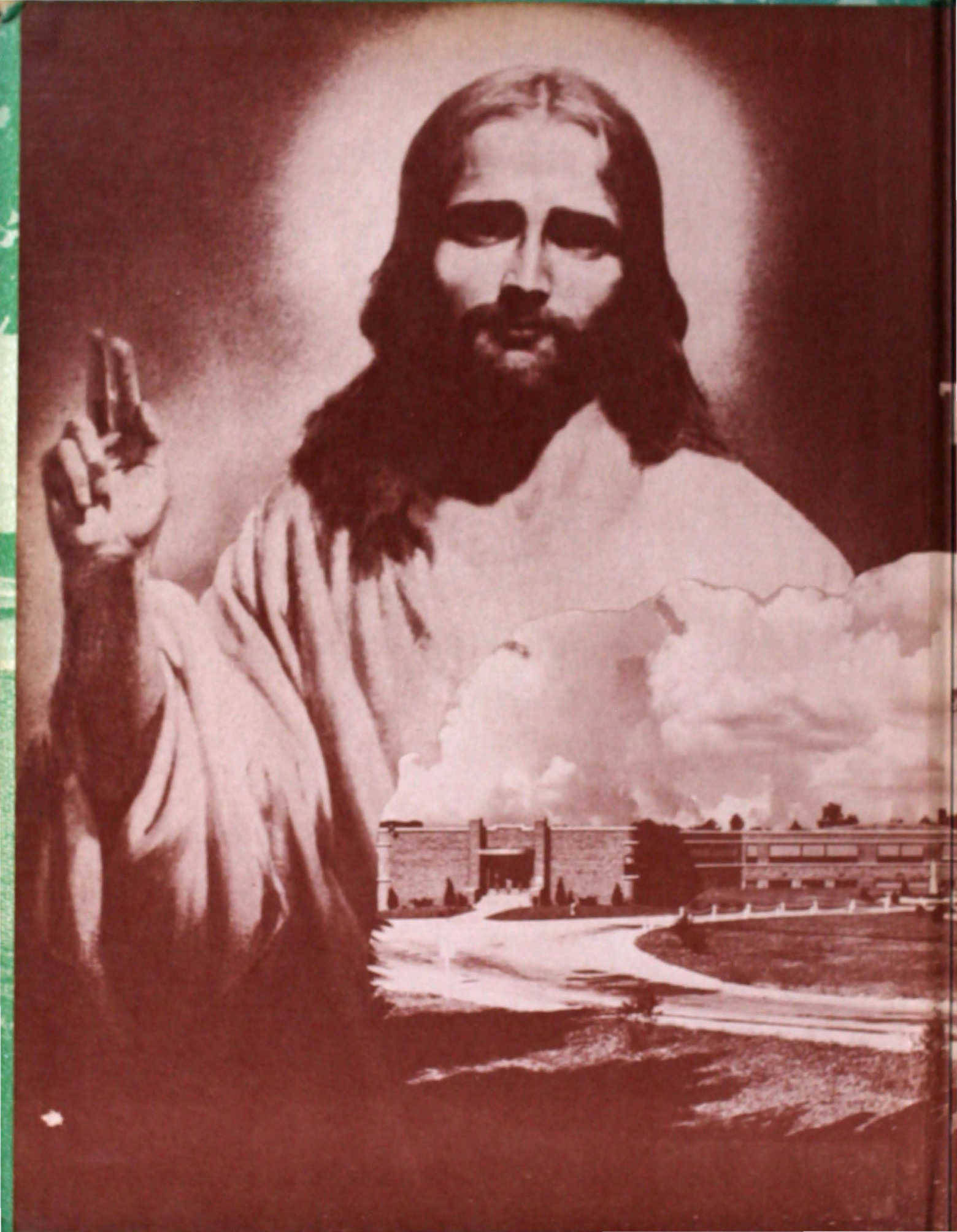
