YOUNG ABE LINCOLN,

Little more than a week remains for Lincoln Amphitheatre's 1992 outdoor musical productions of *Young Abe Lincoln*, the story of the former President's life in southern Indiana from age 7 to 21, and *Big River*, based on the *Adventures of Tom Sawyer and Huckleberry Finn*.

Growing audiences are enjoying the youthful hijinks of two of America's best loved 19th century personalities -- one from the pages of history, the other from the fiction of Mark Twain -- as situations send the boys floating down the Ohio and Mississippi rivers.

The musicals alternate, providing two fun-filled nights of family entertainment for those who would like to spend some time at the Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial, getting to know America's 16th President, or visiting the grave of his mother, Nancy Hanks Lincoln.

The shows are presented at 8 p.m. daily, except Mondays, when the 1,500-seat amphitheatre is closed. The season finale of *Young Abe Lincoln* will come on Friday, August 21, with Huck Finn and the slave Jim seeing the last of the *Big River* the following night.

Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$9 for seniors (60+), \$6 for children (12 and under); there is a group rate of \$9 for adults, \$8.50 for seniors, \$5 for children. The family also can enjoy a picnic supper at the nearby pavilion, with supper/show tickets priced at \$16.50 for adults, \$15.50 for seniors, \$10.50 for children, \$1 off on each for the group rate.

Coupons providing \$5 off on any two admissions are available in area newspapers and at convention/visitor bureaus and interstate rest areas.
