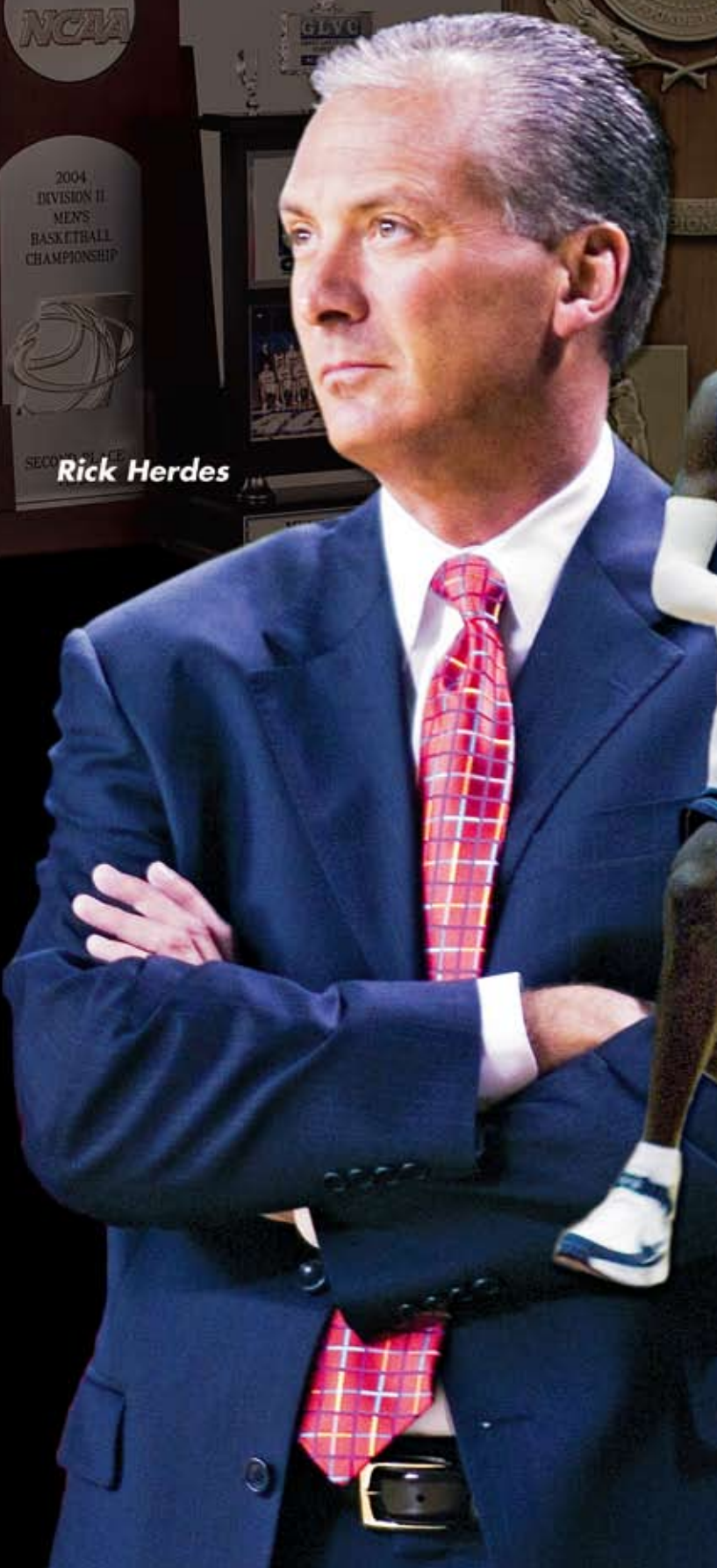

Jon Mark Hall, Director of Athletics



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002, after seven years as the assistant director of Athletics.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and host of the 2004 NCAA Division II Cross Country National Championships.

