

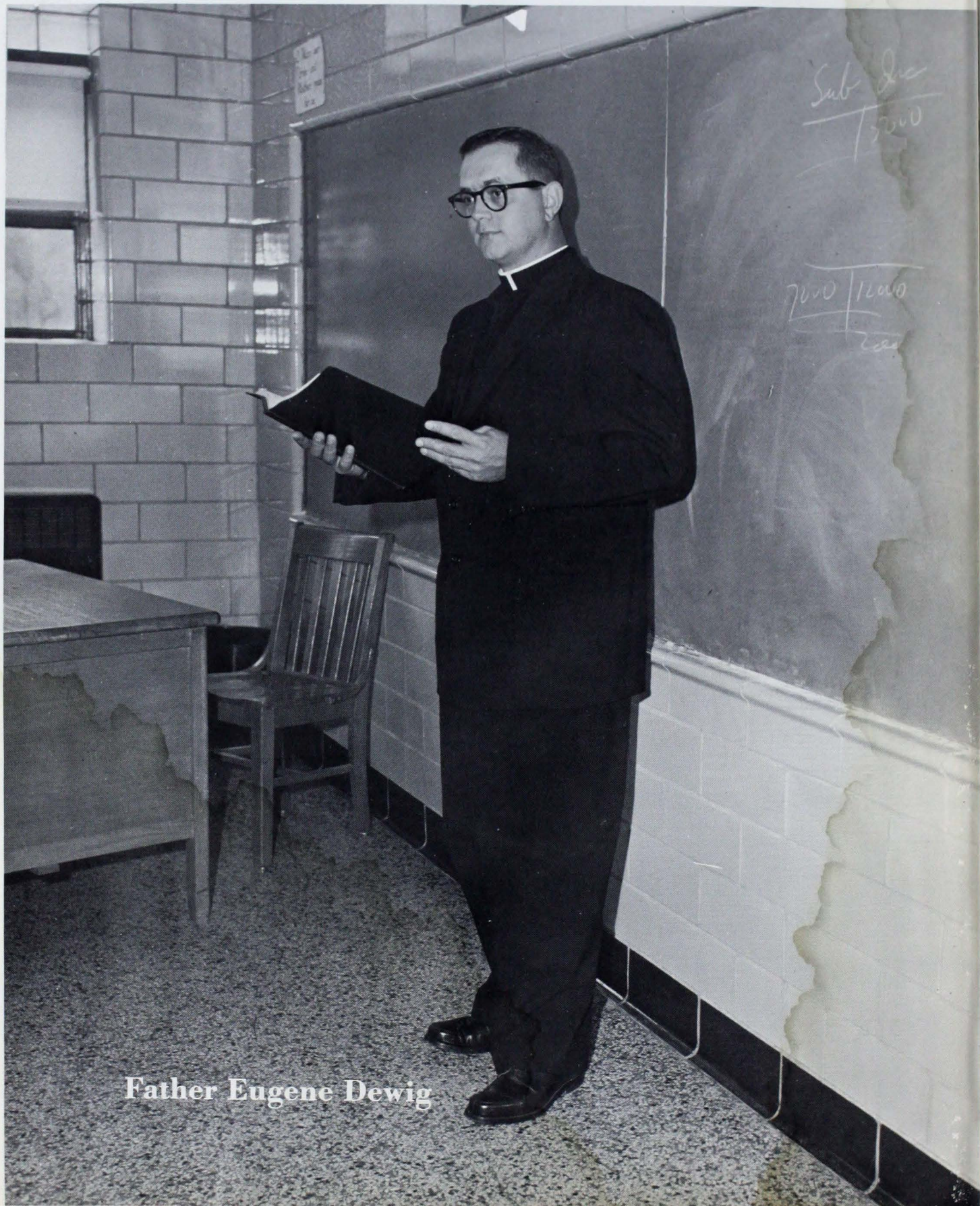


If we, the youth of Mater Dei, successfully in-

Christ!



