About USI





Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded on the banks of the Ohio River in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

The Campus

The Nursing and Health Professions Center, Science and Wright Administration Building, the Education Center, and the Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, the University Center, the Liberal Arts Center, the Technology Center, and the Business and Engineering Center, now under construction, form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation and Fitness Center, which is getting a substantial addition, are located east of the University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 3,000 students who live on campus.

Academic Life

The University enrolls 9,939 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

Campus Life


Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

Residence Life

The more than 3,000 students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suitestyle housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

Financial Assistance

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.



The University of Southern Indiana men's soccer team is looking to do the same thing in 2008 that it did in 2007 – double its wins from the previous year.

The Screaming Eagles doubled their win total in 2007 by producing on the offensive side of the field. USI scored 10 additional goals last fall, resulting in a 6-12-1 overall record, 3-10-0 in the GLVC. The Eagles also were an additional 10 goals away from moving three 1-0 losses, a 2-0 set-back, and the 1-1 tie into the win column.

To continue the upward trend, USI Head Coach **Dan Hogan** has 12 returning players and 11 newcomers to start the season.

FORWARDS:

Leading the Eagles' offensive burst last season was junior **Paul Hutchens** and sophomore **Dan Dormeier**. Hutchens is USI's second leading returning scorer with 10 points on four goals and two assist after posting just four points (one goals and two assists) during his first season.

Dormeier was a point behind Hutchens with nine points on three goals and three assists. He also had two of USI's game-winning goals in 2008.

In addition to Hutchens and Dormeier, the Eagles return senior forward Michael Bendzen. Bendzen did not get on the scoreboard last season after being plagued by injuries.

The Eagles have bolstered their corps of forward with the addition of freshmen **Simon Rawnsley**, **Shane Cloutier**, **Jordan Louks**, and **Rafael Jaros**. Rawnsley, who came to USI from Calderdale College in Halifax, England, practiced with the team last season and redshirted.

Cloutier, who played for the Chicago Magic club team, was an ISCA All-State performer at Lake Central High School (Saint John, Indiana) where he lettered in soccer and basketball. He also was the LCHS Offensive Most Valuable Player in 2007, in addition to being named the Post-Tribune and Northwest Indiana Times All-Area teams and earning All-Duneland Athletic Conference honors.

The Eagles add a large versatile player to the squad in 6-foot-6 Louks, who is capable of playing up front or on defense. Louks, who played club soccer for Dynamo Katner, comes to USI from Brownsburg High School (Brownsburg, Indiana) and help the Bulldogs to three straight Hoosier Crossroads Conference Championships.

MIDFIELDERS:

The Eagles are led in the midfield by sophomore **Michael Simcock**, USI's top returning scorer. Simcock had 11 points on two goals and a team-best seven assists. Two of Simcock's seven assists led to game-winning goals.

Returning to join Simcock in the middle are juniors **Will Reid** and **Kyle Leffel** and sophomore Justin Fox. Reid started 16 of USI's 19 matches a year ago and had one goal, while Leffel had three points on one goal, a gamewinner, and one assist.

Fox was fifth on the team in scoring with five points on two goals and one assist. He also had the game-winning goal against Kentucky Wesleyan College.

To complement the returning players, the Eagles have five new players for the middle in sophomore s **Jared Eaton** and **Austin Schall**; and freshmen **Trey Fosburgh**, **Caleb Johnson**, and **Danny Pratte**.

Fosburgh comes to USI from Collinsville High School (Collinsville, Illinois) where he lettered in soccer and track. He was the CHS co-captain in 2007 as a junior and helped lead the team to the Illinois State Tournament after dishing out the game-winning assists in the sectional and super sectional championship games.

Johnson, a two-time All-City and All-Southern Indiana Athletic Conference performer, scored 54 career goals over four seasons for North High School (Evansville, Indiana) and dished out 42 career assists. He led the Huskies as a senior with 45 points on 17 goals and 11 assists and was named Indiana Soccer Coaches Association first team All-District.

Pratte comes to USI from Hazelwood Central High School (Florissant, Missouri) where he lettered in soccer and baseball. He was the 2007 team captain and Most Valuable Player in soccer after scoring six goals, including three game-winners, as a senior. The All-Conference performer helped lead the Hawks to 2006 sectional championship, in addition to the 2006 and 2007 district titles.

DEFENSE:

USI enters 2008 with a strong base in seniors **Tyree Robinson** and **Dan Grunewald**. Robinson, who was named third team All-GLVC in 2007, started all 19 games for the Eagles last season and had one goal, while Grunewald played in all 19 games and had a pair of goals.

The Eagles also return sophomore Nathan Bower, who saw action in five matches as a freshman.

