Over the course of time, we all learned about ourselves: our likes and dislikes, our goals and aspirations, and who we are as individuals.


Throughout our years at Mater Dei, each of us learns to develop our own truly unique voice.




Bike fun facts?


"I play lacrosse for the Greater Evansville Youth Lacrosse Association. I have fun playing lacrosse with my hilarious teammates from other schools."











































































































