

USI MEN'S BASKETBALL

1996-97 Outlook

The Screaming Eagles are rebuilding since three starters, including the two-time NCAA Division II Player of the Year and the 1996 GLVC Player of the Year, graduated.

Last year, USI finished the season ranked fourth nationally; 25-4 (.862) overall; won the Great Lakes Valley Conference crown with the best winning percentage in league and school history (18-2, .900); and set a school record for wins in the regular season (24-3, .889). But for a team which had gone to the NCAA Division II Championship game for two consecutive seasons, losing in the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional finals proved to be disappointing.

The Screaming Eagles will be reloading after the graduation of guard/forward Stan Gouard, who was the NCAA Division II Player of the Year in 1995 and 1996, and forward Chad Gilbert, who was the 1996 GLVC Player of the Year. Along with these two standouts, forward Scott Boyden and center Neil Coyle, respectively third and fourth on the team in scoring last year, have all graduated. The departing players averaged 66 points and 27 rebounds a game in 1995-96.

Over the last four seasons, no team in college basketball has experienced the kind of success the Eagles have enjoyed.

In his four seasons at USI Head Coach Bruce Pearl, the winningest coach in college basketball, has a record of 104-19 (.846). He led the Screaming Eagles to two GLVC titles and four straight NCAA Division II appearances. Pearl directed USI to the NCAA II Championship in 1995 and the finals in 1994.

Pearl needs seven wins this year to become USI's all-time winningest coach. The record of 110 victories is held by Wayne Boultinghouse (110-79, .582).

To compensate for the departure of Gouard, Gilbert, and Coyle from the starting line-up and Boyden, perhaps one of the best sixth men in Division II (61.9 percent of the scoring and 57.0 percent of the rebounding), Pearl will return two starters and several seasoned players.

Returning veteran players are 6-1 senior point guard **Marc Hostetter** (Lyons, Ind.) and 6-5 senior forward **Scott Taylor** (East Moline, Ill.).

Hostetter, who has directed the Eagles' offense over the past two seasons, had a career high 9.0 ppg and 5.1 assists in 29 games last year. Taylor, who missed the last week of the season with a knee injury which hampered the Eagles' chance for a third straight appearance in the Elite Eight, averaged 10.6 ppg and 4.1 rpg appearing in 25 games with 20 starts.

Joining Hostetter in the backcourt is 6-3 senior guard **Johnny Moore** (Elkhart, Ind.). Johnny Moore averaged 8.6 ppg and 2.1 rpg in 20 games, starting seven.

Tim Tooley (Huntingburg, Ind.), a 6-6 sophomore guard, is returning to the varsity squad after redshirting last season. Playing on the 1995 national championship team, Tooley averaged 1.3 ppg and 1.0 rpg.

While Tooley is back on the varsity squad, 6-3 freshman guard **Ryan Kelley** (Evansville, Ind.) anticipates the first season on the squad. Kelley sat out last season as a freshman redshirt.

To complete the backcourt depth, the Eagles have added a Division I transfer, a junior college transfer, and four freshmen.

Transferring to USI is 6-1 sophomore guard **Larry Moore** (Chicago, Ill.). Larry Moore averaged 4.0 ppg and 1.0 assists per game off the bench at Eastern Illinois University. He played high school ball for his father at St. Francis DeSales in Chicago, one of the finest prep programs in the country.

Shifting from Kankakee Junior College to the Eagles backcourt is senior **David Willock** (Chicago, Ill.). Willock averaged 26.4 ppg in 1994-95 and ranks ninth in NJCAA history with 1,766 points.

Joining the team as freshmen are 6-1 guard **Kevin Herdes** (Shelbyville, Ill.), who averaged 13.0 ppg and 8.9 assists as a high school senior, 6-5 guard/forward **B.J. Watts** (Austin, Ind.), who averaged 21.0 ppg and 9.8 rpg as a senior, and 6-4 guard/forward **Paul Blaylock** (New Harmony, Ind.), who averaged 16.3 last year.

With exception of Taylor, the Eagles graduated the entire frontcourt.

The Eagles will be returning 6-10 senior center **Jason Dominick** (Evansville, Ind.) and junior forward **Joel Thomas** (Evansville, Ind.). Off the bench, Dominick averaged 5.0 ppg and 2.7 rpg, while Thomas averaged 3.2 ppg and 2.9 rpg. Both showed great promise last season.

Redshirted after a knee injury last year, the Eagles return 6-8 junior center **Brad Chapman** (Monroe City, Ind.) to the squad. Chapman averaged 7.3 ppg and 3.3 rpg in three games before being injured.

Like Kelley, 6-8 freshman center **Andy Swan** (Evansville, Ind.) will be getting his first chance at action on the varsity squad after sitting out last year.