In addition to his duties as director of Athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, no one did it better in the GLVC than Hall. He was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular-season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns, and had a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after his appointment at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotional activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife Patti reside in Evansville and have four sons, Nathan, Garland, Ty, and Owen, and daughter, Mary Claire.

Since the first campus building (Wright Administration Building) opened in 1969, the face of the campus has continued to change, providing the most up-to-date facilities for academics, housing, and student life. Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

The Campus

The Nursing and Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, the Education Center, and the Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, the University Center, the Liberal Arts Center, the Technology Center, and the Business and Engineering Center, now under construction, form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation and Fitness Center, which is undergoing a substantial addition, are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,700 students who live on campus.

Academic Life

The University enrolls 10,126 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

Campus Life

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.



Residence Life

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

Financial Assistance

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.

Physical Activities Center

The newly renovated Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 28 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

The center court of the PAC has been the setting for many games of regional and national interest during the past 13 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI men's basketball team has a 368-64 home record since 1980, a .852 winning percentage.

In 2006-07, the PAC underwent renovations that included three new wood courts and a new center-court design that incorporated USI's athletic logo. The renovation also featured a new scoreboard and video board, new portable goals, and new seating. Among the changes to the seating were padded chairback seats and back-supported bleacher seats.

Situated on the banks of the Ohio River, Evansville is a mid-sized city that welcomes USI students and offers them plenty of things to do. Roberts Stadium and the Victory Theatre attract students to concerts by entertainers like Nelly, Aerosmith, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, and Josh Groban. Traveling Broadway shows and feature performances come to The Centre. Excitement high for Eagles in 2008-09

Excitement and expectations are high for the University of Southern Indiana men's basketball team as the squad begins another season as a top contender for the GLVC and Midwest Region championships.

The Screaming Eagles completed their 16th straight winning season last year, posting a 15-12 overall mark. Last year's winning record also was the 22nd positive finish to a campaign in the last 24 years, but the team fell short of advancing to the conference post-season.

The last 24 years have included 17 20-win seasons and 12 25-plus victory campaigns for the Eagles. USI also has appeared in 10 of the 11 GLVC tournaments since 1997-98 and 14 of the last 16 NCAA Division II tournaments since 1992-93.

USI Head Coach **Rick Herdes**, who has led the Eagles to 27 or more wins in four of the last five years, will have the job of meshing six returning players and nine newcomers in 2008-09. Herdes will have to replace 80 percent of the scoring and 62 percent of the rebounding from last year's team.

The squad will lean heavily on senior forward **Anthony Pimble**, the team's top returning scorer, and senior guard **Kenny Love**, who was redshirted last year after a knee injury. Pimble dropped in 11.4 points per game during his first season, while Love averaged 7.8 points per contest during his first season with the Eagles in 2006-07.

USI also will look for major contributions from three other returning players—junior forward/center **George Cunningham**, junior guard **Brent Owen**, and sophomore forward **Nick Duncheon**. Duncheon averaged 3.7 points and 1.2 rebounds per game during his first season, while Cunningham posted 3.1 points and 3.5 rebounds per contest.

Also returning after redshirting last year is junior forward **Brandon Carr**. Carr transferred to USI after averaging 13.1 points and 8.0 rebounds per appearance at the Community College of Baltimore County at Cantonville in 2006-07.

To solve the depth problem at guard that plagued the Eagles last season, Herdes has added four new players in the back court. Junior **Marvin Gray** and sophomore **Kevin**

Gant transfer from junior college ranks, while freshmen **Brandon Hogg** and **Levi Holscher** begin collegiate careers as Eagles.

Gray comes to USI after leading Indian River Community College to a 22-9 record and a number-five ranking in the Florida Junior College Athletic Association in 2007-08. He led the team with 14.7 points, 6.1 assists, and 3.1 steals per game, while also grabbing 4.2 rebounds per contest.

The Freeport, Bahamas, native also earned first team All-FJCAA Southern Conference honors for a second year in a row in 2007-08. He also was named All-State and All-Division both seasons, while receiving the 2008 Pioneer Pride Award (team's most valuable player) at the end of the year.