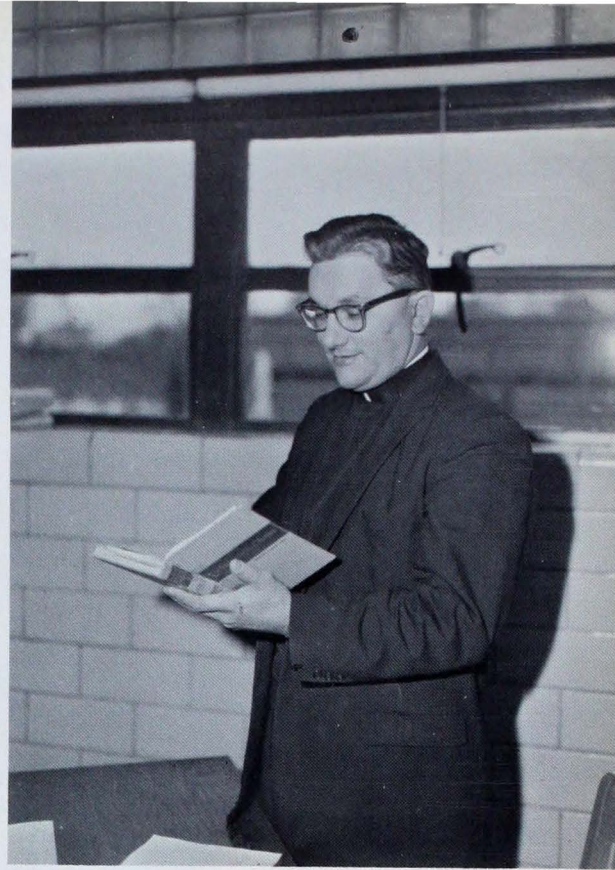

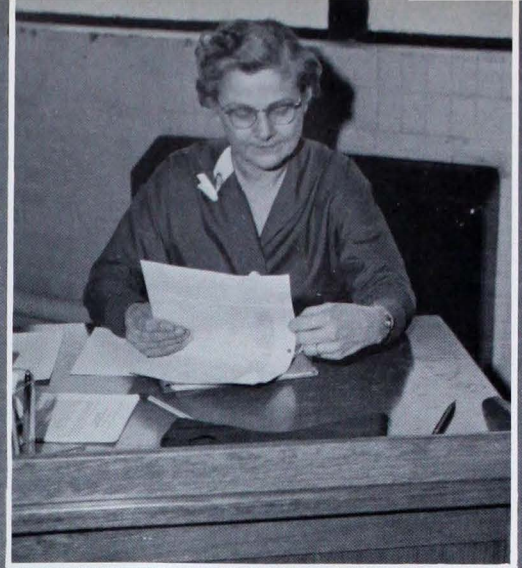

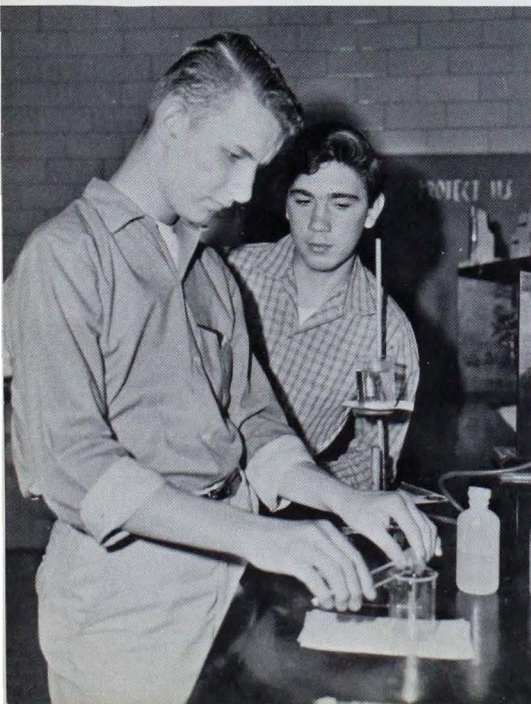

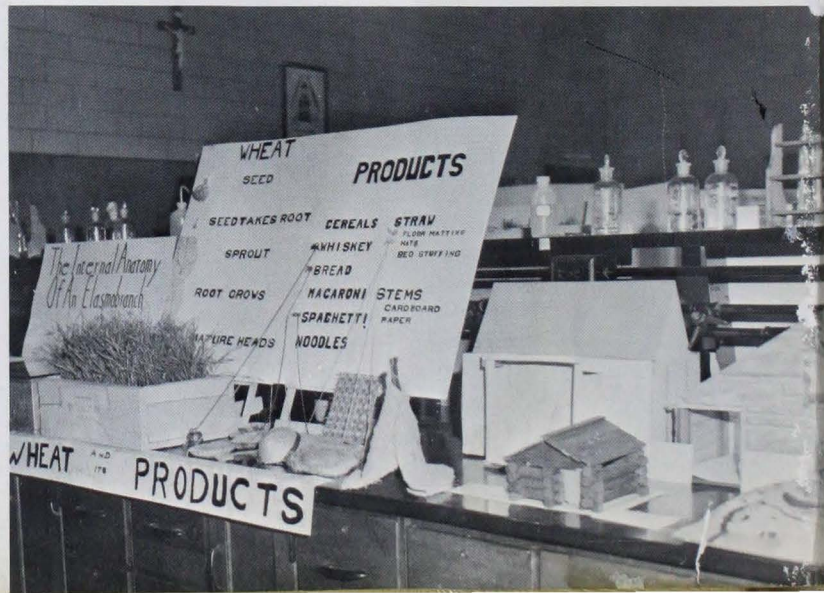
