SEASON OUTLOOK 2005 MEN'S SOCCER

The University of Southern Indiana men's soccer team is looking for the "bounce" in 2005.

After making the GLVC Tournament in 2002 and 2003, the 2004 season did not go the way the Screaming Eagles wanted it to, finishing the year 2-15-1 overall and 1-9-0 in the GLVC. Now USI is looking to rebound back into the GLVC tournament this year.

After having 13 newcomers on last year's team, USI Head Coach **Dan Hogan** leads an experienced squad into the fall campaign.

DEFENSE:

The Eagles' defense begins with senior goalkeeper **Kyle Penick** and junior sweeper **Brian Shepherd.**

Penick, the 2002 GLVC Freshman of the Year, struggled with injuries last season and had a 2.16 GAA in 14 matches. He ranks fourth all-time at USI with 11 shutouts and has a career record of 22-22-1 in 45 starts.

Joining Penick between the posts are freshmen **Jake Bryan** and **Adam Churchill**. Bryan, who could be the tallest goalkeeper in the history of the men's soccer program at six feet-five inches, comes to USI from Portage High School. He won seven letters in soccer and basketball at PHS.

Churchill travels to USI from Warsaw Community High School. The four-year varsity player at WHS was a two-time first team All-Conference performer and the MSRA Northern Indiana Goalkeeper of the Year. He also was the South Bend Tribune Most Valuable Player as a senior and led the IHSAA in goalkeeping in 2003 and 2004.

As a senior, Churchill started 19 matches and produced nine shutouts and a 0.65 goals against average in leading WHS to the Northern Lakes Conference championship.

Shepherd, the team captain, is joined in front of the goal by returning starters **Billy Moore**, a senior, and **Matt Vossmer**, a sophomore. Off the bench, junior **Tim Leavell** and sophomore **Cory Hendon** will be looked to contribute valuable minutes.

Shepherd was very successful at the centerback position despite a nagging preseason ankle injury and a season-ending head injury against the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

Vossmer and Moore started every game for the Eagles last year and will be counted upon for their experience in the back. Leavell and Hendon could see more action in 2005, after moving to the defense in 2004.

New to the back in 2005 is sophomore **Suleiman Khan**. Khan transfers to USI after spending a year at Lincoln Memorial University and helping the Railsplitters to the Gulf South Conference title.

MIDFIELDERS:

The midfield is the one position that could see significant change in 2005.

The Eagles return a trio of starters in senior **Jeff Slaga** and sophomores **Jason Blose** and **Evan Stoll**. In addition, USI brings back sophomore **Quinton Myers**, who saw limited action as a freshman.

Slaga is a four-year senior with a great work rate and could take one of the outside midfield positions. Blose saw a lot of action in the USI midfield as a freshman and has an above average pace and ability to cross the ball.

Stoll started 16 of 18 games as a freshman and will make the switch from forward to midfielder. He had a game-winning goal and had 12 points on four goals and a team-high four assists.

Competing for the open spots are four newcomers in junior transfers **Eric Brewer** and **Richie Maldonado**; and freshmen **Dan Grunewald** and **Tyree Robinson**.

Brewer played two seasons for Southwestern Illinois College where he earned All-Tournament honors at the regional tournament in 2004. He played for Granite City High School prior to attending SWIC and was the team captain in 2002. Brewer also helped GCHS to the 2002 regional and sectional championships.

Maldonado, who can play a multitude of positions, played last year for Western Nebraska Community College where he recorded six points on one goals and four assists.

Robinson is a two-sport athlete at Jefferson City High School, lettering in soccer and track. He finished his soccer career as an honorable mention All-State player in 2004 and was a twotime first team All-District and All-Region performer.

The Munster High School Most Valuable Player in 2004, Grunewald helped lead the Mustangs to three straight conference and sectional championships (2002, 2003, 2004).

FORWARDS:

Offensively, the Eagles return their top scorer from last season in sophomore **Michael Dugger**. Dugger led the team with 16 points on eight goals and had one of the game-winners.

To bolster the offense, USI has added three new forwards to the 2005 roster.

