had the most colorful student section at Sectionals

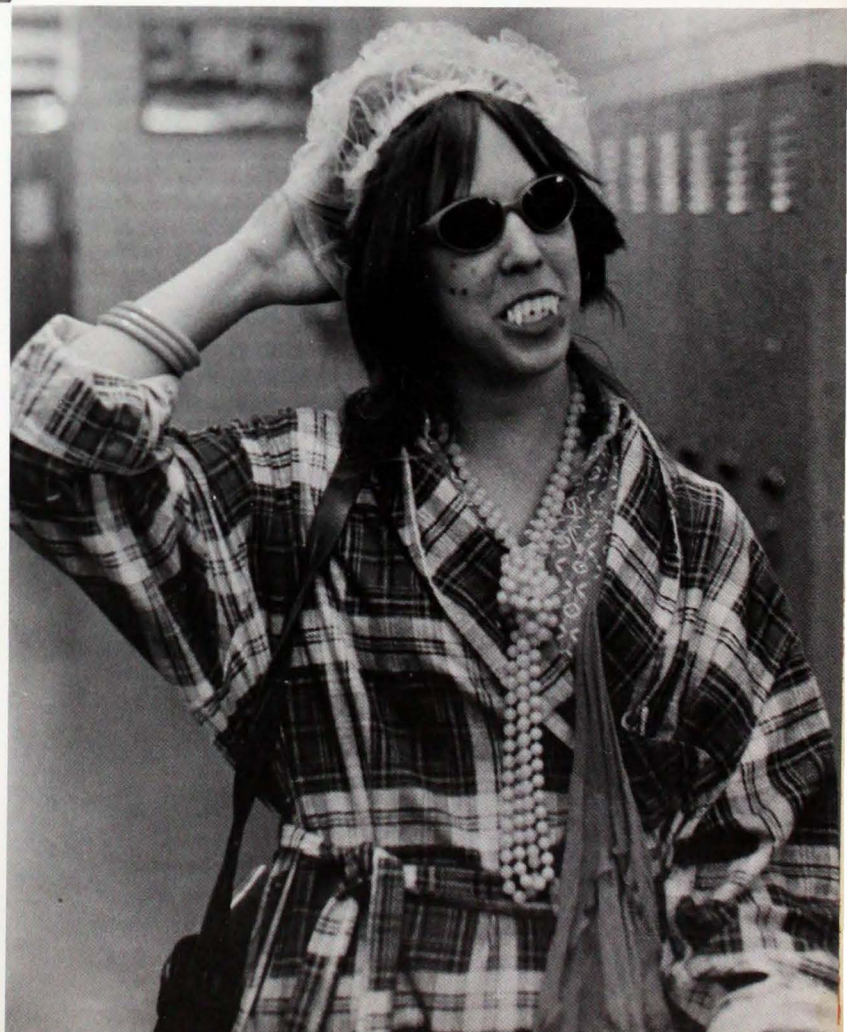
had a REALLY good musical,

somehow didn't get caught while . . .

