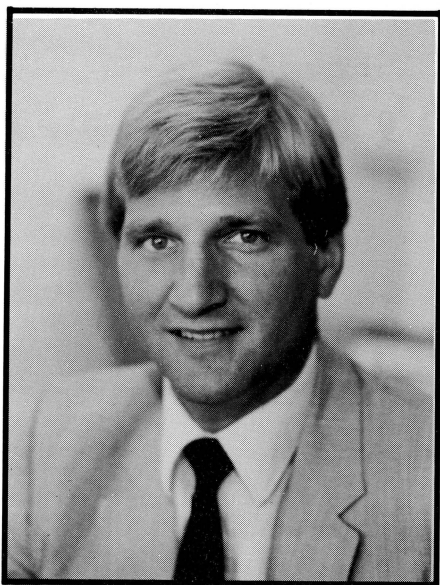

MARK BIAL

HEAD COACH

The 1986-87 season will be the second for Mark Bial as head basketball coach and athletic director at USI. Mark has been at USI four full seasons. He served as an assistant at USI three years prior to taking over for Mark Coomes. Mark has a broad, rich, and successful background to bring to the position. He was an assistant coach at Schlarman High School in Danville, Illinois, his alma mater. He was also an assistant coach at the University of Illinois where he received his bachelor's degree in 1976, and head coach at Northland College in Ashland, Wisconsin, prior to coming to USI. Bial is noted for ability both as a scout and a recruiter. Most notable among his scouting reports was the one which enabled the University of Illinois to defeat number one ranked Michigan State.

It was Bial who brought Stephen Jackson to the USI campus. Jackson already is the career leading scorer at USI and three-time all-conference pick. Bial and his staff again have had a fine recruiting year. Coupled with the returning lettermen, they have been tabbed by the coaches to finish first in the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

Besides holding a bachelor's degree from Illinois, Bial also received his master's degree from Indiana State University at Terre Haute Indiana. Mark and his wife Janet are the parents of a young daughter Brittany Louise.

If not, they will be held for pick-up at the ticket window located at the south entrance of the Physical Activities Center. Please, working credentials only.

SERVICES:

Working media are provided game programs, updated pre-game statistics, brief half-time boxes and a full official NCAA statistical summary following the game.

TRANSMITTING:

Anyone wishing telephone service at the press table should make his own arrangements. Commercial telecopier service is not available.

RADIO

Contact Bryon Swader for credentials and assignment of space. A space for a crew of two is allowed at each station.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS:

There will be a 10-minute cooling-off period immediately following the basketball game at which time the USI dressing room will be closed to both fans and members of the media. The players and the coaching staff will be available for post-game interviews after the 10-minute cooling-off period.

SCOUTS:

Passes for scouts should be requested well in advance. Since arena seating is at a premium, scouts are requested to sit along press row or in the second floor gymnastics area.

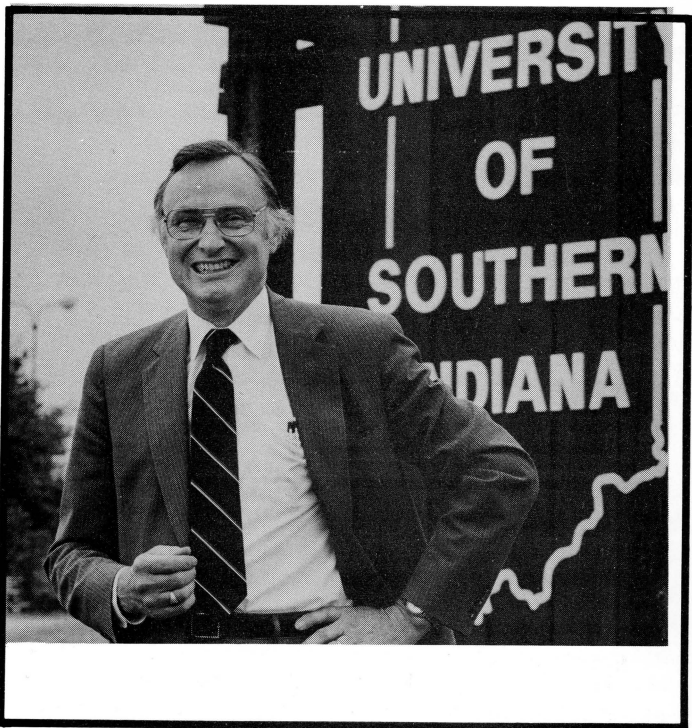

Message from Dr. David Rice

President, University of Southern Indiana

Today's universities which achieve distinction must excel in a variety of roles. Not only does the University provide an excellent education to students, but it also plays an increasingly important role in improving society. Through its partnerships with business, industry, government, social service agencies, and other educational institutions, the University has become a dynamic, or ever-changing, institution. It is both reactive and proactive — sensitive enough to react to changes in its environment and foresighted enough to cause positive change in that environment. The University continues to play many of its traditional roles as well as several new ones. It contributes to the cultural and intellectual well-being of the community it serves through lecture series, concerts, theatre, and the visual arts and it entertains through these events and its intercollegiate athletic contests and provides recreational activities and fitness programs. It trains and re-trains people for the changing needs of a technological and service-oriented work force. It enhances economic development through all these activities and other formal programs designed in cooperation with leaders of the many communities the University serves.