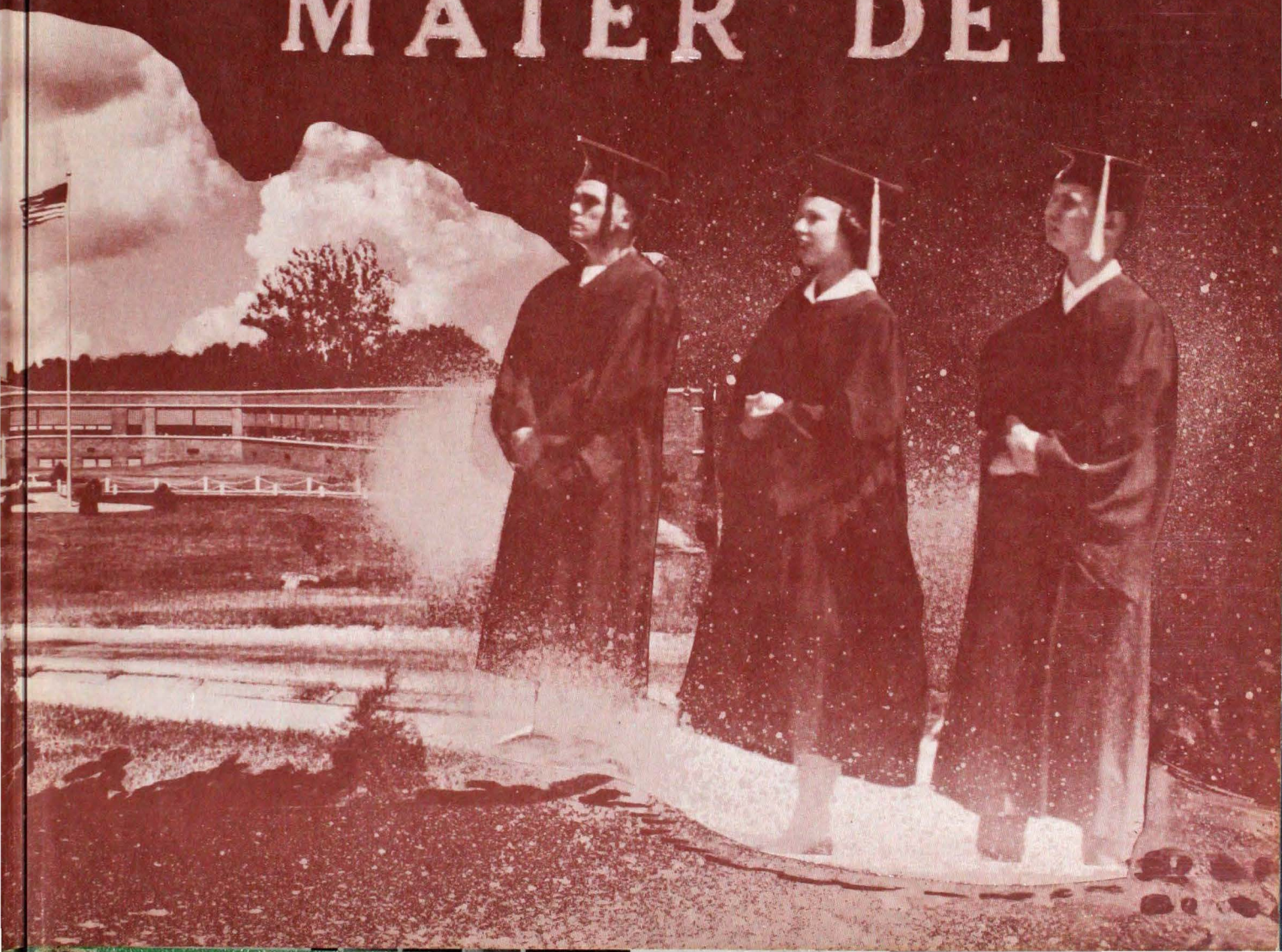
