

Speaker to cover the history of tattooing in Southern Indiana

The University of Southern Indiana History Department will host former USI student, Clint Vaught, owner of local tattoo studio, Cross & Crown, at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, March 15 in Kleymeyer Hall in the Liberal Arts Center. The presentation, “Applied History: Tattooing in the Heartland,” is the first in the Applied History series. Vaught’s talk will focus on the history of tattooing practices in Southern Indiana and the surrounding areas, with a focus on tattoo artists working in Evansville from the 1920’s through the 1950’s.
