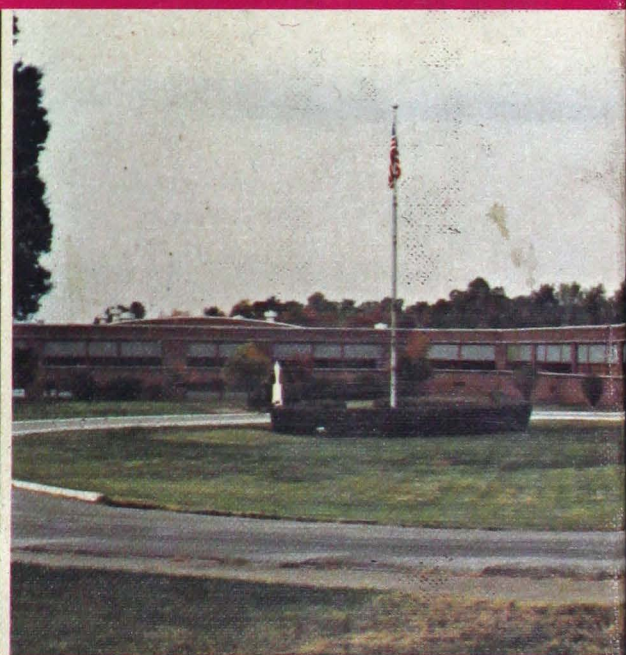

Maybe it is the reputation for championship wrestling and volleyball teams.

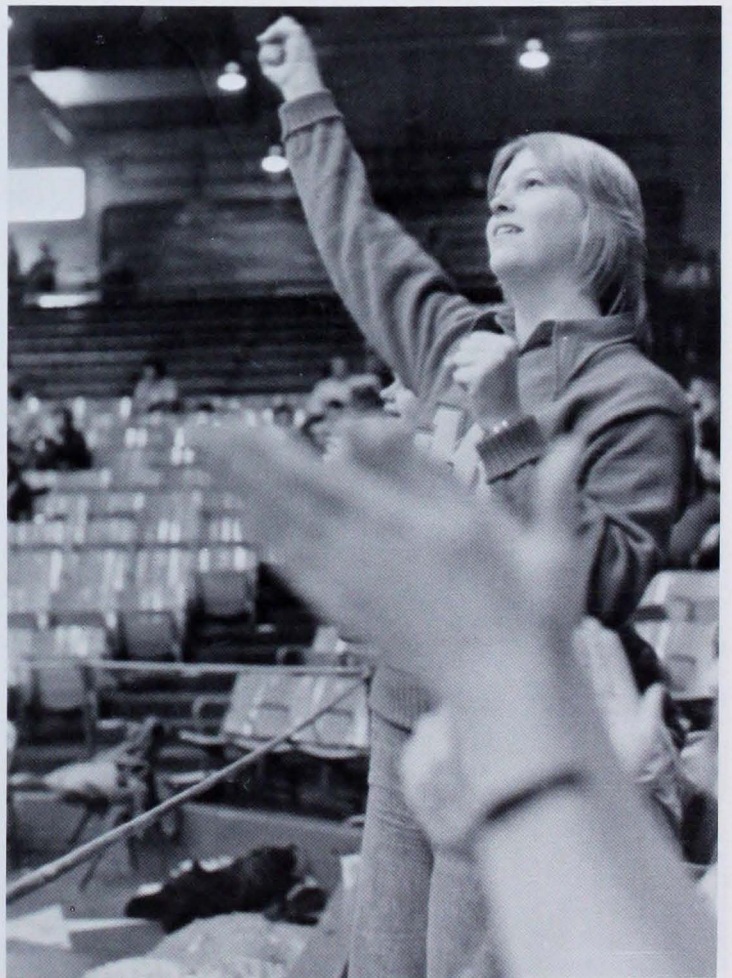
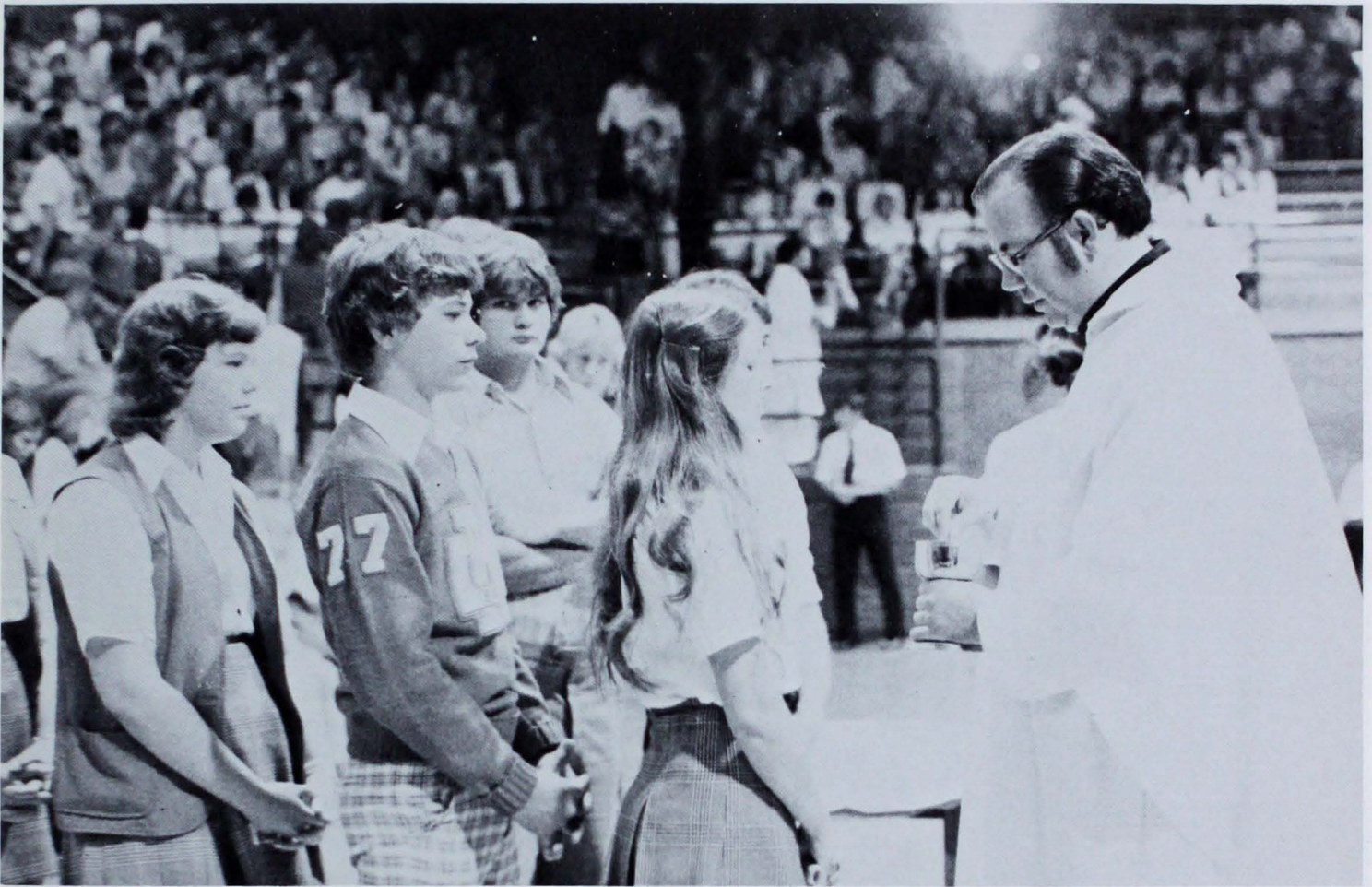

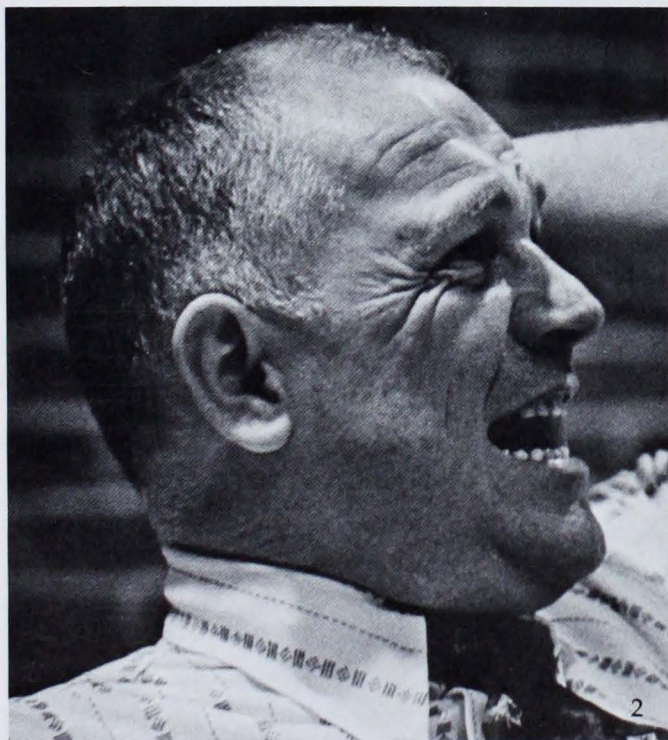

(3) The 1976-77 Wildcat gridgers look big and tough in their official team portrait.





