Mike Hillyard

Men's and women's cross country coach

Mike Hillyard, head coach of both the men's and women's cross country programs, has the women's team in the top ten nationally and the men's program quickly returning to their past glories.

Last season, he directed the women's team to its best season ever. The Screaming Eagles produced an eighth-place showing in the NCAA Division II National Championships, a second place performance in the Great Lakes Regional, and their first-ever Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship.

In 1997, just his second season as head coach, Hillyard led the women's cross country team into the national spotlight. The Eagles gained their first-ever birth in the NCAA II National Championship, finishing 12th in the nation.

In addition to moving up among the national leaders, Hillyard has directed the Eagles to three of their five consecutive Indiana Intercollegiate "Little State" championships.

In 1996, his first season with the women's program, Hillyard led the Eagles to a third place finish in the GLVC and an eighth place finish in the NCAA II Regional. The highlight of the season was a first place finish in the USI Classic and the Indiana Intercollegiate Little State.

With such admirable credentials with the women's program, Hillyard was chosen to continue the men's tradition-rich program left by legendary coach Bill Stegemoller. In just his first season as men's coach, Hillyard helped guide Ben Kapsoiya to a third place finish in the NCAA II Championships. With four of his top five runners returning for 1999, Hillyard should have the men's program back in the top ten nationally.

Hillyard was a member of the USI cross country team in 1991 and 1992. While under the tutelage of coach Stegemoller, Hillyard excelled, earning All-American status in track and field with his fifth place finish in the steeplechase at the 1992 NCAA Division II Championships. Hillyard finished 34th in the 1991 NCAA Division II Cross Country Nationals.

A native of Norris City, Illinois, Hillyard graduated from USI in 1994.

Men's cross country 1999 fall outlook

The men's cross country team faces the daunting task of competing with the NCAA Division II elite without the aid of a Kenyan runner, who anchored the squad for the past three seasons. The 1999 crew is very young, but the return of 10 letterwinners should ease Head Coach Mike Hillyard's concern.

"Although we are a very young team, I am very optimistic about our men's squad," says Hillyard. "We have excellent leadership in senior Jason Heile, and Jon Jacob has set a very solid example for our younger athletes to follow."

Gone from last year's squad is Ben Kapsoiya (Chebimet, Kenya), who finished third in the national finals and succeeded national champion Elly Rono (Rift Valley, Kenya) as the Screaming Eagles nationally renowned distance runner. Poised to fill the void is senior **Jason Heile** (Moores Hill, Indiana), who redshirted last year after completing the 1997 season as USI's number two runner. Heile did compete in the Stegemoller Classic last year and finished second overall. In 1997, he placed 36th at the national finals and was named to the All-American team. In addition, Heile has been named All-Great Lakes Valley Conference in all three of his seasons as an Eagle.

Junior **Jon Jacob** (Mt. Vernon, Indiana) also returns after an impressive sophomore season. Jacob was named to the All-conference team after finishing sixth in the GLVC Championships and had a top finish of third last season at the Stegemoller Classic. Also returning for the '99 campaign is junior **Matt Krack** (Evansville, Indiana), who was Academic All-GLVC in 1998. Krack took 23rd at the GLVC Championships and had a season-best finish of 16th at the Stegemoller Classic.

Also returning from the 1998 team are sophomores **Nathan Owen** (Orleans, Indiana) and **Jeff Rumsey** (Rising Sun, Indiana). Juniors **Jimmy Girten** (Richland, Indiana), **Tim Roman** (Evansville, Indiana), **Matt Toothman** (Tell City, Indiana) and **Ben Stover** (Henderson, Kentucky) also look to add to the success of this year's team.

Joining this year's team is sophomore **David Farmer** (Princeton, Indiana), who redshirted last season; **Evan Cooksey** (Brownsburg, Indiana), who was a two-time All-State selection at Brownsburg High School; **Chris Cox** (Owensboro, Kentucky), a third place finisher in the 3200m Kentucky State Finals...in his *first* year of competitive running. **Andy Freeman** (Evansville, Indiana); **Mike Griffith** (Portage, Indiana), a 13th place finisher in the 3200m Indiana State Finalas; **Miles Krieger**, (Floyds Knobs, Indiana), 19th place finisher in the 3200m Indiana State Finals; **John Seibert** (Mt. Carmel, Indiana); **Lance Sluder** (Fairbanks, Indiana), 14th place finisher in the 3200m Indiana State Finals; **Kyle Telligman** (Freelandville, Indiana); and **Dominic Ventura** (Indianapolis, Indiana), a two-time All-State performer in both track and cross country at Southport High School.

