PASSOVER SUPPER AT ISUE APRIL 6. ISUE's Campus Ministry will host its' fifth annual celebration of the Jewish festival of Passover on Tuesday, April 6, from 6:00 - 9:30 p.m. The dinner will be held in the University Dining Center.

Passover, also called the "Festival of the Unleavened Bread", the "season of our freedom", or Pesach, the festival's Hebrew name; commemorates the deliverance of the children of Israel from the repressive centuries of Egyptian bondage. The story of the Israelites' escape from the Egyptian pharaoh became a focal point of Jewish history. The mass exodus from Egypt crystallized the Jewish national identity and marked the birth of the Jews as a free people. Passover is a celebration of freedom.

The Passover Seder will combine traditional prayers with explanations and Israeli music. The dinner will include matzo ball soup, roast chicken with matzo dressing, sliced tomato and cucumber salad, fruit cup with macaroons, gefilte fish, broccoli, wine, and of course, the special symbolic ritual food.

The price of the dinner is \$6.25 for adults and \$3.00 for children. Deadline for reservations is April 2 at noon. Reservations can be made by calling extension 1810.
