ISUE'S 1979 HOMECOMING. Activities, displays, and entertainment precede the ISUE Homecoming basketball game Saturday, February 17.

ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY SEMINAR. Dr. Arthur Kantrowitz will be the speaker for Engineering Technology seminar on Tuesday, February 20, 1979 at 1:00 p.m. in A126. Dr. Kantrowitz is a Visiting Institute Professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, a member of the National Academy of Sciences, the National Academy of Engineering and the International Academy of Astronautics. He founded Avco Everett Research Laboratory in 1955 and under his leadership, helped in the solution of the critical problem of ballistic missile re-entry.
