
## HEAD COACH TONY COLAVECCHIA

Starting his third season, Head Coach Tony Colavecchia has brought a new enthusiasm to the USI soccer program. In his first two years, he has compiled a 29-14-1 record, been named Great Lakes Valley Conference Coach-of-the-Year twice, named the Met-Life 1989 Great Lakes Regional Coach-of-the-Year, and led the team to two straight GLVC titles.

Colavecchia came to USI after a four-year association with the University of Evansville. The Skegness, England, native was the director of athletics at UE's British campus, Harlaxton College. After two years, Colavecchia was transferred to Evansville where he served as an assistant coach to UE Head Coach Fred Schmalz. Colavecchia credits Schmalz with influencing his career. He feels that coaching at UE helped him gain support valuable to promoting the USI program.

The 31-year old coach holds a F.A. coaching license and a United State Soccer Federation B License. He has served as an instructor of the U.S.S.F. Region II Olympic Development camps, and is recognized as a coaching director for both boys and girls.

Colavecchia has played professionally and as a collegiate midfielder in England. He graduated from St. Paul's College, Cheltenham, England, in 1980 with a degree in physical education.



## **ASSISTANT COACH MOULTON CATO**


Former USI player Moulton Cato is entering his second season on the USI staff. Prior to returning to USI, he played for the CONCACAF and Canadian National Team.

Cato was born in St. Vincent, West Indies, and raised in Birmingham, England where he developed as a player. He was USI's team captain, for three years including the 1982 NCAA playoff team defeated by Oakland, 1-0. He graduated in 1985 with a degree in communications and earned his master's degree at Western Kentucky University while serving as an assistant coach.



During Cato's playing days at USI, he was a honorable mention All-American and was selected as both an All-Region and All-GLVC player.

Cato is responsible for coordinates the fitness program and assists in monitoring the players' academic progress.



## **ASSISTANT COACH ROB SCHOENSTEIN**

Assistant Coach Rob Schoenstein enters his second season at USI after moving from the high school to the collegiate level.

Schoenstein, a graduate of St. Louis High School who is completing an accounting degree at USI, has a soccer pedigree that is an asset to the USI program. He was an All-State performer in high school, captain of the 1985 University of Evansville team which went to the semi-finals of the NCAA tournament, and the sixth career scorer in UE history.

Schoenstein coached at Mater Dei High School for three years and assisted with the Memorial girls' program. He also has taught at the USI and UE soccer camps.

## 1990 UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA SOCCER OUTLOOK

When the University of Southern Indiana soccer team takes the field in 1990, they will be looking for the right chemistry to defend their seventh Great Lakes Valley Championship in ten years and gain a berth in the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Head Coach Tony Colavecchia has 16 players returning from the 1989-90 squad (seven players from Evansville) which won its second consecutive GLVC title last year and has added 13 new players (four from Evansville) this season. To win another GLVC title and go on to the NCAA playoffs, Colavecchia will have to find the right combination of talent to win while playing one of the toughest schedules USI has ever had.

USI will begin the season at Strassweg Field, with the schedule at home being just as tough as it is on the road. USI will host Division II powers such as the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg, University of Missouri-St. Louis and NAIA power Sangamon State University.

On the road this season, USI will be playing Oakland University (Michigan), Lock Haven University and the University of North Carolina-Greensboro, all NCAA playoff teams a year ago.

"The early part of our schedule will highlight our strengths and weaknesses as we compete with some of the top Division II schools. We are pleased to incorporate a large number of Central Region teams which hopefully will gain national recognition for us in 1990," said Colavecchia. "The unfortunate part of the schedule is that we play 11 games on the road.

## GOALKEEPING

To start a good team, Colavecchia says, "You must build a team from the back and have as much consistency up the middle on offensive and defensive positions as possible."

In goal, 5-9 senior Matt Blauvelt begins the season as the starter. Last season, Blauvelt started all 24 games for USI, had a 1.05 goals against average and set a USI record for shutouts in a single season with eight. Over his career, he has 13.

