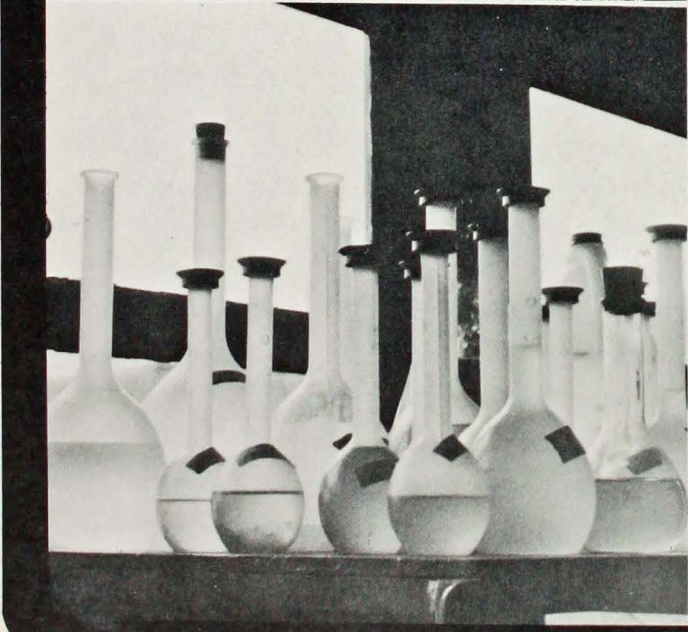
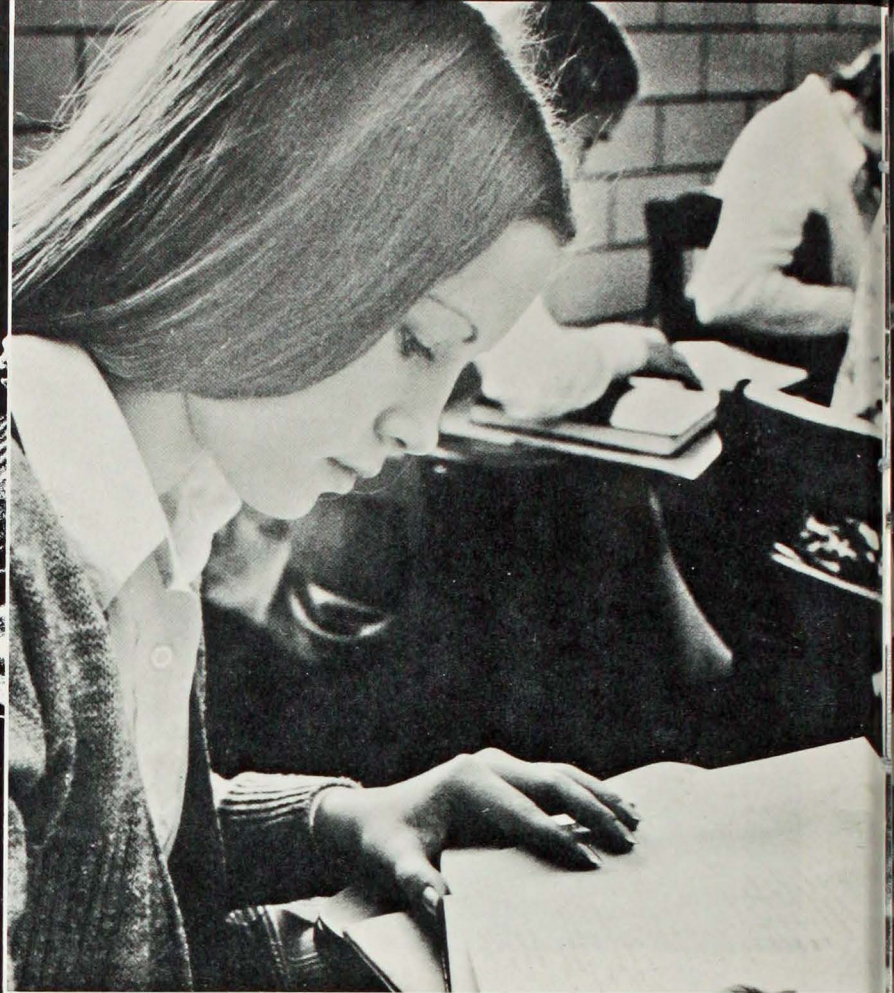