"There is no doubt that this team has the potential to be among Division II's top ten," states Hillyard. "In order to reach that potential, however, our newcomers will have to mature quickly."

Women's cross country 1999 fall outlook

The only question for the women's cross country team is whether they can improve on their eighth place finish at the 1998 National Finals. With the addition of several outstanding freshmen and two transfers, as well as six of their top seven runners returning, that question could turn into an exclamation by the end of the 1999 fall season.

"Our women, over the past two seasons, have continually raised the bar," comments Head Coach Mike Hillyard. "With so much returning talent, and a solid group of newcomers, we hope to improve on last year's performances at both the regional and the national level, as well as repeat as GLVC Championships."

Gone from last year's squad is Christy Moore, who finished third on the Screaming Eagle depth chart. However, USI returns two of the region's best in senior **Nicole Shepler** (Fishers, Indiana) and junior **Melissa Eddy** (Columbus, Indiana). Shepler was the Eagles' top finisher in six of their seven meets last season, including a ninth place finish at the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional and a 28th place finish at the National Finals. She won her first-ever cross country title at the 1998 Stegemoller Classic with a time of 15:19.15. Her 1998 honors include All-Great Lakes Valley Conference, All-Great Lakes Region, and Academic All-GLVC.

Eddy returns as the Eagles' number two runner from a year ago. Eddy improved greatly last season, finishing in the top ten three times. She led USI to a second place showing at the Southern Illinois Saluki Invitational, a meet loaded with Division I programs. In addition, Eddy was named All-GLVC and Academic All-GLVC last year.

Also returning for the '99 campaign are seniors Jessica Decker (Washington, Indiana) and Nichole Oster (Garrett, Indiana), juniors Emily Maier (Griffin, Indiana) and Jessica Vagedes (Gosport, Indiana), and sophomore Jennifer McIntyre (Haubstadt, Indiana), who was named All-GLVC with her tenth-place finish at the 1998 GLVC Championships. Also returning are letterwinners Anne Maier (Griffin, Indiana), Tracy Lampert (Jasper, Indiana), Erin Gilles (Lafayette, Indiana), and Becky Shetler (Evansville, Indiana).

Looking to make an impact in their first seasons as Screaming Eagles are several freshmen and two transfers. **Elizabeth Ellwood** (Evansville, Indiana) transfers from Division I Morehead State University where she won letters in 1997 and 1998. Possibly making the biggest impact on the 1999 squad is junior transfer **Kelly Cunningham** (Bloomfield, Indiana). Cunningham was a National Junior College All-America at Vincennes University last season and won the 1998 and 1999 national championship in the marathon.

Jenny Farmer (Princeton, Indiana), one of the most heralded freshmen in recent history, also joins the 1999 Screaming Eagles. Farmer won individual sectional titles in 1997 and 1998 at Evansville Mater Dei High School. She also was named All-City and All-Conference in each of her four seasons a Mater Dei and advanced to the semi-state all four years, capped by a regional championship and state finals appearance in 1997. Joining Farmer is Cally Thompson (Brownstown, Indiana), another much anticipated addition. Thompson qualified for the cross country state finals every year at Brownstown Central High School, the first runner in BCHS

history to do so. Other incoming freshmen are **Heather Dickey** (Batesville, Indiana) and **Stacey Ketron** (Columbus, Indiana). Ketron teamed with Eddy on 1996 Columbus East High School team that placed third in the 1996 state finals and was named to the 1996 All-State team. **Beth King** (Westfield, Indiana), a member of the 1998 Westfield High School cross country state championship team, **Erin Oxendine** (Oakland City, Indiana), and **Allison Smith** (Georgetown, Indiana) also join the 1999 crew.

"The core of our team is very young, so the upward trend should continue beyond the fall of 1999," anticipates Hillyard. "These young ladies understand that there is a price to pay in order to be successful. Their willingness to continue making such a commitment will determine the potential of this year's squad."

Jim Brown

Men's and women's golf coach

Jim Brown joined the University of Southern Indiana faculty in 1970, becoming the men's golf coach in 1977 and the women's golf coach in 1995. He also is the academic advisor to the USI student athletes.

As the men's coach, Brown's Screaming Eagles made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1996, and have made four consecutive appearances in the NCAA II North Regional. During his tenure, Brown has coached eight All-Great Lakes Valley Conference players and three Academic All-Americans.

In 1995, Brown helped organize the women's golf program and has served as coach since the programs creation. The women's program compiled a match record of 42-16 in fall 1998, including a third place finish in the first-ever women's GLVC Championship.