Overall in two years at IRCC, Gray averaged 14.5 points, 5.2 assists, 3.1 steals, and 4.1 rebounds per game. He also scored a two-year high 32 points against Broward Community College and dished out 12 assists against Santa Fe Community College this past season.

Gant returns to his Indiana roots after one season at Lake Michigan College in Benton Harbor, Michigan. He was selected for the

Western MCAA All-Stars after averaging eight points, 7.9 assists, and three steals per game. The 7.9 assists per game ranked sixth in the NJCAA, while the All-Western Division player set the Lake Michigan single-game (17) and single-season (229) records for assists.

Prior to attending Lake Michigan, Gant played for North Central High School in Indianapolis. He was an alternate for the Hoosier Basketball Top 40 in 2006-07 and tied for 20th in Indiana for assists per game.

Hogg will start his collegiate career after a successful four seasons at Edwardsville High School in Edwardsville, Illinois. A fourth team Illinois Basketball Coaches Association All-State selection, Hogg averaged 14.0 points, 8.1 assists, and 6.6 rebounds per game. His 8.1 assists per game led the St. Louis area in that statistical category.

Holscher was named the Vincennes Sun-Commercial Player of the Year and to the Evansville Courier & Press All-Southwestern Indiana team after averaging 18.2 points and 4.2 rebounds per game last year for South Knox High School. He finishes his career as the SKHS all-time leading scorer (1,296 career points) and all-time leader in steals (192).

In the front court, the Eagles will replace honorable mention All-American and first team All-GLVC Norman Plummer.

To ease the transition, USI has added three talented transfers from the junior college ranks in junior forwards **Brandon Russ**, **Tyrone Bradshaw**, and **Jeron Lewis** in addition to junior guard/forward **Isaac Stoll**.

Russ transfers to USI from St. Catherine College, where he was a first team All-Region and first team All-Tennessee Junior and Community College Athletic Association. The All-State and All-Division honoree averaged 16.1 points and 6.7 rebounds per game for the Patriots, who were 22-6 overall. He led the Western Division of the TJCCAA with an 11-5 record. Russ' 16.1 scoring average was 15th in the TJCCAA.

Bradshaw comes to USI from Southwestern Illinois College, where he averaged nine points, three rebounds, and a team-high 2.5 blocks per game. He also posted season-bests of 32 points against Lake Land College and seven rebounds against Highland Community College.

Lewis averaged 9.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per game at Northeastern Junior College (Sterling, Colorado), while shooting 60.4 percent from the field (122-202) in 2007-08. He started his collegiate career at Wabash Valley College (Mt. Carmel, Illinois), averaging 4.4 points and 2.9 rebounds per contest.

Stoll makes the switch from Division I baseball at Southeast Missouri State University to USI basketball. He has strong basketball roots, developed on the IHSAA class 3A state championship team at Washington High School. Stoll averaged 11.1 points and 7.9 rebounds per game during the championship season.

USI starts the 2008-09 regular season campaign in search of history as it plays in the Disney Division II Tip-Off Classic for the third time in four seasons. USI will try to win a tournament-record fourth championship in five appearances at the preseason tournament, which runs November 7-9.

USI will play Saint Martin University, Minnesota State University, and Bentley College in the three-day tournament.

Prior to playing in the Disney Classic, the Screaming Eagles will play an exhibition game against the University of Evansville November 1.



Senior forward Anthony Pimble (left) is a preseason All-American after averaging 11.4 points and 4.1 rebounds per game last season, while senior guard Kenny Love (right) is making it back from a knee injury that cost him the 2007-08 campaign. He averaged 7.8 points per game in 2006-07.

The Eagles last played the Aces in 2006, and will be completing a three-games-in-five-seasons contract that began in 2004.

The 2008-09 campaign also features 19 USI home contests beginning November 15 against Urbana University to start a six-game home-stand. The 19-game home schedule includes nine GLVC contests.