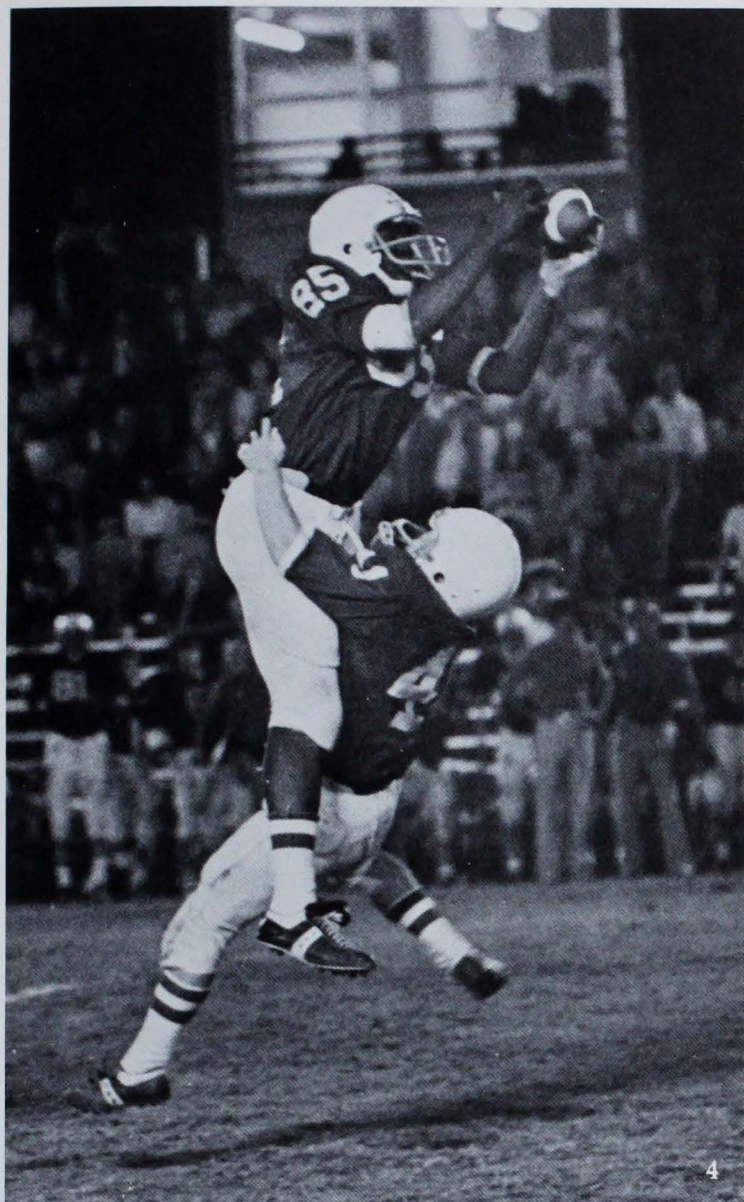

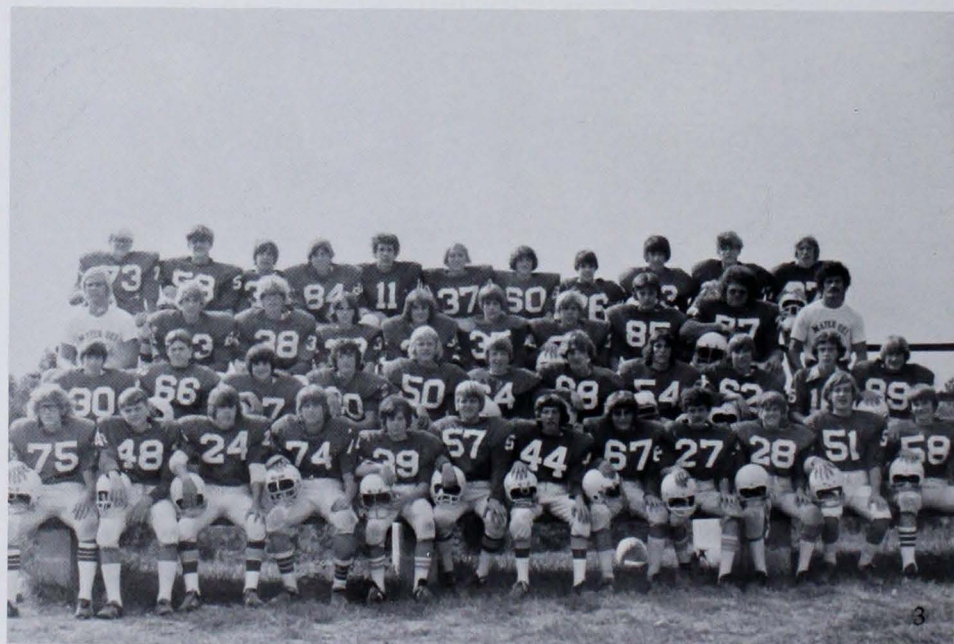

(4) Sophomore Sue Kelle chose Kevin Mischler as her escort.

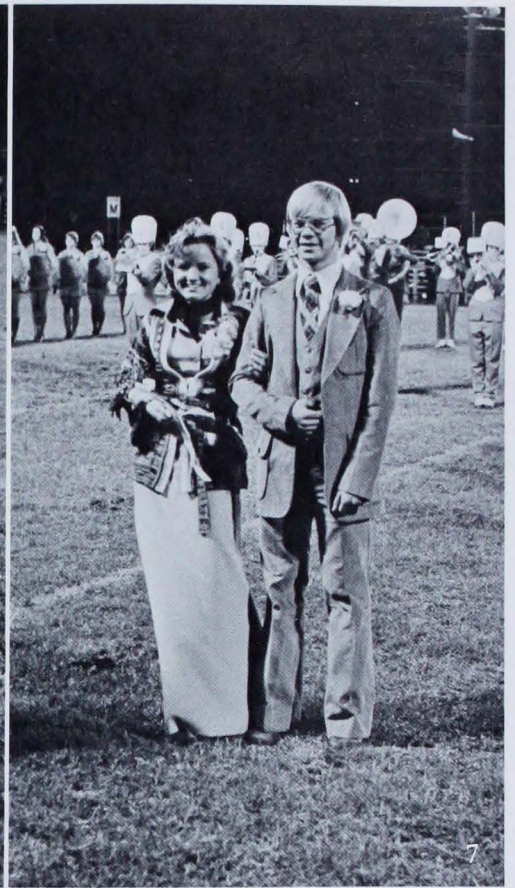
(5) Also representing the sophomores were Cindy Bender and Jerry Montgomery.

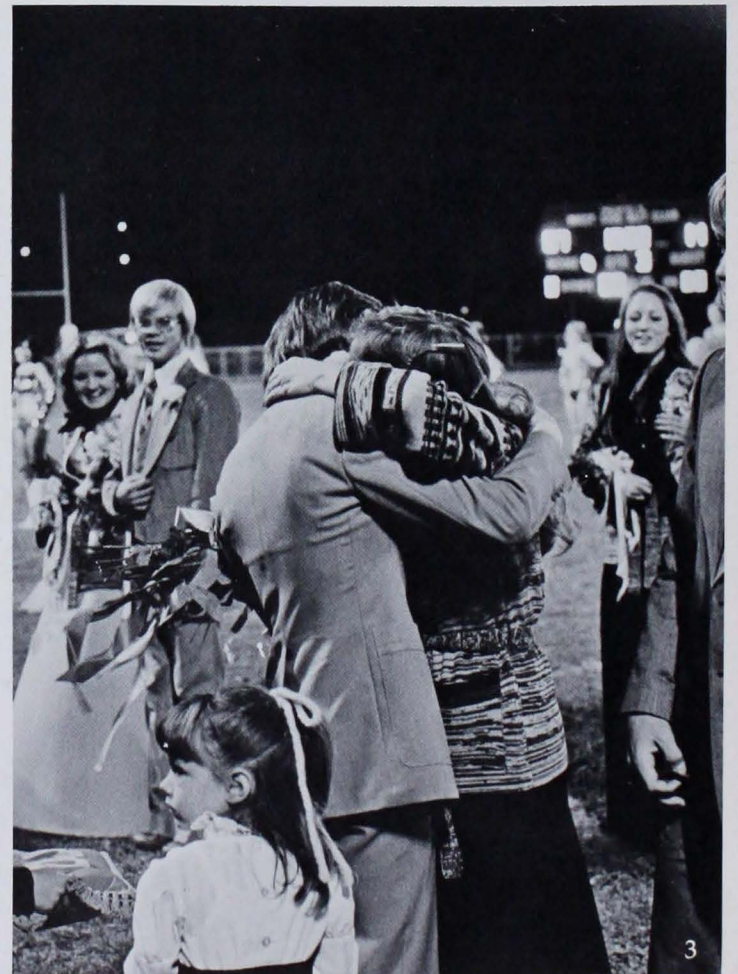
(2) Mary Sue's escort, Jim Martin, looked on as the mayor placed the coveted crown on the queen's head.

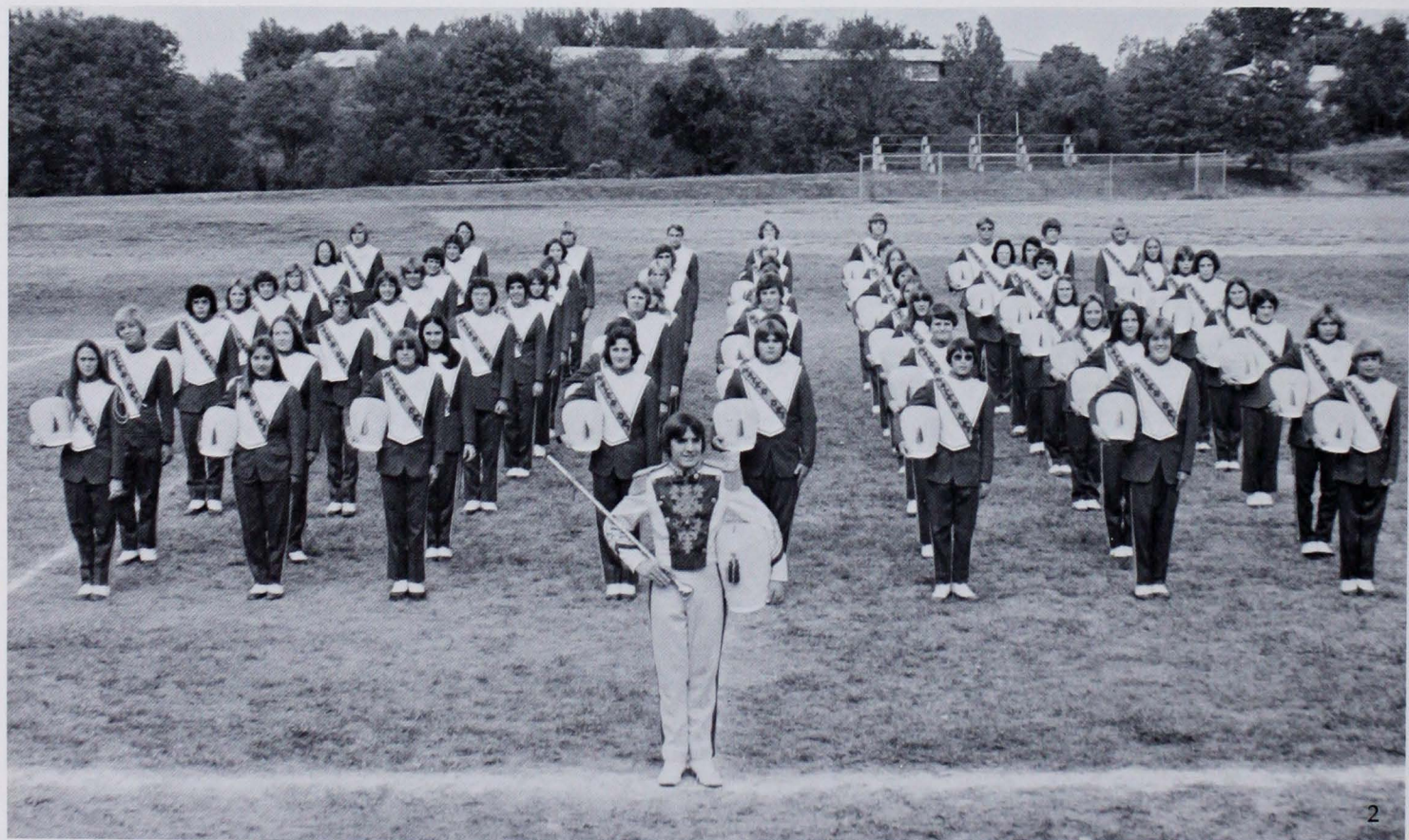
Hard work, plenty of practice perfect performance