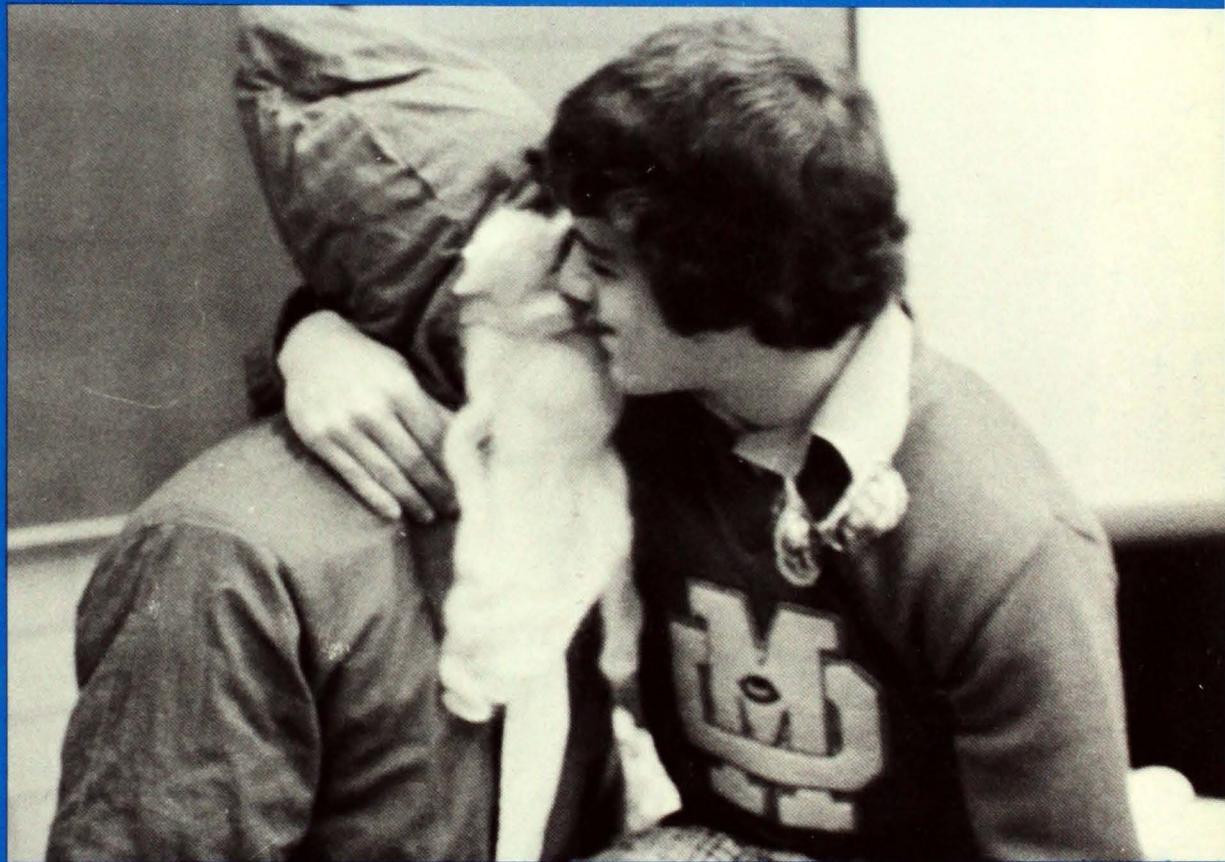
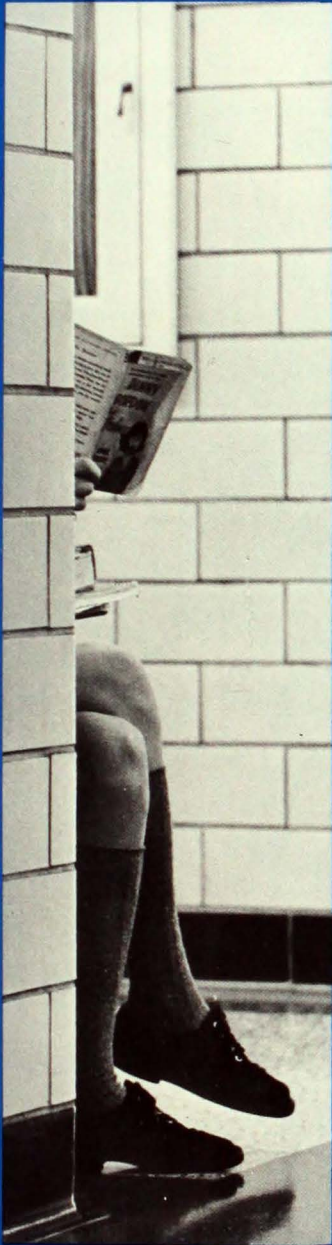
cheating on tests, staying out past curfew,

And all of us made friends and did things we would never admit to but will always remember with the thought that if we didn't do it, it really wasn't worth doing.