The second annual Bill Joergens Memorial Tournament is November 28-29. The Thanksgiving classic-style tournament features USI, Bellarmine University, Florida Southern College, and King College.

Sandwiched between the opener with Urbana and the Bill Joergens Memorial Tournament, the Eagles host Harris-Stowe State University on November 18; the University of Saint Francis on November 22; and Missouri Baptist University on November 24. USI finishes the non-conference schedule with Temple Baptist College December 13; Maryville College December 20; Tiffin University December 30; and Lake Erie College on January 26.

GLVC play begins on the road in 2008-09 when USI goes to Lewis University on December 4. The Eagles will ring in the New Year by starting the home-half of the GLVC Schedule against Saint Joseph's College on January 2.

A highlight of the conference home schedule is the "Battle for the Bridge" game between USI and Kentucky Wesleyan College on

January 15. USI has won the last four regular-season battles in the rivalry, including last season's 79-77 victory in Owensboro, Kentucky.

The GLVC West Division will be different this year with the move of Southern Illinois University Edwardsville to Division I. USI will host Drury University, which advanced to the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional last year, for the Eagles' homecoming game February 7.

Rick Herdes, Head Coach



Rick Herdes (Noble, Illinois) has USI basketball fans looking forward to each March. Herdes has steered the Screaming Eagles to five NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a 173-52 (.768) overall record during his seven years as head coach.

USI, under Herdes' direction both as a head coach and assistant, has reached the 20-win mark 15 times in 16 years and won 25 or more games five times in last seven season.

In 2006-07, Herdes was named the GLVC Coach of the Year after guiding the Eagles to a 29-6 overall record, 14-5 GLVC mark, and their second GLVC Tournament title in three seasons. The Eagles also captured the GLVC West Division crown for a third straight season and became the first team to win three Disney Division II Tip-Off Classic crowns.

Herdes' Eagles also advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament for the fifth consecutive season.

The 2005-06 version of Herdes' Screaming Eagles was 27-7 overall, tied for first in the GLVC West Division, won the Disney Division II Tip-Off Classic, and advanced to the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Region Final for the third time in four

seasons. He also directed the team to its 14th straight 20-win season and the fourth straight year with 25 or more wins.

In 2004-05, Herdes' Eagles won the program's first-ever GLVC Tournament championship and the ninth conference regular-season championship. USI's 17-game winning streak was the longest in the history of the program. The 18-2 league record is tied for first all-time in the history of the program and third all-time in the GLVC for victories in a year.

During 2003-04, Herdes directed the Screaming Eagles back to Division II's center stage as the NCAA II Elite Eight finalists and the Great Lakes Regional Champions. He was named the *Division II Bulletin* Coach of the Month for December when he led the Screaming Eagles to an 11-0 record and to the program's seventh NUMBER ONE ranking in 10 seasons. Herdes' Eagles also finished the season one win short of the school record with a 28-7 mark.

In his second season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Herdes took the Screaming Eagles back to the big dance and to within three-point range of the NCAA Division II Elite Eight.

Head Coach **Rick Herdes** has constantly been ranked in the top 10 of the winningest active coaches list since reaching the minimum five-year requirement. Herdes is second amongst NCAA II coaches in terms of winning percentage.

Herdes directed the Eagles to a 25-7 overall record, a 16-4 mark in the GLVC, and the Great Lakes Regional finals after defeating No. 1-ranked Michigan Tech University in the semifinals. The squad, which also boasted an honorable mention All-American, two All-Region performers, and three All-GLVC players, advanced in the Sweet 16 of the national tournament for the seventh time in nine seasons.

In his first season at the helm, Herdes had a record-tying year. The Eagles posted a 22-8 overall record, tying the USI record for wins by a first-year coach. He also led the Eagles to a fourth-place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a 14-6 mark, advancing to the semifinals of the league's post-season tournament.

Herdes had been with USI for nine seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach before being tapped for the top position in 2001. The native of Noble, Illinois, is widely known as one of the best recruiters and top coaches in Division II basketball. The Eagles' successes since Herdes' arrival reflect his abilities.