The University of Southern Indiana is prepared to meet the challenge of the future by anticipating change and assuming a leadership position. This is a natural step as the University completes its evolution to a comprehensive state university. It is reflected also in the way each of the University's divisions and departments are evolving. Each continues to refine programs, achieve greater goals, and serve a larger constituency with renewed dedication to excellence. In everything the University undertakes, excellence is at the forefront. On the playing court and in the classrooms, standards continue to be important. To become the best on the playing court or field as well as in the classroom, to exhibit the highest standards of personal conduct, and to develop leadership which enhances talent or physical prowess are the challenges we give each student athlete who participates in the intercollegiate sports program at the University of Southern Indiana. We reaffirm our commitment to excellence and salute the young men and women who excel in a variety of roles — student, athlete, team player, and leader!

A LEARNING EXPERIENCE FOR ALL

On July 1, 1985, the University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university. It provides academic offerings in baccalaureate and associate degree programs, and through the Evansville Graduate Studies Center, is meeting the public need for master's degree programs. USI also offers credit and noncredit continuing education classes, professional seminars, and special short-course sessions through the Office of Continuing Education and General Studies.

The University of Southern Indiana is accredited by the North Central Association and by other accrediting agencies for programs in education, engineering technology, and allied health.

It was originally established as a regional campus of Indiana State University, and opened its doors to 412 students at the Centennial School in September 1965. Today, entering its 22nd year of service, the school's enrollment has grown to 4,333 students and its academic degree programs now number more than 60. In 1968, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., raised funds to purchase 1,400 acres of land for the Mid-America University Center, with the first structure, the Science and Administration Building, opening its doors in the fall of that year. The Library opened in 1971, followed by the University Center in 1974, and the Technology Center in 1975. Officials proudly cut the ribbon on the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building in October, 1980. Constructed at a cost of more than four million dollars, the building accommodates a variety of instructional activities and services, and provides an on-campus arena for USI athletic events.

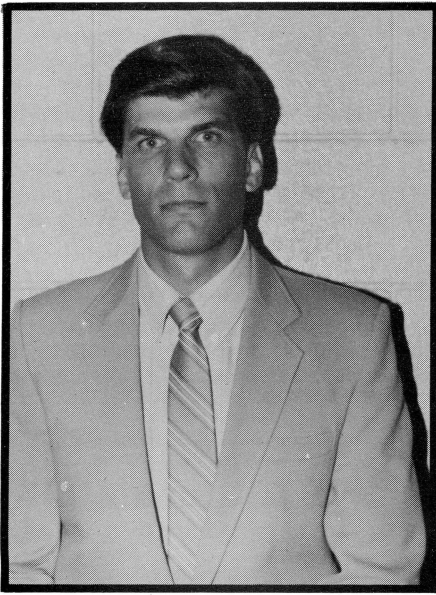

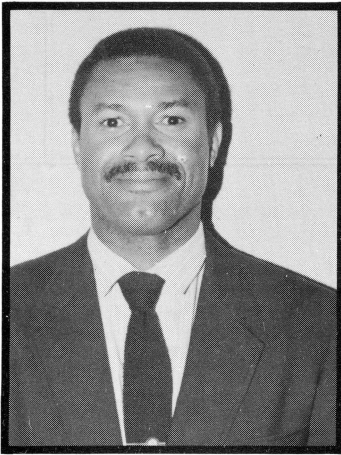

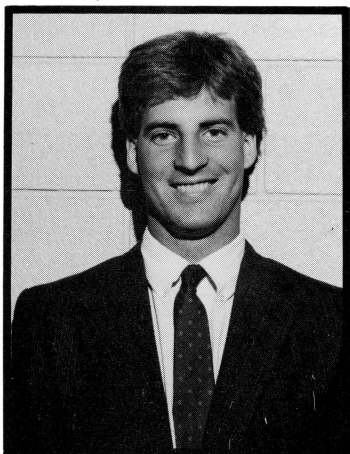
Randy is starting his first full season as a full-time assistant coach. He served as a student assistant the prior two seasons. A former USI player, Randy transferred from West Arkansas Junior College in Fort Smith, Arkansas. Randy made a strong contribution to the USI basketball program. His leadership both on and off the floor played a major role in advancing the program at USI. The Eagles with Curl starting made the NCAA tournament in 1978. Despite playing only two seasons at USI, Curl is still among the top ten all-time leading rebounders in the history of USI.

After two seasons at USI, Curl spent two seasons playing professional ball in Jarvenpa, Finland. Randy returned to USI where he earned his degree in Sociology. Randy will be working with the big men on the front line for Coach Bial, as well as recruiting.

Glenn Carlson is beginning his third year as an assistant coach at USI. Carlson is a 1974 graduate of Evergreen Park Community High School in Evergreen, Illinois. He earned a bachelor's degree in geology and physical education from Monmouth College in Illinois in 1978, and his master's degree in education in 1979 from Northwestern Louisiana State University.

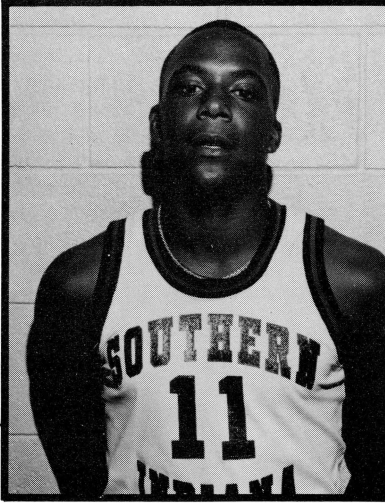