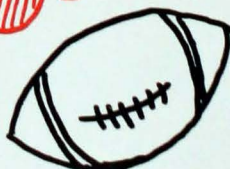


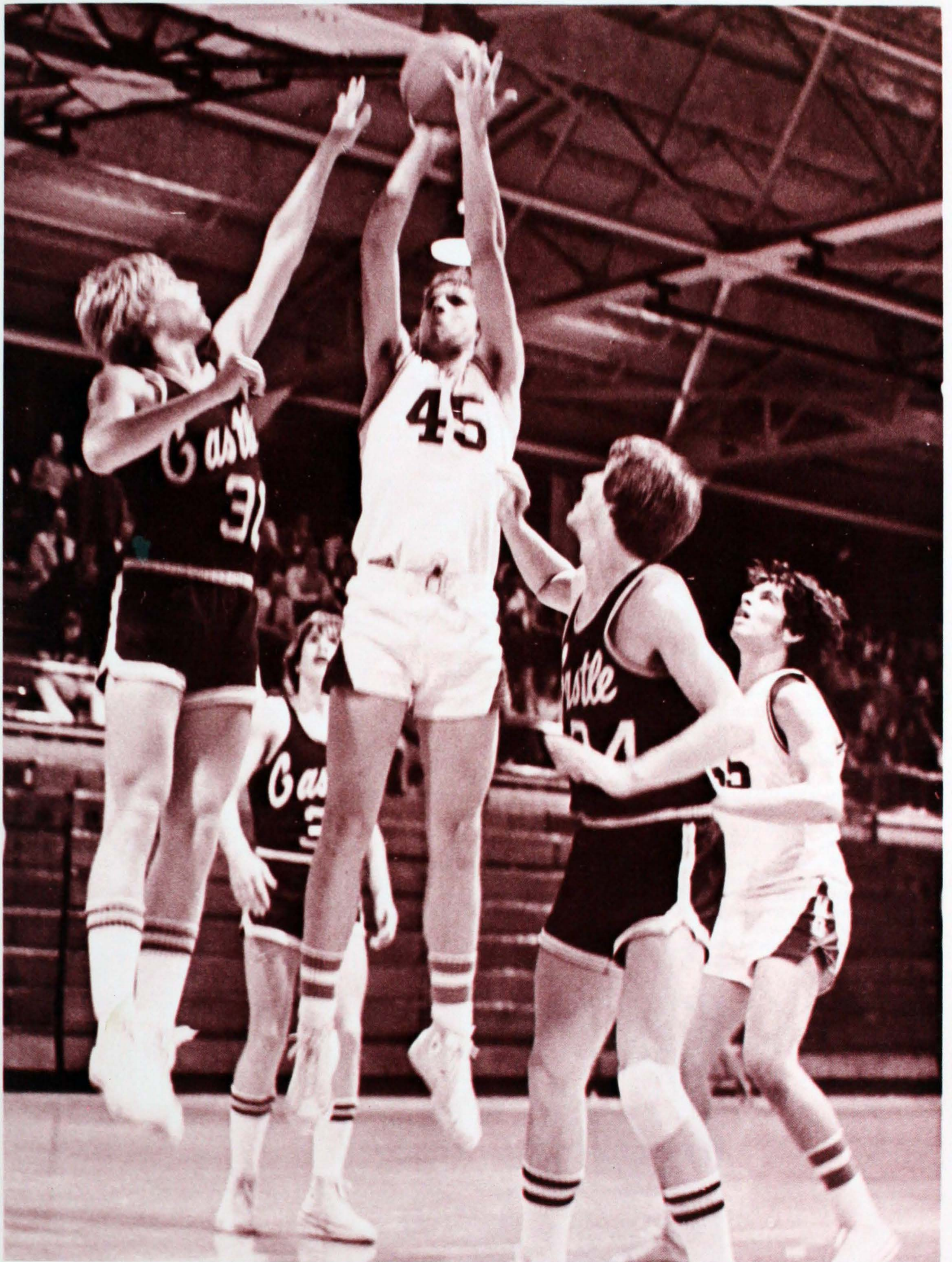


