



ISUE THEATRE PRESENTS "SAY GOODNIGHT, GRACIE"
NOVEMBER 6 - 8 AND 13 - 15. The ISUE Theatre will open its fall season with a comedy by Ralph Pape entitled "Say Goodnight, Gracie" on November 6, at 8:00 p.m. The play, which has been called a comic portrait of a generation at its turning point, will be directed by Doug Hubbell, director of the ISUE Theatre and assistant professor of communications.

The play should appeal to audiences 18 years of age and older because it reflects the television generation at its turning point. The generation in question was raised on Ernie Kovacs, Uncle Miltie, Burns and Allen, Jackie Gleason, and Captain Video.

The author, Ralph Pape, has appeared in over a dozen productions in New York City for Classic Stage Company, Direct Theatre, Workshop Players Art, and others. He is currently writing the screen play for the film version of "Say Goodnight, Gracie."

Randall Pursley, an ISUE Theatre veteran, has appeared in "The Zoo Story," "The Lion in Winter," and "What the Butler Saw." He plays the character Jerry in this play.

Bob Branch, a freshman at ISUE, has performed the leading role in Moliere's "The Miser" and functioned as director of student productions while at Reitz High School. Bob plays the part of Steve in the play.

Bernadette Fife, who was born in New York, appeared in "Taming of the Shrew" and "Happy Birthday Wanda June" at the Indiana Repertory Company in Indianapolis. She also participated in improvisations with the Committee Workshop in San Francisco. She plays the part of Ginny.

Don Morrell, who plays the character of Bobby, appeared in ISUE's production of "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest." He is a DJ and the former owner of a recording studio.

Debra Martin worked with the Vincennes University Summer Theatre for two seasons and acted in several Illinois community theatres. She also acted in the Newburgh Community Playhouse production of "Finishing Touches" last fall. She portrays the character of Catherine.

The entire cast is comprised of ISUE students who are Evansville residents. Performances will be at the ISUE Playhouse, 3001 Igleheart Avenue, at 8:00 p.m., November 6 - 8 and 13 - 15.