Beyond their accomplishments on the golf course, Brown's teams excel in the classroom. Since the creation of the Academic All-GLVC award in 1991, the golf program has had four men's players and two women's players named to individual conference teams for academics.

During his years at the University, Brown has been the head baseball coach, assistant basketball coach, sports information director, and intramural director.

Brown received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Emporia State University (Emporia, Emporia, Kansas) in 1962 and a master's degree in physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

Men's Golf 1999 Fall Outlook

Head coach Jim Brown returns the nucleus of last season's NCAA Division II Tournament team that missed advancing to the National Finals by six strokes. The Eagles, who made their fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Division II North Regional, look to advance to the National Finals for the first time since 1996.

Back to lead the squad to national prominence is junior **Mark Franklin** (Clayton, Indiana). Franklin's average of 75.5 was tops on the squad last season and his one under par 71 at the Indianapolis Invitational helped propel the Eagles to their first of two team championships. A two-time All-GLVC performer, Franklin placed in the top ten in four tournaments, more than any other Eagle golfer last season.

Following Franklin by a stroke is junior **Matt Scheessele** (Evansville, Indiana), whose 76.8 average tied for second on the team. Scheessele was the Eagles' top finisher in the Puma Invitational, the GLVC Tournament, and the NCAA District IV Tournament. An All-GLVC performer in 1998-99, Scheessele also figures to play a major role in USI's return to the National Finals.

Senior **Brad Burvan** (Rensselaer, Indiana) emerged late last year as one of the best golfers on the team. After failing to make the cut for five of six fall tournaments, Burvan returned in the spring as one of USI's most consistent golfers, sporting a 78.5 average (fourth best on the team) and leading the team in the Concord Invitational and the Butler Invitational. Joining Burvan is senior **Chris Compton** (Evansville, Indiana). Compton finished at the top of the leaderboard at the Big Blue Classic in the spring of 1999, leading USI to their second team championship of the season. Compton matched Burvan's 78.5 average last season and should have his name marked at the three or four spot on the Eagles' tournament roster.

Junior Aaron Ashley (Boonville, Indiana), who averaged an 81.5 in two tournaments last season, will be competing for a spot on the Eagles' five-man tournament roster along with nine newcomers. Shooting for a spot in the top five will be junior Jeff May (Evansville, Indiana), as well as freshmen Charlie Lane (Bicknell, Indiana), Tim Garner (Martinsville, Indiana), Michael Heaton (Madisonville, Kentucky), Kyle Howard (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), Curtis Nolin (Rockville, Indiana), Andy Skodinski (New Ross, Indiana), Brett Smith (Jasper, Indiana), and Jeremy Vest (Bloomfield, Indiana).

Women's golf 1999 fall outlook

The University of Southern Indiana women's golf program starts the 1999-2000 season as a team in transition. The Lady Eagles are shifting from a team lost in the rough of mediocrity to a team scooting down the fairway of success. Head Coach Jim Brown, whose teams have improved every year, looks at two seasoned veterans for leadership.

Returning is junior standout **Laura Compton** (Evansville, Indiana), who paced USI in eight of its 11 tournaments last season. Compton was crowned champion of the USI Fall Invitational, the St. Joseph's College Invitational, and the Hanover College Fall Classic and tied the school record twice by shooting a 78 for 18 holes (Indianapolis Classic and Lewis Spring Classic). In addition, Compton has the school record for best score at a 36-hole tournament, a 162 (St. Joseph's Invitational). After averaging a 81.7 in the fall last season, Compton slipped to an 86 average in the spring, but her resulting 83.6 overall average still established a school record for best average over an entire season.

Junior Lindsey McGrath (Kentland, Indiana) is another returnee who should contribute to the Eagles' success. McGrath shot a 79 in the second round of the St. Joseph's College Invitational—a personal best—and finished in third place at the Lady Greyhound Spring Classic. Her two day score of 166 at the Lewis Spring Classic ranked fourth as USI's best 36-hole score ever and her 85.6 overall average last year was third best in school history.

Joining USI's two standouts will be **Julie Reed** (Bloomington, Indiana), who sat out last spring after completing two fall rounds with a 97.5 average, and several newcomers. Those newcomers are junior **Andrea Sholar** (Philpot, Kentucky) and freshmen **Emily Molin** (Martinsville, Indiana), and **Stephanie Murray** (Boonville, Indiana).

