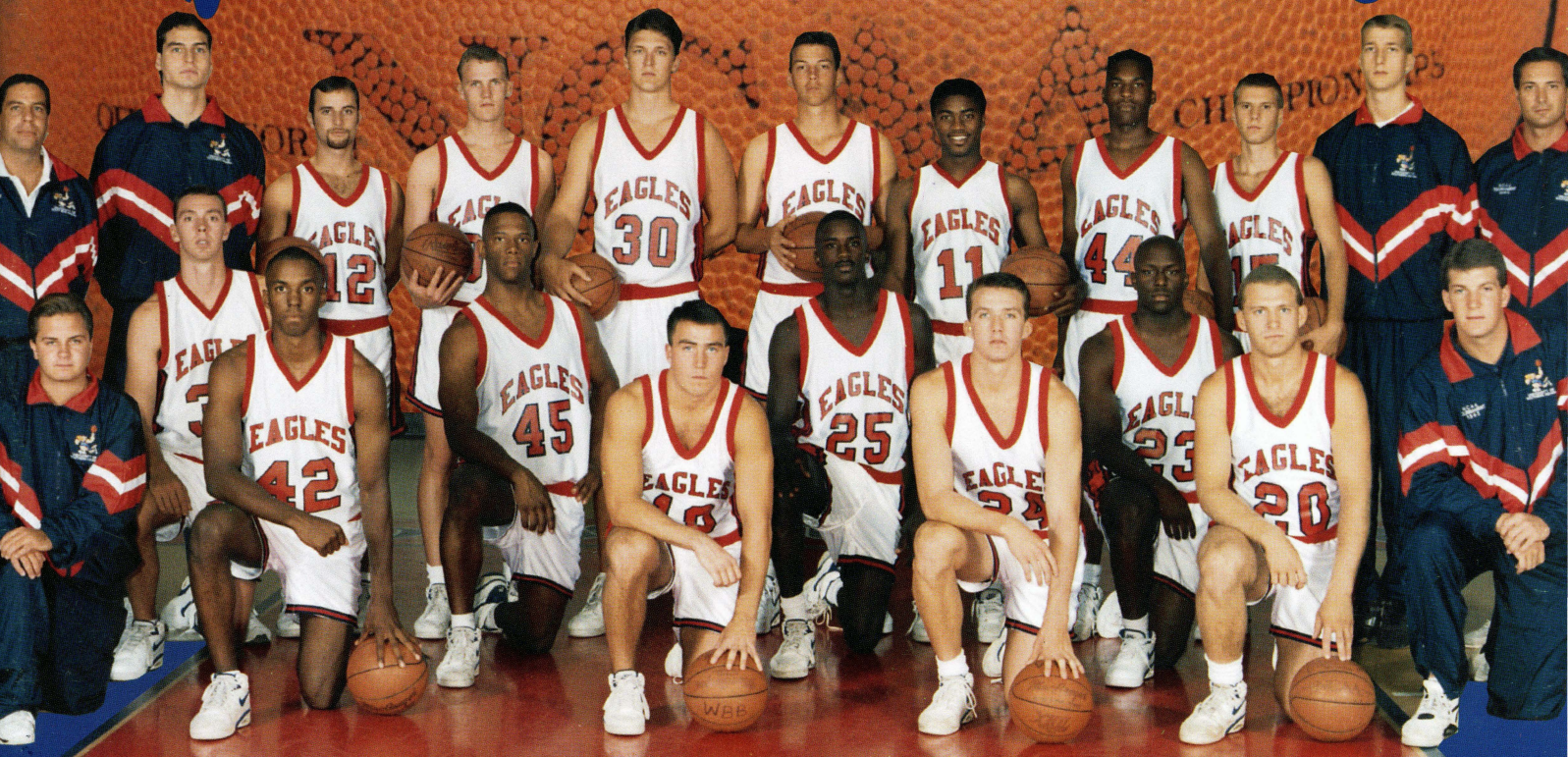

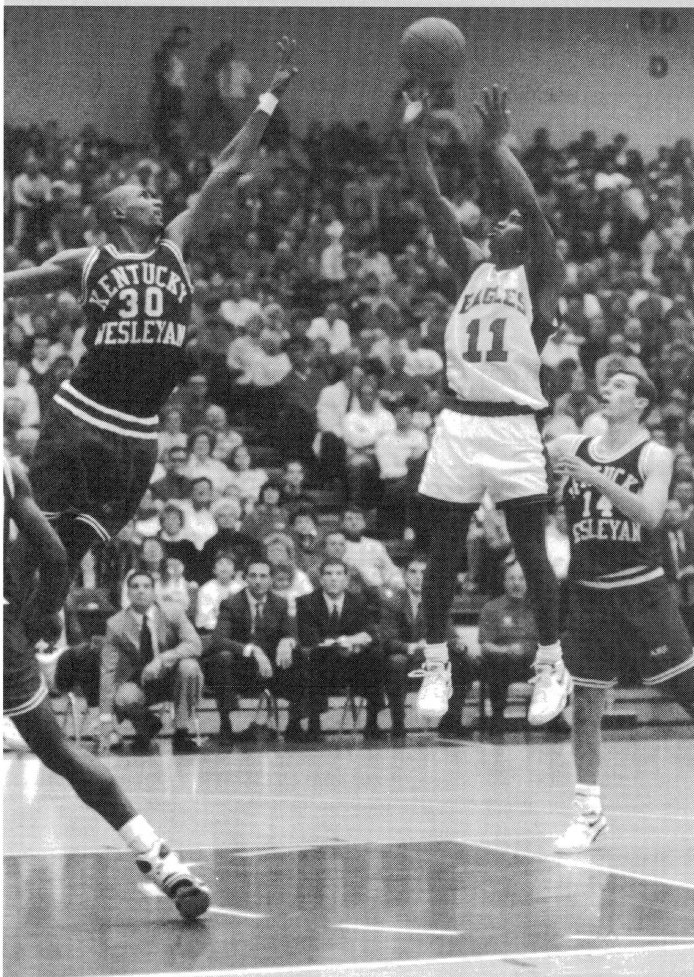

### IT'S A WHOLE NEW BALLGAME

In what could be considered one of the biggest turn-arounds in Great Lakes Valley Conference history, University of Southern Indiana Head Coach Bruce Pearl took the Screaming Eagles club with a previous year record of 10-18 to within one point of going to the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional championship game. With nine letter winners returning, USI will be a team to watch in 1993-94.

The Screaming Eagles, who are ranked as high as fifth in preseason, defeated three national top ten teams within a month during the regular season (Grand Canyon, a preseason seventh; Kentucky Wesleyan, second; and IPFW, fourth), and finished 1992-93 with a 22-7 record, the second highest win total in school history. A 14-4 record in the GLVC was good for a second-place finish, one game out of first. USI also finished the regular season ranked 11th nationally.

Pearl, who was named the Great Lakes Valley Coach of the Year in 1993, will have a veteran squad returning for the coming season with five starters back to do battle.

Leading the way will be All-American Chris Bowles, a 6-10 senior center/forward.

Bowles, who was named to three All-American teams—second team by *Basketball Times*, third team by the *NABC*, and honorable mention by the *Division II Bulletin*—led the Eagles in scoring with 20.6 ppg and in rebounding with 10.0 rpg. An All-America candidate again in 1993-94, he ranked first in the GLVC in rebounding for the second consecutive season and ranked third in scoring. Nationally, Bowles ranked in the top 20 in rebounding for the second straight year.

