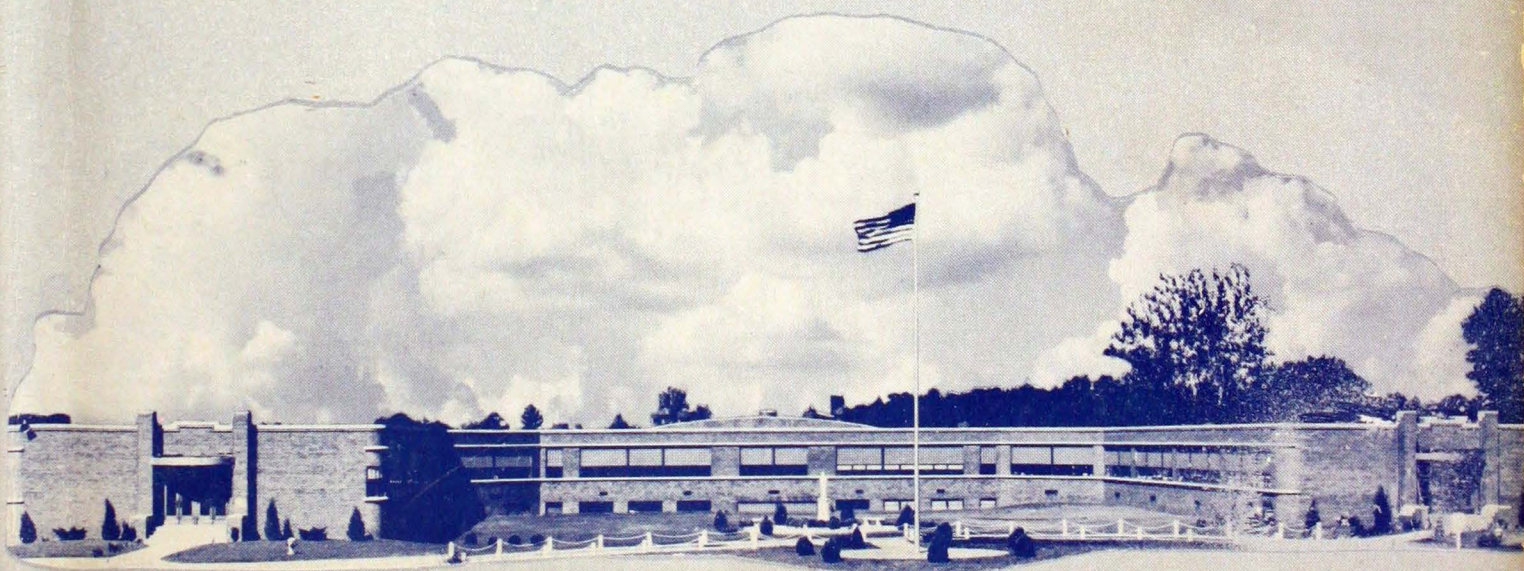

# A City of Truth in the Valley of Youth

## FOREWORD

Many have sought for a fount of youth, or river of youth, a valley of youth; some never found what they sought; some have found the end of their search, but died disappointed; their findings failed to fulfill their hopes. Some, like the fictional Englishman who found the gleaming Shangri-la tucked away in the mountains of Tibet, found indeed a valley of youth, but could not endure in it because of its isolation from the world of man.

Today there is a true Valley of Youth, tucked away in the West Heights of Evansville. Thousands know and love the valley, hundreds live and work there each day...its inhabitants never grow old, its grass is always green, its roads are new, its buildings are bright and shining in the sun.

This valley teems with energy and activity and is a vital part of the world of men about it. Yet the valley has its own spirit, its peaceful atmosphere, its youthful carefreeness.

The lovely valley of Mater Dei on Harmony Way did not always appear as a valley of youth. Ten years ago a wise and God-directed Churchman, Most Rev. Bishop Henry J. Grimmelsman, the one and only Bishop of Evansville, found this valley of youth.

It took faith and foresight to visualize a trim teeming Valley of Youth in the unkept lowland that bordered Harmony Way ten years ago. It took work, planning and courage to realize it...But here it is today as true a Valley of youth as the world can offer.

In 1947 Bishop Grimmelsman entrusted the Valley and the 90 - some youth to the supervision of a man whose devotion to youth was unbounded and whose energy and ability were untiring - Father William A. Lautner.

It was Father who "dreamed up" the city of truth now known as Mater Dei-ville. In 1952-53 the city-form of student government took form. In 1955 the student council officially adopted the name and seal-Mater Dei-ville. In 1956 the Mayor of Evansville recognized the student city as a honorary suburb of Evansville; hence, there is a City of Truth in the Valley of Youth.