In his nine seasons as an assistant at USI, Herdes helped direct the Eagles to a 231-46 overall record (.833), the 1995 NCAA II National Championship, the 1994 NCAA II National Championship game, three Great Lakes Valley Conference championships, nine consecutive NCAA II Tournament appearances, and nine straight 20-win seasons. USI has averaged over 25 victories a season since 1993-94.

*Head Coach **Rick Herdes**, GLVC Coach of the Year in 2006-07 and the Division II Bulletin Coach of the Month for December 2003, has been a part of 531 victories during his collegiate coaching career.*

Herdes has had a hand in over half of the USI men's basketball program's 723 victories. He has helped the Eagles to 404 victories in 16 seasons with the USI men's basketball program.

In 2003-04, Herdes led the Screaming Eagles back to the NCAA II National Championship game for the first time in 10 years. He led the Eagles to their first-ever GLVC Tournament title in 2004-05 after winning the GLVC regular-season title with a conference mark of 18-2. USI also won the GLVC Tournament in 2006-07.

He has led the Eagles to three NCAA II Regional Championship games and five NCAA II Tournament appearances in seven years. He has averaged nearly 25 wins per year in his first seven seasons at the helm of the USI men's basketball program.

USI's point man on the recruiting trail, Herdes brought in nearly all of the key players who contributed to USI becoming a national power in Division II. Some of those key recruits were two-time NABC/NCAA Division II Player of the Year Stan Gouard, All-American and GLVC Player of the Year Chad Gilbert, Division II Bulletin All-American Jeremy Pearson, and 2001 first team All-American Derrick Lyons.

Herdes came to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 (.694) record and three NCAA Tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating recruiting and was the academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fundraising events.

In 22 collegiate basketball seasons, the programs Herdes has been involved with have a .776 winning percentage (531-153).

In 1991 and 1992 at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division. His 1992 team received the silver medal.

Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (Illinois) High School, where he worked for Ron Felling, a former Indiana University assistant coach. LHS was the Illinois Class A State

Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68-game winning streak. Herdes was inducted into the Illinois High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 1998.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education. As a player, he led Lincoln Trail College to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.

Herdes and his wife Sarah reside in Evansville with his daughter Taylor (16) and son Connor (13).

During Rick Herdes' 16-year association with USI, the Screaming Eagles have had 19 players enter the pro ranks.

