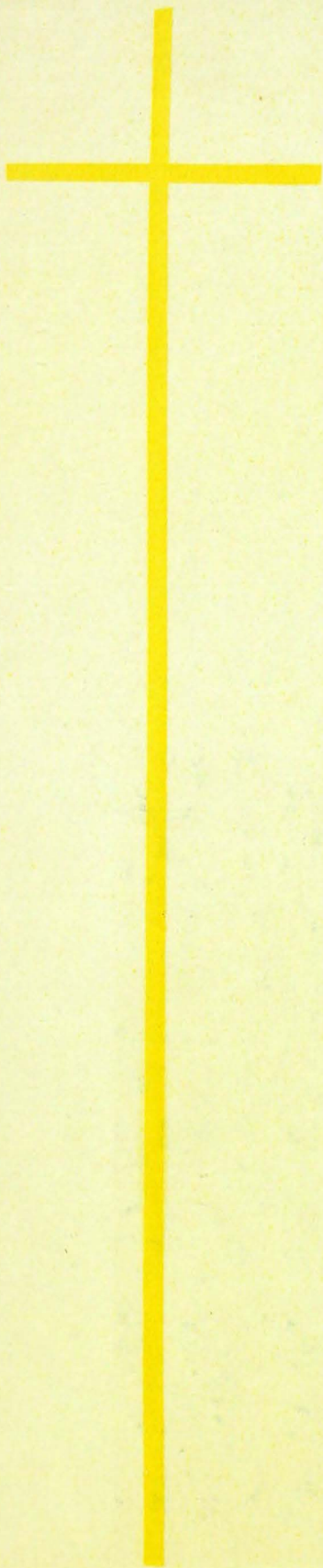

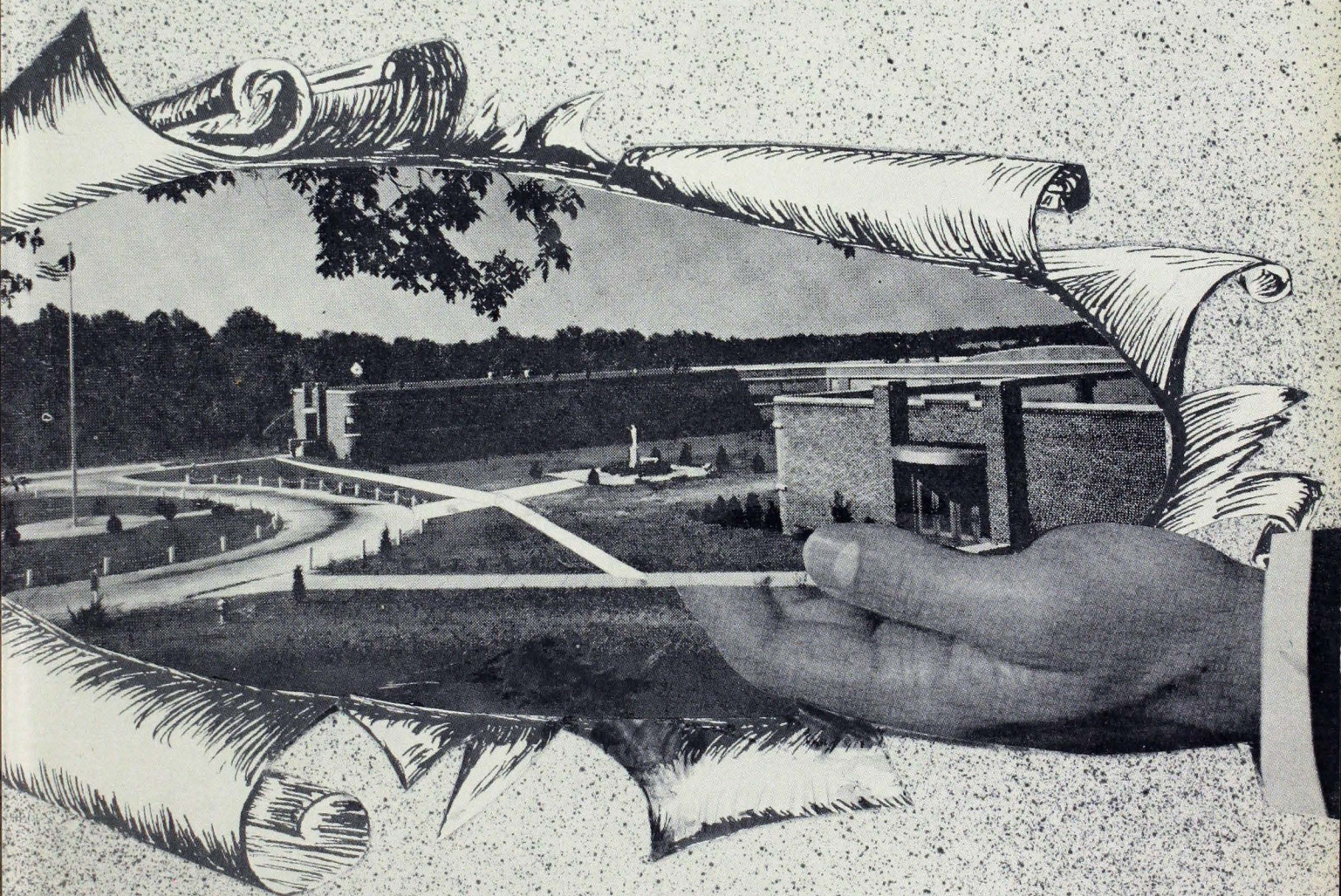

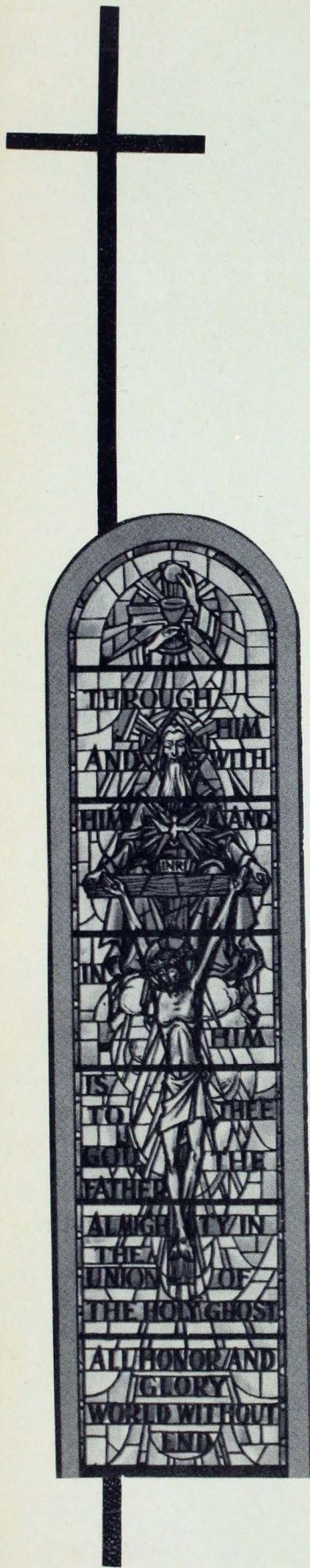
Here you see our students and school centered around our Lady's statue. Even more are our lives and our school centered around God and His Mother in promoting Catholic ideals for youth.

Truly the Spiritual life of our school means more to us than any other. For this way of life will lead us on the heavenly road to God and His Mother, Mater Dei.

