UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN REPORT. ISUE's contribution to the United Fund is now \$2,849 - \$235 less than last year. The contribution to date represents only 50% of all ISUE employees, since only 127 out of 254 have donated. Indiana State University Evansville invites women who are interested in attending classes at ISUE but have questions about enrolling in college classes to the campus Wednesday, December 3, 1975 at 8:30 a.m. The Total Woman Program, an introduction to ISUE, has been designed by *Mrs. Laura Rohrbacher*, Admissions Counselor. The program will include comments by current ISUE women students who have returned to or have just begun college, University Counselor, *Tim Buecher*, and *Susan Donaldson*, Professor of Psychology. PEOPLE IN THE NEWS.

From November 9-12, CHARLES T. BARBER, Associate Professor of Political Science, was at the National Whale Symposium on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington. Among the eighteen sessions he attended were "Public Participation in Scientific Studies of Whales," "Creative Writing of the Yankee Whalemens," "The Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 and the Citizen," and "A Report on the Activities of the International Whaling Commission." Participants came from all parts of the United States as well as from Canada, Malta, and Peru.

MELVIN W. DENNER, Associate Professor of Life Science, spoke to The Scientec Club of Evansville on November 20, 1975.