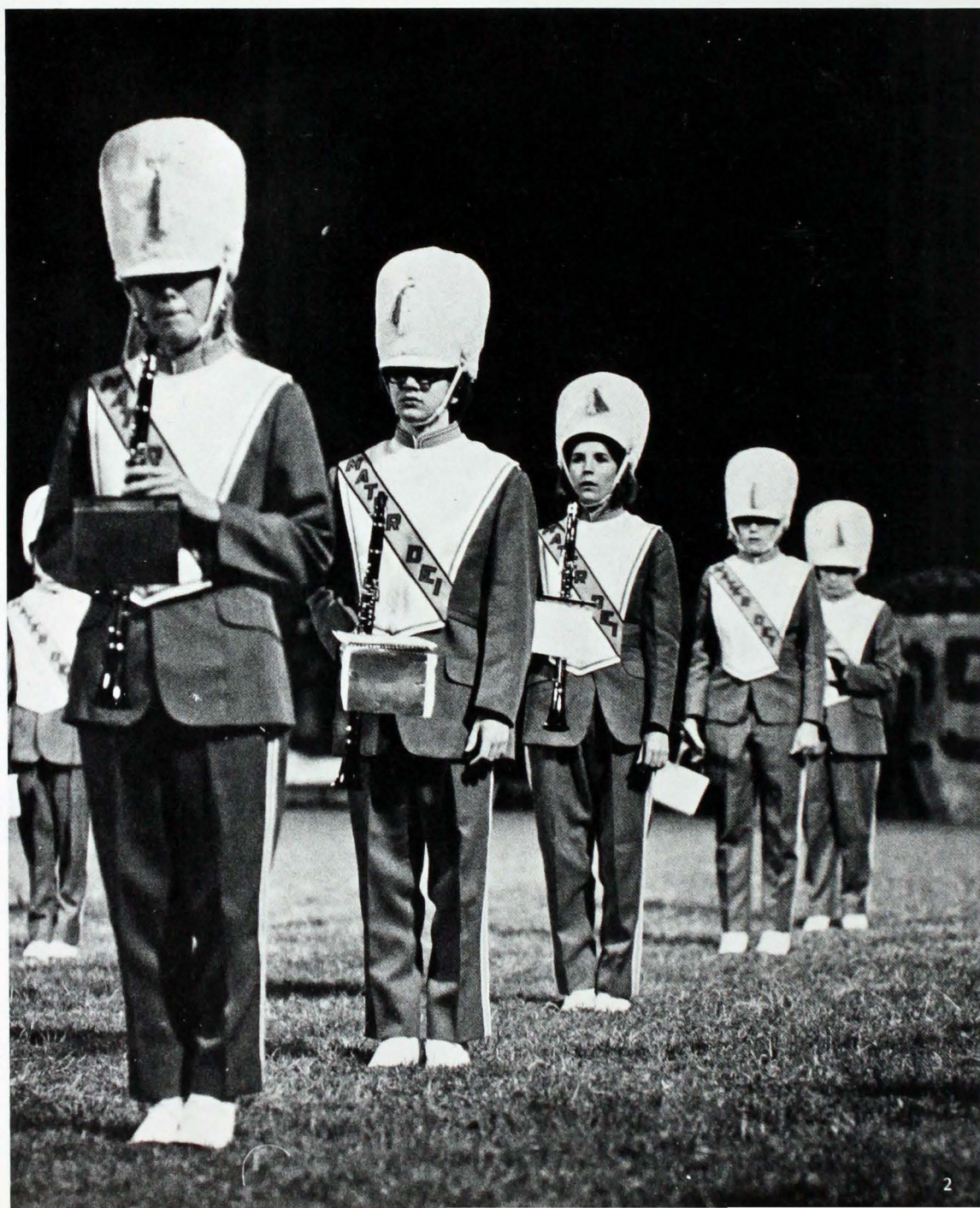

