If you heard Patti Page sing "Mockingbird Hill", or saw Broderick Crawford in *All the King's Men* then you're one of those who remember 1949.

It was a year that produced many things. Harry Truman was in the White House. The Yankees won still another World Series. A little import from Germany called the VW hit the American scene.

But if you were an Evansville West Sider you know that Mater Dei High School originated in 1949. A second generation has arrived since that day twenty-five years ago when Mater Dei opened her doors to 425 students.

The school song has changed, the

dress code has been modernized, all classes are now coeducational, few of the original staff remain, but a good many things have remained constant.

The reputation for excellence in academic achievement was established early under the direction of Father William Lautner and Sister Mary Irmagard who headed the first faculty. Mater Dei's students soon were recognized as among the most loyal and spirited supporters of their school.

Mr. Len Will and Mr. Paul Ellert along with maintenance supervisor Mr. Meinrad Schoenbachler have remained on the staff continuously since that first day in September,


1949. Mr. Will early established the Wildcats as a football power to be reckoned with when he lead his first team to victory in their very first game against Carmi.

Traditions established that first year—May Day, Prom, Hi-Lights, etc.—have flourished. They are as important to the class of '74 as they were to their predecessors in 1949.

Students, styles, curriculum, faculty undoubtedly will change as Mater Dei continues to progress in the years ahead as it has in the quarter century just past, but the legacy left by the first class of 1949 will remain indelibly etched in the memory of its alumni.





Osterman, Elpers make All-City;



Despite critics predictions that the Wildcats wouldn't get moving, the Cats scored an average of 20 points and ended up 5-4 for the year. Mater Dei season didn't start rolling until the fourth game with a sudden-death victory over Memorial. In the following two games the Cat's offense rolled up 98 points. Reitz put the Wildcats offense machine to a halt and scored a 19-6 victory, ending Mater Dei's three game winning streak. The Cats finished the year with a victory over Central and a closing loss to North. The gridders placed two players on the All-City team, end Mark Osterman and lineman Joe Elpers. Mark and Joe along with Rusty Miller, Paul Hillenbrand, and Dan Weinzapfel, were named to the All-Conference team

















Girls Volleyball team takes City title




At the end of the volleyball season the girls captured both the City and Sectional titles before suffering their only loss of the season to Castle in the Regionals. Castle was the strongest team the girls faced during regular season play. It took three games to do it, but Mater Dei came out on top, 15-12, 13-15, 15-9. Castle, however, wanted revenge and got it at Regionals, but not before a hard fought three game match. The girls bowed to Castle 12-14, 15-12, 0-15, ending their victorious season 12-1. Their regular season slate ended 8-0 giving them the first City crown. They entered the Sectionals the heavy favorite and went on to capture the crown by defeating Central 15-4, 15-10, Mt. Vernon 15-1, 15-4, and North 15-8, 15-12 to advance to the Regionals.




Osterman, Debes lead cagers



A disappointing loss to Bosse's Bulldogs in the finale ended dreams for a first sectional crown, but finished Mater Dei's basketball season with the best record in the 25 year history. The 58-50 loss left the Cats with a 15-8 season record, but marked the first time they had made the finals since 1959.




Led by the scoring twosome of Mark Osterman and Pat Debes and the playmaking of guards Charlie Boberg and Greg Baumgart, the Wildcats disposed of North and Central enroute to the final game.

The Cats started the season off with the longest streak for any previous Wildcat basketball team by winning their first seven games, and eight of their first nine. The team finished 3-3 in the city race, tying for second place in a close loss to Central in the final game of the season.

Statistics showed the Cats having two of the city's leading scorers in Debes and Osterman with 17 point averages. The reserves also ended a winner with a 13-5 record.











Winning Matcats top SIAC, Sectional




As is the custom, the Mater Dei Matcats took the sectionals and the SIAC respectively. The Matcats finished the winning season with the only defeats coming from Central and Reitz. The Matcats started out the season without a heavyweight until the Memorial meet when senior Gary Lannert appeared on the scene. In this match, Lannert tied his opponent 5-5. From then on it was all down hill for the Matcats. Matt Muensterman, a highly rated favorite in the Sectionals, was out most of the tournament due to injuries. Besides capturing the sectionals and SIAC, Mater Dei sent four members of the varsity squad to the regional competition. Seniors Joe Elpers 177 lb. class, Paul Hillenbrand 126 lb. weight class, Gary Lannert heavyweight class, and junior Joe Dewig 155 lb. class fought valiantly but were eliminated in the regionals. The Matcats finished the winning season with a 8-2 record.































Another of the highlights in the juniors' year was December 13, the day they received their class rings. The rings were first blessed by Fa-


ther Robert Bultman before being distributed.
