PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. On October 30, Dr. Jane Davis, assistant professor of physical education, will conduct a workshop at Purdue University for the Indiana Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance, on the topic of "Basic Stuff". One of several Indiana workshops, it is part of a national effort to promote "Basic Stuff", which is a compilation of research findings about why people physically move as they do. It is hoped this information can be implemented into curricula by elementary and secondary physical education teachers. Dr. Davis is the district coordinator for IAHPERD, and will, upon request, conduct local in-service training for teachers.