Tyrone Tate, a 6-1 senior guard, will be directing the USI attack on the floor. Tate, also an All-America candidate this season, was the GLVC Newcomer of the Year and second team All-GLVC performer, the only guard in the first two teams. He led the Eagles in assists with 5.6 per game, and was second on the team in scoring with 15.2 ppg. Tate, the high octane in USI's fast-paced offense and pressure defense, was second in the GLVC in assists, tied for sixth in steals (1.6 per game), and tenth in scoring.

Bowles and Tate are joined by returning senior starters Craig Martin, a 6-2 guard; Jeff Doyle, a 6-5 forward; and Todd Jones, a 6-7 forward.

Martin, a two-year starter for the Eagles, was named to the GTE first team Academic All-District V team. The USI Presidential Scholar averaged 10.3 ppg in 1993 and was named to the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic All-Tournament team after scoring 21 points in the championship game against Union University. He was second on the team in three-point field goals, 39.5 percent, hitting a team-high 45 shots from behind the arc.

Doyle and Jones could combine with Bowles in the frontcourt again this season. Doyle had his best season as an Eagle last year, and averaged 7.9 ppg and 3.0 rpg. In his second season with the Eagles, Jones was named co-Most Improved Player. He became a threat from the outside, hitting 39 three-point field goals (third on the team), and averaging 7.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg.