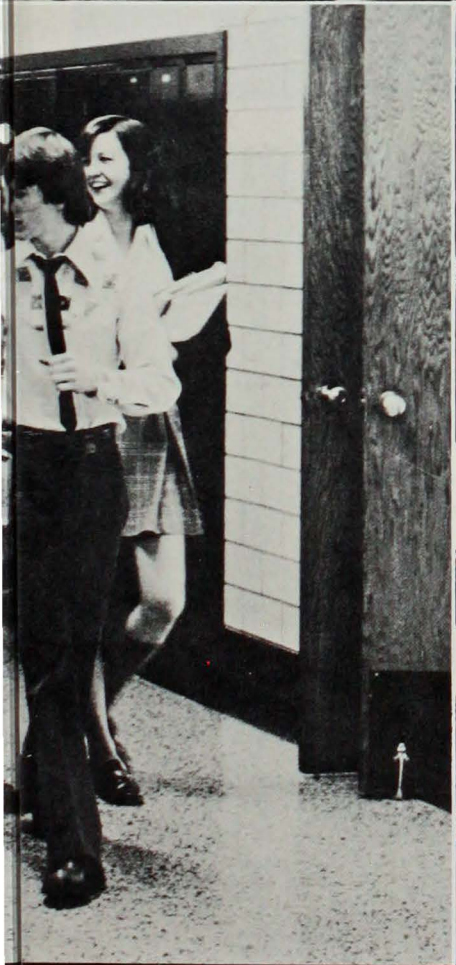


a very special year . . .