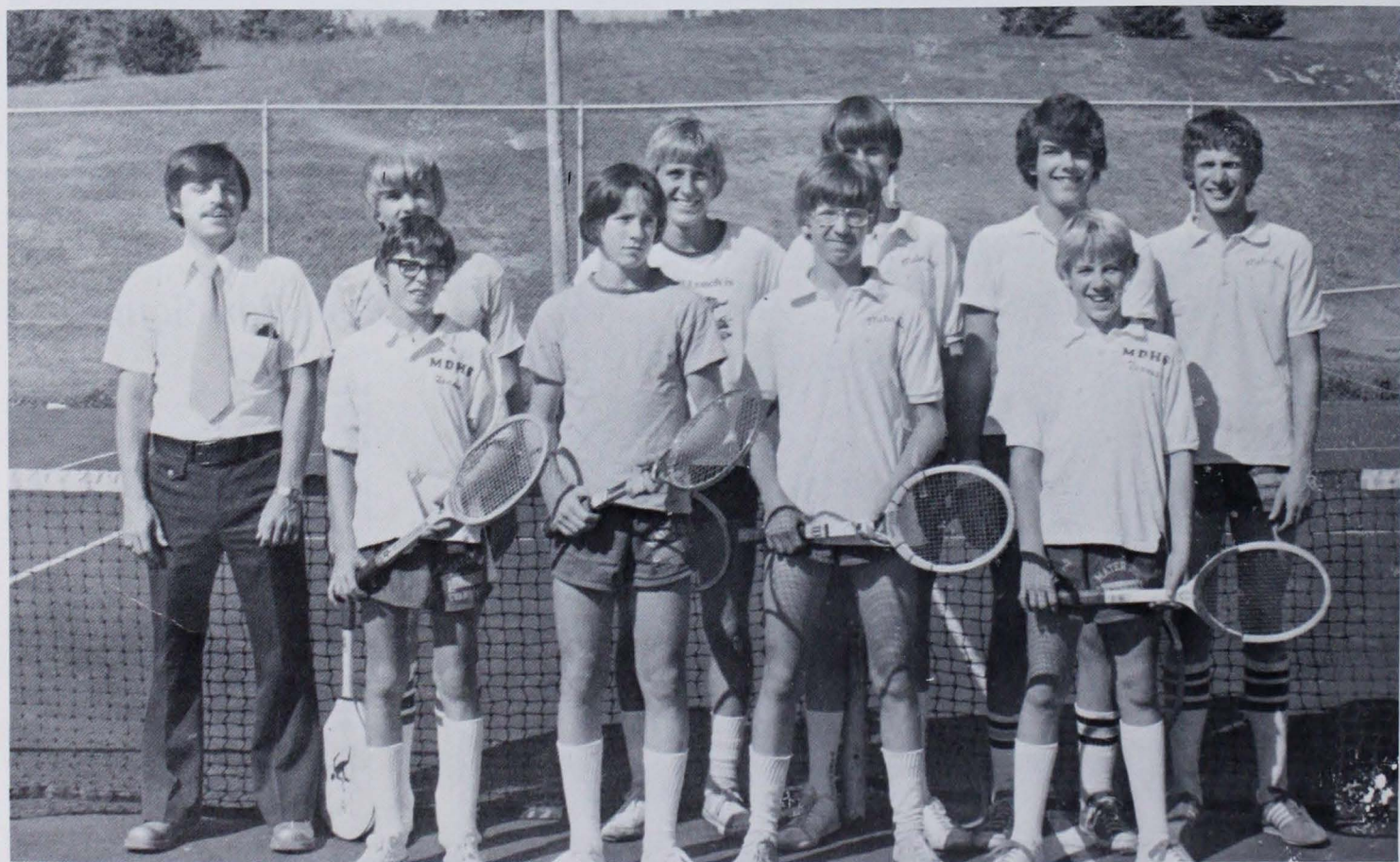

Roger Wathen takes oath as mayor

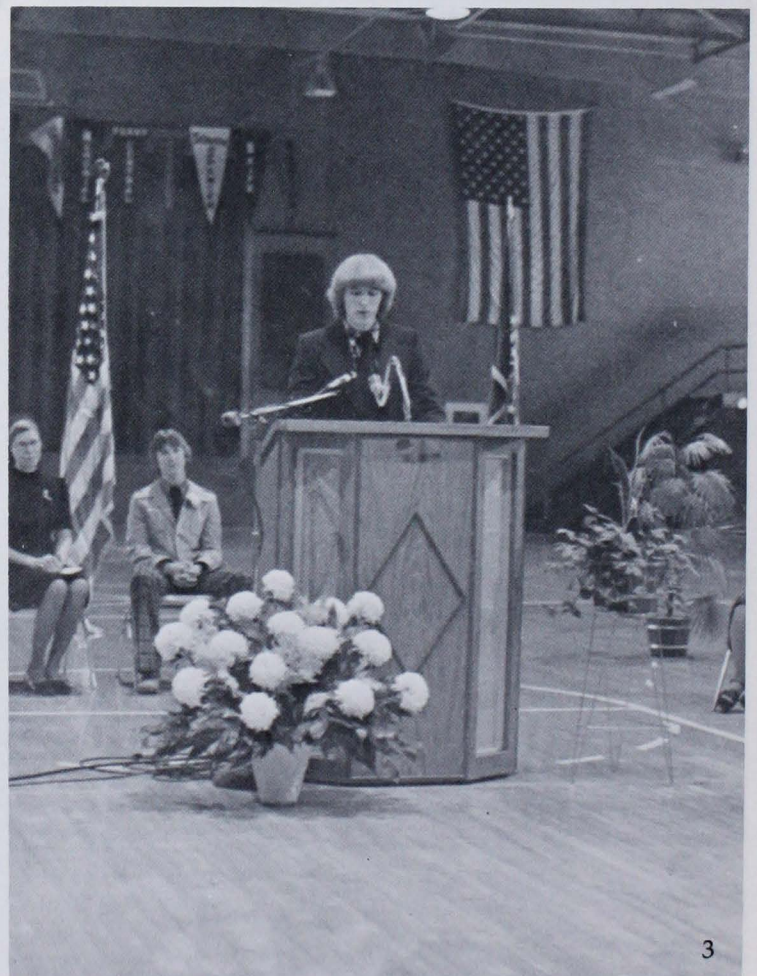
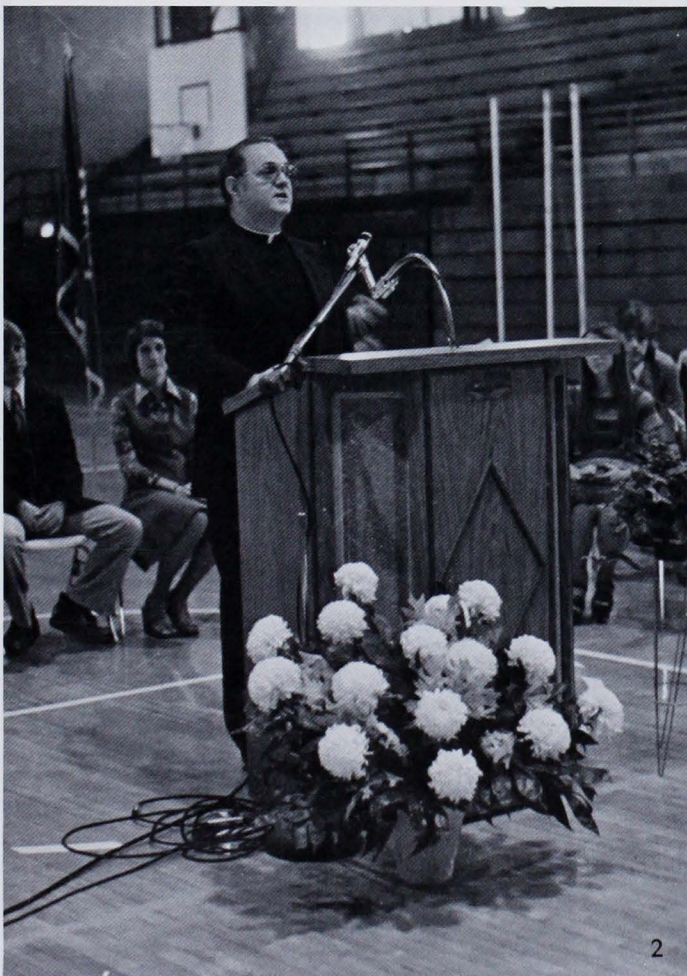
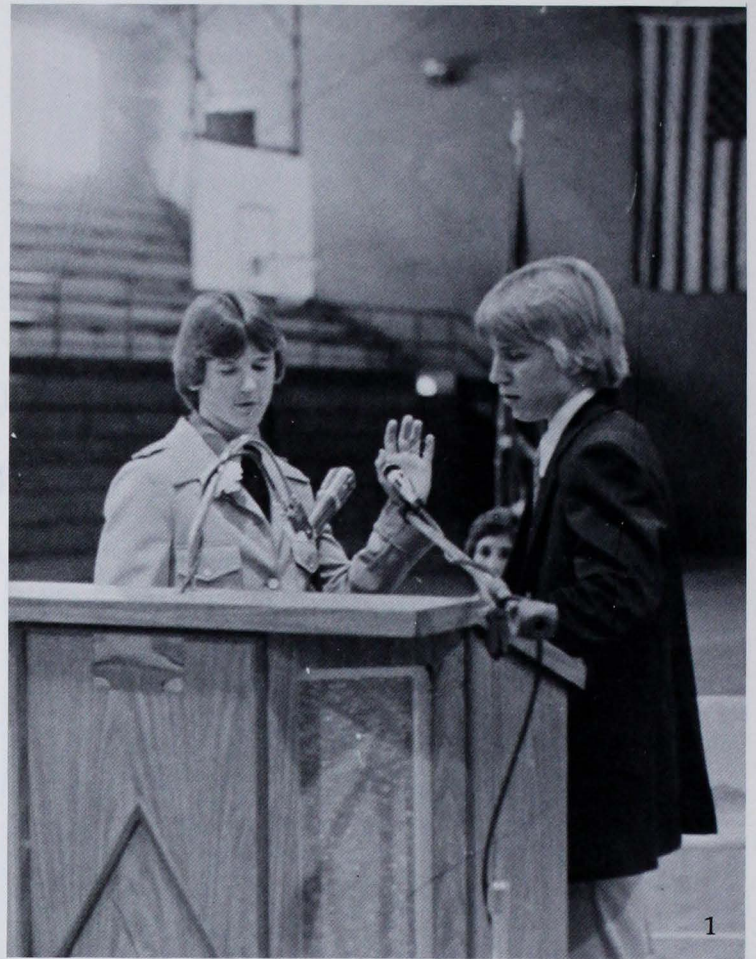

(2) The Reverend Eugene Dewig, pastor of St. Phillips parish, delivered the keynote speech at the early fall assembly.

