1998 Women's Soccer Outlook

In the first two seasons, the University of Southern Indiana women's soccer program earned the respect of the teams in the region. Now USI is ready to take its place as a regional power.

In 1997, the Screaming Eagles had the first winning season, finishing with a 13-6 overall record, 5-4 Great Lakes Valley Conference. USI also qualified for the GLVC Tournament for the second consecutive season and finished tied for third.

In two seasons, USI is 20-15-1 overall.

This year, the Eagles will be hoping to take the next step -- a shot at the GLVC title and an NCAA Division II Tournament berth.

Directing the Eagles will be third-year head coach **Greg Stone**. Stone, who is 123-38-5 in ten years as a collegiate coach, has nine starters and 16 players returning for this season.

USI is led by four All-GLVC players up the middle of the field in sophomore forward **Stephanie Minor** (Evansville, Indiana), junior midfielder **Megan Russell** (Evansville, Indiana), junior back **Anne Bristol** (Marietta, Georgia), and junior goalkeeper **Angie Gries** (Evansville, Indiana).

Minor, who also was second team All-Region, led the Eagles and ranked tenth in scoring with 26 points on ten goals and six assists in the GLVC. The GLVC Freshman of the Year also was named the GLVC Player of the Week on October 20 after scoring three goals and handing out two assists in wins over Bellarmine College and Kentucky Wesleyan College.

Russell, who also played some at forward, was second on the team in scoring with 22 points on seven goals and eight assists. Combined with 16 points from her freshman season, she is USI all-time scorer after two seasons with 38 points on 14 goals and 10 assists.

Bristol, who was named to the All-GLVC for the second consecutive season, led the team's defense which had a goals against average (GAA) of 0.89, tops in the GLVC.

Between the posts is the leagues top goalkeeper in Gries. She had a 0.57 GAA in 788 minutes between the posts as a sophomore, stopping 30 of 35 shots in 13 games.

USI's middle four would not have been as successful as they were without help from a supporting cast.

Coming back for her third season is utility player Kristy Weber (Lawrenceburg, Indiana), a junior who played as a back, midfielder, and forward during different parts of the season. Weber was third on the team in scoring with 17 points on seven goals and three assists.

In addition to Minor's 26 points at forward, USI returns 30 more points. Senior forward **Liz Lawrence** (Evansville, Indiana) and junior forward **Laura Preske** (Evansville, Indiana) had ten points each on four goals and two assists.

Sophomore forward **Kelly Lewis** (Newburgh, Indiana) had five points as freshmen with two goals and an assist.

The most stable position for the Eagles in the first two seasons has been the midfield. Along with the

play of Russell, USI has had great leadership from senior midfielder **Jessica Pigman** (Evansville, Indiana). Pigman, who has been a team captain along with Russell, had nine points as a junior on three goals and three assists.

Russell and Pigman are joined in the middle by junior **Kristi Butler** (Evansville, Indiana), who had seven points on two goals and three assists; junior **Danielle Galligan** (Downers Grove, Illinois), who had two points on a goal; and sophomore **Megan Ehlers** (Loveland, Ohio), who had six points on a goal and four assists.

Ehlers was a surprise as a freshman, starting 18 of 19 games for the Eagles.

In the backfield, USI will have Bristol returning, but will have to replace two-year starter Julie Houser and part-time starter Missy Elpers.

Bristol will combine with sophomores **Amy Henkhaus** (Edwardsville, Illinois), **Krista Weinzapfel** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), and **Andrea Barchet** (Evansville, Indiana).

Henkhaus, who developed into a top-notch defender in the backfield before encountering injuries late in the season, played in 18 of the 19 matches with 17 starts. Weinzapfel played in 17 matches with nine starts and had an assist.

Barchet, who also saw action in the midfield, played in 18 matches and had a goal.

In goal, the Eagles are solid with two starters in Gries and sophomore goalkeeper **Heather Heseman** (Evansville, Indiana). Heseman, split time with Gries, played in 15 matches, 10 starts with a 1.15 GAA.

To supplement the returning players, Stone has added three freshmen players to the roster.