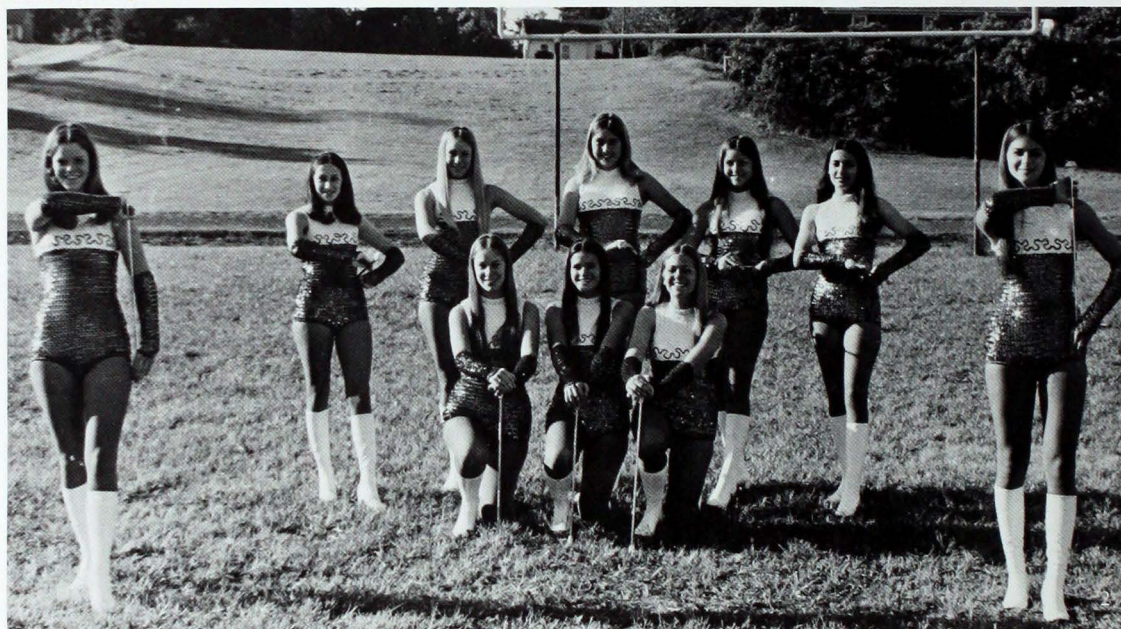

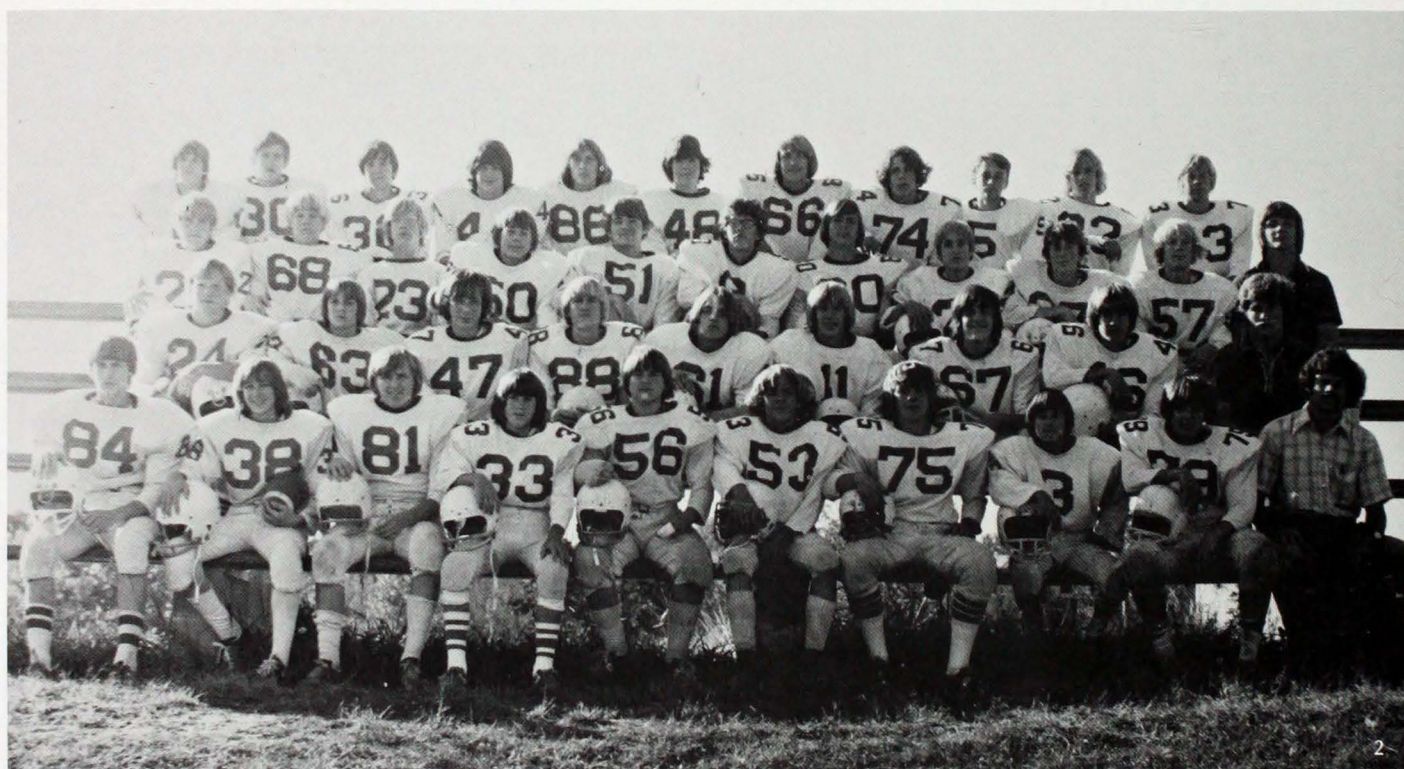