The Eagles also have youth with sophomores Shawn Aldridge, a 6-2 guard; Scott Taylor, a 6-4 forward; Neil Coyle, a 6-8 forward/center; and junior Stu Sheets, a 5-11 guard; all of whom will challenge for starting roles.

Off the bench as freshmen, Aldridge and Taylor made it into every game last season and were key ingredients for the tremendous turnaround the Eagles enjoyed. Aldridge became a force in driving to the bucket, averaging 5.1 ppg and 2.1 rpg. Taylor was a crowd pleaser with spectacular slam dunks and averaged 6.3 ppg and 3.4 rpg. Taylor was voted co-Most Improved Player along with Jones.

Another key to USI's season will be the return of Coyle. The sophomore forward, who is regarded as one of the team's better inside defenders, was starting to become a force in the GLVC before being hit by a season-ending injury for the second year in a row. Coyle had started his last eight games before being hurt, averaging 3.6 ppg and 3.1 rpg.

If the Eagles are to contend for the conference championship, much will depend on how the recruiting class fits in with the returning players. USI has a promising recruiting class to showcase in 1993-94.

Two junior college transfers, 6-5 sophomore forward Stan Gouard and 6-3 junior guard Brian Huebner, lead the recruiting class. Gouard was

a NJCAA third team All-American and Player of the Year in the Great Rivers Athletic Conference in 1991-92 at John A. Logan College. He averaged 19.0 ppg and 11.0 rpg as a freshman before sitting out last season with a knee injury. Huebner, who was the Newcomer of the Year in the GRAC and All-Region the same year at Olney Central College, averaged 17.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg last year. Both will compete for starting positions this season.

Freshman Marc Hostetter, a 6-2 guard He graduate averaged 13.5 ppg and 3.0 rpg as a senior. Hostetter is a fine point guard prospect and could push for playing time as a freshman.

Also joining the Screaming Eagles in 1993-94 will be 5-9 junior guard Ronnie Combs, who is transferring from St. Joseph's College, and 6-5 sophomore forward Scott Boyden, who transferred to USI from Danville Area Community College and sat out last season.

The Eagles will take on 25 NCAA Division II schools, the most ever scheduled by USI. The men's squad will host only one tournament this season, the Kenny Kent Toyota National Shootout, which combines two tournaments held the past four years — the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic and USI National Shootout. This year's tournament features Grand Valley State University of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Southwest Baptist University (Mo.), and Missouri Southern State University of the Midwest Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Missouri Southern was an NCAA Division II tournament participant and finished 21-10 last season, while Southwest Baptist was 21-7 in 1992-93.

The GLVC action will be as competitive as ever. The league will feature four 20-game winners from a year ago, including USI, Kentucky Wesleyan, St. Joseph's College, and IPFW. In 1992-93, the top five finishers had a record of 67-5 at home (USI was 16-1).







## USI HEAD COACH BRUCE PEARL

Bruce Pearl, in his initial season as the head basketball coach at USI, led the Screaming Eagles to a 22-7 record, a second place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, and a berth in the NCAA Division II tournament. At 33, Pearl is considered by many to be one of the bright young coaches in the nation. He had his efforts recognized by the conference coaches who named him the 1993 GLVC Coach of the Year.

Pearl, who also serves as coordinator of athletic development at USI, has in one year's time helped to spur unparalleled growth in the Varsity Club. This fan support, along with the creation of the Courtside Club, the student booster organization, has revitalized the enthusiasm for USI basketball.

Prior to coming to USI, Pearl was an assistant coach at the University of Iowa, where he was responsible for implementing full-court pressure defensive tactics. He was also responsible for the performance of Iowa's inside players, particularly the offensive and defensive post players. Coach Pearl has been given considerable credit for the success of current pro basketball players Brad Lohaus (Milwaukee Bucks) and Acie Earl (Boston Celtics).

During Pearl's six-year stay at Iowa, the Hawkeyes received five tournament berths, one final eight appearance (1987), one final 16 appearance (1988), and placed eight players in the National Basketball Association. While at

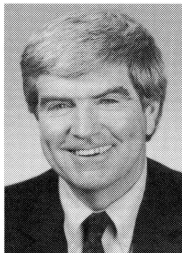
Iowa, Pearl helped head coach Dr. Tom Davis to a 129-63 record. For his efforts in 1988, Pearl was recognized as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by *Basketball Weekly*.

