
Junior Skit Prevails









"It can't happen to me." That is what too many Americans say when the subject of AIDS is brought up.










Runners Reach Regional


Soccer Goes To State

The boys soccer team finished fourth in the state as it advanced to the Final Four for the first time. The Cats had a 14-5-4 record with sectional and regional championship titles.






Congratulations to Coach Randy Helfrich who broke the national record of consecutive wins and to all the reserves he coached. He now has 232 consecutive victories.

Nine games were lost by an average of seven points. Sophomore Chris Koester said, "This year was very frustrating at times, but we learned to keep our heads up and work as a team."







Niemeier Leads League


Girls 'Love' Tennis




Golfers Place Third In City




Among band accomplishments was

All of the major roles were double cast. For the first time, a freshman starred in a major role: Alex Zenthoefer.