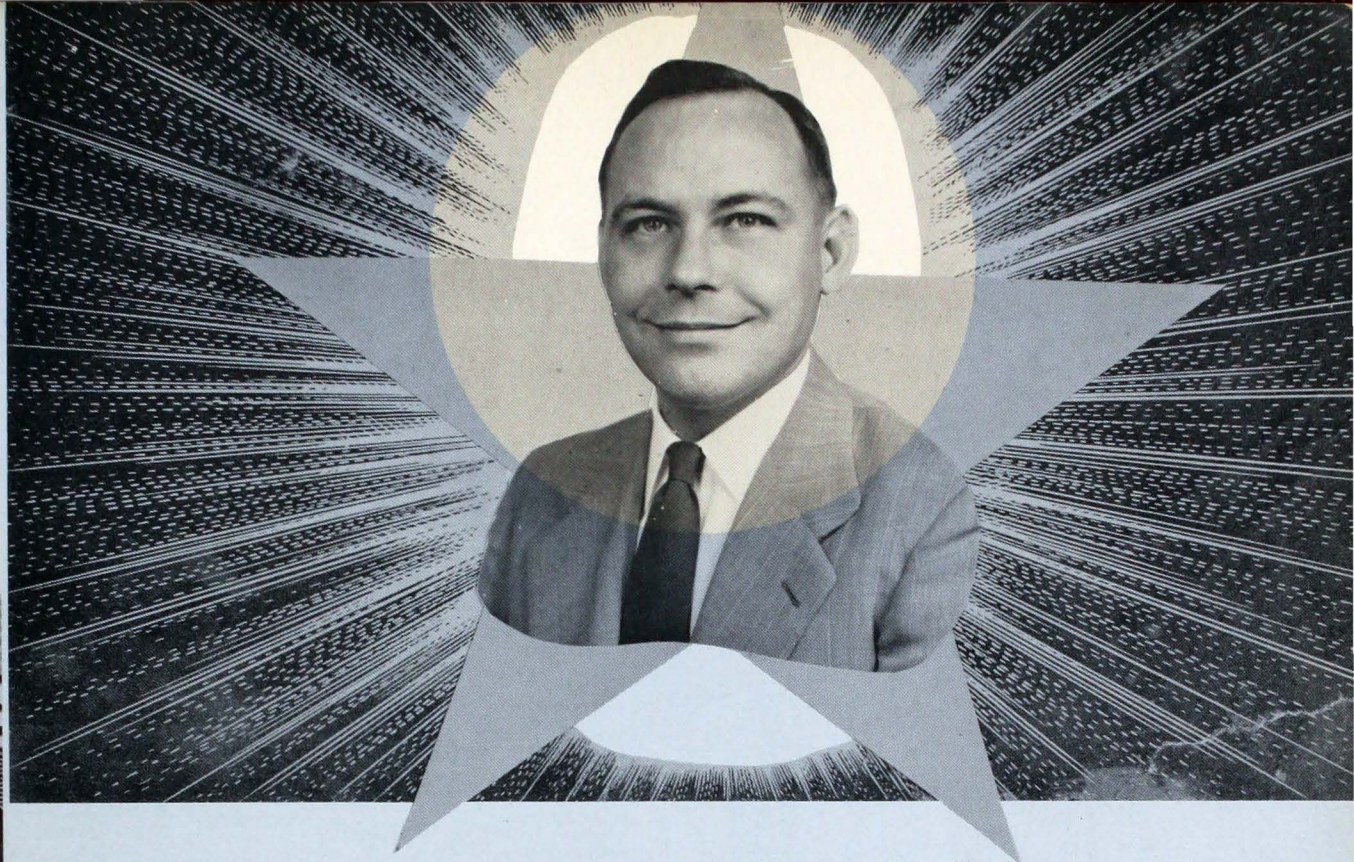

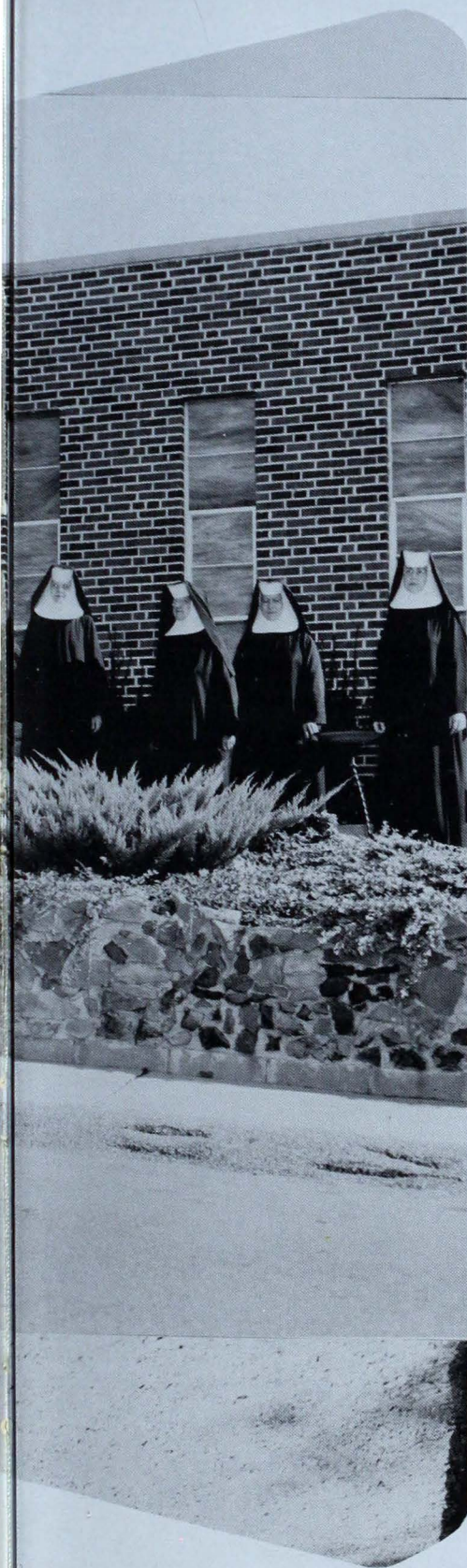
# They Guard the Valley of Youth

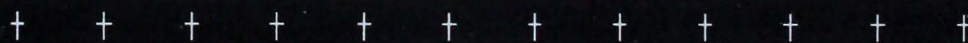

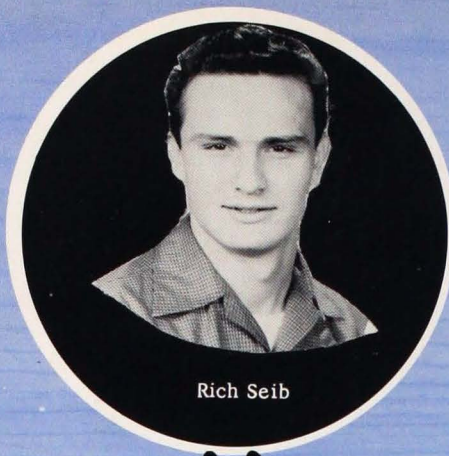
# They Hold the Keys of the City

"After two days at Mater Dei, I think of it not as just an ordinary school, but a little city off to itself with its own people." How true! a little city, not only with its own people, but with its own government.