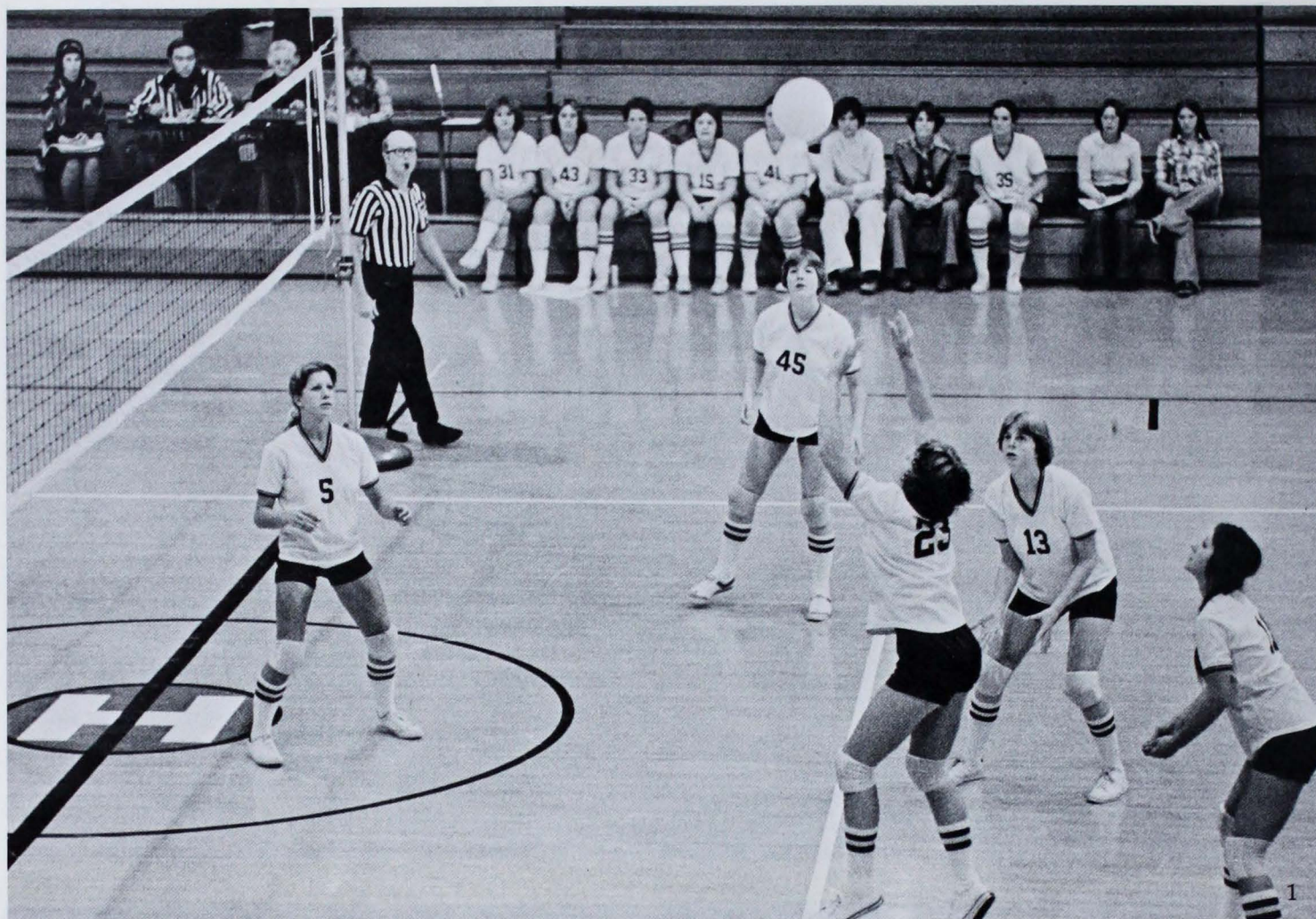
(3) Senior Jeff Wolf, class treasurer and a member of the National Honor Society, served as master of ceremonies.

Volleycats take fifth city title

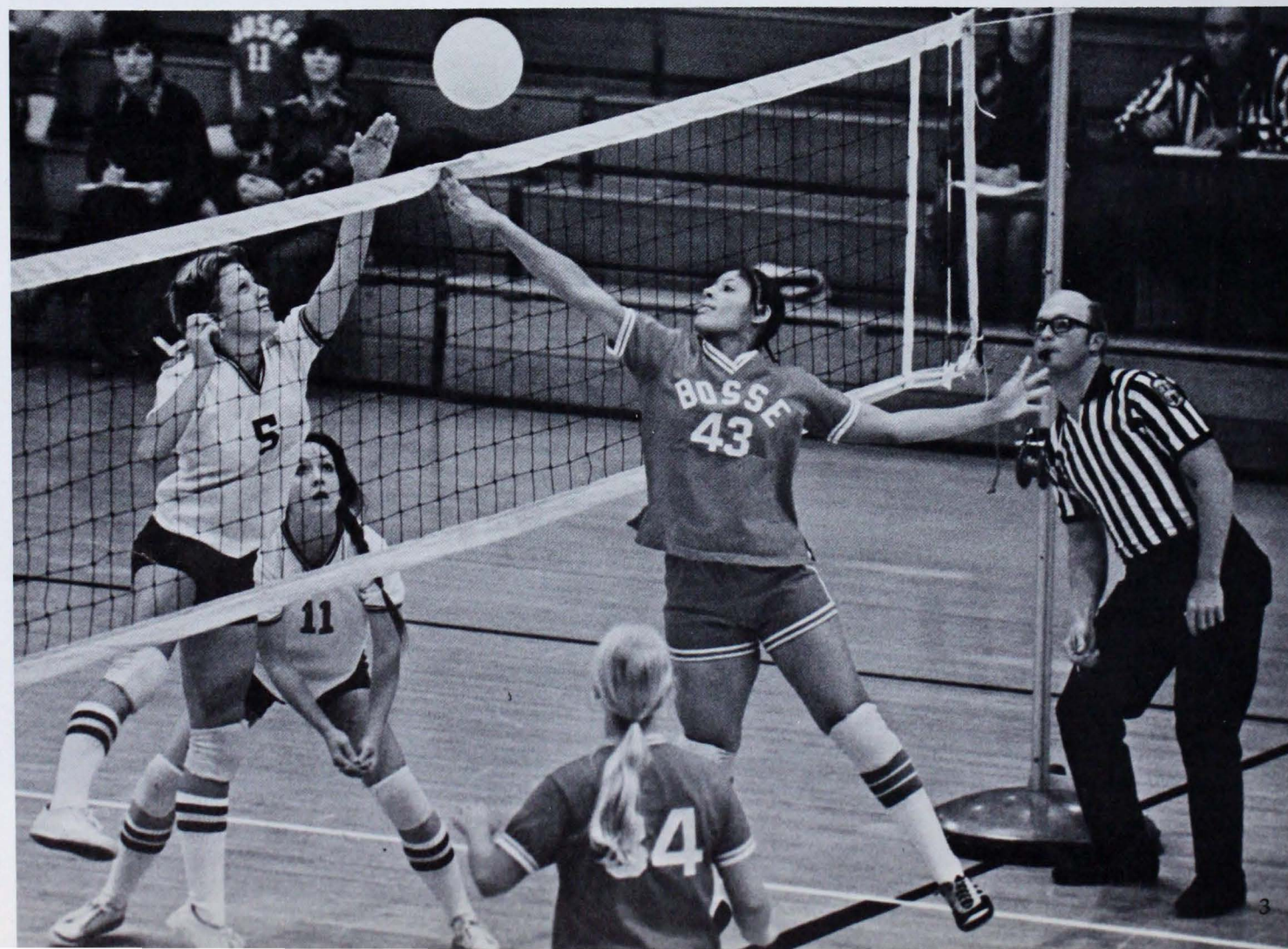
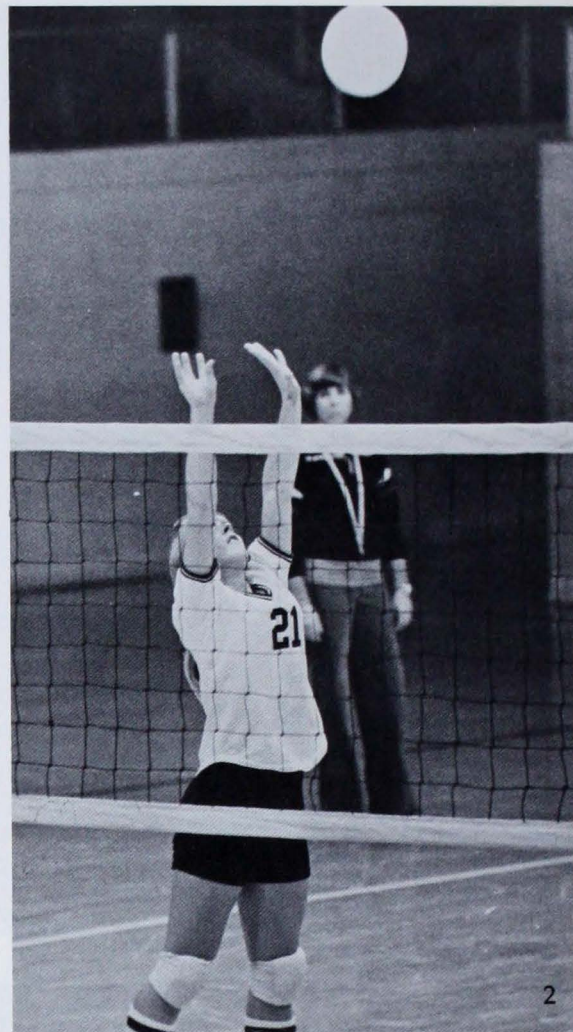

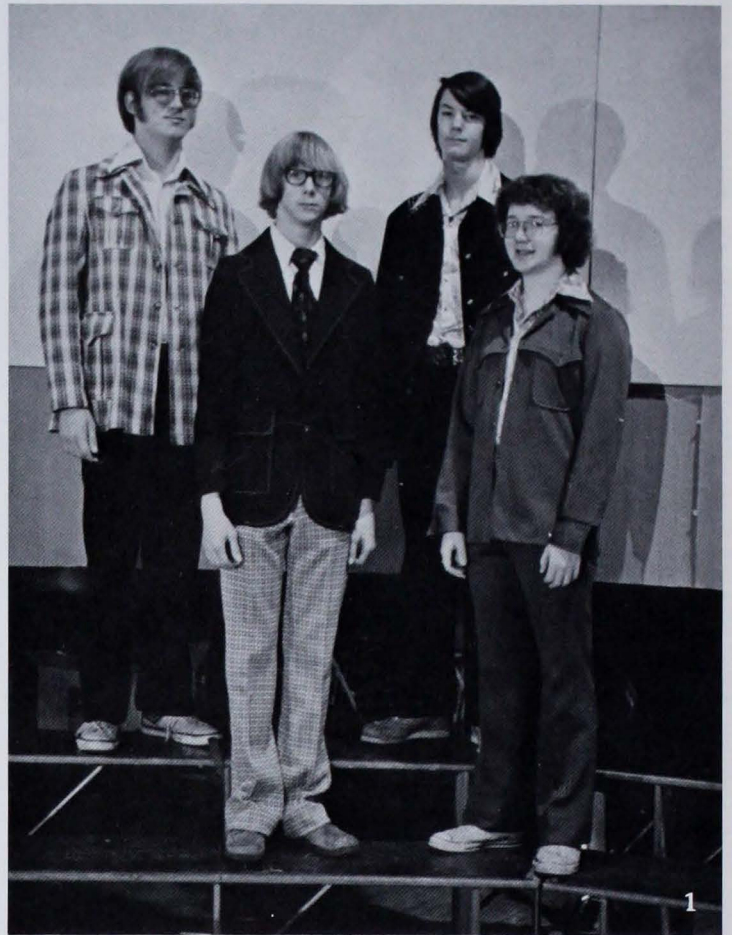
Choirs harmonize Wildcat style

(2) The frosh, who displayed the skills in harmony they polished in last period class, made their first public appearance at the Christmas concert.