From Missouri, the Eagles add forward **Kristen Light** (Florissant, Missouri), who comes to USI from Rosary High School, and midfielder **Jenny**

Wessel (St. Louis, Missouri), who played for Ursuline Academy and the Busch Soccer Club in St. Louis.

From the tri-state area, **Kayla Schuller** (Evansville, Indiana), a midfielder, joins the team after playing for Reitz High School in Evansville last year.

Greg Stone

Women's Soccer Head Coach



Greg Stone, the first head coach of the USI women's varsity soccer team, has started his tenure at USI by attracting regional and national attention.

Last season, Stone directed the team to its first winning season finishing 13-6-0 overall, 5-4 GLVC. The Screaming Eagles completed the conference regular season in fifth place, but finished tied for third in the GLVC Tournament.

In the team's and his first season, Stone led the Screaming Eagles to a top 25 national ranking and a berth in the Great Lakes Valley Conference tournament. He directed the Eagles to a 7-9-1 overall record, 2-6-1 GLVC.

Stone came to USI from Anderson College in Anderson, South Carolina, where he was the women's soccer head coach since 1988. Under Stone the women's program, which was started on a one-year trial basis in 1988, registered a 103-23-4 record, three straight Region 10 championships, and three national tournament appearances in eight seasons.

The team reached the 1990 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA)

Tournament. During the next three years, the team finished with one third-place and two fourth-place finishes in the NJCAA tournament. Stone was named the Region 10 Coach of the Year in 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, and the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Umbro East Regional Coach of the Year in 1992.

In 1995, Stone helped the Anderson program make the transition from junior college status to competition as a four-year institution in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. Anderson won the National Christian Collegiate Athletic Association national championship year.

While at Anderson, Stone also was the assistant men's soccer coach and a part of the Olympic Development Program in South Carolina from 1988 to 1994.

Stone, a native of Miami, Florida, graduated from Erskine College in Due West, South Carolina, in 1988 with a degree in physical education. While at Erskine, Stone was the men's soccer co-captain and was selected to the All-District team.

1998 Men's Soccer Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana men's soccer team wants to surprise its opponents in 1998.

The University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles have won more GLVC soccer titles than any other school, nine since 1979. Since returning to Division II in 1995, the Eagles have not been able to put together the seasons they had 1980-84 and 1988-91.

The Eagles are under the direction of third-year head coach, **Scott Westbrook**, who has a career record of 115-107-19 in 13 years as a head coach.

Westbrook has a solid corps of players. Five players return from the starting line-up and four additional letter winners, who started games throughout the season.

Senior midfielder **Rich Curran** (Arnold, Missouri) and sophomore forward **Derek Stull** (Ballwin, Missouri) lead the way offensively. Curran is USI's top returning scorer with eight points on three goals and two assists, while Stull was voted one of the co-captains during spring practice and had four points on two goals.

In the defensive third, the squad is led by senior backs **Brian Cordia** (St. Louis, Missouri) and **Jon Long** (St. Louis, Missouri) and sophomore goalkeeper **Nick Mirth** (Florissant, Missouri).

Cordia holds the other co-captain position and played in all 18 matches a year ago at outside back. Long, who also did not miss a match last season, showed brilliance at times as the sweeper.

Mirth, who started 17 matches as a freshman, should show some maturity this season after

suffering through growing pains as a freshman. He had a 2.33 GAA in 1,354 minutes between the post.

Contending for the remaining starting positions are junior **Chris Jones** (Leonardtown, Maryland) and sophomore **Tom Peroutka** (St. Louis, Missouri) at forward; sophomores **B.J. Babb** (Evansville, Indiana), **Jason Kadar** (Charleston, Illinois), **Ryan Tucker** (Greenwood, Indiana) in the midfield; and junior **Brandon Robards** (Evansville, Indiana) in the back.

Jones, who also saw action at forward, played 14 games and had seven points on three goals and an assist. Peroutka would have made an impact as a freshman, but an injury cut his season short after the fourth game.

