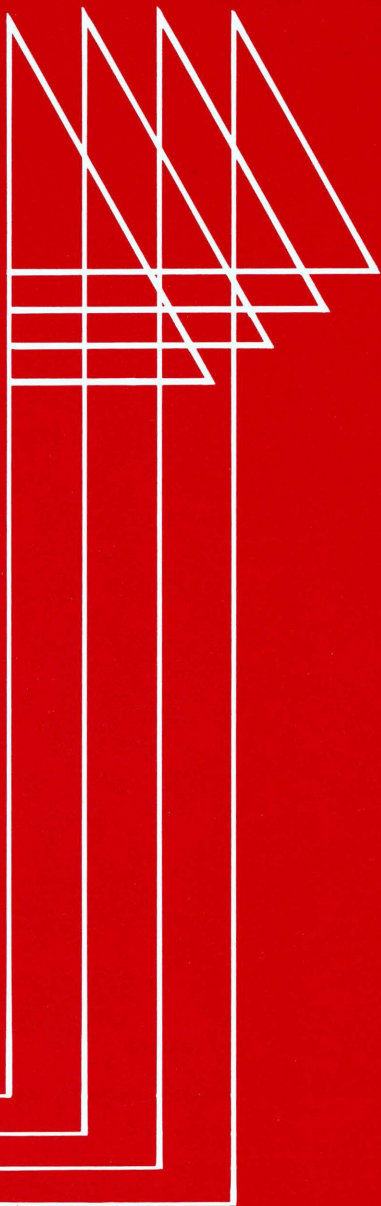

Provost Ann Reynolds to Deliver Address



The Commencement address today will be delivered by Wynetka Ann Reynolds, Provost of Ohio State University, who has distinguished herself as an educator, researcher and university administrator.

When named provost in 1979, Dr. Reynolds became the first woman to serve as the chief academic officer of Ohio State. In addition to her duties as provost, Dr. Reynolds is president of the board of directors of the Ohio State University Research Foundation and holds joint appointments as professor in the department of anatomy and in the department of obstetrics and gynecology.

A well-known zoologist and anatomist, Dr. Reynolds has conducted research on several topics including diabetes research and the effect of chemical substances during pregnancy and infancy. She is the author or coauthor of more than 100 scholarly works related to her research and has received several grants as principal investigator for research projects.

Prior to her appointment at Ohio State, Dr. Reynolds was associate vice chancellor for research and dean of the Graduate College of the University of Illinois at the Medical Center in Chicago. She held appointments there as professor of anatomy and research professor of obstetrics and gynecology. She also was

associate dean for academic affairs in the College of Medicine.

A member of the University of Illinois Medical Center faculty since 1965, she also served on the faculty of Ball State University from 1962 to 1965.

A former Woodrow Wilson fellow, Dr. Reynolds received a Bachelor of Science degree in biology and chemistry from Kansas State Teachers College. She was awarded the Master of Science and the Doctor of Philosophy degrees, both in zoology, by the State University of Iowa.

She is a member of numerous professional organizations and a past president of the Perinatal Research Society. She has served as a consultant to state government and in 1977 was selected as an associate fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. Dr. Reynolds is active on committees of the National Academy of Sciences and National Institutes of Health.

A native of Kansas, Dr. Reynolds and her husband Rex Reynolds, Jr. are the parents of two children.

She will receive the honorary Doctor of Science degree in today's ceremony.

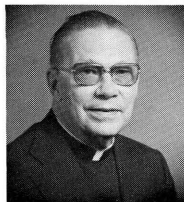
Scholarship Honors

Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.

Three Receive Highest Recognition

Three Evansville area leaders will be recognized for their outstanding community achievements in today's ceremony. Honorary doctorate degrees will be conferred on Monsignor Thomas James Clarke, Roderic Malcolm Koch, and Charles Wayne Worthington. The Commencement speaker, Dr. W. Ann Reynolds, will also receive an honorary degree.