Although Blauvelt comes into the season as the starter, he will be challenged for the position by two young goalies, 5-11 sophomore Jim Morrow and 5-11 freshman Larry Nohalty. Morrow enters his second season at USI with improved skill and valuable experience from last season when he combined with Blauvelt on two shutouts. Nohalty comes in with a 32-9 career record at Holy Cross High School in Jeffersonville, Ind. where he had a 0.72 GAA and 23 career shutouts.

## DEFENSE

Defense for the Eagles may be in question, with the departure of All-Central Region sweeper Kevin Swords. Colavecchia said, "Last season, we had more mental lapses than the previous year and at times we appeared to lack speed in the covering positions."

"We also were playing someone new (Swords) at sweeper which led to problems in developing a tight unit."

Leading the returning backs is 6-2 sophomore Shane Gibson at the stopper position. Gibson started last season at forward and was able to score 12 points on four goals and four assists.

Also returning at the outside back position is 5-9 senior Scott Hehr, who also had 12 points on five goals and two assists, while 5-10 sophomore Brad Schultheis, an All-Great Lakes Valley Conference performer a year ago, again will see time on defense.

"We have a number of players who will compete for the outside back positions," said Colavecchia. "The obvious choice is Gibson at stopper, but the dilemma is who is experienced enough to play at the sweeper position."

"The solution may be found in the pre-season or early in the year, but it will have to be as soon as possible so adjustments can be made. Prime candidates are Robert Bennett and Mark Schlachter."

Bennett, a 5-8 senior who played in just about every position except goalkeeper last season, had a goal and three assists, while Schlachter, a 6-0 freshman, brings to the USI backfield a wealth of experience from playing in state select soccer programs.

## **MIDFIELD**

"One of the deepest and strongest positions on the USI team is the midfield," Colavecchia said. "We have a glutton of midfield players all who are capable of playing orthodox situations and are good in one-on-one offensive and defensive situations."

Returning at wide midfield is 1989 leading scorer Chris King, a 5-7 senior. Joining King at wide midfield could be Troy Pemberton, a 5-11 sophomore transfer from Louisville and 5-4 freshman Vincent Houben.

King, who ranked 30th in the nation in Division II, led the team in scoring last season with 30 points with eight goals and ranked sixth in the nation with 14 assists.

At center midfield will be 5-8 freshman John Hamilton. "He will be a new dimension up the middle. I think he will orchestrate the play of the team from midfield," said Colavecchia.

## **FORWARD**

Last season the Eagles had little trouble attacking the goal of some of the top Division II teams in the nation, but their problem was taking advantage of situations and putting the ball in the net.

Leading the returning strikers is 5-11 junior Eric Schoenstein, who led the Eagles with nine goals last year and All-Central Region and All-GLVC performer Travis Marx, a 5-11 sophomore.

Marx was the second leading scorer of a year ago with 22 points on six goals and 10 assists, which ranked 16th in the nation.

"By pushing King to midfield, we hope to add scoring punch, but we still need a legitimate goal scorer. Schoenstein is a consistent player, although he has a lack of individual flair in creating chances for himself. He is an effective team player," said Colavecchia.

"We still are searching for the right chemistry in our front players to complement the attacking flair of the midfield," he added.

Returns for his senior season at USI after a 15-8-1 record a year ago...holds the USI career record for shutouts in a year with eight last season and 13 over a career...started all 24 games last season for USI and had a 1.05 goals against average...majoring in communications.

**Coach's Comment:** "One of the best goalkeepers I've seen in a one-on-one situation. He needs to be more assertive on crosses and consistency in kicking the ball. His leadership will be an important factor."

Saw limited action last season in four games and combined with Blauvelt in two shutouts...was All-MAC in 1986 and 1988 at Bennett High School...majoring in business administration.

**Coach's Comment:** "Morrow is the most improved player of all the returners. He had an impressive spring and diligently worked on his weakness in distribution. This season he will be a legitimate contender for the starting role."

**Coach's Comment:** "He was plagued by injuries last season. He has the potential to organize USI defensively. Bennett needs more consistency in his performances to become a real factor."


