HISTORIC COMMUNAL SOCIETIES CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN IOWA. The National Historic Communal Societies Association will hold its 11th annual Historic Communal Societies Conference at Amana, Iowa October 4- 7. The conference is co-sponsored by the Center for Communal Studies at ISUE. Speakers will address the religious, social, economic and architectural aspects of the communities of the Amana Inspirationists, Mormons, Swedes of Bishop Hill, French Icarians of Nauvoo, Illinois, and Germans of Bethel, Missouri. There will be tours of the seven Amana villages, a musical performance by an Amana choral group and Amana church services in English and German. Programs, registration forms and information on shared transportation are available in the Office of the Center for Communal Studies and from conference director Dr. Donald Pitzer in Room SC 173. One semester hour credit may be earned by registering for History 400 in conjunction with attending this conference.

CHILDREN'S ART FAIR AT THE ZOO. The 12th annual Children's Art Fair at the Zoo will be held Saturday, September 22, 1984 from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. at Mesker Zoo. This event is co-sponsored by the Evansville Arts & Education Council and Lazarus.

The fair will provide an opportunity for children to participate in a wide variety of hands-on arts activities, often using the animals surrounding them as inspiration. Activities will include painting, pottery, weaving, origami, puppet-making, instrument-making, straw painting, chalk murals, body tracing and many more. All activities are led by art teachers, artists and volunteers.

Materials, instruction and inspiration are provided free of charge. Regular Zoo admission fees--\$1.00 for children, \$2.00 for adults, free for children under two--will be in effect. In the event of rain, the fair will be Sunday, September 23 from noon until 4:00 p.m.

MESSAGE FROM THE PERSONNEL OFFICE. Employees of ISUE are now offered a choice of insurance companies: Blue Cross/Blue Shield or Maxicare of Indiana, Inc. The rates for the 1984-85 year are:

BLUE-CROSS/BLUE-SHIELD. Blue Cross/Blue Shield premium rates will be increased effective October 1, 1984. Staff members will continue to pay 25% of the premium and the University will contribute 75% of the cost. The new monthly rates for staff members with Blue Cross/Blue Shield coverage are:

Remember that October is open enrollment month for Blue Cross/Blue Shield health insurance. This enroll period is made available to all employees who have not previously enrolled themselves or their dependents in the program.

Those staff members who wish to take advantage of this opportunity should contact the Personnel Office. Coverage will become effective November 1, 1984, if the necessary forms are completed by Friday, October 19, 1984. A cash payment can be made for October coverage if the necessary forms are completed by October 1, 1984. Be sure to contact the Personnel Office before October 19, 1984, for open enrollment information.

MAXICARE. Effective October 1, 1984, the University will begin to offer health insurance coverage through a second insurance carrier, Maxicare of Indiana, Inc. University contributions to Maxicare will be based on the actual dollar contribution made by the University to Blue Cross/Blue Shield, unless the Maxicare premium is less than the University contribution.
