4. Humanities Division Colloquium

On Thursday, January 8, 1970, from 4:00 to 5:30 p. m. in room #292, Dr. Michael Pasko will present a paper on "The Place of the Humanities in Higher Education". A commentator from each division will respond to Dr. Pasko's remarks. These will include Dr. Pitzer, Dr. Denner, Dr. Small and Mr. Marting. Scheduled comments will be followed by an open discussion. All faculty and staff members are invited and urged to attend this and subsequent colloquia.

5. 1970 Mid-States Craft Exhibition

From February 15 through March 15, 1970, the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science will have a Craft Exhibition. Any craftsman living within a 200-mile radius of Evansville, Indiana, may submit three (3) entries in any combination of categories. Categories include CERAMICS, TEXTILES, METALWORK, MISCELLANEOUS (wood, enamels, glass, other handcrafted materials). Entry fee is \$3.00. All work must be original, completed within the last three years, and not previously exhibited at the Mid-States Craft Exhibition.

Objects to be exhibited should be received by the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science between January 15 and January 25, 1970. Nothing will be accepted for entry after January 25, 1970. Forms for entries may be picked up at the Museum daily, Tuesday through Saturday, from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. or on Sundays from noon until 5:00 p.m.

6. ISUE Foundation Century Club

The ISUE Foundation started in late October 1969. Two projects were instituted, the Century Club and the Book Club.

The Century Club consists of donors who contribute \$100.00 or more annually for unrestricted operating funds. These funds will be used for the following purposes: Scholarships, Fellowships, Student Loans, Grants-in-Aid, Visiting Artists and Professors, Enrichment Programs, Faculty Achievement Recognition, Additional Equipment and Facilities, Library Collections, and other vital needs.

Donors who contribute \$10.00 as a Book Contributor, or who join the Book of the Month, Quarter, or Year Plan are current Book Club Members. The average cost of a volume for the Library is \$10.00. Books purchased with Book Club contributions will be identified with a nameplate designating the donor, and a separate catalogue card file will be maintained to perpetuate identification of books and donors.

Contributions to colleges and universities in Indiana may be used as certain credits against the state adjusted gross income tax (not a deduction from income, but a deduction from the tax itself).