In leaving Iowa, Pearl ended 14 years as an assistant and right-hand man to Dr. Davis. Prior to joining Davis at Iowa, Pearl was his assistant coach (1982-83) and an associate head coach (1983-86) at Stanford University. As an undergraduate, Pearl was Davis' administrative assistant at Boston College (1978-82).

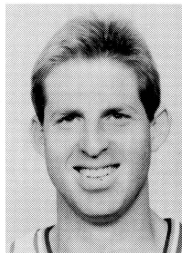
Pearl received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Boston College in 1982, graduating cum laude. He is working on his master's degree from Iowa.

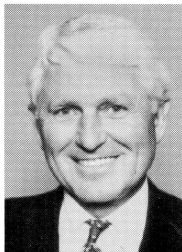

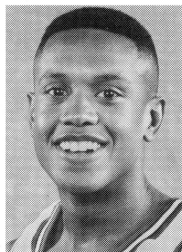

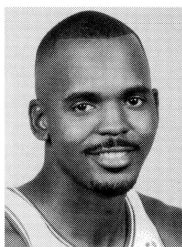

## ASSISTANT COACH RICK HERDES

Rick Herdes enters his second season at USI as Coach Pearl's top assistant coach. Herdes is considered to be one of the best recruiters in Division II basketball, and this year's class is no exception. He also directs scouting and the highly successful Bruce Pearl Summer Basketball Camps.

Herdes came to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 record and three NCAA tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating on- and off-campus recruiting. He also was academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fund-raising events.

While at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division, in 1991 and 1992. His 1992 team received the silver medal.

Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (Ill.) High School, where he worked for current Indiana University assistant coach Ron Felling. LHS was the Illinois Class A State Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68-game winning streak.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education. He is completing a graduate program in secondary education at USI.

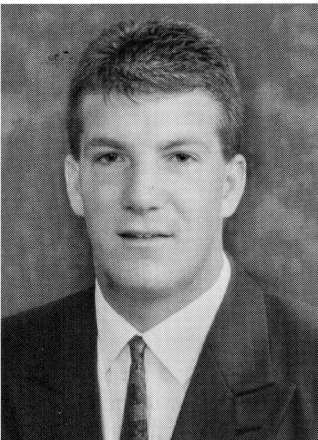
As a player, Herdes led Lincoln Trail to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.

Herdes and his wife, Lisa, have a daughter, Taylor.

## GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH BRENT BAKER

Brent Baker begins his second season as a graduate assistant coach at USI. His duties include academic monitoring, practice preparation, scouting, preseason conditioning and travel.

Baker came to USI with Coach Pearl from the University of Iowa, where he was a basketball manager for five years, the last two as head manager. He assisted in recruiting prospective student athletes, coordinated special events, assisted with team travel arrangements, hosted visiting teams and dignitaries, and analyzed game films and practice statistics.

Baker was the associate camp administrator for the Tom Davis Basketball Camp for three years (1990-92), assisting in the administration and coordination of one of the nation's largest camps.

Baker graduated from Iowa with a bachelor's degree in sports studies, with an emphasis in sports management. At USI, Baker is working toward a master's degree in liberal studies.