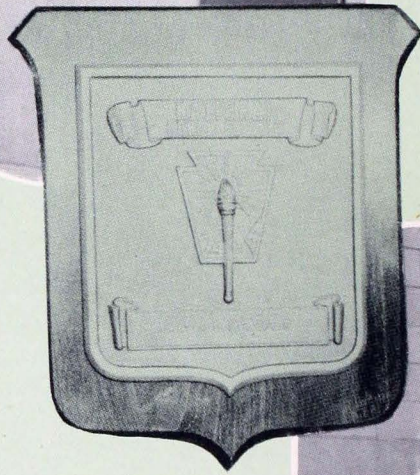

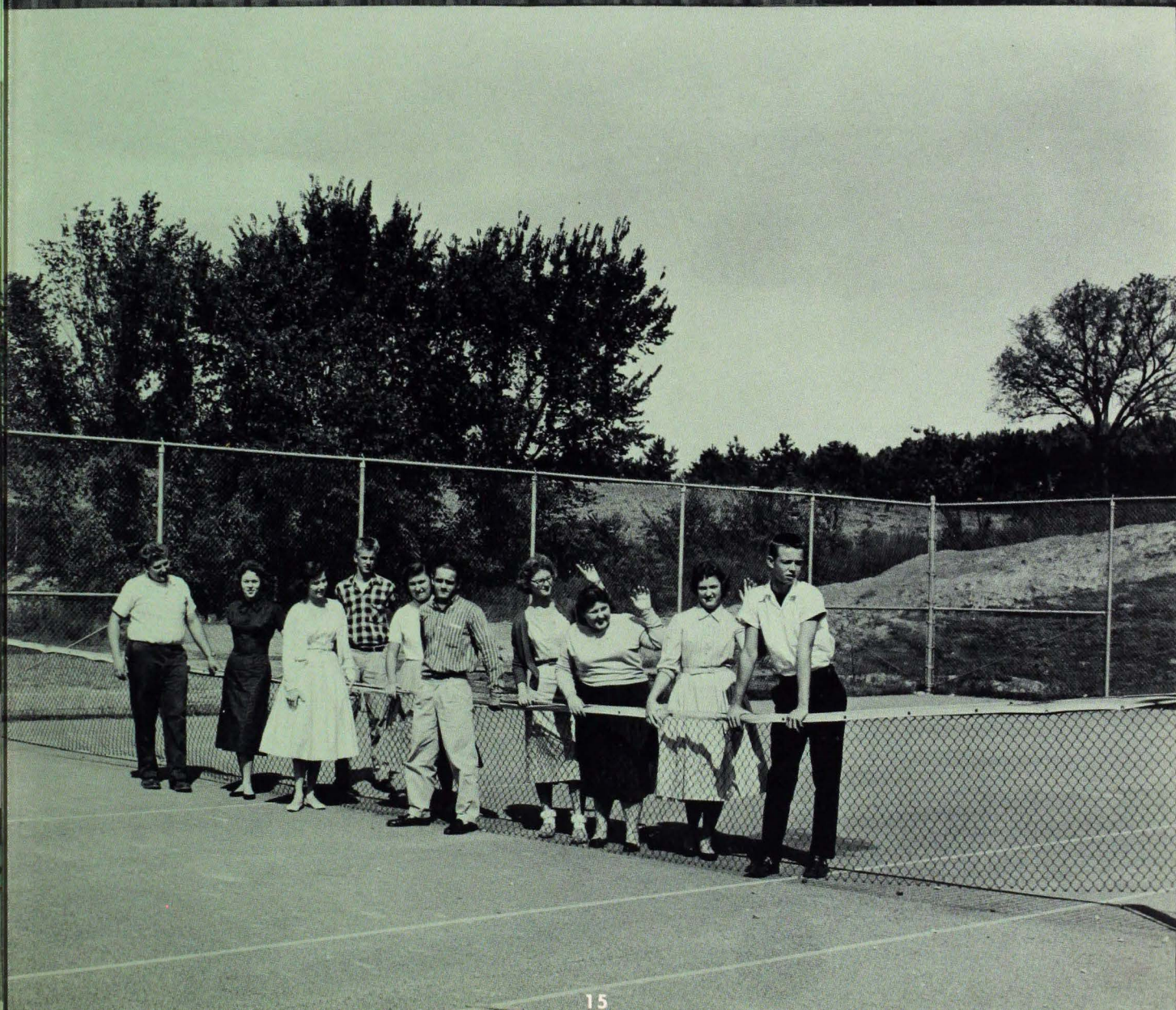
Campus Life

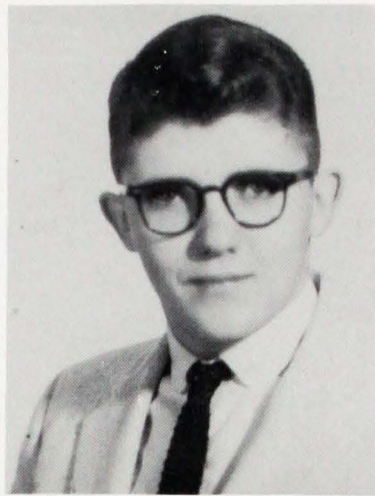

The Annual Retreat, the Pontifical Mass on October 11, May Crowning and Baccalaureate are Religious activities in which the whole school participates.