Babb and Kadar saw their playing time increase through 1997 as they adapted to Coach Westbrook's system. Tucker sat out 1997 as a redshirt after seeing action in 18 matches in 1996.

Robards, after playing sparingly as a freshman, showed steady improvement throughout 1997 and could push for one of the starting slots in the back.

With the end of the 1997 season, USI lost leading scorer Sam Jenkins from the midfield and four-year starter Les Meenan from the backfield. To replace them, Westbrook has brought in ten players, the largest recruiting class since his arrival at USI.

In the offensive third of the field, senior **Jamelle McCreary** (Ballwin, Missouri) and junior **Jason Steinmetz** (Florissant, Missouri) enter their first year as forwards with USI.

McCreary, a transfer from the University of

Evansville, played in 18 matches a year ago and had one goal off the bench. Jason Steinmetz transferred to USI from Florissant Valley Community College where he played the last two seasons.

In the middle, USI will add three new players in sophomore **Jason Embry** (Evansville, Indiana); junior **Matt Steinmetz** (Florissant, Missouri); and freshman **Ed Pieper** (St. Louis, Missouri).

Embry joins the team after spending four years in the military before entering college, while Matt Steinmetz joins his brother Jason in transferring from FVCC. Pieper joins fellow Vianney High School graduates Stull and Peroutka on the team.

In the defensive third, USI will bolster the backfield with four backs and a goalkeeper.

Returning to the squad after redshirting last year are freshmen **Adam York** (Carmel, Indiana) and **Justin Wilson** (Washington, Indiana). They will be joined by newcomers **Scott Lund** (Rock Island, Illinois), a 6-4 freshman, and **Dax Nightingale**, a junior transfer from San Jacinto Junior College.

Between the posts the Eagles will add freshman **Matt Miller** (Danville, Illinois).

The Eagles need consistency in the defensive third of the field, maintaining possession of the ball to be successful in 1998. Of the 12 losses a year ago, seven had a margin of two or fewer goals.

Scott Westbrook is at the helm of the Screaming Eagles men's soccer team for a third season.

Westbrook, who has a 115-107-18 career record in 13 seasons as a college head coach, began coaching in 1985 at Lindenwood College in St. Charles, Missouri. He led them to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics playoffs in 1985 and 1987. Westbrook was named the Show Me Conference Coach of the Year in 1987.

In 1989, Westbrook moved to St. Louis and took over the soccer team at Fontbonne College. During his tenure at Fontbonne, he led the squad into post-season play in 1989, 1990, 1991, and 1992, reaching the NCAA Division II Regional finals in 1991 and 1992.

In addition to the team's success, Westbrook was named the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1990, 1991, and 1992, and the Gatorade Mid-West Regional Coach of the Year in 1991.

Westbrook coached at the University of Arkansas-Little Rock in 1994 and 1995. Along with his coaching duties, Westbrook was the assistant compliance coordinator at UA-LR.

Westbrook earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Evansville in 1982 and a master's degree in business administration from Fontbonne in 1994. While at Evansville, he led the Aces to their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I tournament, was named to the All-Mideast Region team, and was selected for the Senior Bowl in 1982.

Following his graduation from Evansville, Westbrook played professionally between 1983 and 1985, in the indoor and outdoor leagues. He was selected 21st overall in the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) draft by the Wichita Wings in 1983 and was the team Rookie of the Year for the Detroit Express of the American Soccer League (ASL).

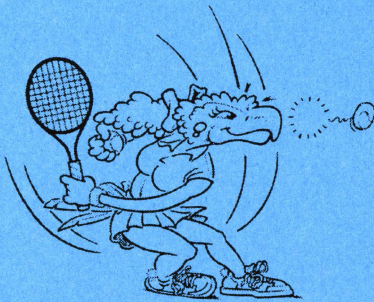

1998 Men's and Women's Cross Country Outlook

The fall of 1998 will mark the beginning of a new era for men's cross-country at the University of Southern Indiana. Mike Hillyard will add the men's program to his list of duties, taking over for retired coach Bill Stegemoller. Hillyard has already brought the women's program into the national spotlight, and hopes to keep the men in the same position.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Hillyard could not have asked for a better 1997 season. The USI women's cross country Eagles started a banner season with a bang by winning the USI Classic. From that victory, they never slowed down.