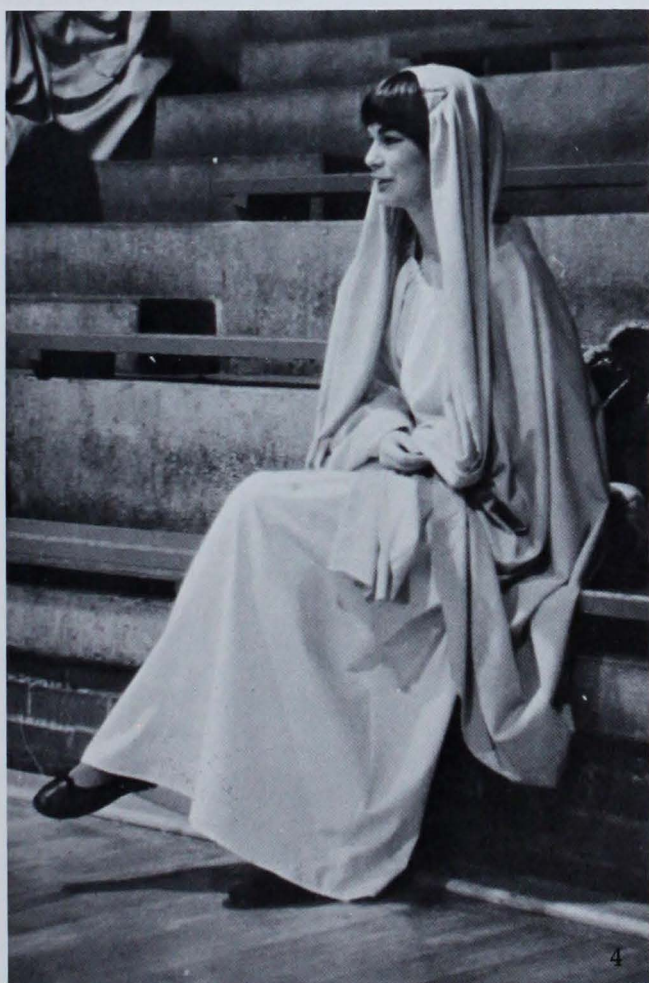
(3) Members of Marians, West Side Singers and Singing Wildcats joined forces in the Mixed choir to present a special number in the December program.

(3) No, it wasn't a visiting professor in English Literature. Just the creation of an intellectual snowman found mysteriously one morning in a junior homeroom.

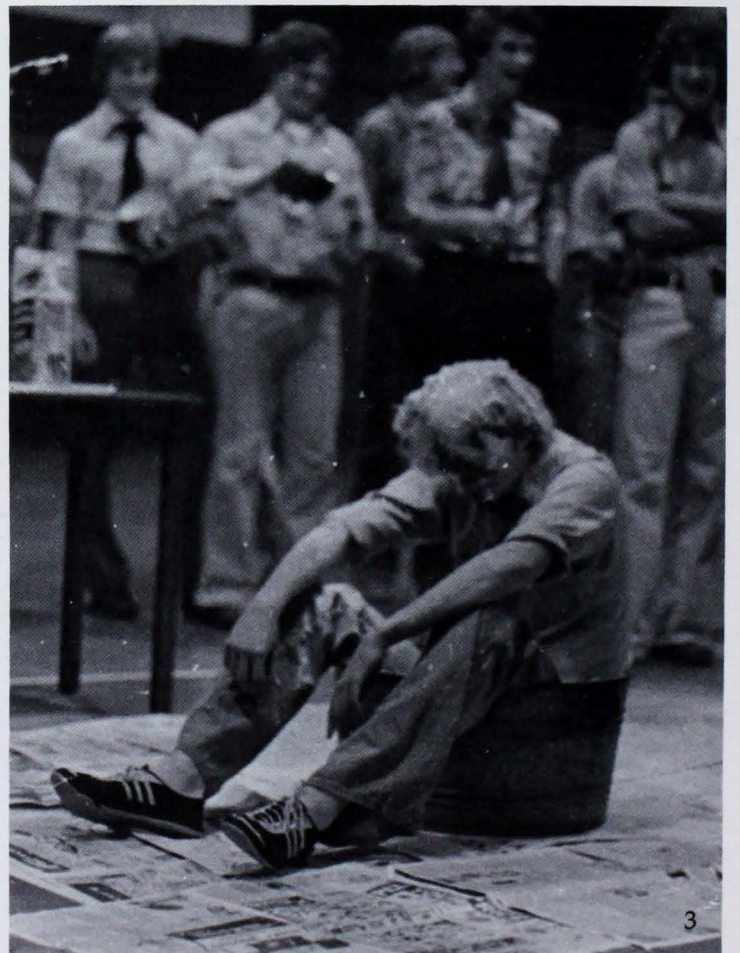
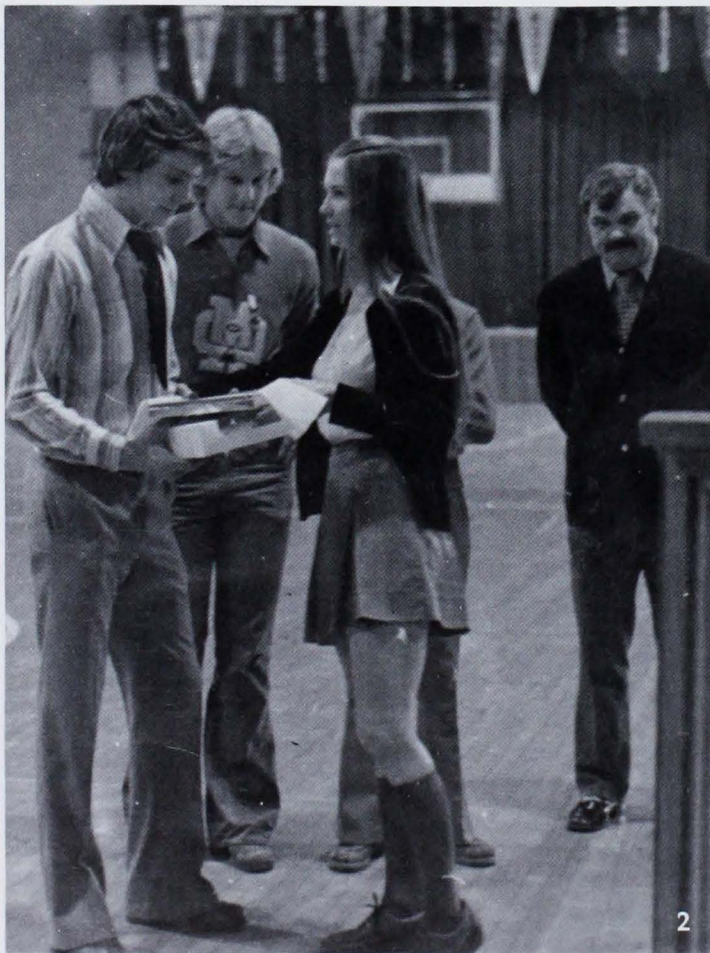
(4) Just getting to the school bus was difficult. The ride home was sometimes terrifying.