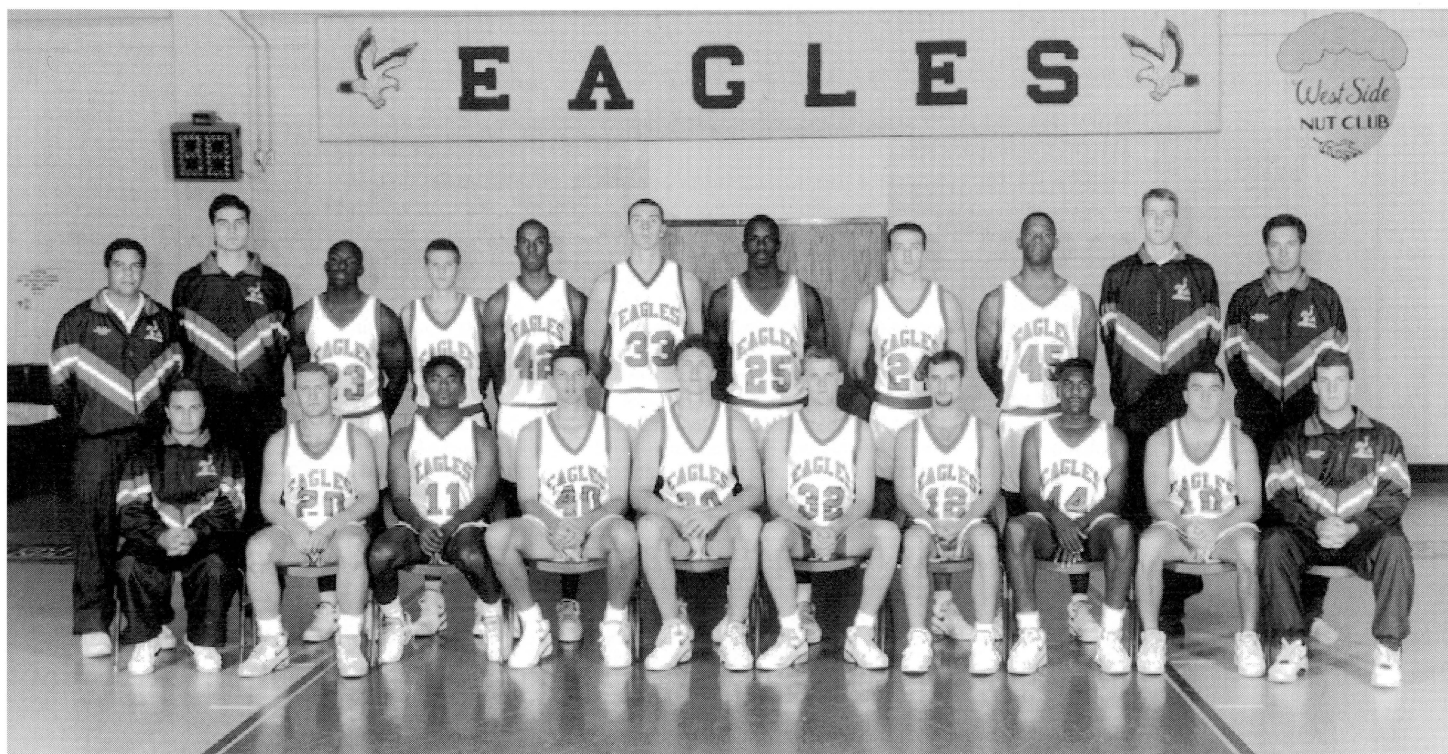

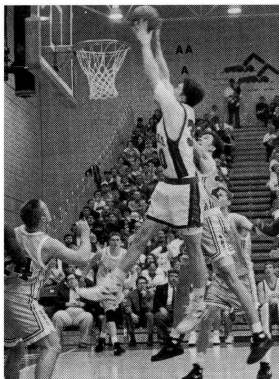




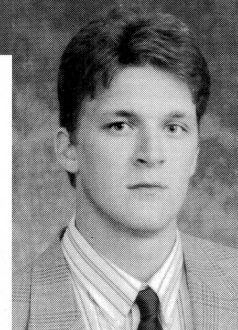
# MEET THE 1993-94 SCREAMING EAGLES

## CHRIS BOWLES

**6'10" ...225...Forward/Center...Senior...Madisonville, Ky.**  
**MAJOR: Communications**



**1992-93:** USI's team leader the past two seasons...was named to three All-American teams (second team by *Basketball Times*, third team by NABC and honorable mention by *Division II Bulletin*), the first since 1981 when John Hollinden made more than one All-American list...also was named to the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Region All-Tournament team, first team All-Great Lakes Region, first team All-GLVC (for the third straight year), Academic All-GLVC, GLVC Player of the Week, twice, and the USI Most Valuable Player for the second straight season...led the Eagles in scoring and rebounding with 20.6 ppg to rank third in the GLVC, and 10.0 rpg to rank first in the league, starting all 29 games...had a season high of 32 points and 17 rebounds on the road versus Lewis University...also had 32 points in the third game of the year against Union...was the Most Valuable Player in the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic and was named to the Executive Inn National Shootout All-Tournament team. **1991-92:** USI's Most Valuable Player...named to the first team All-GLVC, honorable mention All-American (*Don Hansen Weekly Basketball Gazette*), and to the Kenny Kent Toyota Classic and USI/Executive Inn National Shootout All-Tournament teams...started all 28 games and led the team, averaging 19.6 ppg (ranked number two in the GLVC) and 10.9 rpg (ranked number one in the GLVC)...pulled down a career and season high 18 rebounds versus Purdue University-Calumet and had a season high 31 points versus Quincy College. **1990-91:** Named to the first team All-Great Lakes Region, first team All-GLVC, the GLVC Newcomer-of-the-Year, the USA Today Player-of-the-Week for Division II twice and to the USI/Kenny Kent Toyota Classic All-Tournament team...played in 28 games, started 27, and averaged 16.4 points and 9.1 rebounds per game...had a career high of 45 points versus Northern Kentucky University (a USI single game record). **TRANSFERRED:** Came to USI from Western Kentucky University and sat out the 1989-90 season as a redshirt. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Was All-District, 1986-88, All-Region, 1987-88, and nominated for the McDonald's All-American in 1988 while at Madisonville North Hopkins...averaged 17 points and 12 rebounds as a senior at MNHHS. **PERSONAL:** Born January 13, 1969...hobby is fishing.