The 1997 season contained numerous highlights--a first place finish in the USI Invitational, the Indiana Intercollegiate "Little State" title for the fourth year in a row, a second place finish in the SIU Saluki Invitational, and a second place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference Championships.

The biggest achievement of the 1997 season, though, was receiving a berth in the NCAA II National Championships and finishing 12th. The team also finished the year with second highest grade point average in the nation, at 3.86.

Improving upon last season's finish will be tough with the loss of two important members of the roster, Tess Harden and Crissy Carlson. Harden finished her career being named to the Academic All-GLVC three times, while Carlson was a two-time All-GLVC, Academic All-GLVC, and an Academic All-American performer. Carlson's best race of the 1997 season was

finishing third in the USI Classic.

Although replacing these two key performers will be tough, it will be possible. USI and Hillyard have several candidates to fill the void left by Carlson and Harden.

Senior **Christy Moore** (Nashville, Indiana), an Academic All-American, was a strong runner finishing first overall in the USI Invitational. Junior **Nicole Shepler** (Fishers, Indiana) had a great sophomore season placing in USI's top three in each meet and having the team's top finish in the NCAA II National Championships, placing 35th.

Coach Hillyard is excited about the upcoming cross country year, and his expectations are high. "In 1997, we just wanted to compete in the nationals. Now we would like to finish in the top four," said Hillyard. In addition to the goal of returning to the nationals, Hillyard feels his team can win the Great Lakes Valley Conference and NCAA II Great Lakes Region titles.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Hillyard hopes to carry on the tradition of excellence that retiring coach Bill Stegemoller has maintained since the program's inception in 1978. Gone is Elly Rono, the 1997 Division II National Champion, and Chad Smith, a three-time all-conference performer.

Although those three key loses would be enough to set most programs back a couple of years, USI looks to reload and shoot back to the top of the GLVC.

Senior All-American **Jason Heile** (Moores Hill, Indiana) will be looked to as a team

leader in the upcoming 1998 season. Heile finished in the top ten in the USI Classic and the GLVC Championships, while placing 36th in the NCAA II National Championships. Junior **Ben Kapsoiya** (Chebiemit, Kenya) should be a runner to watch as well, finishing ninth in the USI Invitational and 21st in the GLVC Championships.

Sophomores **Matt Krack** (Evansville, Indiana) and **Jon Jacob** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana) look to contribute, but they will be challenged by a large and talented freshman

Mike Hillyard **Men's and Women's Cross Country Coach**

Mike Hillyard has led the USI women's cross country team into the national spotlight in just his second season. In 1997, he led the Eagles to their first-ever birth and 12th place finish in the NCAA Division II National Championship.

In addition to moving up among the national leaders, Hillyard directed the Eagles to a fourth consecutive Indiana Intercollegiate "Little State" championship, a second place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, and a fourth place finish in the NCAA II Regional.

In his first season with the women's program, Hillyard led the Eagles to a third place finish in the GLVC and an eighth place finish in the NCAA II Regional. The highlight of the season was a first place finish in the USI Classic and the Indiana Intercollegiate Little State.

With such admirable credentials with the women's program, Hillyard has been chosen to continue the men's tradition-rich program

class for positions five through seven.

Among the team's goals are a GLVC championship, a Great Lakes Region championship, and a top four team finish at the NCAA II championships in Lawrence, Kansas.

While under the tutelage of coach Stegemoller, Hillyard excelled, earning All-American status in track and field with his fifth place finish in the steeplechase at the 1992 NCAA Division II Championships. Hillyard finished 34th in the 1991 NCAA Division II Cross Country Nationals. A native of Norris City, Illinois, Hillyard graduated from USI in 1994.

1998-99 Men's and Women's Golf Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana men's and women's golf teams are becoming one of the most reputable programs in the Midwest.

USI Head Coach Jim Brown has been at the helm of the Screaming Eagles men's team since its creation in 1977 and the women's team since it started in 1995.