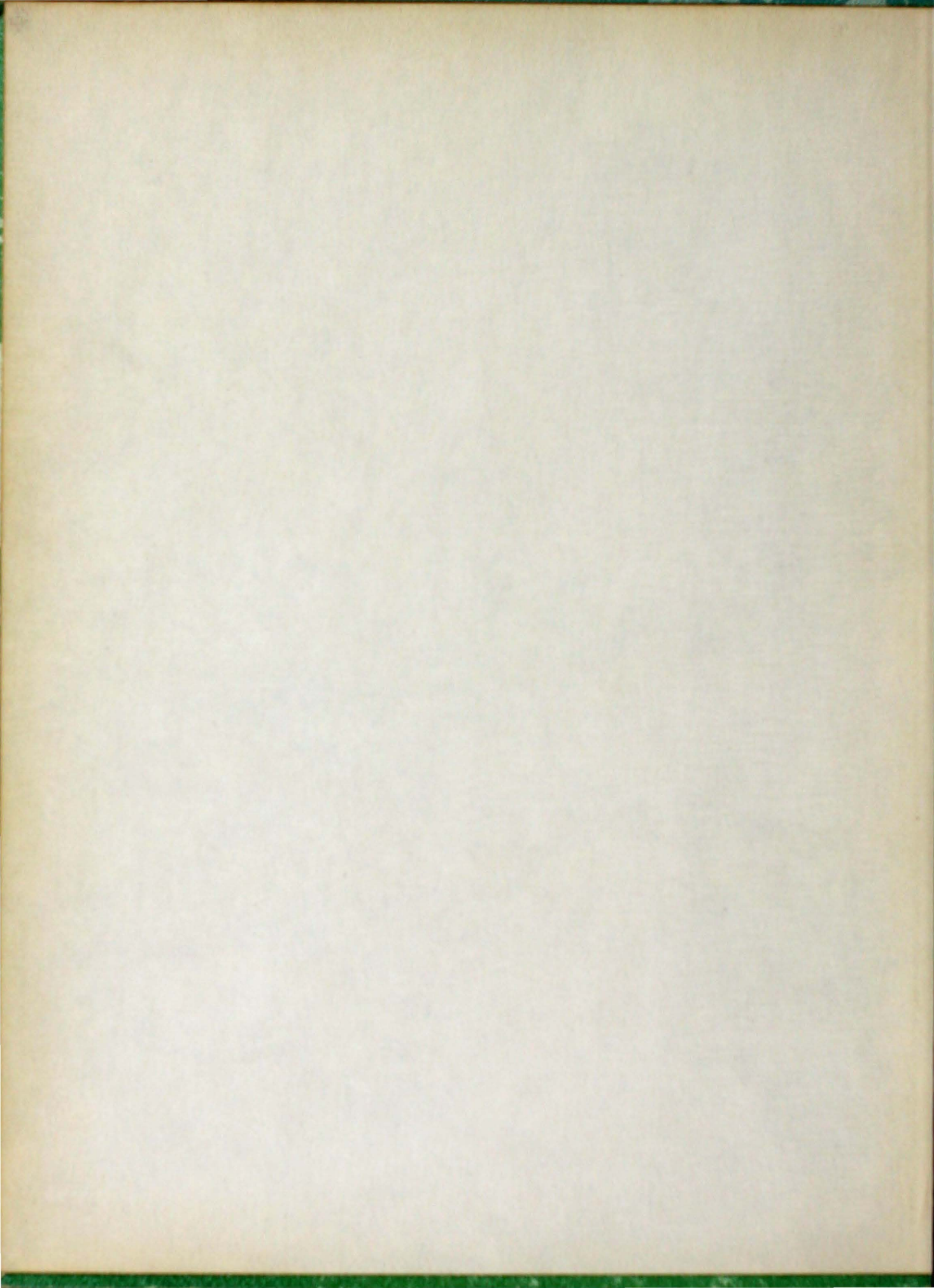

