USI BASEBALL OUTLOOK

Reloaded for 1996

Last season, the USI baseball team graduated one of the most successful classes in the history of the program. The class of 1995 produced three NCAA II Tournament appearances; two Great Lakes Valley Conference regular season titles; a GLVC tournament title; four players who are playing or played professional baseball; two two-time All-Americans; and five All-GLVC performers.

When such a successful group of players graduates, what is a coach to do? In the case of USI Head Coach **Mike Goedde**, who led the Screaming Eagles to a 29-23 record and their seventh consecutive winning season in 1995, the answer was simple, reload.

Goedde has 15 returning players and 15 newcomers to complete this season's roster.

The Eagles will compete in an always-tough GLVC, which will feature preseason ranked Saint Joseph's College (12th), Lewis University (17th), and Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville (27th). To go with a difficult league schedule, USI will be playing Columbus College, ranked seventh in the preseason, and Division I teams like Murray State University and Xavier University.

The Pitching Staff

The Eagles return six veteran pitchers in 1996 who will have to step up and produce if the team is going to be successful. The returning hurlers had a combined 19-18 record in 1995.

Leading the way is senior right-hander **Craig Shoobridge**, who was second on the team in wins a year ago at 5-4 with a 4.99 ERA in 13 games, nine starts. In just three seasons with four career shutouts, he is tied for first all-time at USI with Mike Fetscher (1992-95), Dennis Humphrey (1990-93), and Gene Whorl (1980-82).

Returning with Shoobridge in the starting rotation is junior left-hander **Kadish Evans**, who tied Shoobridge for second on the team in wins at 5-4 with a 5.10 ERA in 12 games and ten starts. Evans also was second on the team in complete games with three last year.

Looking to make major contributions to the staff in 1996, both in the starting rotation and out of the bullpen, are sophomores **Doug Allison**, a left-hander, and **Kyle Wagner**, a right-hander. Both contributed late in 1995 with Allison going 2-1 with a 5.64 ERA in seven appearances, including four starts; Wagner also was 2-1 with a 5.92 ERA in ten appearances and three starts.

USI will have some senior experience out of the bullpen. Senior right-hander **Shayne Stock** led the team in ERA in 1995 with a 2.57 in 21.0 innings pitched. He also had a 1-0 record in his first season as a collegiate pitcher.

Joining Stock out of the 'pen will be senior right-hander **Drew Durham**, who made 13 appearances for the Eagles in 1995, going 1-5 with a 6.75 ERA.

To give the staff some depth the Eagles have added five freshmen arms. From the right side, the Eagles have **Rudy Boals** (Howe, Ind.), who pitched for Lakeland High School in 1995; **Scott Fisher** (Connersville, Ind.), who pitched for Connersville High School; and **Peter Johnson** (Cambridge, Ind.), who pitched for Lincoln High School as a senior. On the left side, **Ryan Martin** (Evansville, Ind.) and **Jay Sparks** (Evansville, Ind.) join the team after pitching for Reitz High School last spring.

The Infielders

Around the infield the Eagles will return players in four of the five positions.

Junior **Kevin Irons** (Ft. Wayne, Ind.) returns and rotates between first and third base duties. In 1995, Irons had a career high .355 batting average and was second on the squad in RBIs with 45, while playing and starting 51 of the Eagles' 52 games last year.



Sophomore Jason Engelbrecht was the sparkplug for the Eagles' offense in 1995.

Senior **Korey Lamb** (Evansville, Ind.) returns for his final season at second base. Lamb, whose batting average dipped to .267 as a sophomore in 1994, bounced back to hit .367 as a junior with 20 RBIs. He also had a .952 fielding percentage in 145 chances at second base, including 13 double plays.

Returning at the hot corner will be senior infielder **Craig Carpenter** (Bel Air, Md.). In his first season with the Eagles, Carpenter hit .291 with 30 RBIs and 28 runs scored in 45 games, 44 starts.

Behind the plate, junior catcher **Andy Hoffman** (Evansville, Ind.), the first team All-North Central and All-GLVC performer, will be back to take charge. Hoffman led the GLVC in hitting with a .409 average, while knocking in 25 RBIs and scoring 24 runs. He also was fourth on the team with nine doubles.

