ELIZABETHAN DINNERS BROADCAST. "An Elizabethan Christmas Celebration," a half-hour television special featuring the Mid-America Singers of Indiana State University Evansville, will be broadcast nationwide by the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS).

In Evansville, Channel 9 (WNIN) will broadcast the Elizabethan Dinners, produced in December 1976, on Thursday, December 15 at 7:30 p.m. and on Friday, December 23 at 8:30 p.m.

Under the direction of DR. JON CARLSON, Director of Music, the dinner is an authentic reproduction of the madrigals in Elizabethan England. The colorful special includes authentic songs and dances of the Elizabethan era and centers around elaborate processions and a feast which includes roast boar's head, wassil, and flaming pudding.

This program is the first that WNIN has submitted to PBS for consideration.
