# 1998-99 Women's Basketball Outlook

Chancellor Dugan begins her eighth season as the head coach of Southern Indiana in competitive fashion. She will have to replace three starters and six letterwinners on a team which has gone 56-3 overall, 37-1 in GLVC play the last two seasons. The Eagles also won the first ever GLVC Tournament and hosted their first ever NCAA II Regional last year.

The class of 1998 won three GLVC titles (1995, 1997, 1998), had four consecutive berths in the NCAA Division II Tournament, an Elite Eight appearance in 1997, and was 100-16 in four years.

Senior point guard Adrienne Seitz (Otwell, Indiana), USI's all-time leader in assists, and senior center Cathy Tepool (Wadesville, Indiana) return to the USI starting line-up.

Seitz, who also will finish her career in the top five for steals, broke the USI career record for assists last year (371) and tied the single season record (153), which she set as a sophomore. She also is the USI leading returning scorer with 6.6 ppg.

Tepool, who battled a back injury over the entire 1997-98 season, had her best season as a Lady Eagle, averaging 5.4 ppg and 4.4 rpg.

In addition to the returning starters, Dugan returns seven letter-winners from last year's team.

Joining Seitz in the backcourt are junior guards Jennifer Donner (Wadesville, Indiana) and Mindy Gingerich (Kokomo, Indiana).

Donner improved upon her sophomore season, averaging 6.0 ppg and shot 40 percent from beyond the arc.

In the backcourt, Tepool can look for support from junior center Angi Lintker (Venedy, Illinois), sophomore center Stosha DeShaiser (Carrollton, Illinois), sophomore forward Liz Prewett (Washington, Indiana) and sophomore guard/forward Leah Mercer (Evansville, Indiana).

Lintker, who sat out 1997-98 with wrist surgery, averaged 6.2 ppg and 3.9 rpg as a sophomore when USI made its run at the national championship. She also had 24 blocks in 1996-97.

Maturing as her freshman season went along, DeShaiser is second only to Seitz in returning scorers, returning with 6.4 ppg. She also averaged 3.8 rpg last year.

To supplement the returning players, Dugan will rely on three redshirt freshmen to step in and contribute immediately. Moving onto the varsity roster this season are guards Gretchen Miles (Washington, Indiana), Shavon Sork (Fairfield, Illinois), and Rebecca Tichenor (Owensville, Indiana).

Sork was an Illinois Basketball Coaches Association All-Star, conference most-valuable player, first team All-Conference, and first team All-Area by the *Evansville Courier* as a senior in 1996-97 at Fairfield Community High School.



Miles led Washington High School to four Indiana semi-

state appearances and one appearance in the state finals. She was named the *Evansville Courier* Player-of-the-Year as a junior and as a senior, second team All-State her junior year, and first team All-State her senior year. Miles averaged 21.7 ppg and 8.2 assists as a senior, while hitting ten or more three pointers in a game four different times.

New faces on the squad this year are sophomore guards Natalie Glaser (Evansville, Indiana), Karrie Hochgesang (St. Anthony, Indiana) and freshman guard/forward Casey Hughes (Bicknell, Indiana).

Glaser, a transfer from St. Louis University, is a former area and Southern Indiana Athletic Conference (SIAC) Player-of-the-Year. She appeared in 23 games for SLU as a freshman and averaged 2.3 ppg and 1.3 rpg.

Hochesang, a transfer from the University of Indianapolis, averaged 7.5 ppg and 2.3 rpg as a freshman last year for the Greyhounds.

Hughes, who played for North Knox High School last year, averaged 22.8 ppg, 7.0 rpg, and 3.7 assists as a senior. She also was named first team All-State, *Vincennes Sun-Commercial* All-Area and Player-of-the-Year, and *Evansville Courier* first team All-Southwestern Indiana.

Dugan and the Eagles face an ambitious schedule. The squad will open the season with last year's number one ranked College of St. Rose (New York), before heading south to play in Disney's Division II Tip-Off Classic in Orlando, Florida.

When the team returns to the midwest, the season's calendar will include 22 Great Lakes Valley Conference games, non-conference games with the University of Tampa, and Truman State University, before the second annual GLVC Tournament.





After seven seasons, Chancellor Dugan is one of the top coaches in Division II.

Last year, Dugan directed the Eagles to a number one national ranking for six weeks, a 26-2 record, and a second consecutive Great Lakes Valley Conference title going 17-1. The Eagles also won the first-

ever GLVC Tournament Championship and made their fourth straight appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

For her efforts, she was named the GLVC Coach-of-the-Year for the second straight season.