Returning to fill the vacant shortstop position will be junior infielder **Chad Montgomery** (Wabash, Ind.), who saw time at both the second base and shortstop positions last year. In 30 games, 20 starts, Montgomery hit .317 with 10 RBIs and 22 runs scored. He also had six stolen bases.

From the 1995 squad, the Eagles can draw on some second-year players off the bench. Backing up Hoffman behind the plate is sophomore catcher **Rich Eycler** (Loogootee, Ind.), who hit .467 in 13 games, while freshman infielder **Jeremy Jones** (Evansville, Ind.) returns after being redshirted last season.

New to the infield squad will be freshman **Drew Bailey** (Evansville, Ind.), who attended Indiana University last season; freshman **Nate Betancourt** (Clarksville, Ind.); freshman **Jeremy Cook** (Evansville, Ind.), who played for Reitz High School last spring; and freshman **David Scheu** (Mt. Vernon, Ind.), who played for Mater Dei High School as a senior.

Joining the infielders and the corps of catchers is freshman **Steve Reed** (Clarksville, Ind.), who played for Our Lady of Providence in 1995. Reed could see action in the infield, behind the plate, or on the mound.

The Outfielders

USI has two-thirds of its starting outfield coming back to patrol the spacious perimeters of the USI Baseball Field.

Sophomore **Jason Engelbrecht** (Evansville, Ind.), who was named second team All-GLVC as a freshman, will return to centerfield. In his first season with the Eagles, he was second on the team in hitting with a .393 average while leading the team in stolen bases with 10. Engelbrecht

also knocked in 25 runs while batting in the lead-off position.

Senior **Sam Marx** (Evansville, Ind.) will move from leftfield to rightfield. Marx overcame ankle injuries as a junior to hit .281 with 28 RBIs and three home runs.

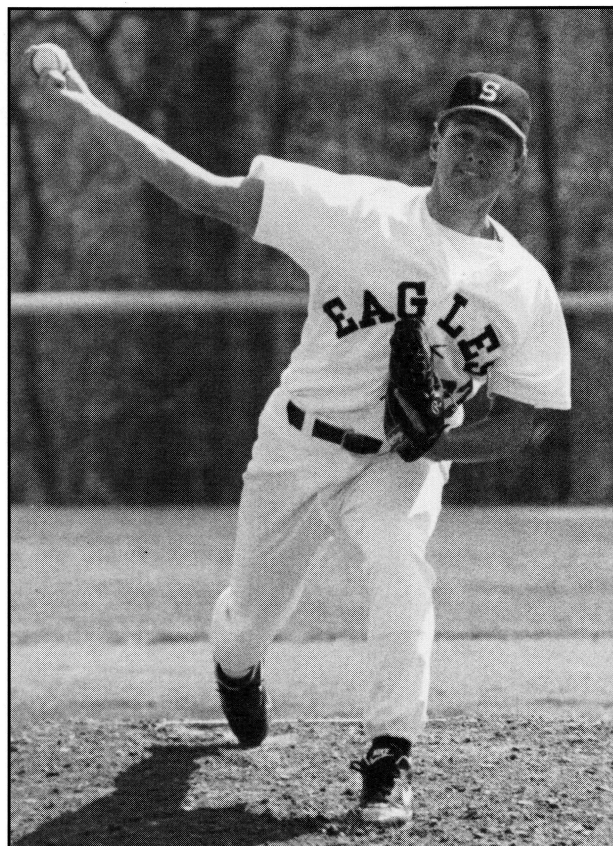
Returning to challenge for the final starting spot will be sophomore **Chad Ailstock** (Van Buren, Ind.). In 22 games last season, Ailstock hit .345 with eight runs scored and five RBIs.

Joining the team and seeking the final spot is sophomore **Kyle Niemeier** (Evansville, Ind.), who was a redshirt last season; freshman **Todd Chase** (Evansville, Ind.), who played for Central High School in 1995; and freshman **Jason Folz** (Mt. Vernon, Ind.), who played for Mater Dei High School in Evansville.