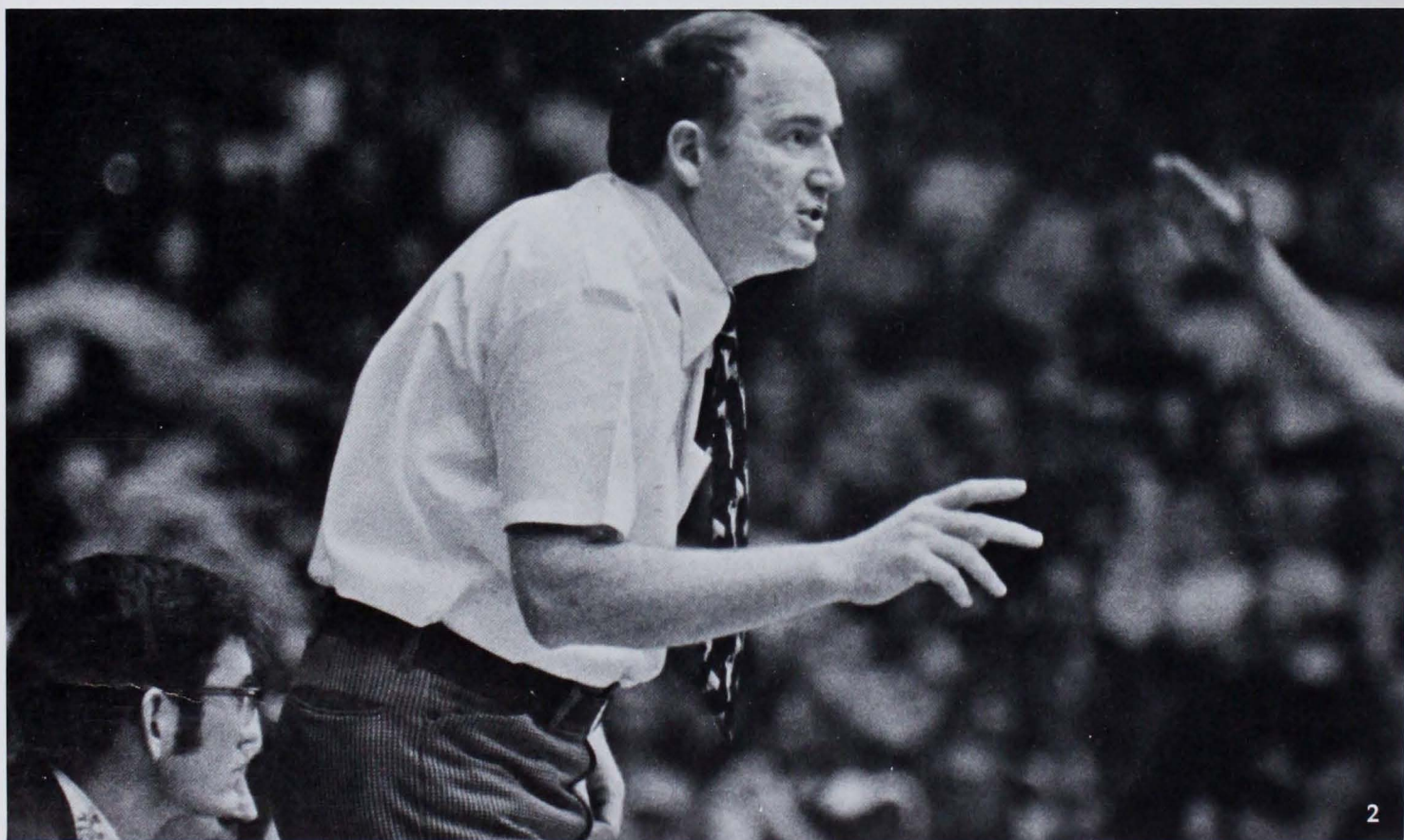
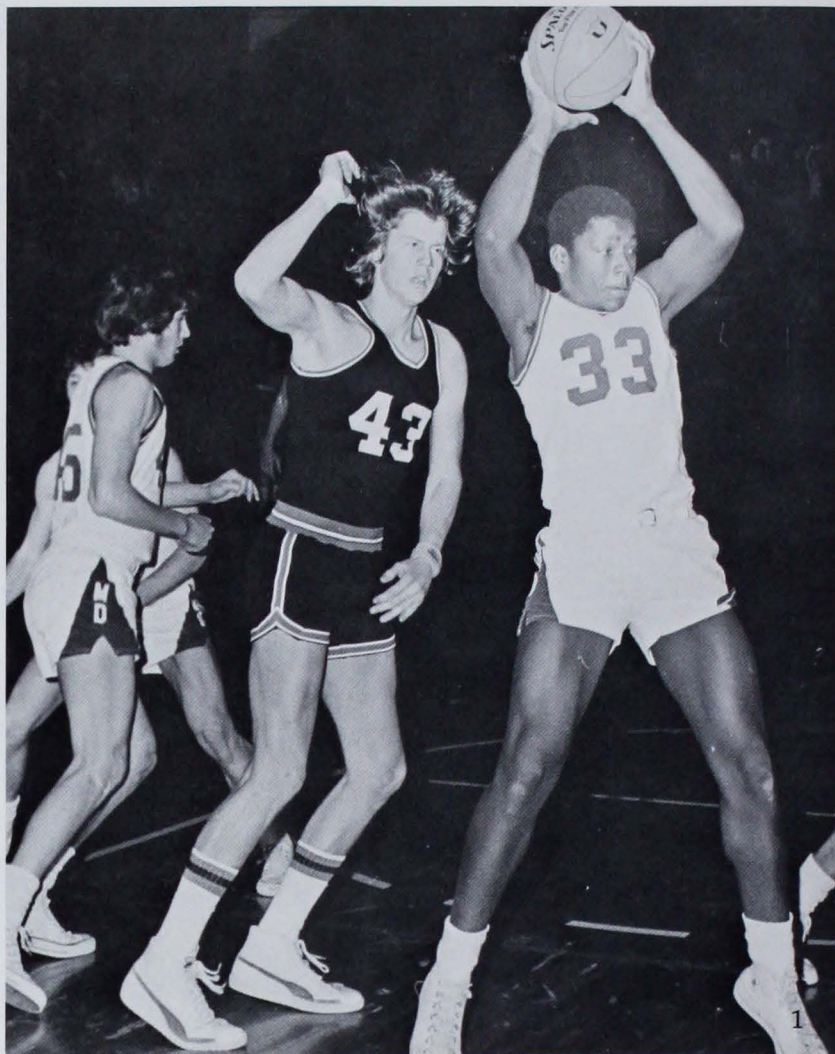
Wildcat cagers enjoy winning season

(3) Revenge was sweet when the Cats managed to take the Panthers in an overtime thriller in the second game of the Sectionals.

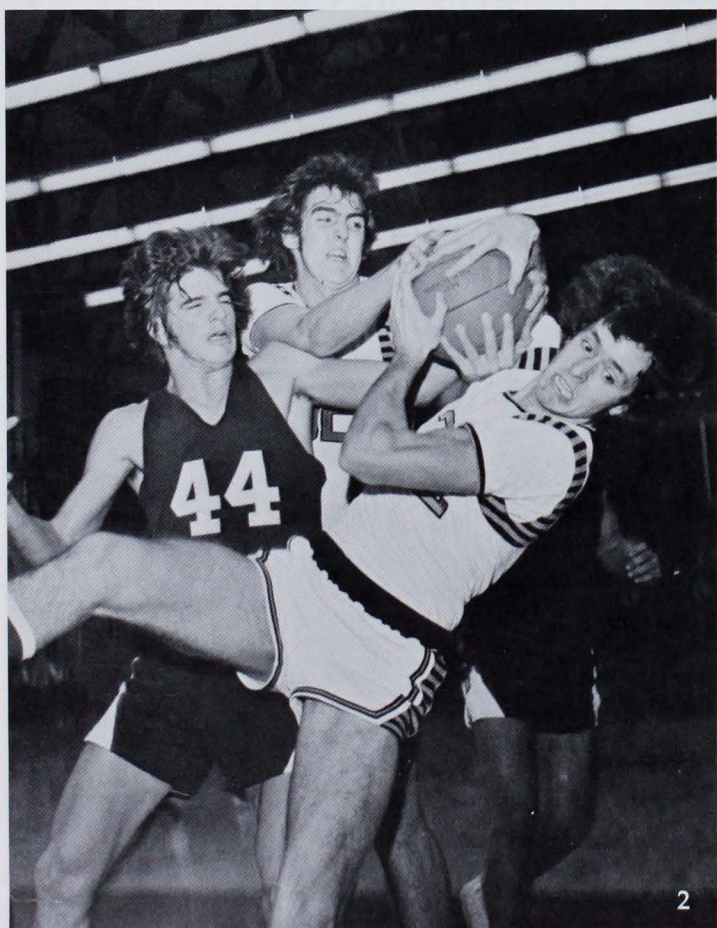
(4) Sophomores John Greaney and Kurt Weinzapfel were in the thick of the action when the Cats fought the North Huskies.

(6) Varsity cheerleaders and Willy Wildcat were always out front supporting their favorite team.



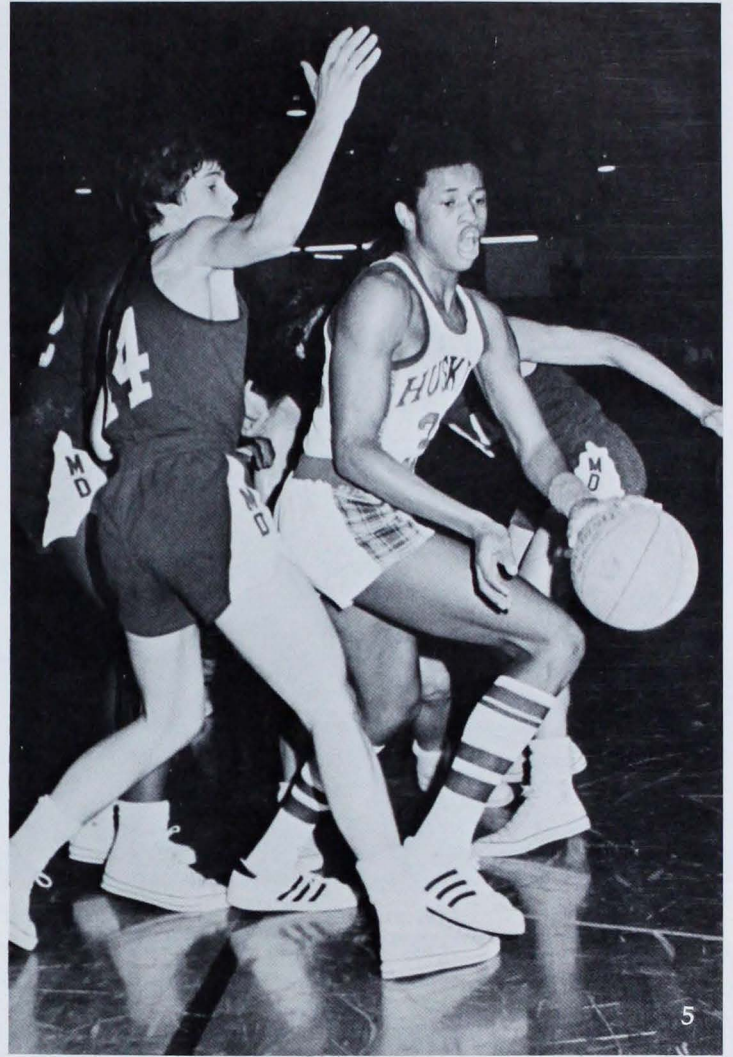
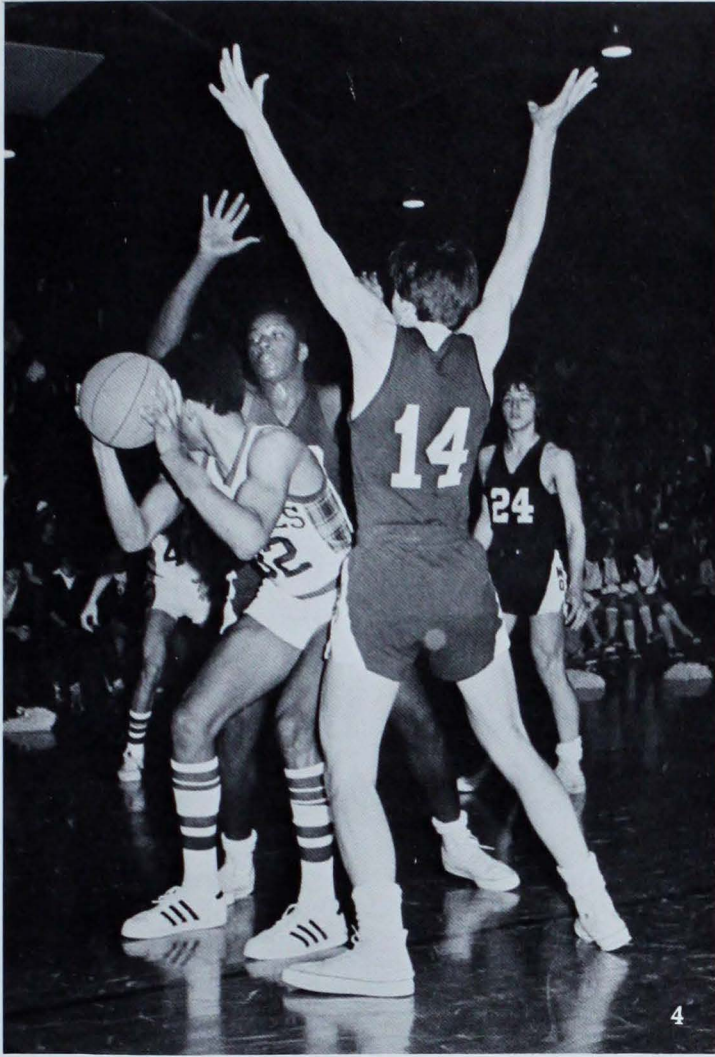