Monsignor Thomas James Clarke served at the center of Diocesan authority in Evansville for more than a quarter of a century. As the first chancellor of the newly-created Evansville Diocese, he assumed a myriad of roles for the church from January, 1945 until November, 1970.

During that 25-year period, in addition to serving as chancellor, he was presiding judge of the matrimonial court, chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital, pastor of Sacred Heart Church, rector of Holy Trinity Church, director of the council of Catholic nurses, director of all Diocesan internal operations, and chairman of the Diocesan insurance commission, an organization which consolidated and managed all Diocesan properties. His leadership as chairman of the insurance commission resulted in Diocesan properties being among the first contributions to the Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., community effort to secure real estate for the Mid-America University Center and Indiana State University Evansville.

Monsignor Clarke has devoted his life to his church and to the development of the Evansville Diocese. Educated at St. Meinrad Seminary, he was ordained into the priesthood in 1934 and came to Evansville as assistant pastor at St. Anthony's Church. He left Evansville to pursue his studies at Catholic University in Washington, D.C., where he received his masters and doctorate in canon law. On completion of his studies in 1943, he was made a judge and notary in the marriage tribunal and returned to pastoral duties at St. Anthony's.

The prelate began to reduce his responsibilities in 1970 and formally retired in 1973. Monsignor Clarke will receive the honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree.



Roderic Malcolm Koch

The name of Roderic Malcolm Koch is synonymous with the development of cultural opportunities in Evansville. Mr. Koch, executive vice president of George Koch Sons, Inc., and an officer of several locally-based corporations, has devoted much of his energy to shaping Evansville's cultural dimension.

He was one of a group of dedicated citizens in the 1950's who worked to secure the funds, design, and build the Evansville Museum of Arts and Sciences in Sunset Park. One of the few museums built in recent years without government grants, it is a gift to the people of Evansville by the people of Evansville. Mr. Koch, who also was instrumental in acquiring the Museum Train, has been a director and member of the Museum since 1945 and still serves on its executive board.

Many other organizations have benefited from his active involvement. He is president of the Indiana Foundation for the Arts and Science, chairman of the board of the Santa Claus Samaritans Foundation, a director of the Salvation Army, member of the ISUE Foundation Century Club, and a life member of the Conrad Baker Foundation, Deaconess Hospital Foundation, Vanderburgh Humane Society, and Wesselman Park Nature Center.

Mr. Koch is a Central High School graduate who attended the University of Wisconsin and graduated from the University of Evansville. He has been selected for biographical listings in such publications as *Leaders in American Science, Who's Who in Finance and Industry, Who's Who in the World, Men of Achievement*, and the *International Book and Who's Who*. Mr. Koch and his wife Loretta have one daughter. He will receive the honorary Doctor of Humanities degree in today's ceremony.



Charles Wayne Worthington

Charles Wayne Worthington is recognized as one of Evansville's most dedicated civic and business leaders. As president and chairman of the board of the 130-year-old National City Bank, he guides an institution that has grown from assets of \$16 million to more than \$200 million in his 39 years of association with the bank.

His career at National City Bank began in 1941 when he started as a messenger. He advanced steadily in the ensuing years from manager of the bookkeeping department to assistant auditor, assistant cashier, cashier, vice president, and senior vice president. He was elected to the board of directors in 1966 and became executive vice president a year later. He moved up to president and chief administrative officer in 1972, was elected chairman and chief executive officer in 1975, and became president and chairman of the board in 1978. His expertise in banking matters led to his election as president of the Indiana Bankers Association in 1979.

Mr. Worthington's interests in the Evansville community have not been limited to banking. He serves on the board of directors of the ISUE Foundation and currently is chairman of the ISUE Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building fund drive. He is also vice president and treasurer of the *Evansville Courier*, a trustee of the University of Evansville, past president of the East Side Kiwanis, past president and treasurer of Evansville Little League, and a member of the Scottish Rite and Hadi Shrine.

A graduate of the Graduate School of Banking at the University of Wisconsin, Mr. Worthington and his wife Betty are the parents of three children. He will receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree in the ceremony today.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.