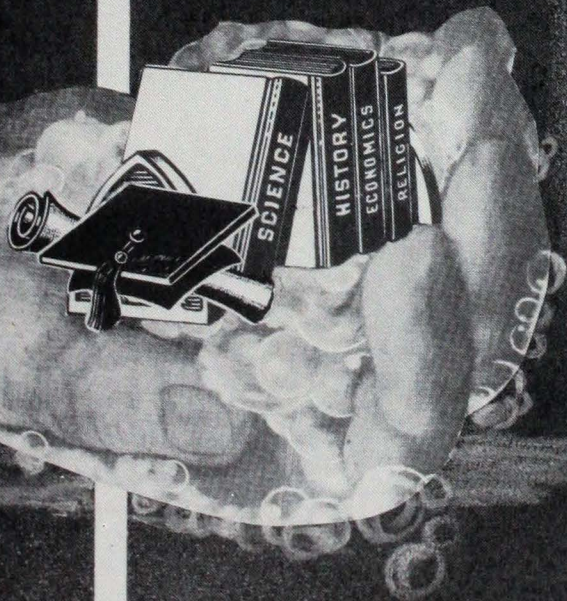

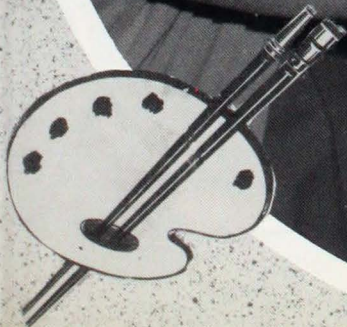
Music class work is also supplemented by performances and participation in the local and State contests in vocal and instrumental music.

Besides being M. D.'s master-artist, Sister Claudia is also the faithful bookstore keeper.

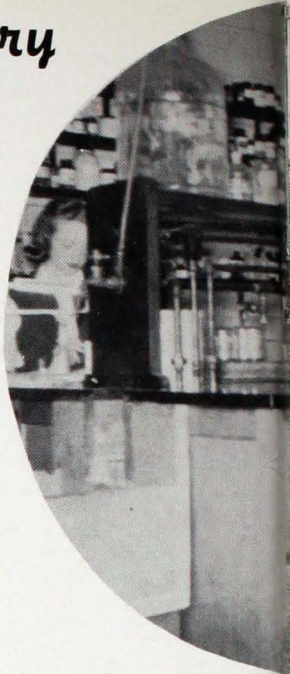

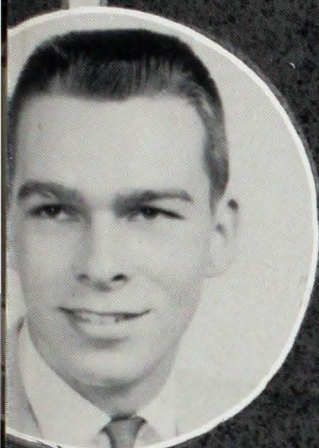

The team was consistently praised by sportscasters and described as an excellently coached team. Indeed it was for Mater Dei's fine football team had an even better team of coaches behind it.