TO CHRIST THROUGH MATER DEI

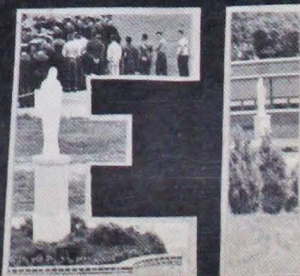

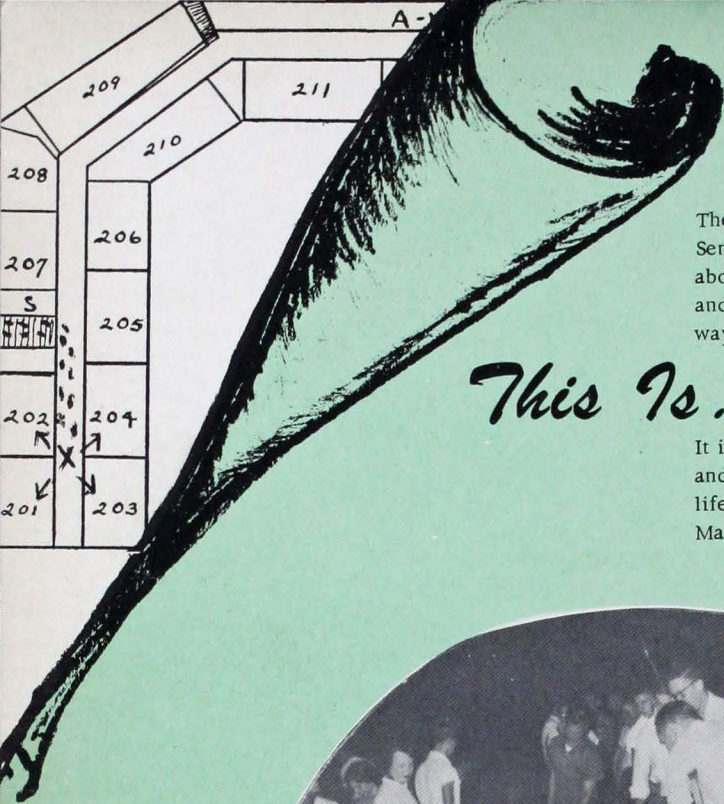
A seasonal "Mater Dei" display on the landing above the entrance is one of the distinctive features of Mater Dei. (At left are pictures of various seasonal displays.)

