Lincoln College (III.), before transferring to NEMO.

In addition to her basketball duties, Boyd is the women's head volleyball coach. She led the Screaming Eagles to a 14-13 record and a 5-4 GLVC record for a fifth place finish in the GLVC in her first volleyball season in 1992.

A native of Argenta, Ill., Boyd attended Argenta-Oreana High School.

**DUGAN ON BOYD:** "This is the start of the third season that this coaching staff has been together. Kelly has the dual responsibilities of head volleyball coach and women's basketball assistant coach. She has done a tremendous job balancing them."



## GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH RICK STEIN

Graduate assistant coach Rick Stein enters his third season with Coach Dugan and the USI women's basketball program. Stein coordinates the study table, on-the-floor coaching and the game-film exchange.

Stein graduated from USI in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and is working toward a master's degree in liberal studies. He also holds an associate degree from Parkland College in Champaign, III.

Stein played two seasons for the USI Screaming Eagles and helped earn a berth in the NCAA II South Central Regional in 1991. At Parkland, Stein was a member of the 1988 NJCAA Division II runner-up and 1989 fourth place teams. Stein is a native of Crete, III. and attended Crete-Monee High School.

**DUGAN ON STEIN:** "Rick has matured into a very professional collegiate coach. In his third season he will be counted on to recruit."







## **ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY**

The University of Southern Indiana endeavors to improve access to higher education and to serve the economic, intellectual, and cultural needs of southern Indiana. Established in 1965, the University of Southern Indiana serves over 7,000 students, of which 90 per cent are from Indiana.

USI is located seven miles west of downtown Evansville. The natural beauty of the University is a significant feature of the campus. Located on 300 acres of gently rolling hills, the University has six main buildings. Construction of a Health Professions Building is to be completed in 1994.

Academic programs in over 60 majors are offered in the School of Business, the School of Education and Human Services, the School of Liberal Arts, the School of Science and Engineering Technology, and the School of Nursing and Health Professions.

The University of Southern Indiana grants Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Occupational and General Studies (B.O.G.S.), Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.), and Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) degrees at the undergraduate level. Several of the schools offer associate degrees for two or three years of full-time study. Graduate students may work toward a master's degree in business administration, education, industrial management, liberal studies, or social work.

Through the Office of Continuing Education, USI offers seminars, workshops, short courses, and customized and in-house programs. The topic range includes business/professional development, Total Quality Management, fitness/wellness/recreation, arts and leisure, personal interest, programs for children, and travel/study programs.

Located within walking and biking distance to the campus, the Mid America Student Housing (MASH) units and Campus Apartments are home to over 1,300 students at USI.

USI sponsors 11 intercollegiate sports—men's baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, and tennis and women's basketball, softball, cross country, volleyball, and tennis—in the Great Lakes Valley Conference of NCAA Division II competition. The soccer program is independent in NCAA Division I.