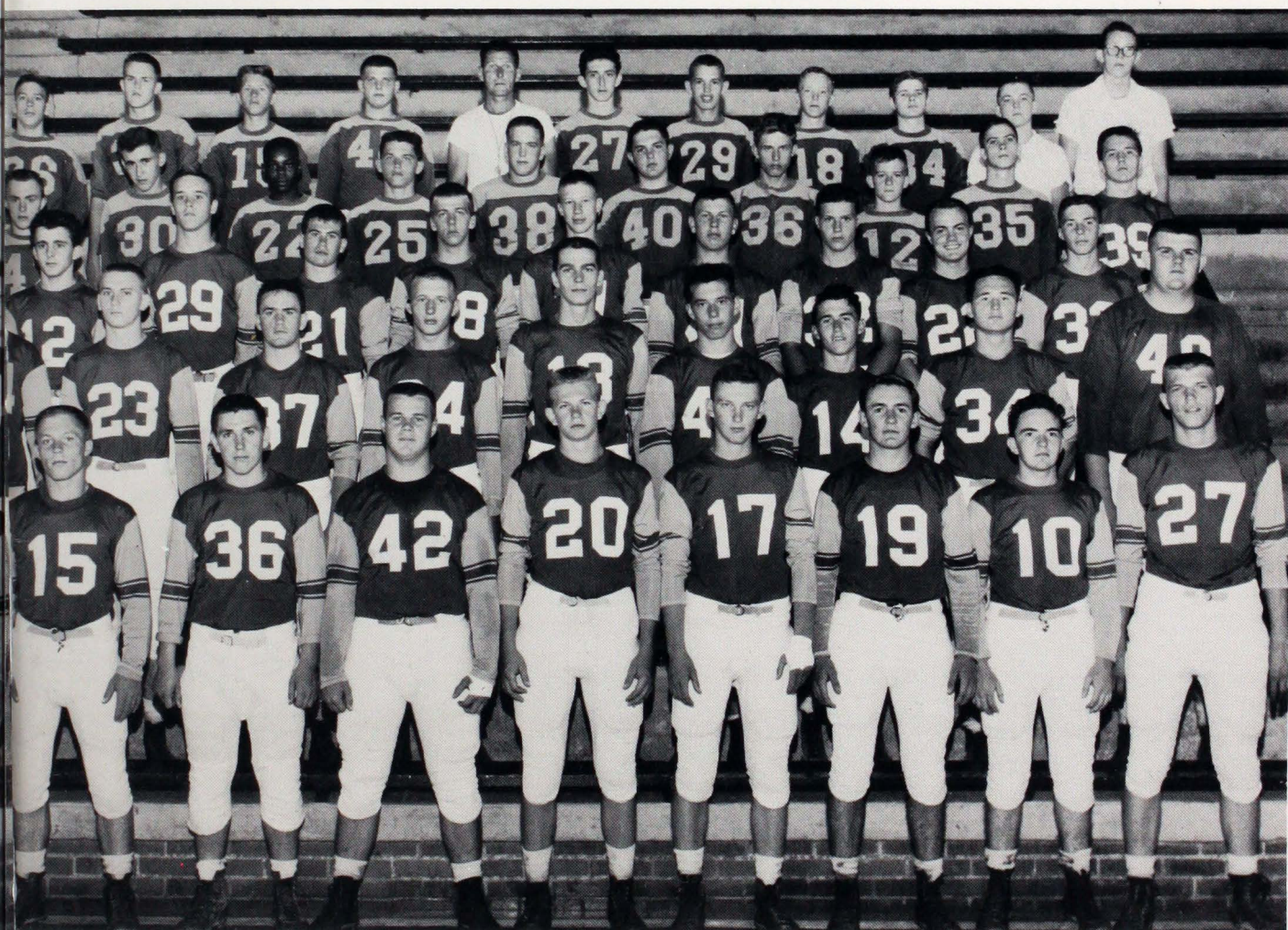

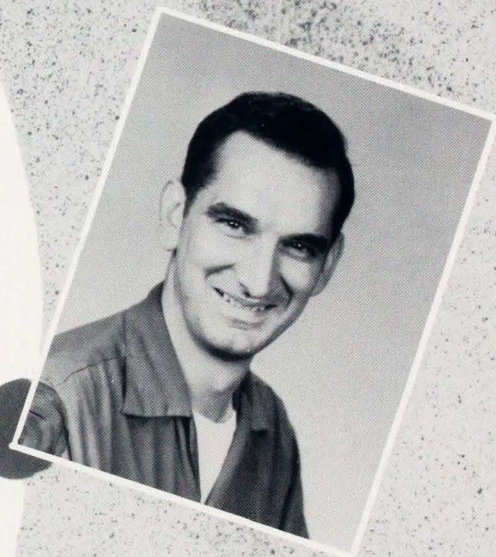