New to the USI backfield are sophomores **Justin Brotherton** and **Buddy Stoermann**. Brotherton comes to USI after one season with St. Louis Community College-Forest Park (Missouri) where he played in 24 matches and posted four points on one goal and two assists during his first collegiate season.

Between the posts, the Eagles have a pair of veterans in senior **Andrew Haley** and junior **Brad Cadden**. Cadden recorded a pair of shutouts in the final two matches of 2008, while Haley had his season cut short due to an ankle injury after going 1-3 in four starts.

Head Men's Soccer Coach

Head Coach Dan Hogan begins his ninth season at the helm of the USI men's soccer team and his 20th season as a collegiate head coach. Hogan's tenure has seen him direct USI into three GLVC Tournaments, including back-to-back appearances in 2002 and 2003.

In 2003, Hogan's Eagles were 10-7-1 overall, finishing second in the GLVC with an 8-2 league record, and were ranked in the top five of the NCAA II Central Region. USI's secondplace regular-season finish was the team's best since 1991.

The Eagles began their two-year run under Hogan in 2002, producing a 13-8-0 overall record and a 7-3-0 mark in the GLVC. The squad also featured the GLVC Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year, a first-team NSCAA/adidas Scholastic All-American, a secondteam Verizon Academic All-American, a second-team All-American, and four All-GLVC performers.

Hogan's second season saw the Eagles post a 6-10-0 overall record in an injuryplagued season.

In his first season at USI, Hogan directed the Eagles to a 7-9-2 overall record and a 5-5-1 GLVC mark in 2000, the best record USI had seen in four seasons. USI also returned to the GLVC Tournament for the first time since 1995.

In addition to his duties as men's soccer coach, Hogan is the Athletic Department's academic advisor. His tenure at USI has seen Screaming Eagle student athletes receive numerous Academic All-GLVC awards.

Hogan joined the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional committee in 2008 and served as head coach for the Indiana State Olympic Development Program in 2002 and 2003.

A successful coach in both the NCAA and the NAIA, Hogan has helped guide men's soccer programs at three different schools to a record of 167-151-12 in 17 years. Hogan's last position was with Columbia College (1991-99) in Columbia, Missouri, where he compiled a record of 122-60-8 (.653), winning two Show-Me Collegiate Conference and three American Midwest Conference Coach of the Year awards in nine seasons.

In addition to the team's success over nine seasons, Hogan's squads produced 17



NAIA All-Americans, 12 All-America Scholar Athletes, two AMC Tournament titles, and one AMC regular-season crown. He is the winningest coach in Columbia history and his 1998 and 1999 squads set successive season records for wins and winning percentages (1998: 17-5, .773; 1999: 20-5, .800).

Prior to coaching Columbia to three national top-20 finishes in the NAIA, Hogan was the head coach of Ottawa (Kansas) University, 1989-90, and an assistant coach at Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State University) from 1986 to 1988.

Off the field, Hogan has a United States Soccer Federation "B" license and is the chair of the NSCAA Central Region Ranking Committee. He also has served as the chairman of the American Midwest Conference and the NAIA Region V.

Hogan is a 1986 graduate of Northeast Missouri State University with a bachelor's degree in communications/public relations.

Carl Carr, Assistant Men's Soccer Coach

Carl Carr is in his first season as an assistant coach under Head Coach Dan Hogan after serving as the team captain in 2007. He will assists Hogan in all facets of the program.

Carr played two seasons for the Eagles, leading the team in scoring with 13 points on five goals and three assists last season.

During his first season, Carr battled through injuries to play in 13 matches. He scored his first goal as an Eagle in the win over Kentucky Wesleyan College.

Carr joined the USI squad after transferring from Martin Methodist College (Pulaski, Tennessee). He had four assists during the 2003 season.

Prior to playing college soccer in the United States, Carr lettered in soccer, tennis, and cricket at William Howard School in Bramton, Cumbria, England.

Owen McCarthy, Student Assistant Men's Soccer Coach

Owen McCarthy begins his first season at USI as a student assistant coach for the men's soccer program. McCarthy holds a USSF "D" coaching license after directing the southern Indiana district team of the Olympic Development Program. A former assistant at Memorial High School (Evansville, Indiana), he is a member of the Evansville Soccer Club coaching staff.

Prior to beginning his coaching career, McCarthy was a cadet at the United States Military Academy and was a member of the Army Division I soccer team in 2004-05. His collegiate soccer career was cut short after his freshman season due to injury.

McCarthy was the starting midfielder at the U.S. Military Academy Preparatory School (Ft. Monmouth, New Jersey) and spent a semester in residence training at the IMG Soccer Academy in Florida. He also trained in Brazil.

A Memorial High School graduate, McCarthy was a fouryear member of the varsity soccer team and was a part of the Tigers' 2002 IHSAA soccer championship. He also was a starter on the Indiana ODP State Team that won the ODP Region II championship.