The Eagles acquired three recruits at an average size of 6-7 to fill the spots left in the frontcourt. Playing for USI this season is 6-8 junior forward **Wayne Houston** (Temple Hills, Md.), 6-9 freshman forward/center **Kyle Keith** (Campbellsburg, Ind.), and junior 6-6 forward **Jeremy Pearson** (Apex, N.C.).

Houston averaged 17.6 ppg and 7.8 rpg last year for Brown Mackie Junior College. Pearson averaged 18.5 ppg and 7.5 rpg last year for Trinity Valley Junior College.


Following in Neil Coyle's footsteps from West Washington High School, Keith averaged 16.0 ppg and 8.0 rpg as a senior at WWHS.

The Eagles' goal is to return to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight for the third time in four seasons. To do so, USI must succeed in the GLVC, one of the toughest conferences in Division II.

In the GLVC, which gains the University of Missouri-St. Louis, USI will play Northern Kentucky University, the 1996 NCAA Division II runner-up; Kentucky Wesleyan College, which has won more basketball national championships than any other school in Division II; and the University of Indianapolis, which made an appearance in the NCAA II Tournament last year and continues to improve.

In the non-conference schedule, USI will once again host the National Shootout in December. This year the tournament will feature Barry University, Mars Hill College, and the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg, which ranks tenth in winning percentage (155-48, .764) in Division II since 1990.

Also on the non-conference schedule is the challenging High Desert Classic in Las Vegas, Nev. The Eagles will play California State University San Bernardino on December 18, and the University of Denver on December 19.




Senior point guard Marc Hostetter



MEN'S COACHING STAFF

USI Head Coach Bruce Pearl



In four seasons Bruce Pearl has brought the USI men's basketball program into the NCAA Division II's elite. Pearl's teams have a record of 104-19 (.846), making him the winningest active college basketball coach in America.

This past season, Pearl led USI to its second Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship in three seasons and reached the 100-win plateau against Bellarmine College on February 22, 1996. In his four seasons, Pearl's Eagles have finished as either the GLVC champions or only one game out of first.

In 1994-95, Pearl, the NABC National Coach of the Year, led the Screaming Eagles to the University's first NCAA Division II National Championship. Pearl's Eagles, who returned five players and had seven newcomers, also captured their second straight Great Lakes Regional championship, finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally, and had a 29-4 overall record.


Over the four years, Pearl, who at 36 is considered by many to be one of the brightest young coaches in the nation, has coached two players named national Player of the Year; four players named All-American; two players named GLVC Player of the Year; three players named GLVC Newcomer of the Year; and three players named first team All-GLVC.

In 1993-94 Pearl directed the Eagles to what was then their best season in school history (28-4) and finished the regular season ranked ninth. The Eagles earned a GLVC championship (16-2), a Great Lakes Regional championship, and played as a finalist in the NCAA II championship game. Pearl became only the second coach in GLVC history to be named conference Coach of the Year in two straight seasons, and reached 50 wins faster than any coach in USI history.

In his initial season, Pearl led the Screaming Eagles to a 22-7 record, a second-place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a 14-4 record, a berth in the NCAA Division II tournament, a final regular season rank of 11th, and received his first GLVC Coach of the Year award in 1993. The success of the team in 1992-93 was the biggest turnaround in GLVC history after inheriting a squad which finished 10-18 overall, 4-14 GLVC, in 1991-92.

Pearl, who also serves as coordinator of athletic development at USI, has spurred unparalleled growth in scholarship contributions to the Varsity Club. This fan support has revived basketball enthusiasm at the PAC. Attendance is at an all-time high as the Eagles expect to sell out half of the GLVC schedule.

Prior to coming to USI, Pearl was an assistant coach at the University of Iowa, where he was responsible for implementing full-court pressure defensive tactics. He also was responsible for the performance of Iowa's inside players, particularly the offensive and defensive post players. Coach Pearl taught many current pro basketball players, including Brad Lohaus (Charlotte Hornets), Acie Earl



(Toronto Raptors), B.J. Armstrong (Golden State Warriors), Kevin Gamble (Miami Heat), and Matt Bullard (Houston Rockets).

During Pearl's six-year stay at Iowa, the Hawkeyes received five tournament berths, one final eight appearance (1987), one final 16 appearance (1988), and placed eight players in the National Basketball Association. While at Iowa, Pearl helped head coach Dr. Tom Davis to a 129-63 record. For his efforts, Pearl was recognized in 1988 as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by *Basketball Weekly*.

Upon leaving Iowa, Pearl ended 14 years as an assistant and right-hand man to Dr. Davis. Prior to joining Davis at Iowa, Pearl was Davis' assistant coach (1982-83) and an associate head coach (1983-86) at Stanford University. As an undergraduate, Pearl was Davis' administrative assistant at Boston College (1978-82).

Pearl received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Boston College in 1982, graduating *cum laude*. He is working toward a master's degree at Iowa.

Pearl and his wife Kim have two daughters, Jacqui and Leah, and two sons, Steven and Michael.

