Post doctoral fellowships available

The Columbia Society of Fellows in the Humanities, with grants from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the William R. Kenan Trust, and the Arthur Vining Davis Foundation, will appoint a number of post-doctoral fellows in the humanities for the academic year 1999-2000. Fellows newly appointed for 1999-2000 must have received the Ph.D. between January 1, 1993 and July 1, 1999. The stipend will be \$30,000, one half for independent research and one half for teaching in the undergraduate program in general education. An additional \$1,000 is available to support research.

American Council of Learned Societies 1998-99 fellowships and grants competitions

The American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS) offers fellowships and grants with deadlines in early October and November. ACLS Fellowships are for postdoctoral research in the humanities and humanities-related social sciences. Also available are the ACLS/New York Public Library Center for Scholars and Writers Residential Fellowships.

- ACLS/SSRC International Postdoctoral Fellowships for postdoctoral research in the humanities and humanities-related social sciences on the societies and cultures of Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, or sub-Saharan Africa.
- Contemplative Practice Fellowships for academic faculty members to develop courses and teaching materials that explore contemplative practice from a variety of disciplinary and interdisciplinary perspectives.
- Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Dissertation Fellowship Program in American Art for Ph.D. dissertation work in the art history of the United States in any period.
- Fellowships for East European Studies for postdoctoral or dissertation research on East Europe in the social sciences and humanities; intended to support work undertaken primarily outside East Europe.
- The Committee on Scholarly Communication with China, CSCC China Programs for research in China by advanced graduate students and postdoctoral scholars in the humanities and social sciences.
- Humanities and social science research programs are also offered by the Social Science Research Council (<http://www.ssrc.org>), the Council for International Exchange of Scholars (<http://www.cies.org>), and the International Research and Exchanges Board (<http://www.irex.org>).

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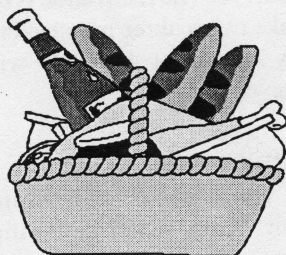

All letters received by HGF will be submitted to HGF's Research Committee, comprised of scientists and physicians, who will pick the topics most relevant to HGF interests. 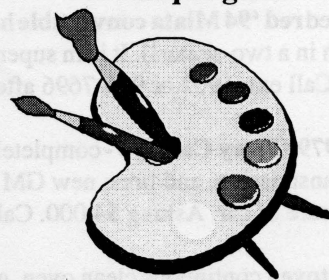