In addition to defending their USI Invitational crown, the Lady Eagles also travel to the Saint Joseph's Invitational, a tournament they placed second in last fall, and the always tough Tri-State Lady Thunder Fall Classic where they finished seventh out of 13 teams last year. New additions to the fall schedule are the Lady Panthers Fall Invitational at the Summit Country Club in Owensboro, Kentucky, and the Lady Greyhound Fall Preview at Oak Tree Golf Course in Plainfield, Indiana. USI will try to improve upon last season's third place Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament showing on September 27 and 28, also at the Oak Tree Golf Course.

Women's tennis 1999 outlook

Head Coach **Keely Porter** can't help but smile as she talks about the 1999-2000 University of Southern Indiana women's tennis team.

"We will have unparalleled depth," says the grinning coach. "We should be almost unbeatable at four, five, and six singles."

Although she returns only four letterwinners from last season's fifth place Great Lakes Valley Conference team, Porter has added three players who will step in and immediately strengthen her lineup. Porter is optimistic that this year's team, who finished 9-6 overall and 6-4 in conference play last year, will invariably climb the GLVC ladder.

"I'd like to finish in the top three in the conference," says Porter matter-of-factly. "We've never finished better than fourth in my eight seasons at the USI."

Junior Emily Nall (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), who posted a record of 11-3 overall and 8-3 in the GLVC last year, returns for the fall campaign as the number five or six singles player. Another returnee for the Lady Eagles is sophomore Jill Clements (Loogootee, Indiana). As a freshman last season, Clements played at number five and six singles and posted a 10-3 overall, 8-3 GLVC record.

However, it is the rookie class that will make this team stand tall among their peers. Freshman **Emily Blinzinger** (Oakland City, Indiana) comes in as the best recruit in Porter's tenure. Blinzinger, who was honorable mention All-State at Wood Memorial High School, will play number one singles. Another key addition is

freshman **Jamie Carie** (Washington, Indiana), a former Washington Catholic High School standout who will play either number two or three singles.

Making the transition from the basketball court to the tennis court is sophomore **Gretchen Miles** (Washington, Indiana). Miles, who played one season for the Lady Eagle basketball team, was the number one singles player for all four years of her career at Washington High School. A two-time individual sectional champ, Miles will play either number two or three singles for USI.

Junior Kelly Sergesketter (Evansville, Indiana), who recorded an 8-5 overall record last season, 6-4 GLVC, and sophomore Gwen Gosman (Jasper, Indiana), who went 7-8 at the number three singles slot, including a respectful 6-6 in GLVC play, have returned to campus battling for the remaining varsity slots.

Also joining this year's team are senior Jessica Helm (Evansville, Indiana), who joins the team after a four-year hiatus from competitive tennis; sophomore Kristy Hite (Lake Station, Indiana); and freshmen Katie Catlin (Sullivan, Indiana), Mary Jo Meuth (Newburgh, Indiana), and Beth Vanatti (Princeton, Indiana).

Porter knows her team's potential, but remains leery.

"The top half of singles should be more competitive than previous years," predicts Porter. "But finding the right combinations at doubles and fine-tuning our net play will either win or lose the close matches in the fall."

Keely Porter has completed eight seasons as the women's tennis head coach at the University of Southern Indiana.

In addition to coaching at USI, Porter is the head pro at Rolling Hills Country Club in Newburgh, Indiana, and on staff at Advantage Court and Fitness (formerly the Executive Inn Athletic Club) in Evansville. She is a United States Professional Tennis Registry certified pro, with 15 years of teaching experience.

In 1998, Porter directed the USI squad to a 9-7 overall record and a 6-4 GLVC mark. The Eagles finished sixth in the GLVC Tournament after finishing the regular season in fifth place.

In her USI career, Porter has accumulated a 59-49 (.546) overall record and a 40-33 (.548) record in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. She has led the Screaming Eagles to fourth-place finishes in league play during the 1991, 1995, 1996, and 1997 seasons.

Porter, a native of Newburgh, is a 1984 graduate of the University of Evansville with a bachelor's degree in geography and anthropology. As a student athlete, Porter was the number one singles player and still holds the Evansville record for career doubles winning percentage.

Porter's assistant coach is Deke Gunderson, a USI professor in biology and a native of Los Angeles, California.

Women's Golf mid-season report

Women's golf off to best season ever

Lady Eagles fall just short in GLVC Tournament, finish second

The University of Southern Indiana women's golf program continues to rise after only four-and-a-half years of existence. The Lady Eagles won the first two tournaments of the season, then went on to finish second at the Great Lakes Valley Conference tournament, their best finish ever.