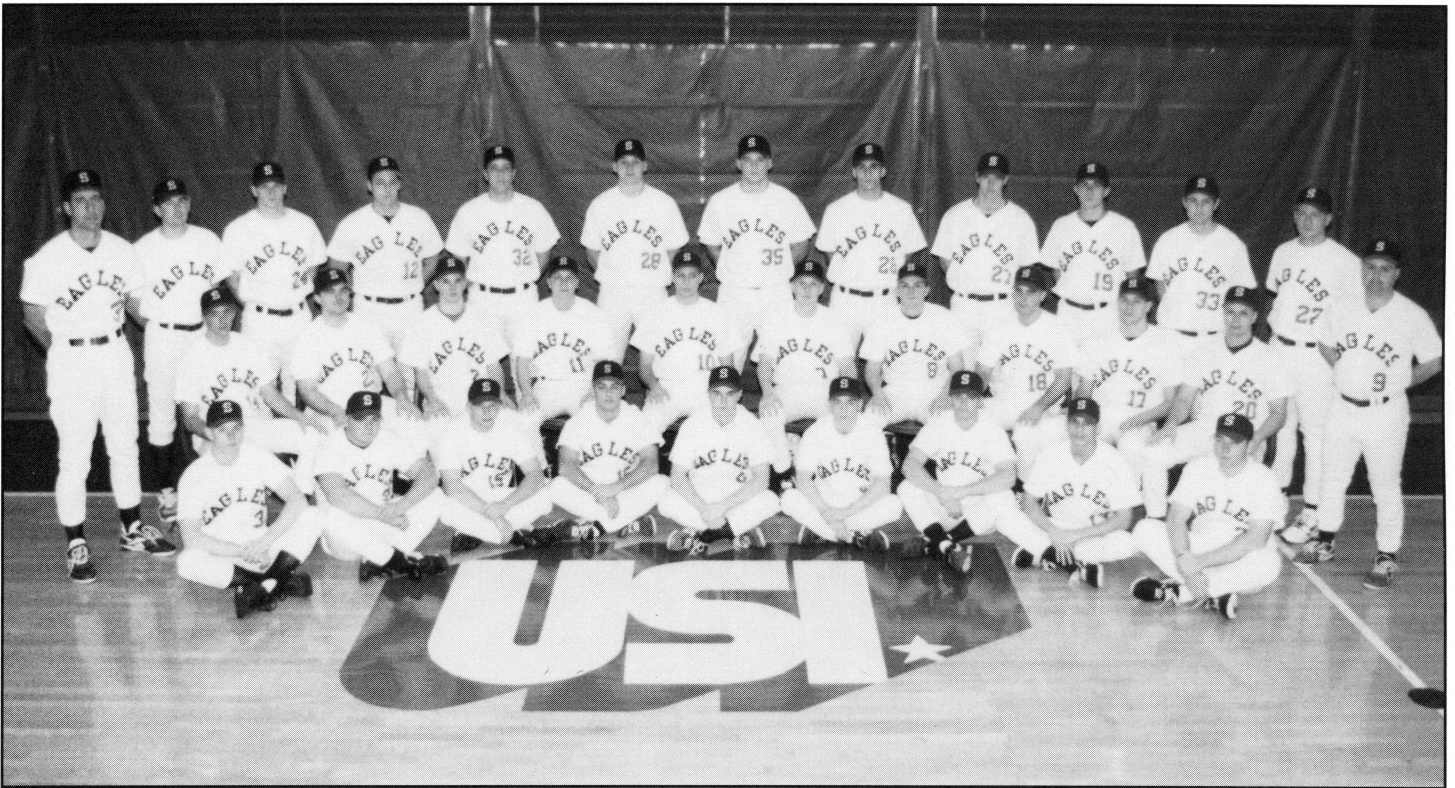

About the University of Southern Indiana Baseball Field

The USI baseball field became the permanent home of the Screaming Eagles 22 years ago and has seen outstanding players and great games. Today, it stands as one of the premiere playing surfaces in southern Indiana and the NCAA Division II.

Located on the USI campus, it has concession stands, media accommodations, seating for approximately 200 fans, and restrooms. In close proximity to the field is the Bent Twig Outdoor Education Center, a picnic/nature area down the left- and rightfield lines.

