Bob Harris will discuss "Who Shot JFK?" on November 18 at USI

The late President Kennedy was shot in Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963

November 22, 1998 marks the 35th anniversary of his death

Bob Harris, outspoken lecturer on government and public policy, will present "Who Shot JFK" at 7 p.m. Wednesday, November 18, in Carter Hall located in University of Southern Indiana's University Center. His appearance, sponsored by the USI Activities Programming Board, is free and open to the public. The author of Encyclopedia of the JFK Assassination on CD-ROM, Harris was nominated lecturer-of-the-year by Campus Activities Today. He is a political activist, researcher, author, and five-time Jeopardy champion.

Upon graduating from Case Western Reserve University with degrees in electrical engineering and applied physics, Harris was discouraged with job offers involving creation of military machines that kill people. He became a comedy performer and later created serious lectures and presentations concerning social and political policy.

In this lecture, Harris will offer his theory on the Kennedyassassination supported by declassified documents and the limited physical evidence available. His lectures are considered not only informative but also provocative.
