**OFFICE CONSOLIDATION PLANS DURING HOLIDAY PERIOD.** The Evansville Campus has been notified that a gas curtailment of 35 to 40% is probable during the winter months. Near completion is the installation of an electric boiler to be used to provide heating whenever curtailment is in effect. The cost of providing heat with electricity will be approximately four times greater than with gas; therefore, the use of the electric boiler only in emergency situations is planned.

The following plans will be used to conserve the maximum availability of campus gas allocation for days when classes are scheduled: During the regularly scheduled holiday period of December 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 31, January 1, and 2, the University will be closed and heat will be reduced to a minimum in all buildings. On December 28, 29, and 30 all offices will be consolidated into the Administration Building and Library. Other areas will remain unheated. The Vice Presidents and respective administrative heads will coordinate work station locations.

University personnel are encouraged to take vacation or convenience day time off. Such plans should be arranged with the immediate administrator or supervisor as soon as possible in order to facilitate work station assignments.