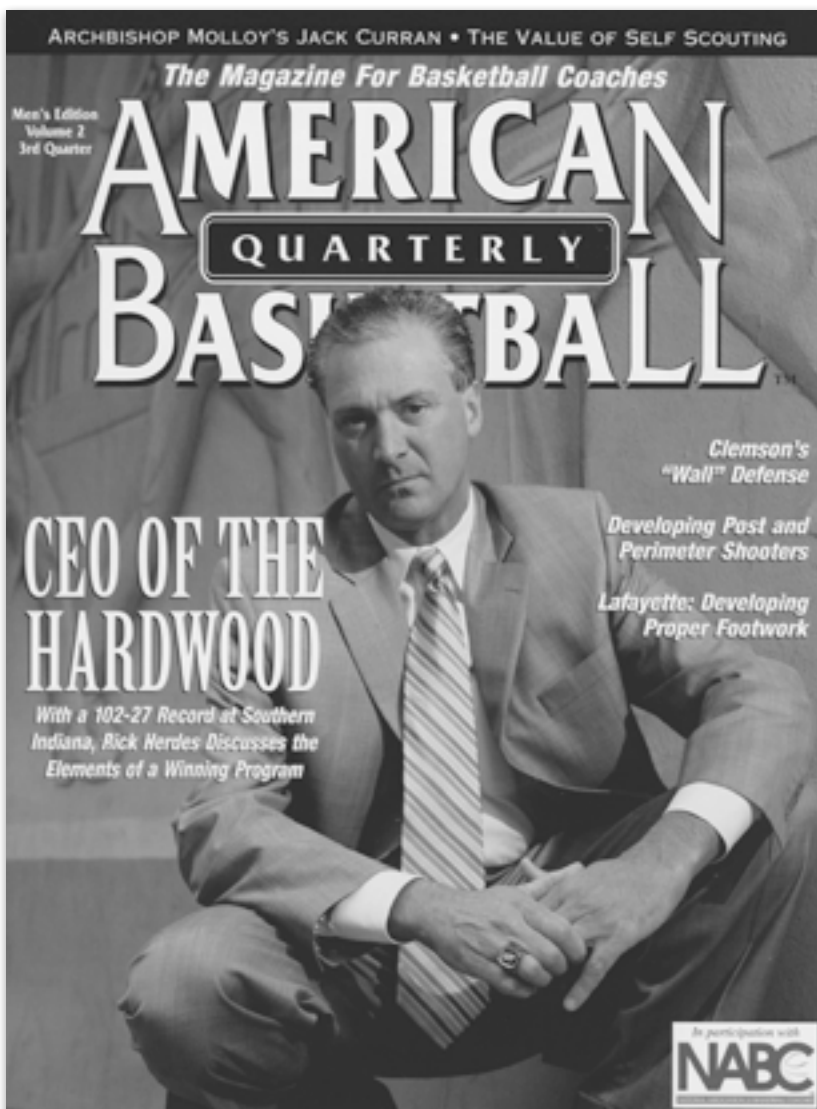

In the Spotlight



The University of Southern Indiana men's basketball team is consistently in the Evansville media spotlight. With Head Coach **Rick Herdes** at the helm, the Screaming Eagles also have been getting recognition on the national level.

Herdes has been featured in *American Basketball Quarterly*.

He was named the national coach of the month by the *Division II Bulletin* in December 2003 after leading the Eagles to an 11-0 start and the program's seventh NUMBER ONE ranking in 10 years.



On the local level, Herdes and the Eagles are covered by three television stations as well as multiple radio stations, including two that broadcast USI games over the airwaves and on the Internet. The Eagles, who are covered by numerous newspapers, also have their home games carried on the local cable system.

In 2007-08, the Eagles had a majority of their home games broadcast on television. Coach Herdes also has a local radio show as well as a weekly television show.

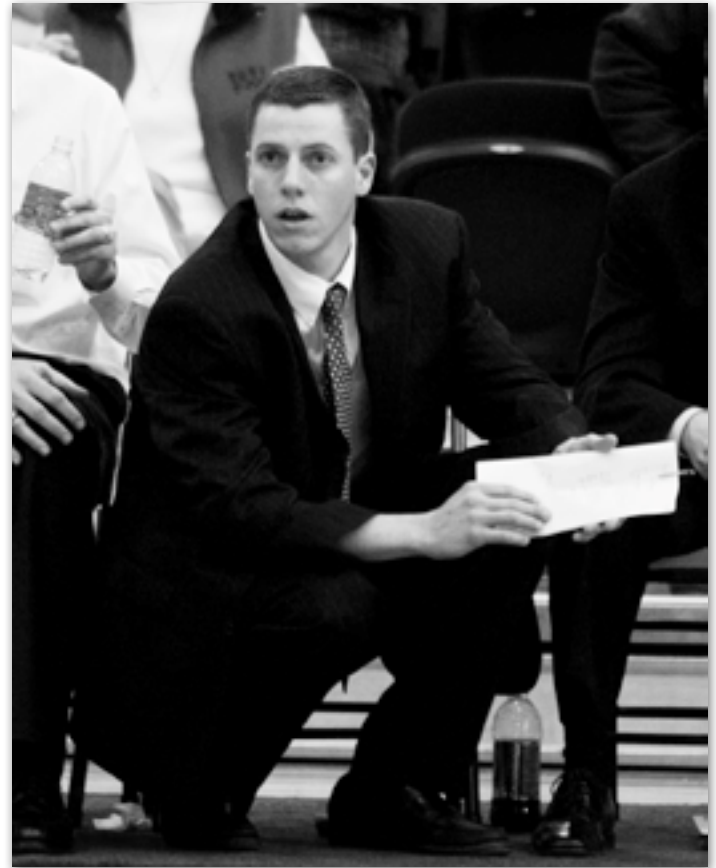

Soaring through years of success



During the last 28 years, the University of Southern Indiana men's basketball program has become a force in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, the Great Lakes Region, and at the national level.