MEN'S COACHING STAFF

Assistant Coach Rick Herdes



Rick Herdes begins his fifth season at USI as Coach Pearl's top assistant coach. Herdes is considered to be one of the best recruiters in Division II basketball. This year's recruits are no exception. He also directs scouting and the highly successful Southern Indiana summer basketball camps.

Herdes came to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 record and three NCAA tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating on- and off-campus recruiting. He also was academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fund-raising events.

In 1991 and 1992 at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division. His 1992 team received the silver medal.

Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (Ill.) High School, where he worked for current Indiana University assistant coach Ron Felling. LHS was the Illinois Class A State Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68-game winning streak.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education. He is completing a master's in secondary education at USI.


As a player, Herdes led Lincoln Trail College to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.







At Iowa Davis was co-author of "Pressure Defense" with his father, scouted opposing teams, and helped in the recruiting process and at basketball camps.


In 1995, Davis received a bachelor's degree from Iowa and is pursuing a master's in liberal studies at USI.

ABOUT USI

The University of Southern Indiana endeavors to improve access to higher education and to serve the economic, intellectual, and cultural needs of southern Indiana. Established in 1965, the University of Southern Indiana serves over 7,750 students, of which 90 percent are from Indiana.

USI is located seven miles west of downtown Evansville. The natural beauty of the University is a significant feature of the campus. Located on 300 acres of gently rolling hills, the University has eight main buildings.

Academic programs in over 60 majors are offered in the School of Business, the School of Education and Human Services, the School of Liberal Arts, the School of Science and Engineering Technology, and the School of Nursing and Health Professions.





PRESIDENT H. RAY HOOPS



A native of Illinois, H. Ray Hoops received his undergraduate degree from Eastern Illinois University and master's and doctoral degrees in Audiology and Speech Sciences from Purdue University. He also completed an M.B.A. degree from Moorhead State University.

His career as a scientist and educator has included a faculty appointment jointly at the University of Michigan and Wayne

State University. He published extensively and was nationally recognized for his contributions in the areas of rehabilitation of post-surgical patients with cancer of the larynx and in the analysis of the language of dynamics resulting from brain damage. Among his numerous publications in a variety of behavioral and medical journals was the report on a study which received the National Research Award, the highest honor of the American Speech and Hearing Association. Dr. Hoops also was named Fellow of the Association.

Administrative appointments included the directorship of Division of Marketing in the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. He received two national service awards for that work. He also was a Senior Fulbright-Hayes Research Scholar for the College of Medicine for the University of the Philippines. Other appointments included dean of Graduate College of the University of Northern Iowa, associate vice chancellor for Academic Affairs for the Oregon State System of Higher Education, vice president for Academic Affairs of North Dakota State University and president of South Dakota State University.

In the six years prior to becoming the second president of the University of Southern Indiana in 1994, Dr. Hoops served as the vice chancellor for Academic Affairs at the University of Mississippi. While at "Ole Miss," Dr. Hoops received the National Council of State Governments Association Award for his pioneering work on Project '95, a blueprint for the reform of education in the state of Mississippi. He also received the Peterson's Guide Award for contributions to the education of minority students in the innovative and highly successful graduate participation initiative.

Dr. Hoops and his wife, Linda, the director of training for the National Food Management Institute, are the parents of a daughter Victoria, an M.B.A. graduate of Ole Miss, who is a marketing professional for the trust division of an investment firm in Louisville, Ky.

STEVE NEWTON, ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Steve Newton, a native of Terre Haute, Ind., was named the athletic director in 1995.

Newton has brought new enthusiasm and pride to the University and the Athletic Department. With an emphasis on community service, he has directed the creation of the Eagle Math program for grade school students and The Letterwinners Club, for USI alumni athletes.

Newton also has placed an emphasis on assisting student athletes reach their full potential both academically and athletically. To help the student athlete, he has overseen the creation of new endowment scholarship programs.

Prior to taking the position at USI, Newton was serving as an assistant athletic director at the University of South Carolina. He was the head basketball coach at South Carolina from 1991 to 1993.

His duties at South Carolina included serving as the university representative for pre-Olympic preparations for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and the South Carolina steering committee for the Olympics.

Newton served as head coach at Murray State University from 1985 to 1991. During his eight seasons as head coach, he was 136-100 (.576). His Murray State team's best run in the NCAA Tourna-

ment was in 1988 when it defeated North Carolina State University before losing to eventual national champion, University of Kansas, 61-58.

As a head coach, Newton was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1990; National Association of Basketball Coaches District VII Coach of the Year in 1988; and led Murray State to four consecutive Ohio Valley Conference championships and post-season tournament appearances, 1988-91.

Newton received a bachelor's degree in physical education and master's in education from Indiana State University. A member of the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame Silver Anniversary team, Newton and his wife, Kathy, have four children--daughter LeAyer, and sons Harv, Jay, and Royce.
