HPER BUILDING SCHEDULE FOR HEALTH MAINTENANCE AND RECREATION.

University employees and students may use facilities of the new Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building for personal health maintenance and recreation activities. A schedule for use of the building during fall semester has been established and is attached to this issue of University Notes.

According to Larry Shown, facility

coordinator of the HPER Building, the schedule is subject to change and the schedule for the aquatic area will be contingent on the availability of lifeguards. In the next two weeks, a 24-hour telephone line (464-1919) will be in service and will give up-to-date schedule information on athletic, intramural, health maintenance and recreation schedules.

In addition to the daily health maintenance and recreation periods for employees, Friday nights and Saturday mornings have been reserved as a time when employees, their spouses and children may use the facilities. Students may also bring their spouses and children during these weekend periods.

BUS SERVICE AVAILABLE. The Metropolitan Evansville Transit System (METS) has again arranged for bus service to ISUE beginning the first day of classes, Tuesday, September 2.

Riders can take a METS bus to downtown Evansville and transfer at 6th & Main to the ISUE bus. The return bus will depart from the ISUE campus to the downtown Evansville transfer point (6th & Main). Commuter buses will be available Monday through Friday.

MAJOR MEDICAL - DENTAL INSURANCE RATE INCREASE. The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States has notified the University that effective October 1, 1980, there will be a rate increase in our insurance premiums. This increase will be reflected on September 5, 1980 Clerical/support staff checks and the October 1, 1980 check for faculty and administration. The new premiums are as follows:
