Stepping into a newly created administrative post holds many challenges, and building an office and its procedures from scratch is paramount among those challenges. Fortunately, when ANN PADBERG joined ISUE in April as ISUE's first Director of Development, she found that some of the "foundation" had been laid for her through fund-raising activities of the ISUE Foundation.

ANN brings to ISUE her experience in development work at the Villa Duchesne/Oak Hill School in St. Louis, an independent day school, where she served as Director of Development and Public Relations. In addition to being responsible for the school's annual fund drive, she handled public information for the school and was editor of the school's community newsletter. ANN received her B.A. from Notre Dame College in St. Louis and continued her studies at St. Louis University and the University of Missouri at St. Louis.

ANN'S top priority right now is the capital campaign for the new Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building. There are some portions of the building which can not be paid for from State funds. It will be ANN'S responsibility to develop and execute a fund drive, which among other things, will allow ISUE to install bleachers in the multi-purpose activity area and to cover the swimming pool. "As plans now stand," ANN says, "The campaign will be divided into two phases. The first phase is the advanced giving phase in which we will personally contact key individuals and businesses in the community. In the second phase letters asking for donations will be written to individuals associated with the university."

ANN attended the Big Ten Fund Raisers Institute at Mackinac Island in August and came back to ISUE with renewed enthusiasm and new ideas for development. "My goals include contacting individuals in the community to cultivate their interests in planned giving programs at ISUE, and in the future, I hope to centralize ISUE's fund-raising activities and to establish a much needed planned giving program. In three to five years, I feel ISUE's Development Office should be first rate, but there will always be areas that need refining and new areas to incorporate into the workings of the Development Office," she states.

ANN occasionally "dabbles in art" and is interested in horseback riding and stamp col-



lecting. As a new member of the River City Civitan Club in Evansville, she will be working on public service projects with that group. A basketball enthusiast, ANN quickly points out that though she is not athletic, she is an "expert fan." "All four of my brothers were sports participants and I traveled around the countryside following my brother's high school and college career in basketball."

"I am looking forward to the opening of ISUE's basketball season when I can join the 'Blue Crew' in following the ISUE Screaming Eagles," ANN says.

CPS PREPARATION OFFERED AT ISUE. ISUE has been selected by the Evansville chapter of the National Secretaries Association (NSA) to offer a comprehensive program of study to prepare persons to take the Certified Professional Secretary (CPS) examination.

Offered through the Office of Continuing Education, the program of study will consist of six courses, one to cover each section of the national CPS examination.

The first course, Economics and Management, will be offered beginning September 18 for eight Mondays from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. It will be taught by Emmett Edwards, M.B.A., Assistant Professor of Business. The course will prepare students for Part III of the CPS examination, and includes applied economics, management principles and the elements of business operation. The management of personnel, finances, production, and marketing will also be examined.

The CPS course will be offered on a noncredit basis, although students will be evaluated and letter grades will be assigned. Continuing Education Units (CEUs) will be awarded for each course completed successfully.

In addition, persons who successfully complete all parts of the CPS examination and who have been admitted to a specific program of study at ISUE will receive 15 semester hours credit for the program.

Persons interested in enrolling in the first course should contact the Office of Continuing Education by Monday, September 18.

SOCIAL SECURITY INFORMATION. Employees are reminded that they may use a form available in the Personnel Office to check the accuracy of their earnings records in Social Security Administration's files. Employees who complete and mail in the form will

SOCIAL SECURITY INFORMATION (CON.) receive a statement of earnings credited to their social security account and can then check this amount against their own records. According to Social Security Administration officials, this action is advisable at least every three years so that any mistakes can be corrected. Workers, dependents or survivors will be paid social security benefits on the basis of their earnings records.

PERSONNEL DEADLINE FOR PAYROLL CHANGES. The Personnel Office wishes to remind department heads and fiscal agents that paycheck-related communications must be in the Personnel Office by Thursday noon of the week in which clerical/support or student worker time sheets are due in the Payroll Department. The deadline for receiving such communications will be firmly enforced in order to insure timely processing of necessary information to the Payroll Department. The deadline must be observed in order to avoid delayed reimbursement or deductions for employees.

Examples of communications due in the Personnel Office by Thursday noon are: W-4's or State Tax changes including address changes, insurance or Credit Union deduction changes, changes in pay rate or change of status of employees, changes of department and absence reports. Those involved in pay-related communications and who have questions are asked to call the Personnel Office at extension 1770.