USI's overall fall record was an astounding 41-8, significantly better than last spring's final record of 28-23. The Lady Eagles head into this year's spring season as the fifthranked team in the East Region.

Junior Laura Compton (Evansville, Indiana) led the Lady Eagles with a 82 average. Compton matched the school record of 78 on two occasions this season, and has shot a 78 four different times in her career. Her 158 score for the 36-hole GLVC Tournament broke the school record for best 36-hole effort, a record she set just last spring. Compton finished third at the conference tournament and won All-conference honors.

Fellow junior Lindsey McGrath (Kentland, Indiana) also enjoyed a very successful fall campaign. McGrath averaged an 83.2 over seven rounds, and just missed equaling the USI record for an 18-hole tournament when she fired a 79 on two separate occasions this fall. She sits third in the record books with her 162 score at the GLVC Tournament. McGrath finished fifth at the conference tournament and won All-conference honors.

Sophomore Kristy Herndon (Greensburg, Indiana) rejoined the team for the GLVC Tournament and fired a two-day scored of 176. Her 88 average will provide a much needed boost for the Lady Eagle spring season.

The most impressive statistic, however, is not an individual accomplishment. The Lady Eagles shattered the school record for best team 18-hole score at the GLVC Tournament when they combined for a 331 score. They also broke the record for best 36-hole effort after tallying a 668 total at the GLVC Tournament.

USI will start its spring season on Monday, March 27 at the Bellarmine College Invitational.

Jim Brown

Men's and women's golf coach

Jim Brown joined the University of Southern Indiana faculty in 1970, becoming the men's golf coach in 1977 and the women's golf coach in 1995. He also is the academic advisor to the USI student athletes.

As the men's coach, Brown's Screaming Eagles made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1996, and have made four consecutive appearances in the NCAA II North Regional. During his tenure, Brown has coached eight All-Great Lakes Valley Conference players and three Academic All-Americans.

In 1995, Brown helped organize the women's golf program and has served as coach since the programs creation. The women's program compiled a match record of 42-16 in fall 1998, including a third place finish in the first-ever women's GLVC Championship. In 1999, the women's team continued their rise, finishing second in the GLVC Championship and finishing the fall season with a 41-8 record.

Beyond their accomplishments on the golf course, Brown's teams excel in the classroom. Since the creation of the Academic All-GLVC award in 1991, the golf program has had four men's players and two women's players named to individual conference teams for academics.

During his years at the University, Brown has been the head baseball coach, assistant basketball coach, sports information director, and intramural director.

Brown received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Emporia State University (Emporia, Emporia, Kansas) in 1962 and a master's degree in physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

Men's Golf mid-season report

Despite disappointing fall, Eagles aim for regional berth

After starting the fall season with back-to-back third place finishes, the men's golf team struggled at some of the more important tournaments of the fall.

Nonetheless, the Screaming Eagles still have their sights set on a fifth consecutive NCAA Division II North Regional berth, but will need a strong start to their spring season in order no reach their goal.

In the fall campaign, USI collected third place finishes at both the Indianapolis Invitational and the St. Joseph's Invitational. However, the fall season ended with two huge tournaments on the Eagles schedule, the NCAA District IV Fall Tournament and the Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament. Both tournaments are used as measuring sticks for North Regional selections. Unfortunately, the Eagles finished 13th at the district tournament and then followed that up with a seventh place

finish at the conference tournament.

Individually, junior Mark Franklin (Clayton, Indiana) registered a team-best 77.3 average in the fall season and had a top ten finish at the St. Joseph's Invitational. Junior Matt Scheessele (Evansville, Indiana) followed closely with a 77.4 average and finished seventh at the USI Fall Invitational, while senior Brad Burvan (Rensselaer, Indiana) posted a 77.7 average and had third place finishes at the Indianapolis Invitational and St. Joseph's Invitational.

The Eagles continue their run at a NCAA Regional berth on March 26 and 27 when they compete in the NCAA District IV Tournament. Once again, the District IV Tournament will be an important event in the Eagles' quest for national prominence.

Jim Brown

Men's and women's golf coach

Jim Brown joined the University of Southern Indiana faculty in 1970, becoming the men's golf coach in 1977 and the women's golf coach in 1995. He also is the academic advisor to the USI student athletes.

As the men's coach, Brown's Screaming Eagles made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1996, and have made four consecutive appearances in the NCAA II North Regional. During his tenure, Brown has coached eight All-Great Lakes Valley Conference players and three Academic All-Americans.

