## BERTRAM APPOINTED ACTING EDUCATION CHAIRMAN

*Charles J. Bertram*, Assistant Professor of Mathematics, has been appointed Acting Chairman of the Division of Education. He will fill the position recently vacated by Ted DeVries, who resigned to accept the presidency of Valley City State College in North Dakota.

*Dr. Bertram*, a member of the ISUE faculty since 1969, has experience in working in all phases of teacher education for elementary mathematics teachers including pre-science and in-service work, demonstration classes, and clinical techniques. He has worked as a consultant for secondary and elementary school programs in mathematics in the tri-state area. *Dr. Bertram* has served as President, President-elect, Vice-President, and Treasurer of the Indiana Council of Teachers of Mathematics. He also has served on the State Mathematics Advisory Committee appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.