MEN'S GOLF

Last year, the USI men's program made its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Division II North Regional in 1998 and placed ninth in the rain-shortened event. The best finish at the regional was third in 1996 when the team advanced to the national championship round.

At the 1997 Great Lakes Valley Conference Championships, the Eagles continued to be one of the top upper-division teams with a second place finish.

Entering this fall, USI will begin the year with a veteran group, returning nine players.

USI will be led in to the 1998-99 season by senior **Chris Holstein** (Rockport, Indiana), who had a 76.5 average last year. Holstein led the Eagles with a 77.9 average during the spring and was named All-District IV.

The Eagles also return two of the top five finishers at last fall's conference meet in senior **Chris Compton** (Evansville, Indiana) and freshman **Mark Franklin** (Clayton, Indiana).

Franklin, who was named the GLVC Freshman of the Year for his efforts at the league tournament, was fourth at the GLVC Championship and led the team last fall with a 74.3 average. Compton placed fifth in the league tournament.

Franklin followed Holstein in the season ending

scoring averages with a 77.0 Compton was close behind with a 77.8, while freshman **Matt Scheessele** (Evansville, Indiana) also had a 77.8; and **Brad Burvan** (Rensselaer, Indiana), 79.7. As a team, USI averaged 307.9, 299.3 in the fall and 313.8 in the spring.

Holstein and Scheessele joined Franklin and Compton on the All-GLVC teams last spring.

Also returning this fall are sophomores **Aaron Ashley** (Boonville, Indiana), **Nick Beckort** (Rockport, Indiana), **Steve Stenger** (Bedford, Indiana), and **Travis Turpin** (Sullivan, Indiana). All four saw action last season.

Turpin joined Franklin Burvan on the Academic All-GLVC team.

To strengthen the squad, the Eagles will enlist the talents of seven freshmen in 1998-99. USI has added **David Carter** (Fairfield, Illinois); **Donavon Crews** (French Lick, Indiana); **Jared Earley** (Carlisle, Indiana); **Brian Egloff** (La Mar, Indiana); **Steve Hobbs** (Sullivan, Indiana); **Sam Meyers** (Huntingburg, Indiana); and **Jason Nuffer** (New Harmony, Indiana).

WOMEN'S GOLF

The women's program enjoyed its best season since its creation in the spring of 1995. The Eagles had a first at the Hanover College Classic during the fall to go along with three second-place finishes and one third in 11 tournaments.

For the second straight year, USI will be led into the season by junior **Jill Young** (West Lafayette, Indiana), who led the Eagles for the second straight year with an 88.1 average. She was third in the fall with an 86.0 average and second in the spring with 89.9.

Young will be joined by sophomore **Laura**

Compton (Evansville, Indiana). Compton, who joined the team at the mid-way point last year, was the team leader during the spring with an 88.7 average.

Also returning are sophomore **Lindsey McGrath** (Kentland, Indiana), 92.9; and junior **Julie Reed** (Bloomington, Indiana), 103.5.

The squad averaged 362.5 for the year, 355.7 during the fall and 362.5 in the spring.

To give the team depth in 1998-99, the Eagles have recruited seven new players, one senior and six freshmen.

Jim Brown

Men's and Women's Golf Coach

Jim Brown joined the University of Southern Indiana faculty in 1970, becoming the men's golf coach in 1977 and the women's golf coach in 1995. He also is academic advisor to the USI student athletes.

As the men's golf coach, Brown's Screaming Eagles made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1996, made three consecutive appearances in the NCAA II North Regional, and won the Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship in 1980 and 1984. He also coached Dave McAtee, who went to the national championship as an individual in 1987, and Brian Merrill, who was a two-time Academic All-American and a four-time All-GLVC performer.

In 1995, Brown helped organize women's team and has served as coach since the programs creation. The women's program has made great strides in its third year with its first winning season.