In 1995, Brown helped organize the women's golf program and has served as coach since the programs creation. The women's program compiled a match record of 42-16 in fall 1998, including a third place finish in the first-ever women's GLVC Championship. In 1999, the women's team continued their rise, finishing second in the GLVC Championship and finishing the fall season with a 41-8 record.

Beyond their accomplishments on the golf course, Brown's teams excel in the classroom. Since the creation of the Academic All-GLVC award in 1991, the golf program has had four men's players and two women's players named to individual conference teams for academics.

During his years at the University, Brown has been the head baseball coach, assistant basketball coach, sports information director, and intramural director.

Brown received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Emporia State University (Emporia, Emporia, Kansas) in 1962 and a master's degree in physical education from Indiana University in 1968.

2000 Men's Tennis Outlook

GLVC Regular Season Champions: 1994, 1998, 1999 GLVC Tournament Champions: 1999

Even though the University of Southern Indiana men's tennis team has yet to solve the puzzle of receiving an NCAA Division II Tournament invitation, the players enter the 2000 spring season with only one thing on the their mind, another Great Lakes Valley Conference championship.

"The pieces are in place, but we need to continue our hard work," comments Head Coach **Jon Mark Hall**. "If we do, good things will happen."

Last spring, the Screaming Eagles finished 10-0 in the conference and won their first-ever GLVC Tournament title. However, USI's 22-4 overall record and impressive run at the conference title was not enough for an NCAA II Tournament berth. The Eagles ended up at number 14 in the Midwest Region, but only the top 13 ranked teams are invited.

Even if the NCAA Tournament is not the number one priority to the players, last year's snub still stings the Eagles.

"Our first goal is to win the GLVC Championship and that's our main goal every year," says Hall. "But the NCAA Tournament is something we believe will happen sometime, hopefully this season."

The Eagles enter the 2000 season as the tenth ranked team in the Midwest Region, their highest ranking ever. The November ranking means the Eagles are in position, albeit a very early, to make the NCAA II Tournament for the first

time in school history. Hall is optimistic, but cautious.

"We are excited about the ranking, but we realize that it is early," says Hall, who was named GLVC Coach of the Year for the third consecutive year in 1999. "Hopefully, this ranking will give us even more motivation for the spring."

The Eagles return every player from last season's team, including junior standout **Edgar Linares** (Caracas, Venezuela), last year's GLVC Player of the Year. Linares finished last season with a record of 12-6, 7-1 in conference play. He also won the top singles flight of the 1999 GLVC Fall Tournament and will enter the 2000 season as the 27th ranked player in the Midwest Region.

Linares teamed with fellow junior **Andrew Majxner** (Bozeman, Montana) to post a 15-4 overall record at number one doubles, including 9-2 in the GLVC. The duo won the top flight of the 1999 GLVC Fall Tournament and also advanced to the quarterfinals of the ITA Midwest Regional in the fall of 1999. The combination is currently ranked 19th in the Midwest Region.

Majxner produced a fine season of his own in 1999. After tallying an 18-13 record, he was named All-conference for the second consecutive season. Majxner tied the record for most doubles wins in a season last year when he won 23 total games as a doubles player. He has a chance to become the all-time wins leader at USI after only his junior

season. He needs 39 combined wins (singles and doubles) to eclipse the mark of 110 combined career wins held by Chad Higgins (1994-97). Majxner also appears to be a lock to set records for career singles wins (56) and career doubles wins (54). He currently has 29 singles and 42 doubles victories.

But junior **Jeremy Richie** (Evansville, Indiana) may give Majxner a fight for the career wins mark. Last season, he went 23-5 in singles competition and has 34 career wins as a singles player. He paired with junior **Jeff Durham** (Greenville, Ohio) to win the Green Division of the 1999 GLVC Fall Doubles Tournament. Durham returns to the team after sitting out the 1999 spring season. His presence may be what the Eagles need. In 1998, Durham played number one singles for the Eagles and was named to the All-conference team.

Also back in 2000 are a pair of successful seniors, John Benedyk (Billings, Montana) and Jason Coomer (Austin, Indiana). Benedyk went 12-12 last season, mostly at number three singles. He also teamed with sophomore Chris Crawford (Jeffersonville, Indiana) at number two doubles to post an impressive 17-3 record, including a perfect 12-0 in GLVC play. Coomer, who finished last spring with a record of 20-9, won the Red Division of the 1999 GLVC Fall Tournament.

Sophomore **Ethan Davis** (Sullivan, Indiana) finished last season with a record of 21-3 at number six singles, including a perfect 11-0 in the GLVC. In the fall, Davis won the White Division of the 1999 GLVC Fall Tournament.