In the outfield, the dimensions measure 355 ft. down the lines, 375 ft. to the power alleys, and 385 ft. to dead center-field. The entire area is maintained by a computerized-underground sprinkler system installed in 1992. Behind the fence is a beautiful tree line which provides an excellent hitting background.

As the program has developed, so has the playing field. In 1987, two all-weather batting cages and a 15-ft. warning track along the outfield fence were added to the facility. The summer of 1989 brought resurfacing of the infield with a special blend of brick dust to create an all-weather field. Resurfaced in the fall of 1994, the brick dust is protected by a tarp which covers the entire infield. The tarp enables the Eagles to play and practice when most teams in the midwest are rained out.

The nine-inning scoreboard was added in 1993. It has high visibility and displays inning-by-inning scoring and current runs, hits, and errors.

During the summer, the field is home to the Funkhouser American Legion team which hosted the 1994 American Legion Tournament. The diamond became a practice facility for movie stars during the making of the movie *A League of Their Own* in August 1992.

Head Coach Mike Goedde

Mike Goedde is in his third season as head baseball coach at the University of Southern Indiana. He successfully led the Eagles to their seventh consecutive winning season at 29-23 last year.

In his first season, Goedde led the Eagles to a 36-19 record and berths in the Great Lakes Valley Conference and NCAA Division II Central Region tournaments.

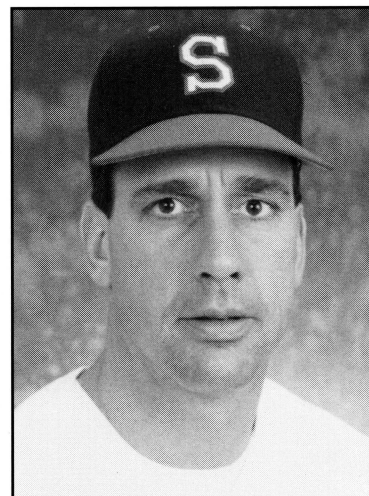
Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville (UE) under head coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993.

While Goedde was at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, who plays professionally for the St. Louis Cardinals.

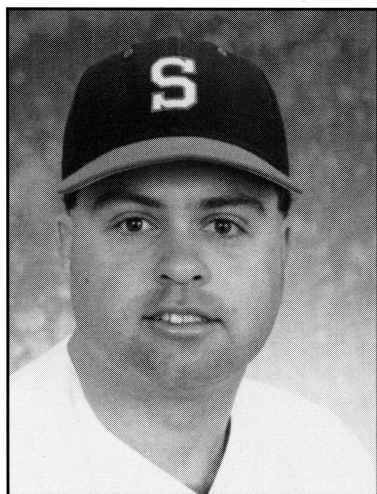
In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Cincinnati Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

The Evansville native graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Mater Dei High School.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is assistant intramurals director at USI.

Barney joined Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, Tenn. Prior to working at Tusculum, Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92) with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. While at both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund-raising projects.