The returning players are joined by senior **Victoria Hardin** (Henderson, Kentucky), who transferred to USI from Lindsey Wilson College. The freshmen recruits are **Angela Biehl** (Seymour, Indiana); **Nicole Cates** (Hazleton, Indiana); **Sara Craven** (Evansville, Indiana); **Kristina Herndon** (Greensburg, Indiana); **Laura Leshner** (Kokomo, Indiana); and **Christy Wallace** (Potoka, Indiana).

The women's team will be looking forward to this season when the first-ever GLVC Tournament will be held in conjunction with the men's in October.

In addition to their accomplishments on the golf course, Brown's teams get the job done in the classroom. Since the creation of the Academic All-GLVC award in 1991, the golf program has had eight men's players and two women's players named to individual conference teams for academics.

During his years at the University, Brown has been the head baseball coach, assistant basketball coach, sports information director, and intramural director.

Brown received a bachelor's in physical education from Emporia State University (KA) in 1962 and a master's in physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

1998 Women's Tennis Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana's women's tennis team has big expectations heading into the 1998 fall season. Head coach Keeley Porter loses only one player, while a solid nucleus returns to improve on last season's 11-6 overall record, including a 5-4 record in Great Lakes Valley Conference play.

Senior **Rhonda Cole** (Lakeville, Indiana) will be looked upon as the cornerstone to this year's team. She has the best singles record of all returning starters at 10-4 (6-3 GLVC). In three years with the Screaming Eagles, Cole has a singles record of 20-6. Another key returnee is sophomore **Emily Nall** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana). Nall teamed up with Amy Blackford, who is redshirting this year, at number three doubles to go 15-2 (12-1 GLVC).

Other sophomores playing vital roles in last season's success were Nall, 8-8 singles record last year; **Kelly Sergesketter** (Evansville, Indiana), 9-6; and **Sarianne Butler** (Wadesville, Indiana), 1-0.

The sophomores are not the only returning letterwinners for the Screaming Eagles. Seniors **Mindy Albin** (Newburgh, Indiana), 5-2; and **Jill Fehrenbacher** (Evansville, Indiana), 5-4; come into the 1998 season with three years of varsity experience.

Last year's team had only one senior, Heather Garner, who finished her career with a 39-15 overall record and a .722 winning percentage. Garner sported a 9-6 record last fall, earning her a spot on the All-GLVC team.

Porter anticipates an exciting season ahead

with the Eagles expecting to contend with the top teams in the GLVC. Although an abundance of experience plays out on the singles court, Porter hopes to solidify the doubles teams in order to accomplish a strong finish in the GLVC. "Most of our top players don't have very much doubles experience, so I would like to see some improvement there," said Porter.

History shows that improvement can be expected by Porter. With only nine wins in 1995, the Eagles improved to ten wins in 1996, followed by eleven total wins in 1997.

Keely Porter Women's Tennis Coach

Keely Porter has completed seven seasons as the women's tennis head coach at the University of Southern Indiana.

In addition to coaching at USI, Porter is the head pro at Rolling Hills Country Club in Newburgh, Indiana, and on staff at Advantage Court and Fitness (formerly the Executive Inn Athletic Club) in Evansville. She is a United States Professional Tennis Registry certified pro, with 14 years of teaching experience.

In her USI career, Porter has accumulated a 50-42 (.543) overall record and a 34-29 (.540) record in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. She has led the Eagles to fourth-place finishes in league play during the 1991, 1995, 1996, and 1997 seasons.

Last year, Porter directed the USI squad to a 9-5 overall record and a 7-5 GLVC mark. The Eagles finished fourth in the GLVC

Tournament after finishing the regular season in fifth place.

During the 1996 season, Porter led the Eagles to a 10-7 overall record, starting the season 6-0, and went 6-3 in conference play. USI finished fourth in GLVC season play, as well as in the tournament.

Porter, a native of Newburgh, Indiana, is a 1984 graduate of the University of Evansville with a bachelor's in geography and anthropology. As a student athlete, Porter was the number one singles player and still holds the Evansville record for career doubles winning percentage.

In 1998, Porter will be joined by Assistant Coach Deke Gunderson, a USI assistant professor of biology and a native of Los Angeles, California.