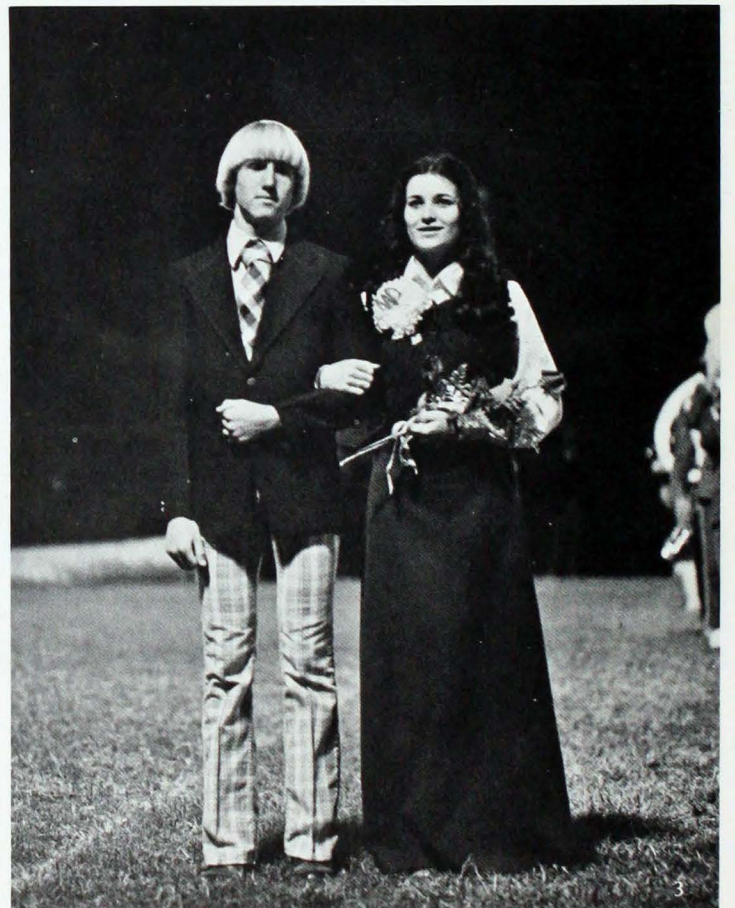
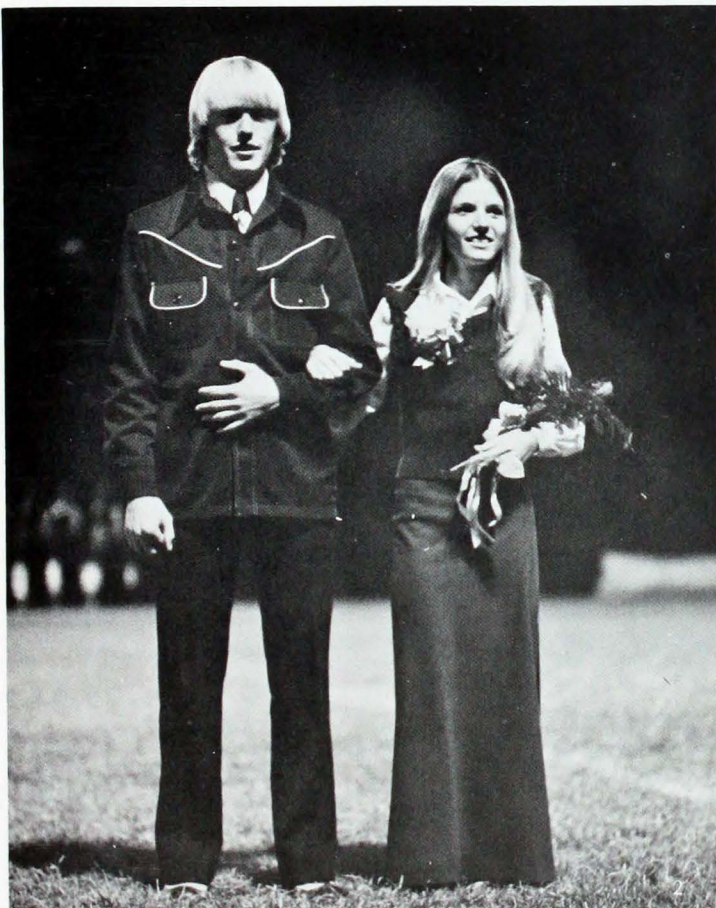