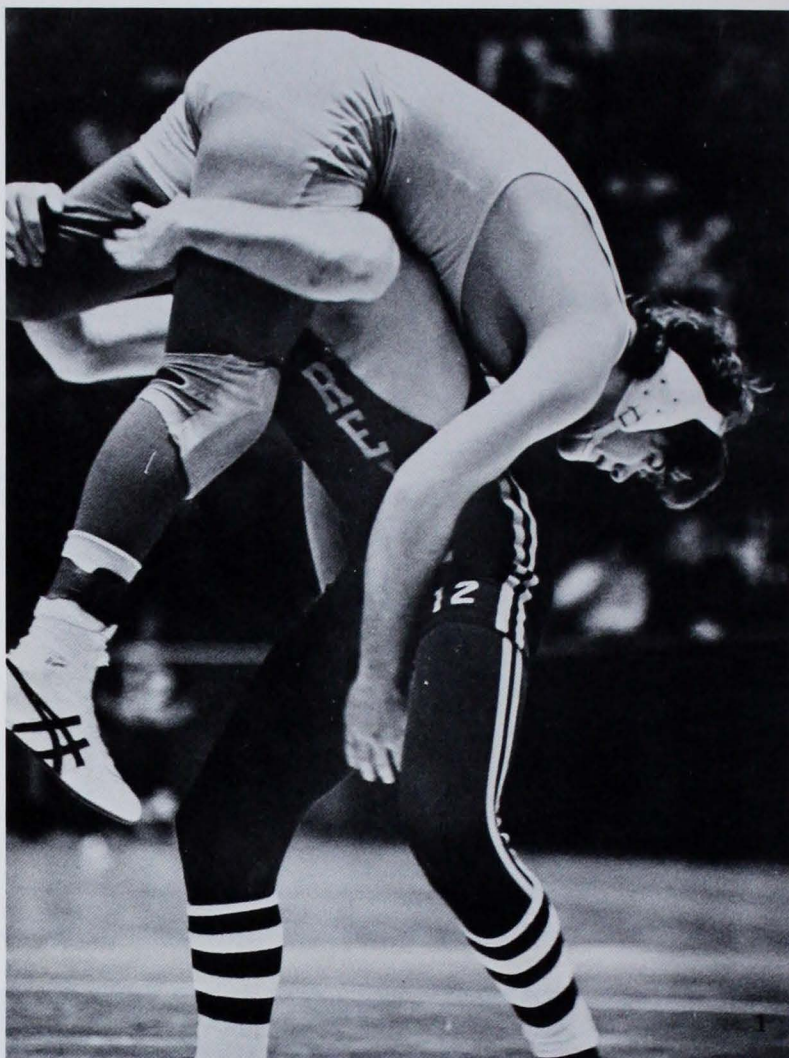
Grapplers grab City, SIAC, Sectional titles

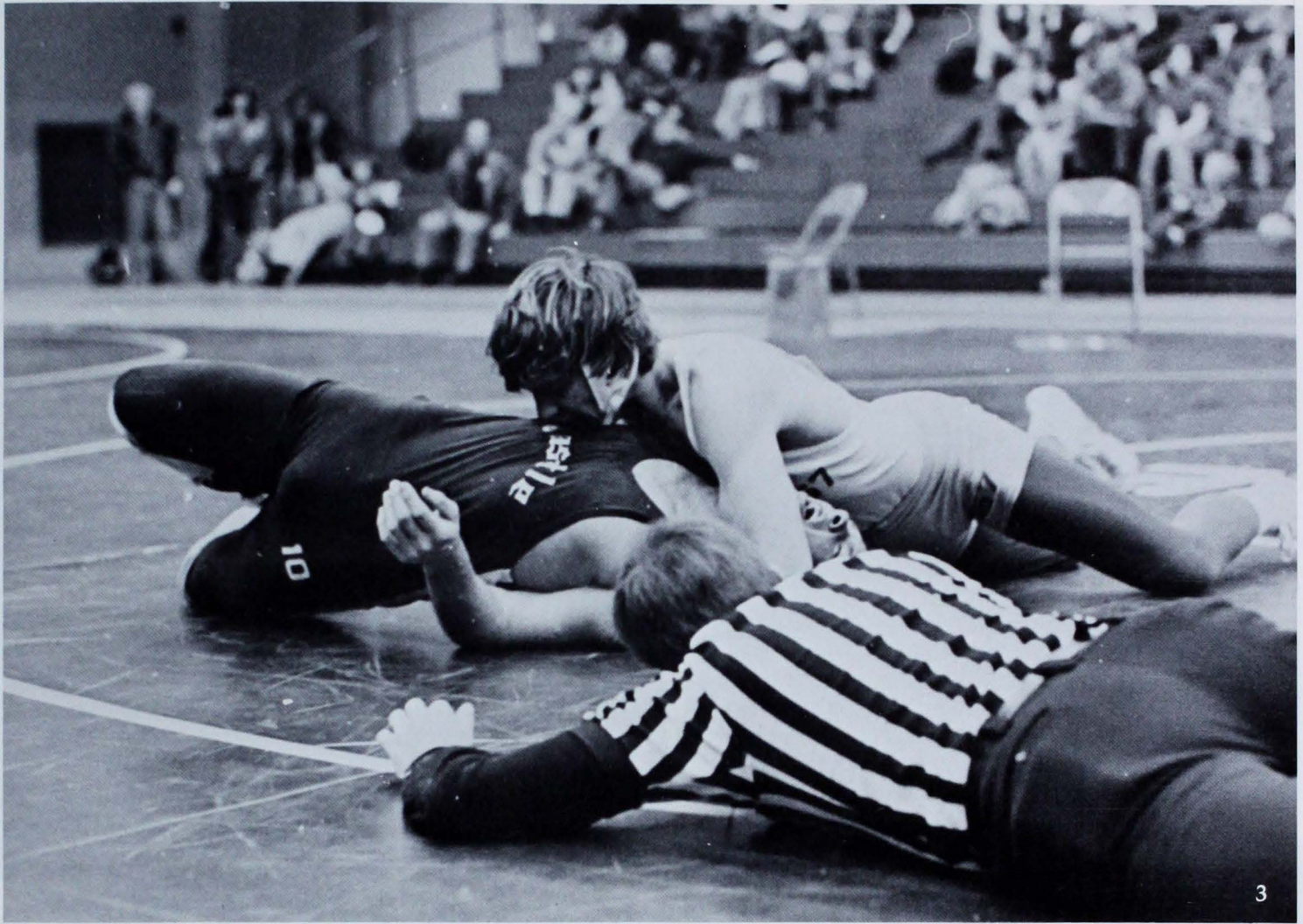

Gossman's Matcats finish season 11-0

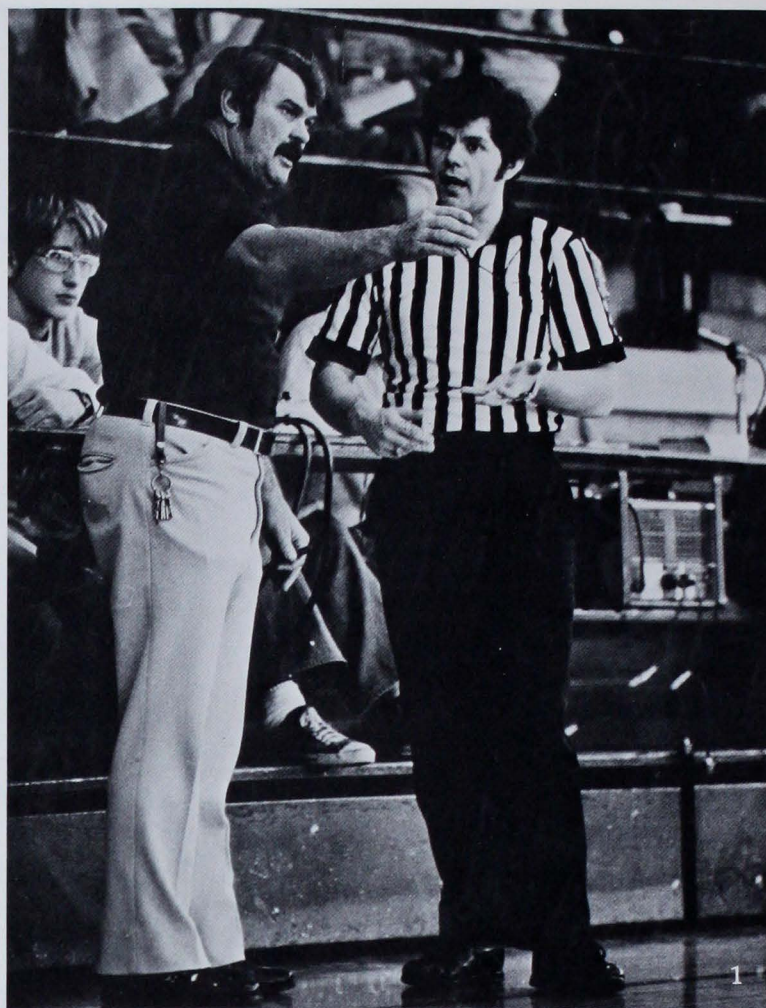
(1) Wrestling coach, Mr. Joe Gossman controlled his temper as he argued with a referee over a difference of opinion during regular season wrestling.