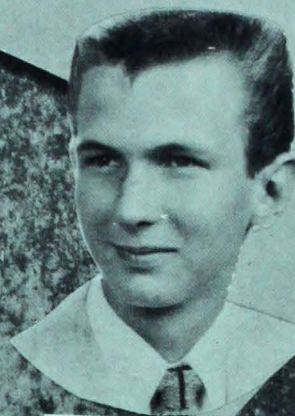
Senior Stars

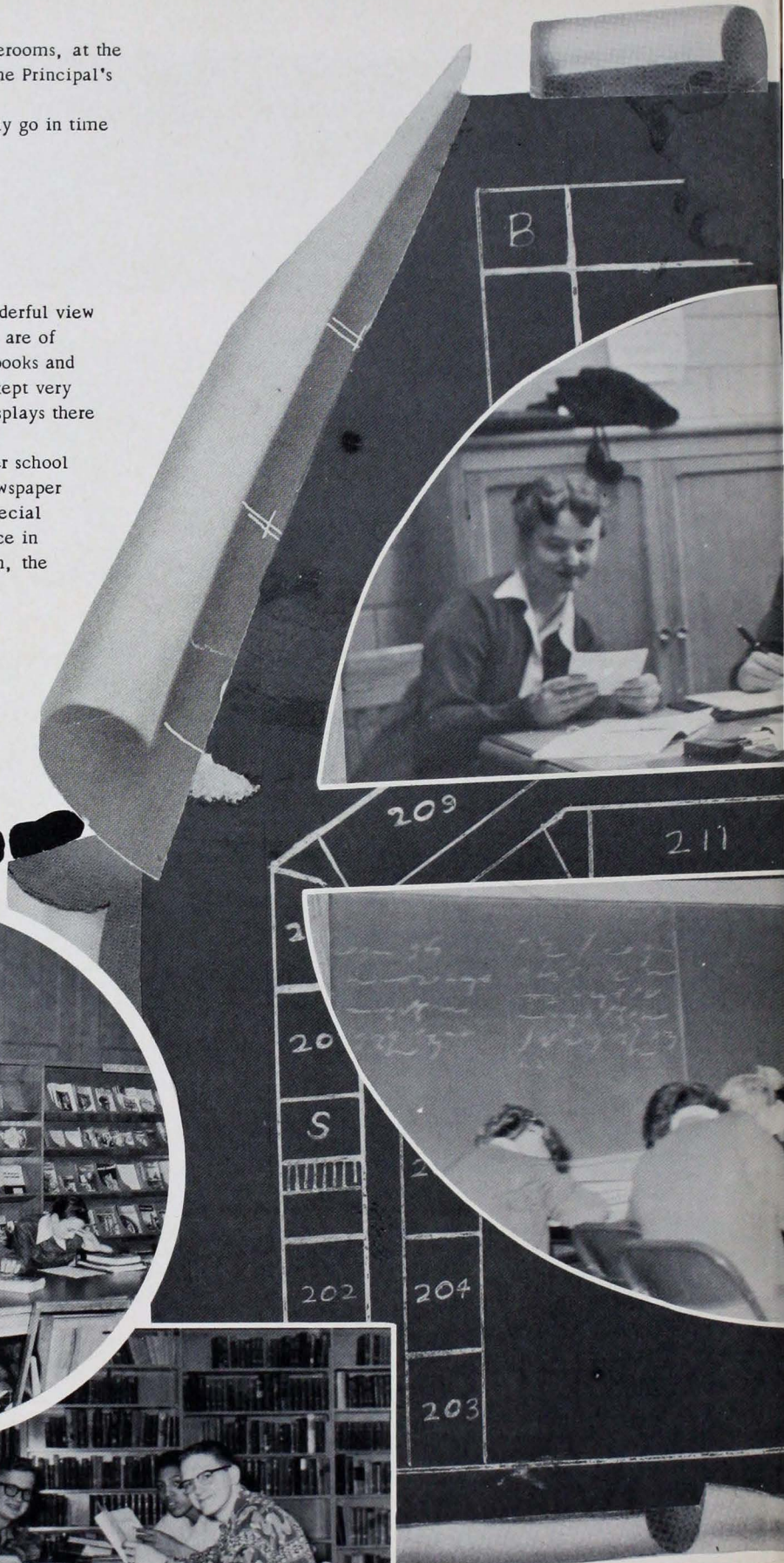
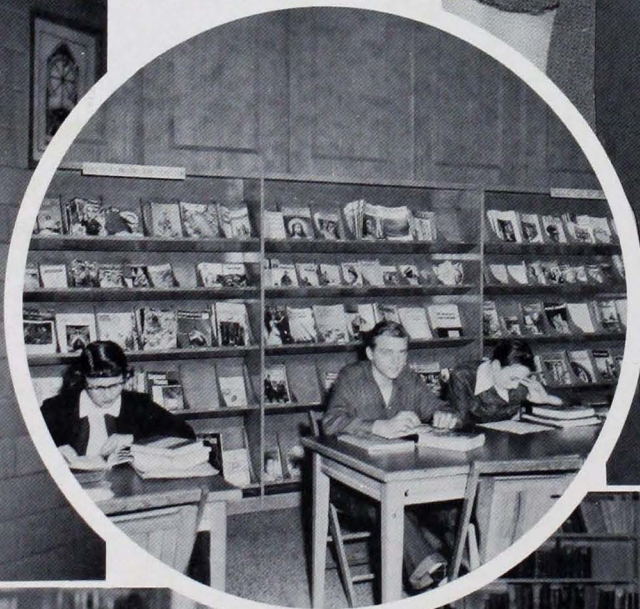
In the midst of the Sophomore and Freshman homerooms, at the last turn of the horse-shoe-shaped building, we find the Principal's Office and the Library.

Alice received a trophy from the AJBC in recognition of her national standing — Evansville's national celebrity, Alice Dillman.

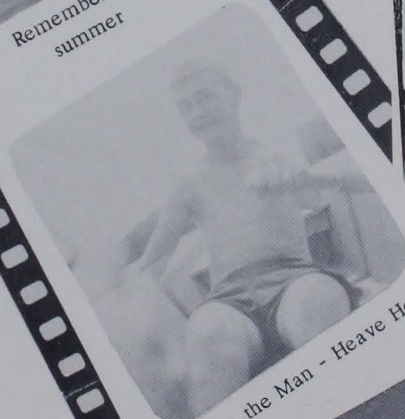

MATER DEI-VILLE

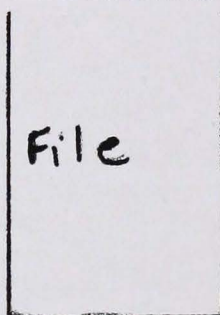