Senior Jason Cash (Newburgh, Indiana) and sophomore Mark Cummings (Vincennes, Indiana) teamed at number three doubles and went 16-4 overall and 12-0 in conference matches. Both are expected to make big impacts on the spring season.

Also returning for 2000 is senior **Chris Webb** (Williamsport, Indiana) and junior **Britt Wilson** (New Castle, Indiana). Webb is 15-5 in singles and 7-3 in doubles after three seasons with the Eagles. He won the Green Division of the 1999 GLVC Fall Tournament. Wilson has a 1-0 career singles record and a 3-0 career doubles record.

Hall has beefed up the schedule for the upcoming season. In addition to the always-tough GLVC schedule, the Eagles will play at the Central Oklahoma Broncho Invitational. The tournament boasts eight of the top ten teams in the Midwest Region and will no doubt be a deciding factor in the Eagles NCAA Tournament hopes.

Comments coach Hall, "We are going to Oklahoma for one reason, and that's to try and position ourselves for an NCAA Tournament bid."

Acquiring that position also involves maintaining the success the Eagles have achieved in past conference play. Last year, USI won 54 of 63 singles matches and 37 of 39 doubles matches. Combined, that's an unbelievable .892 winning percentage.

The Eagles appear to possess all the parts for an NCAA Tournament run, and if the pieces fall into place, the result would be a picture perfect season.

Jon Mark Hall

Men's Tennis Coach

Jon Mark Hall joined the University of Southern Indiana Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach. As the assistant athletic director, Hall is the assistant administrator for internal affairs, oversees budgets, is the compliance coordinator, and oversees game management operations.

In 1999, his fourth season as head coach, the Screaming Eagles tennis team continued their dominance of the Great Lakes Valley Conference. USI finished 22-5 overall, including a 10-0 conference mark, their second consecutive perfect regular season in the GLVC. In addition to their perfect regular season, the Eagles won their first-ever GLVC Tournament crown. In addition, Hall was named the GLVC Coach of the Year, his third straight COY award. After four years as head coach, Hall has compiled a record of 65-30 (.684).

Hall led the Screaming Eagles to one of their best seasons ever in 1998. His squad finished with an overall record of 15-4 and a first place regular season finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a perfect 10-0 record. Hall was named the GLVC Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

In his second season as the men's tennis coach, Hall, who was named the GLVC Coach of the Year in 1997, led the Screaming Eagles to a 17-9 overall record and a first place tie in the Great Lakes Valley Conference regular season with a 9-1 record. USI finished third in the GLVC post-season tournament.

During his first campaign as the men's tennis coach, Hall led the Screaming Eagles, who were 11-12 in dual matches, to a fifth place finish in the GLVC.

Hall came to USI after a tenure at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fund-raising and promotion activities.

The native of Murray, Ky., is a 1990 cum laude graduate from Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

Men's and Women's 2000 Track and Field Outlook

Head Coach Mike Hillyard comes into the men's 2000 spring track with great expectations.

"We have a chance to place a few national qualifiers on the men's team," says Hillyard. "I'm confident that we can make a good showing at the national level this spring."

In the indoor portion of the Screaming Eagles schedule, junior **Jon Jacob** (Mt Vernon, Indiana) poses USI's best chance at a national qualifier for the 5k run.

Sophomore Jeff Rumsey (Rising Sun, Indiana), as well as freshmen Lance Sluder (Fairbanks, Indiana), Miles Krieger (Floyds Knobs, Indiana), and junior Matt Krack (Evansville, Indiana) should all break the 15 minute barrier in the 5k.

"The 15-minute barrier is pretty significant for our guys," says Hillyard. "Just 10 runners in the history of our program have done it. It's definitely a mark of respectability as a collegiate runner."

The indoor track season runs from January 22 through March 11. The Eagles will compete in four tune-up meets before racing in the GLVC Championships on February 26 and the NCAA II National Championships on March 10 and 11.

"We take a fairly low-key approach to the indoor campaign in terms of training," comments Hillyard. "Everything we do is geared toward being at our best fitness level in late April and May. We definitely are setting some ambitious goals for indoors, but within the structure of our overall training plans."

The outdoor track schedule features several Division I dominated meets, including the Alabama Relays in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The meet features 17 teams, 14 of which are NCAA Division I teams. USI also runs at the Division I EIU Big Blue Classic in Charleston, Illinois and the Division I Butler Twilight in Indianapolis, Indiana.