Junior **Brett Palazzolo** played two seasons for St. Louis Community College at Meramec after earning seven letters at St. John the Baptist High School in St. Louis, Missouri. He was a first team All-State performer and had 67 goals in four seasons for St. John the Baptist and was a teammate of USI's Brian Shepherd. Palazzolo also played in the North/South All-Star game as a senior.

Beginning their collegiate career at USI are freshmen **Mike Bendzen** and **Matt Long**. Bendzen was an honorable mention All-State and a two-time first team All-City performer at Harrison High School. He also was a two-time first team All-SIAC performer and was named to the IHSAA College Showcase Team.

A three-year varsity performer at Reitz High School, Long was the Panthers' 2003 and 2004 Offensive Most Valuable Player and led the state with 16 assists in 2004. The 2003 All-City player also scored 12 goals.

Long, who was coached at RHS by former USI soccer player B.J. Babb, scored 20 goals and dished out 26 assists during his high school career. He also earned Academic All-State and All-District honors as a senior and was named All-City and All-Conference the last two years. RHS was a combined 39-12 during the last three years.

Dan Hogan, *Head Men's Soccer Coach*

Head Coach **Dan Hogan** begins his sixth season at the helm of a USI men's soccer team that is once again soaring toward upper-division of the GLVC. Hogan, who is in his 17th season as a collegiate head coach, ranks 30th nationally in victories among active NCAA Division II coaches.

Hogan's Eagles struggled in 2004, but returns 12 players in 2005 from a squad that featured 10 freshmen on the roster. He had led the Eagles to back-to-back GLVC Tournament appearances for the first time since 1991in 2002 and 2003.

In 2003, Hogan's Eagles were 10-7-1 overall, finished second in the GLVC with an 8-2 league record, and were ranked in the top five of the NCAA II Central Region. USI's second place regular season finish was the team's best since 1991.

The Eagles began their two-year run under Hogan in 2002, producing a 13-8-0 overall record and a 7-3-0 mark in the GLVC. The squad also featured the GLVC Player and Freshman of the Year, a first-team NSCAA/adidas Scholastic All-American, a second-team Verizon Academic All-American, a second-team All-American, and four All-GLVC performers.

Hogan's second season saw the Eagles post a 6-10-0 overall record in an injury-plagued season.

In his first season at USI, Hogan directed the Eagles to a 7-9-2 overall record and a 5-5-1 GLVC mark in 2000, the best record USI had seen in four seasons. USI also returned to the GLVC Tournament for the first time since 1995.

In addition to his duties as men's soccer coach, Hogan is the athletic department's academic advisor. His tenure at USI has seen Screaming Eagle student athletes receive 150 Academic All-GLVC awards.

Hogan also coached the Evansville Alliance U-18 boys team and directs the Southern Indiana Soccer Academy. He served as a head coach for the Indiana State Olympic Development Program in 2002 and 2003.

A successful coach in both NCAA and the NAIA, Hogan has helped guide men's soccer programs at three different schools to a record of 162-139-12 in 16 years. Hogan's last position was with Columbia College (1991-99) in Columbia, Missouri, where he compiled a record of 122-60-8 (.653), winning two Show-Me Collegiate Conference and three American Midwest Conference Coach of the Year awards in nine seasons.

In addition to the team's success over nine seasons, Hogan's squads produced 17 NAIA All-Americans, 12 All-America Scholar Athletes, two AMC Tournament titles, and one AMC regular-season crown. He is the winningest coach in Columbia history and his 1998 and 1999 squads set successive season records for wins and winning percentages (1998: 17-5, .773; 1999: 20-5, .800).

Prior to coaching Columbia to three national top-20 finishes in the NAIA, Hogan was the head coach of Ottawa (Kansas) University for two years, 1989-90, and an assistant coach at Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State University) for three seasons, 1986-88.

Off the field, Hogan has a United States Soccer Federation "B" license and is the chair of the NSCAA Central Region Ranking Committee. He also has served as the chairman of the American Midwest Conference and the NAIA Region V.

Hogan is a 1986 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University with a bachelor's degree in communications/public relations.