Since the beginning of the GLVC in 1979, the Screaming Eagles have become one of the premier teams in the league, winning 12 regular-season titles in the GLVC. USI's teams also have featured four GLVC Coaches of the Year and six conference Players of the Year.



Starting with the 1992-93 USI team, the Eagles have made their mark on the Great Lakes Region and the NCAA Division II. USI has won 20 or more games 16 times in the last 17 years, including the last 15 seasons, and averaged more than 25 victories a year since 1993-94.

The Eagles stepped into the national spotlight in 1993-94 when they made their first trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight and the NCAA Division II Championship game.

The loss in the 1994 championship game propelled USI back into the NCAA Division II Championship game in 1995, and on to its first-ever national championship.



USI has been ranked number one nationally at one point during the season in eight of the last 14 years and has been to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16 nine times in the last 16 years.

• ABOUT the GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE •

The 13-member Great Lakes Valley Conference has made its name throughout the last 30 years as a power in NCAA Division II basketball. In the last few years, however, the GLVC has seen success in many sports, and the league can now claim itself as one of the nation's top in all NCAA Division II athletics.

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools - Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine and Indiana State University at Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana) - began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, the University of Indianapolis and Saint Joseph's College expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools - along with Ashland University - united to become the GLVC.

Since formulation of the conference, 11 schools have joined the league: Lewis University (1980), Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne (1984), Northern Kentucky University (1985), Kentucky State University (1989), Quincy University (1994), Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (1994), University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994), University of Missouri-St. Louis (1995), Drury (2005), Missouri S&T (2005), and Rockhurst (2005). Ashland and Kentucky State left the conference after the 1994 season, IPFW left the league following the 2000-01 academic year and SIU Edwardsville exited the league following the 2007-08 academic year.

The conference headquarters are located in downtown Indianapolis, one of the many Midwest major media markets in which the league maintains a presence. The GLVC has schools in Milwaukee/Northern Illinois (UW-Parkside), Chicago (Lewis), Indianapolis (Indianapolis), Cincinnati (Northern Kentucky), Louisville (Bellarmine), Evansville (Southern Indiana), Springfield, Mo. (Drury), Owensboro (Kentucky Wesleyan), Kansas City (Rockhurst) and St. Louis (UM-St. Louis).

The conference sponsors 17 championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, indoor and outdoor track and field, and tennis for men and basketball, cross country, softball, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, golf, and volleyball for women.

GLVC institutions have won 11 national championships in basketball. Kentucky Wesleyan leads all Division II institutions with eight men's basketball titles, while Southern Indiana won the men's crown in 1995 and finished as the runner-up in the 2004 tournament. Northern Kentucky's women won the school's first-ever basketball national championship in 2000 and followed with a national title in 2008. In addition, SIU Edwardsville became the first GLVC school to win a national championship in softball in 2007.

In 2001, the league announced the creation of the GLVC Hall of Fame, with the first class being inducted in 2002. The GLVC annually presents the Richard F. Scharf Paragon Award to the top male and female student-athlete in the league, and the Bertram Award to a distinguished alum who both succeeded while a GLVC student-athlete and excelled in accomplishments after graduation.

The GLVC strives to adhere to the NCAA Division II Strategic Platform and has introduced several initiatives in recent years including the GLVC Sportsmanship Award which was awarded to Northern Kentucky in 2007-08.

The league continually maintains an effort to combine academic and athletic excellence and the hard work put forth by the student-athletes has been evident on the playing fields and in the classrooms.