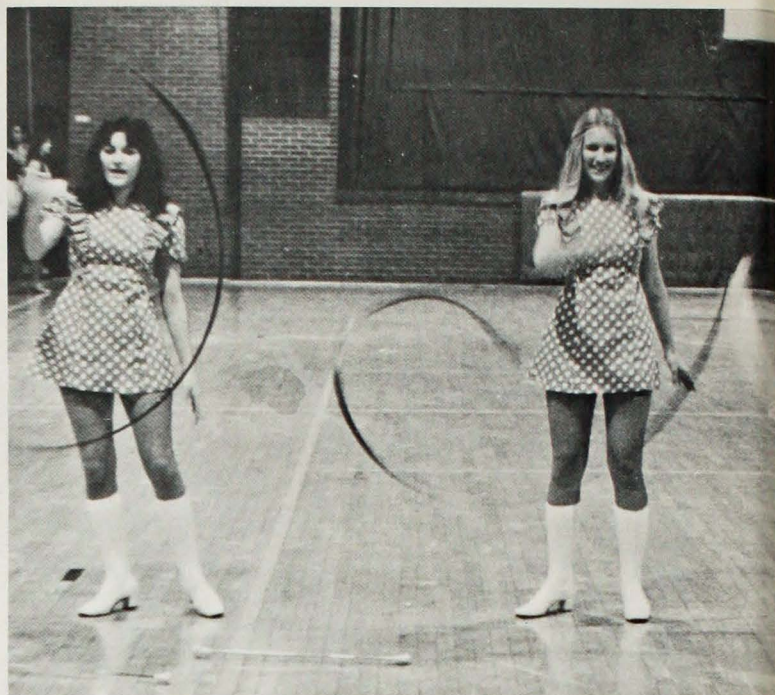

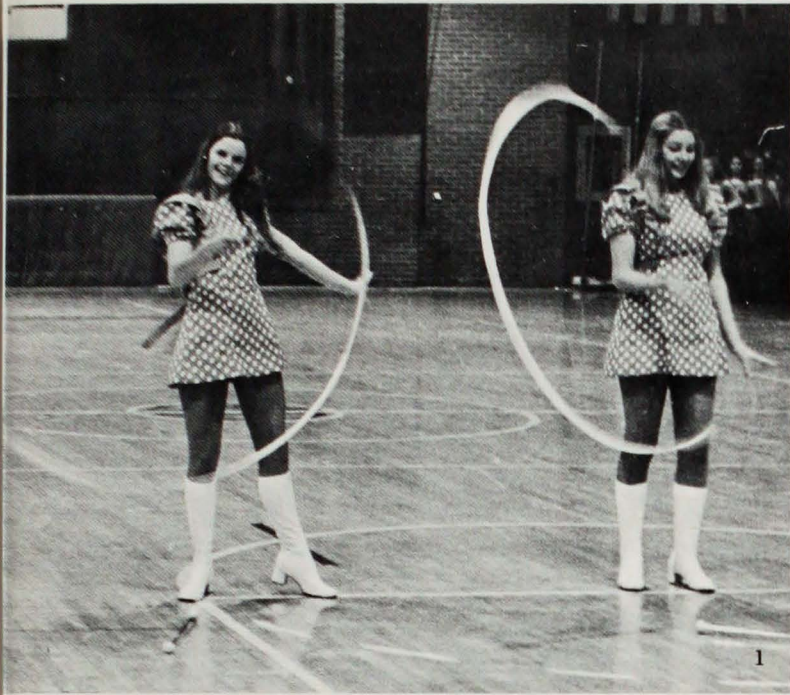

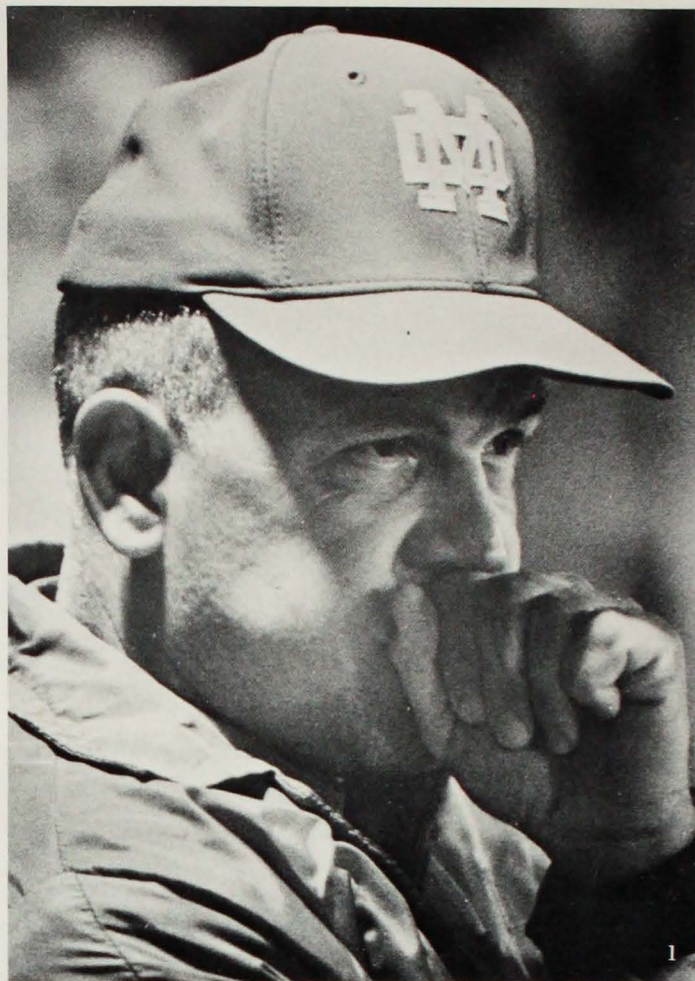