"We open up with the Alabama Relays, one of the most competitive meets in the country," says Hillyard. "This should give us the opportunity to run some fast times right off the bat."

The Eagles will debut two runners in the 3k Steeplechase this spring. Rumsey and Sluder, both new to the event, will shoot for national qualifying marks.

In the 10k, Jacob looks to be the Eagles' best bet for a national qualifier. Krack will challenge Jacob for the honor of top 10k runner.

The deepest event for USI will be the mile run. Sophomore David Farmer (Princeton, Indiana) and freshman Dominic Ventura (Indianapolis, Indiana) both possess the proper speed and strength to advance to the national finals. Freshmen Andy Freeman (Evansville, Indiana) and Mark Thurner (Hebron, Indiana), who finished eighth in the 1998 Indiana High School State Finals in the mile run, will also compete in the event.

"We have plenty of guys who have the same capacity for success that Ben Kapsoiya had," quotes Hillyard. "If they can train with the intent and purpose that Ben did, then this will be a very strong event for us."

After finishing ninth at the 1999 cross country national finals, the Lady Eagles also have high hopes for the track season.

"Melissa Eddy and Jennifer McIntyre both qualified for the national meet a year ago," says Hillyard. "We have a lot of ambitious girls who see that if they train with these two, then they can have similar success."

The Lady Eagles run the same track schedule as the men's squad and will face the same amount of Division I teams.

Junior **Melissa Eddy** (Hope, Indiana), a national qualifier in the mile in 1999, will be the Lady Eagles best chance for an All-American in 2000.

But several other runners come into the spring with good chances of making the national finals.

Senior **Nicole Shepler** (Fishers, Indiana), a 1998 All-Region and All-conference pick in the cross country season, will run the 5k and 10k for USI.

Junior **Kelly Cunningham** (Bloomfield, Indiana) won the junior college indoor marathon national championship in 1998 and 1999. She will run the 5k.

Hillyard can count on great performances this spring from his two freshmen, Cally Thompson (Brownstown, Indiana) and **Jenny Farmer** (Princeton, Indiana). Farmer
was named All-conference and All-Great
Lakes Region in the 1999 cross country
season, while Thompson made the Allconference team. Both have their best
years ahead of them.

"Cally and Jenny earned both All-conference and All-Region honors as freshmen," comments Hillyard. "In our league, and in the Great Lakes region, that's not easy. These two young ladies will no doubt have similar success on the track."

Returning from an injury in the fall is junior **Jennifer McIntyre** (Haubstadt, Indiana). In the spring of 1999, McIntyre established USI freshman records for the 3000 m, 5k, and 10k. She ran a 10k race in 37:17, which qualified her for the outdoor track and field National Championships. She will be counted on as one of the better runners in 2000.

"Jenny is the first freshman in the history of the program to qualify for the track and field National Finals," says Hillyard. "She is a solid All-American candidate."

Mike Hillyard

Men's and women's cross country coach, track and field coach

Mike Hillyard, head coach of both the men's and women's cross country programs, has the women's team in the top ten nationally and the men's program quickly returning to their past glories.

Last season, the women's squad finished in the top ten nationally for the second consecutive year. The Lady Eagles finished second in the Great Lakes Valley Conference championships, won their first-ever Great Lakes Regional, and then went on to finish ninth at the NCAA II National Finals.

In 1998, the Screaming Eagles produced an eighth-place showing in the NCAA Division II National Championships, a second place performance in the Great Lakes Regional, and their first-ever Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship.

In 1997, just his second season as head coach, Hillyard led the women's cross country team into the national spotlight. The Eagles gained their first-ever birth in the NCAA II National Championship, finishing 12th in the nation.

In addition to moving up among the national leaders, Hillyard has directed the Eagles to three of their five consecutive Indiana Intercollegiate "Little State" championships.

With such admirable credentials with the women's program, Hillyard was chosen to continue the men's tradition-rich program left by legendary coach Bill Stegemoller.

In 1998, his first season as men's coach, Hillyard helped guide Ben Kapsoiya to a third place finish in the NCAA II Championships. Last year, the Eagles barely missed an NCAA II National Final invite after finishing third in the Great Lakes Regional. Only the top two teams were invited.

Hillyard was a member of the USI cross country team in 1991 and 1992. While under the tutelage of coach Stegemoller, Hillyard excelled, earning All-American status in track and field with his fifth place finish in the steeplechase at the 1992 NCAA Division II Championships. Hillyard finished 34th in the 1991 NCAA Division II Cross Country Nationals.

A native of Norris City, Illinois, Hillyard graduated from USI in 1994.