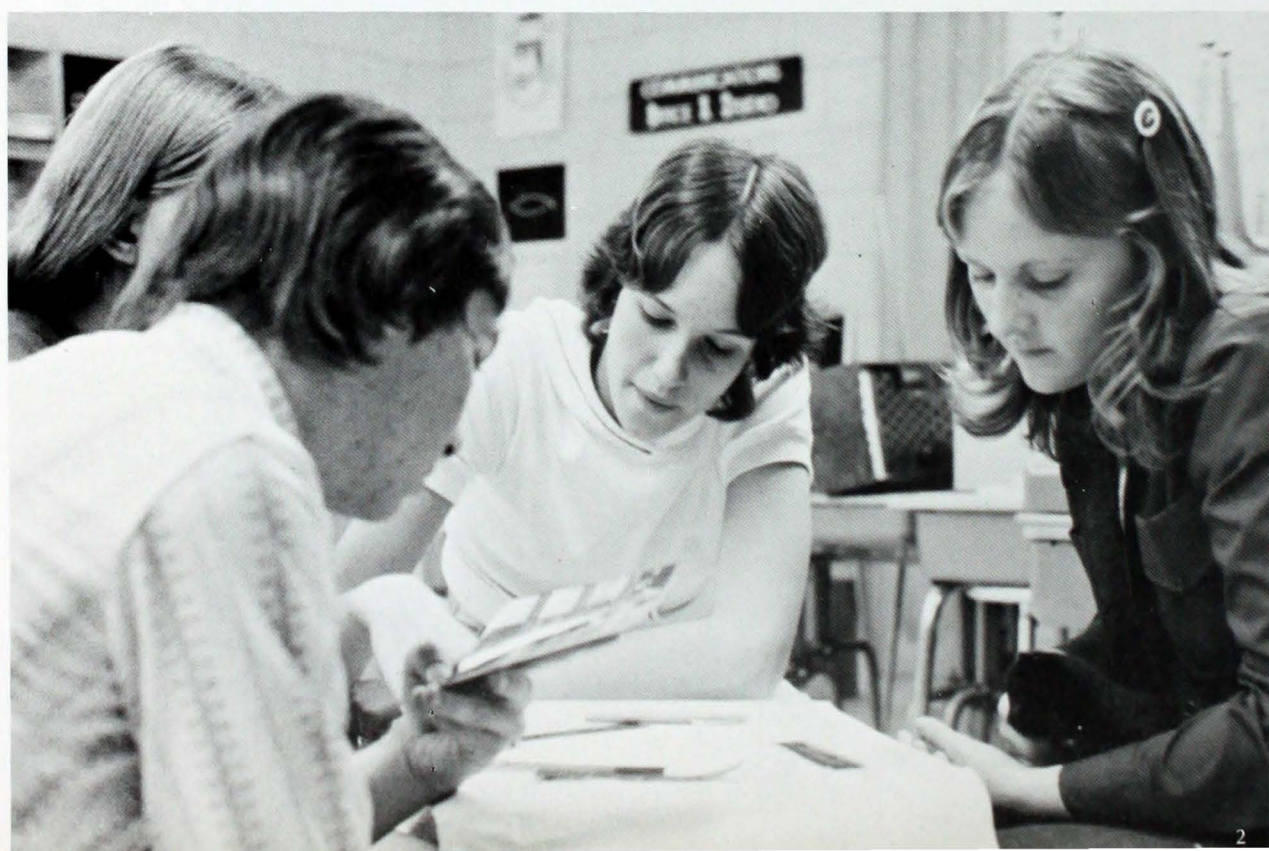

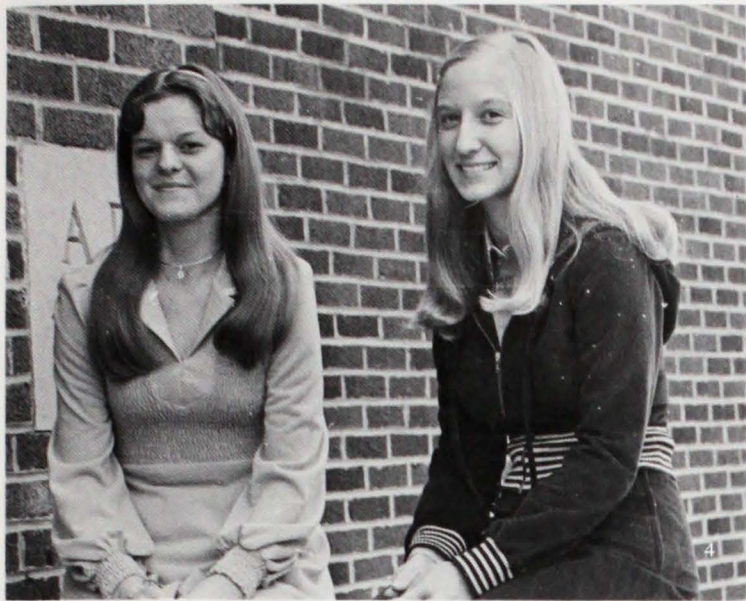

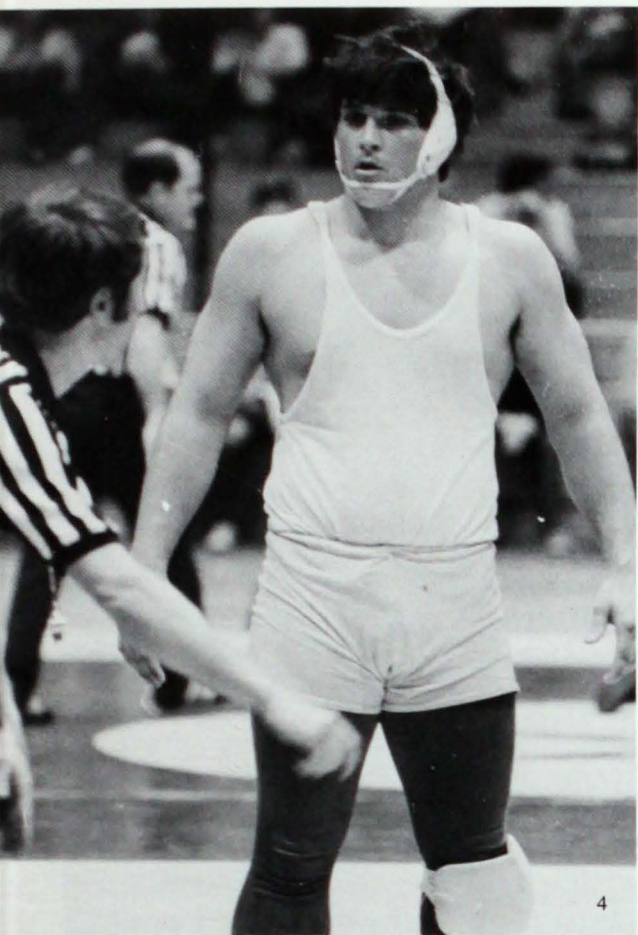

