GRADUATE COURSES OFFERED AT A REDUCED RATE. Graduate courses are offered at a reduced rate to full-time ISUE employees and their spouses. Currently an employee can enroll in two courses, up to six credit hours per academic year, at the reduced rate. Employees are eligible to take one course during the fall semester and one course during the spring semester at the rate of \$4.75 per credit hour. A three-hour course currently costs \$14.25.

Spouses are eligible to take one graduate course per registration period at one-half the regular cost.

Registration for graduate courses is normally done at the first class meeting unless there is a pre-registration period. For further information concerning graduate courses, contact Dr. Robert Mays, professor of education, at extension 1813.