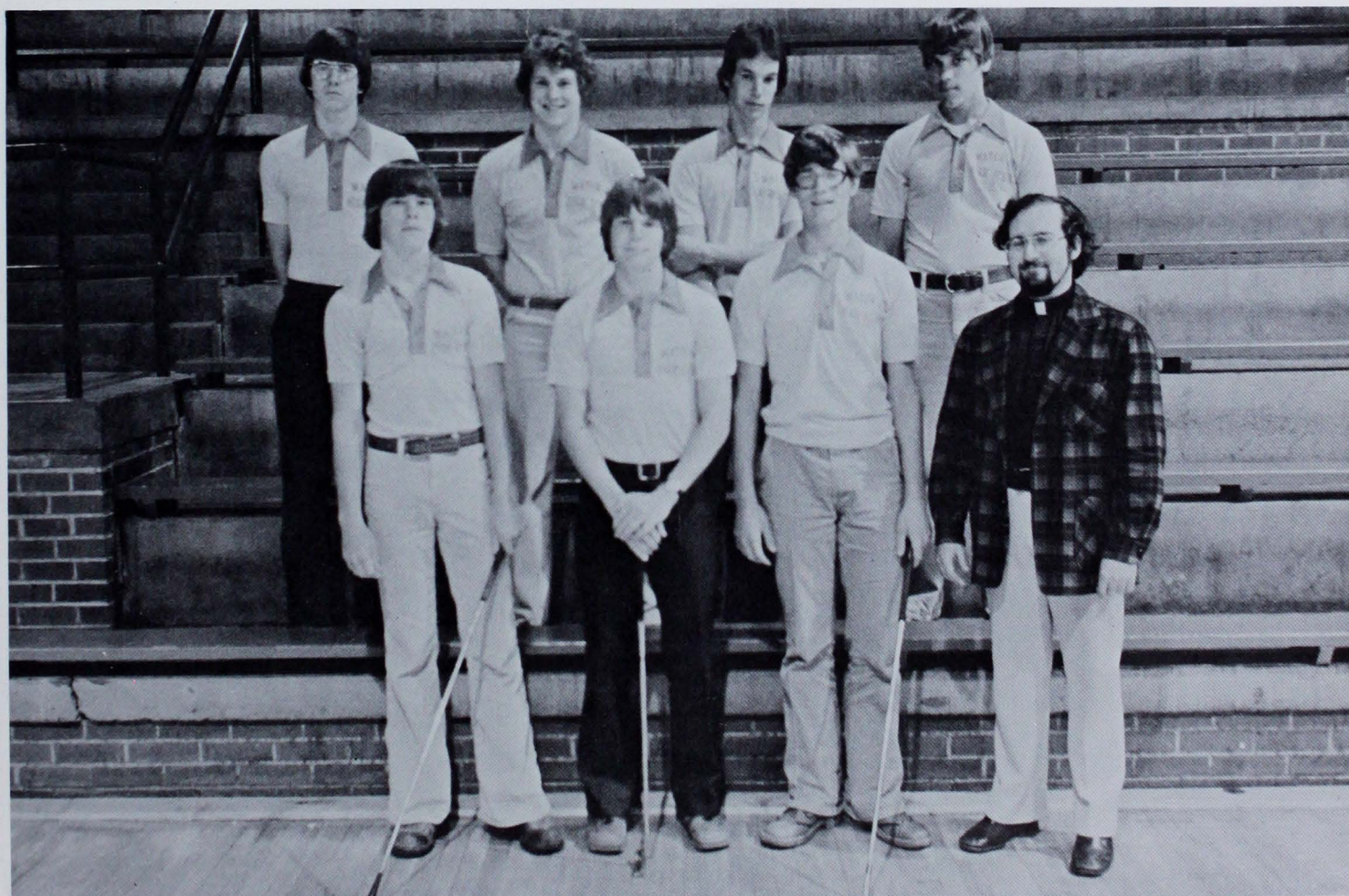
Boys Golf builds foundation for future

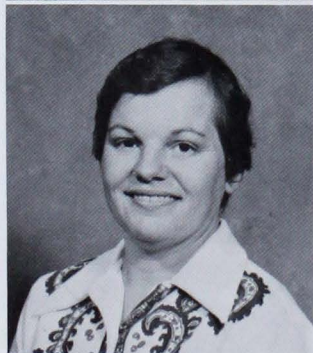
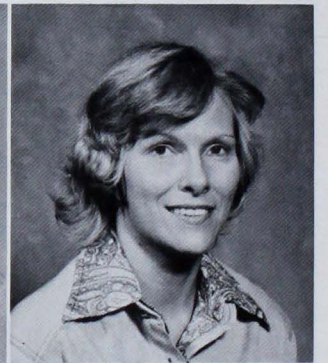


Students, staff lose respected teacher, friend

New to the curriculum for seniors were a series of mini-courses. These one quarter classes were designed to suit individual needs and interests. It was the first year for a girls' basketball team.

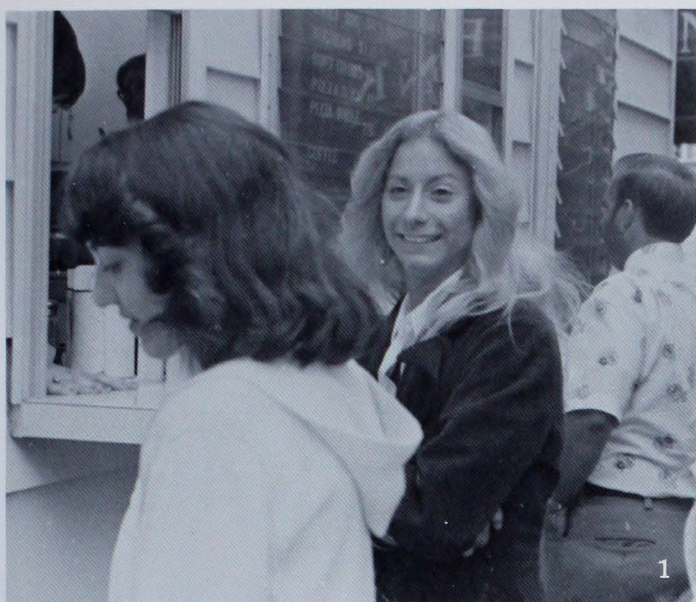

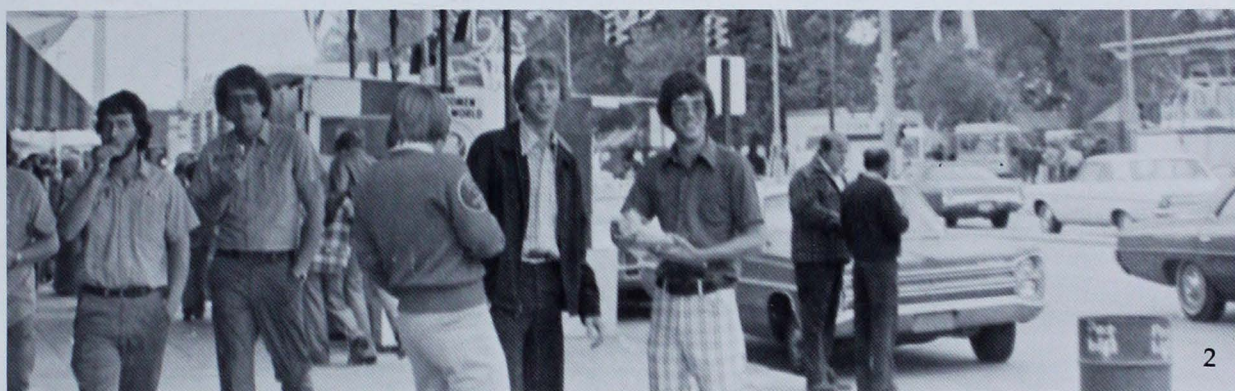

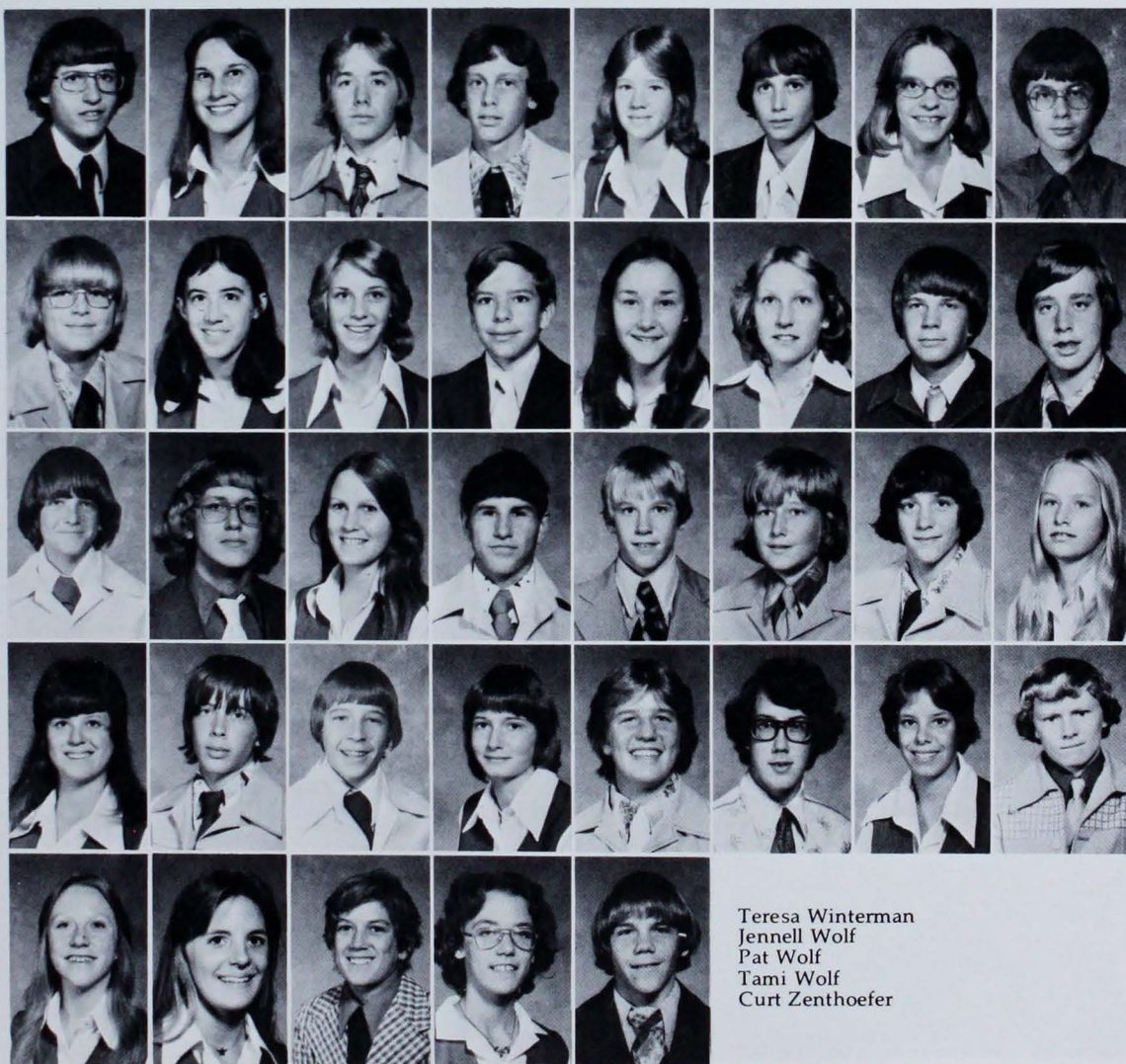




Class takes sale, looks to future