Barney graduated from Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

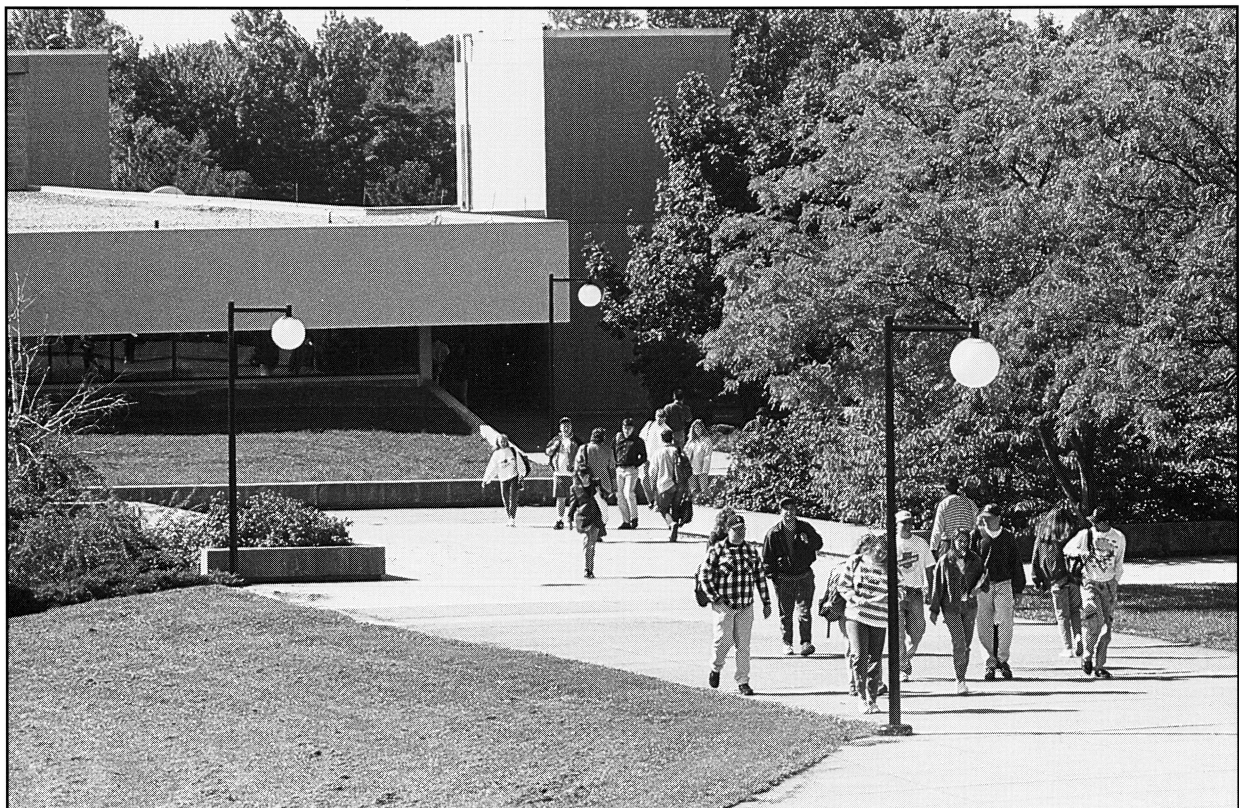
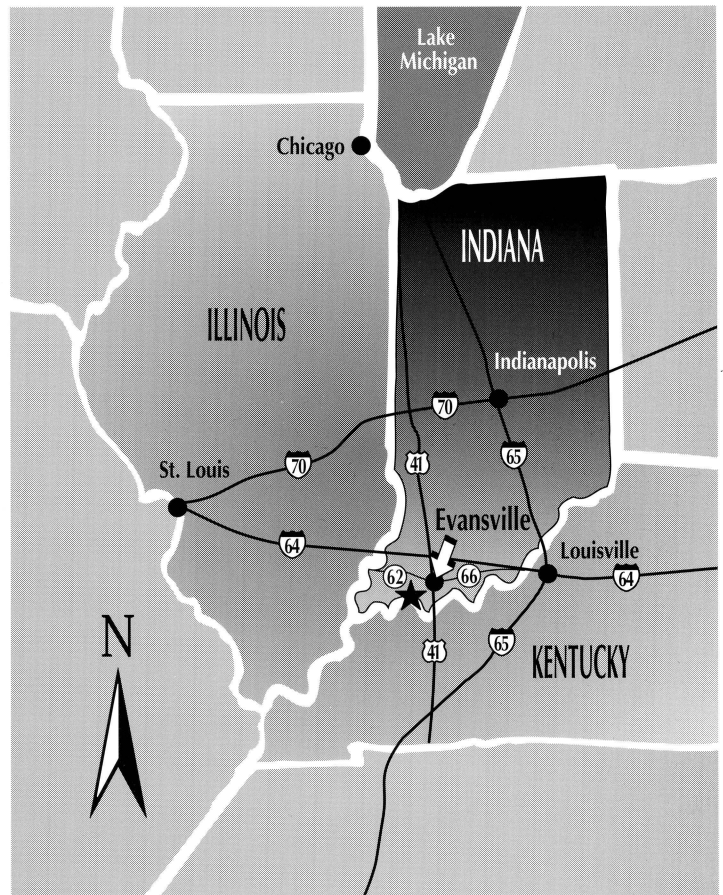