In 1997, Dugan's Eagles had their best season ever with their first trip to the Elite Eight and the NCAA II Finals. The Lady Eagles stormed to a 30-2 overall record, winning 29 straight. They compiled a school record 20-0 GLVC mark to win their second GLVC Championship in three seasons. With the GLVC title came USI's third consecutive trip to the NCAA Division II Tournament, its first Great Lakes Regional Championship, and first trip to the national championship game.

Success in the 1996-97 season earned Dugan Coach-of-the-Year honors in the WBCA District 4 and in the GLVC.

At USI, Dugan ranks first in games won (140) and winning percentage (.700, 140-61). A key is the mental discipline she imparts to the players, which makes them strong down

the stretch. In the last four years, Dugan's teams have been 38-8 (.826) in February and March.

In 1995-96, Dugan led USI to a second consecutive berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament with a 22-7 overall record and a second place finish in the GLVC at 16-4. Dugan and the squad, who fought all season for respect, climbed in the regional rankings late in the year and went 7-1 in the final eight games to reach the national tournament.

# Before and After Coach Chancellor Dugan

### **Before**

- USI had a school record of 16 wins in a season and had never won 20 games.
- USI had never won a GLVC Championship and never appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament.
- Three years prior to Dugan (1988-91), USI had finished last in the GLVC and had an overall record of 11-72 (.153).
- USI had six seasons with a .500 or better record in 16 seasons.
- USI never had a player named to the first team All GLVC.

### After

- USI won a school record 30 games in 1996-97 and has had four consecutive seasons of 22+ wins.
- USI has won three GLVC titles and appeared in the NCAA II
   Tournament in four consecutive seasons since 1994-95. The Lady Eagles won the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional and finished as the NCAA II Finalist in 1997.
- Since Dugan's arrival, the Eagles have finished in the upper division of the league each year since 1992-93 and won league championships in 1995, 1997, and 1998. USI is also 140-61 (.700).
- USI has compiled a .500 or better record in six consecutive seasons
- Since 1991-92, USI has had three first team All Americans (LeAnn Freeland is a three-time All American), four GLVC Players of the Year (Freeland twice), and three first team All-GLVC performers.

In 1994-95, Dugan, who is also an assistant athletic director, led the Lady Eagles to a series of firsts. Dugan's squad had the best record in school history (22-5); made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament; claimed their first GLVC title; ranked in the NCAA top-20; and had a 16-game winning streak, 15 of the games coming from the 1994-95 season. During the regular season, the team was nationally ranked as high as third.

With the winning streak, Dugan has succeeded in a complete turn-around of the program since she took over the helm in 1991-92.


Under Dugan's direction in 1993-94, the Lady Eagles set a school record for wins in a season (17) and a school record for wins in the GLVC (12). In 1993-94 Dugan led the team to a third-place finish in the GLVC, the highest ever by a USI women's team.

In her second season Dugan led the women's program into the upper division of the GLVC. In 1992-93 she coached the Eagles to a school-record nine wins in the GLVC and fell one game short of tying the school record for wins in a season, with 15 victories. The first season, Dugan led the women's basketball team to an 8-20 record, which was more wins than the previous two years combined.

The hard-working, enthusiastic Dugan, a native of Louisville, Kentucky, graduated from Eastern Kentucky University in 1982 with a bachelor's in physical education. She received a mas-



ter's in physical education in 1989 from Morehead State University. While an undergraduate at EKU, Dugan was a three-year starter and finished her junior and senior years as the team's leading rebounder and second-leading scorer.



Assistant Coach

Assistant Coach Rick Stein has been with Coach Dugan and the USI women's basketball program for seven seasons. Stein is responsible for assisting with on-the-floor coaching,

individual player assessment, and game scouting.

In addition to his duties on the court, Stein teaches physical activity classes in the Physical Education Department and manages the recently-renovated PAC weight room.

Stein graduated from USI in 1992 with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and is working toward a Master of Liberal Studies. He also holds an associate degree from Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois.

He began his tenure under Coach Dugan as a graduate assistant coach in the 1991-92 season.

Stein played two seasons for the USI Screaming Eagles and helped earn a berth in the NCAA II South Central Regional in 1991. At Parkland, Stein was a member of the 1988 NJCAA Division II runner-up and 1989 fourth-place teams.

Stein, a native of Crete, Illinois, and his wife Kari have a son Alex.




# Assistant Coach SHANNON LITTON