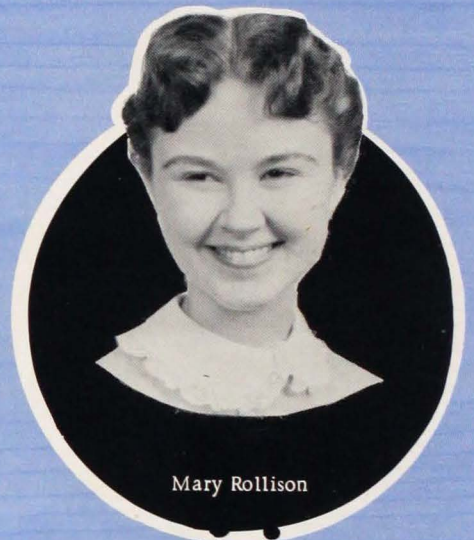
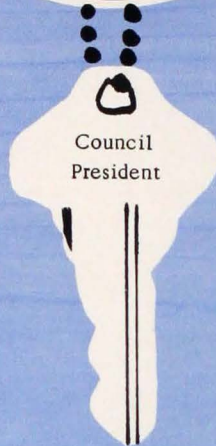
Here are the people who hold the keys to the teen city of

The Student council elects its own president; and the Mayor appoints the various officials who head the commissions and make up his official family.

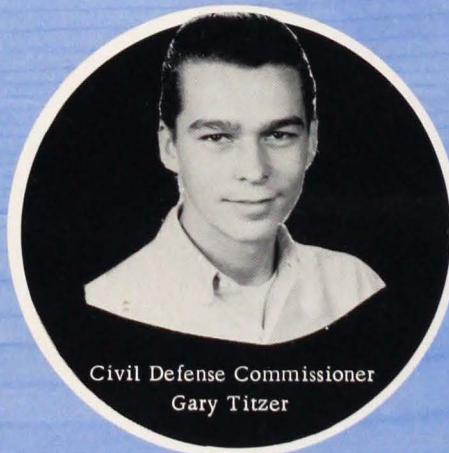