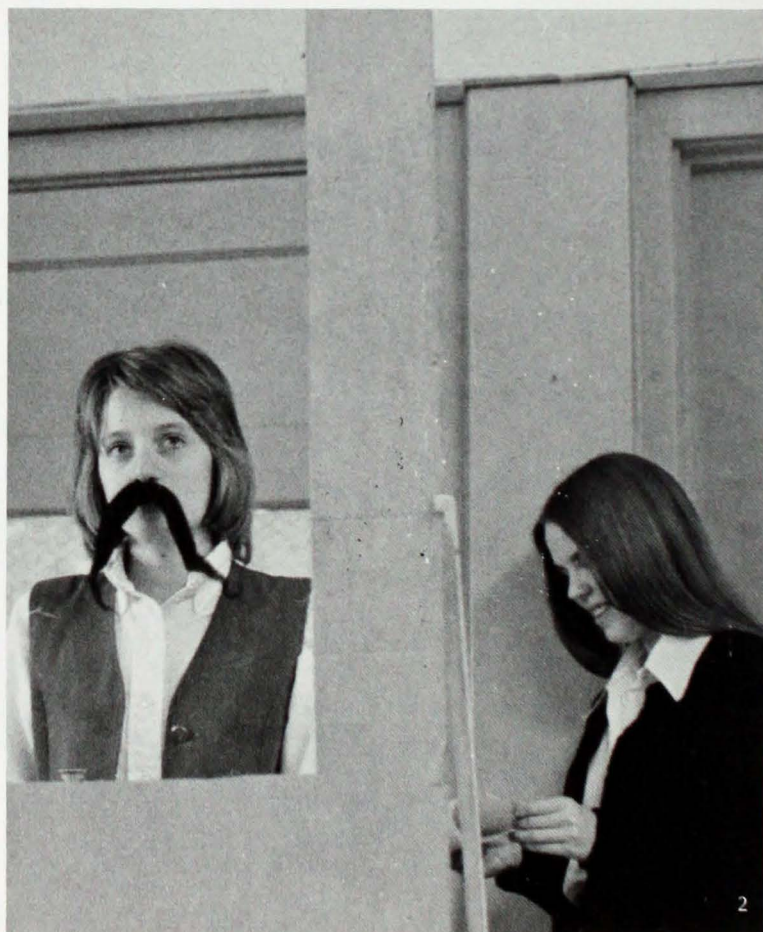

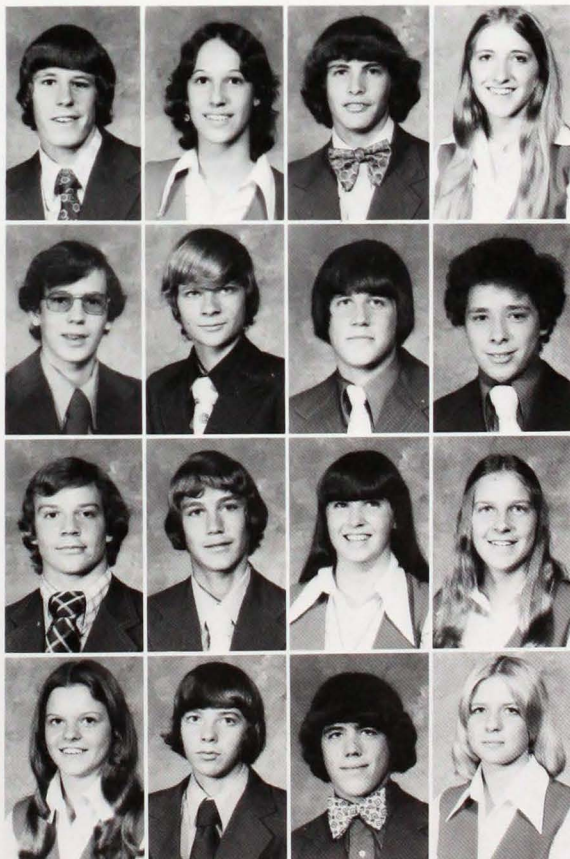

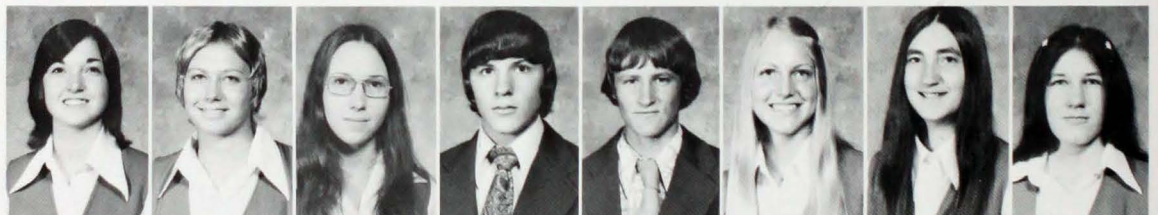