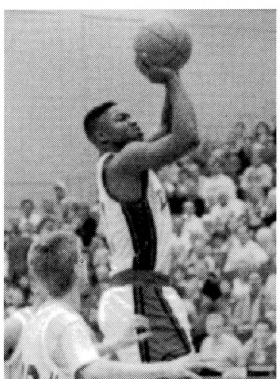

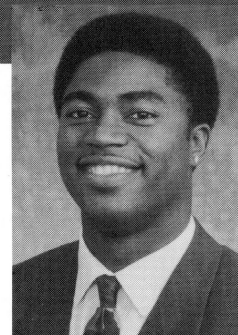

**1992-93:** A 1993-94 preseason All-America candidate who helped make USI's transition to Coach Pearl's offensive and defensive coaching style an easy and spectacular one...was named the GLVC Newcomer-of-the-Year, second team All-GLVC, and Executive Inn National Shootout Most Valuable Player in his first season at USI...started 25 of 29 games, second on the team in scoring with 15.2 ppg, tenth in the conference...led the team in assists with 5.6 apg (161 assists), second in the conference, three-point field goal shooting, hitting 40-of-94 (.426), and steals (46)...had a USI career high of 23 points in two outings, once at home versus then seventh ranked Grand Canyon University and once on the road at the University of Indianapolis...had a USI game and career high 12 assists at home versus Graceland College. **TRANSFERRED:** Transferred to USI from the University of Utah...averaged 4.8 points, 2.2 rebounds, and led the team in assists with 105 (3.0 apg) in 35 games, started 34...had career high games of 15 points versus Wichita State University and 10 assists, twice, versus the University of New Mexico and San Diego State University in 1992. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Played for Weber High School in Chicago, and averaged 25.0 ppg, 10.0 apg, 5.0 rpg...was named Co-Player-of-the-Year and to the All-City and All-Conference teams. **PERSONAL:** Born April 7, 1970...hobbies include swimming and

bowling.

# THE PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES CENTER

## HOME OF THE SCREAMING EAGLES

The Physical Activities Center (PAC), home court for USI Screaming Eagles basketball, opened in 1980. The PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, student recreation, and provides an on-campus arena for USI basketball and volleyball.

The PAC has a multipurpose activity area, a gymnastics and dance module, an aquatics area, physical therapy and weight-training rooms, four general classrooms, men's and women's locker rooms, and offices for educational and athletic personnel.

The multipurpose activity area is the building's most versatile section. It can support several activities simultaneously when the floor-to-ceiling curtains separate it into three teaching modules. Without the curtains, it can accommodate activities of a larger scope. Indoor intramural activities are held in the multipurpose area. The gymnastics and dance module overlooks the multipurpose activity area and complements the teaching modules.

There is an enclosed 25-meter swimming pool with one- and three-meter diving boards in the aquatics area. Weight-training and physical therapy rooms are important support components.

In the multipurpose area during spectator athletic events and public forums, chairback and bleacher seating for 3,000 people can be moved into place. The spectator capabilities were made possible through generous donations from businesses and individuals in southwestern Indiana. More than \$300,000 was raised by the USI Foundation in the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building Fund Drive in 1979.

In addition to regularly scheduled credit and noncredit classes, health maintenance and open recreation periods are available. Information on use of the building is available by calling at 464-1945.

The PAC also houses USI and community special events such as concerts, convocations, and commencements.