Size, inexperience overpower determined Wildcat gridders

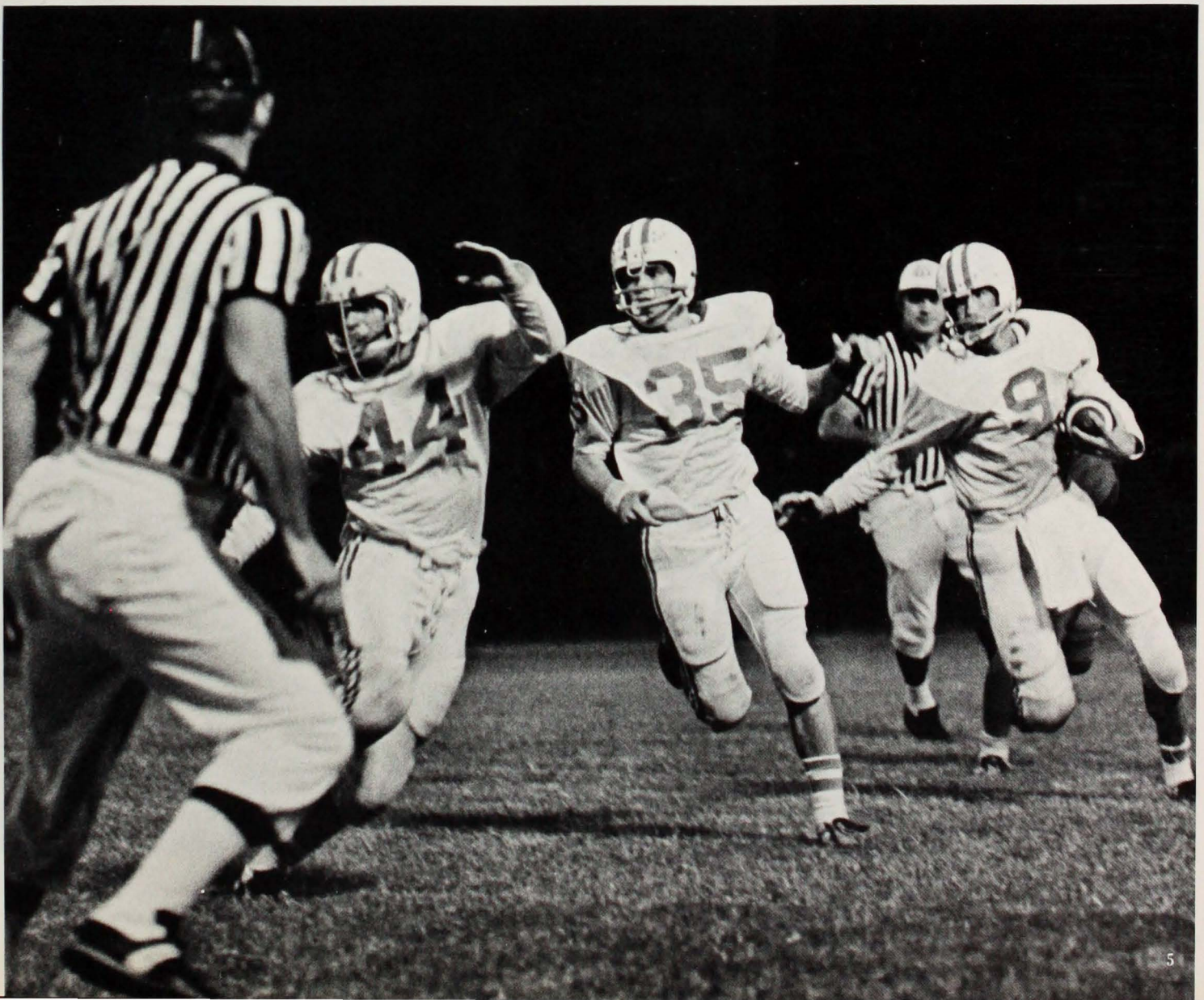

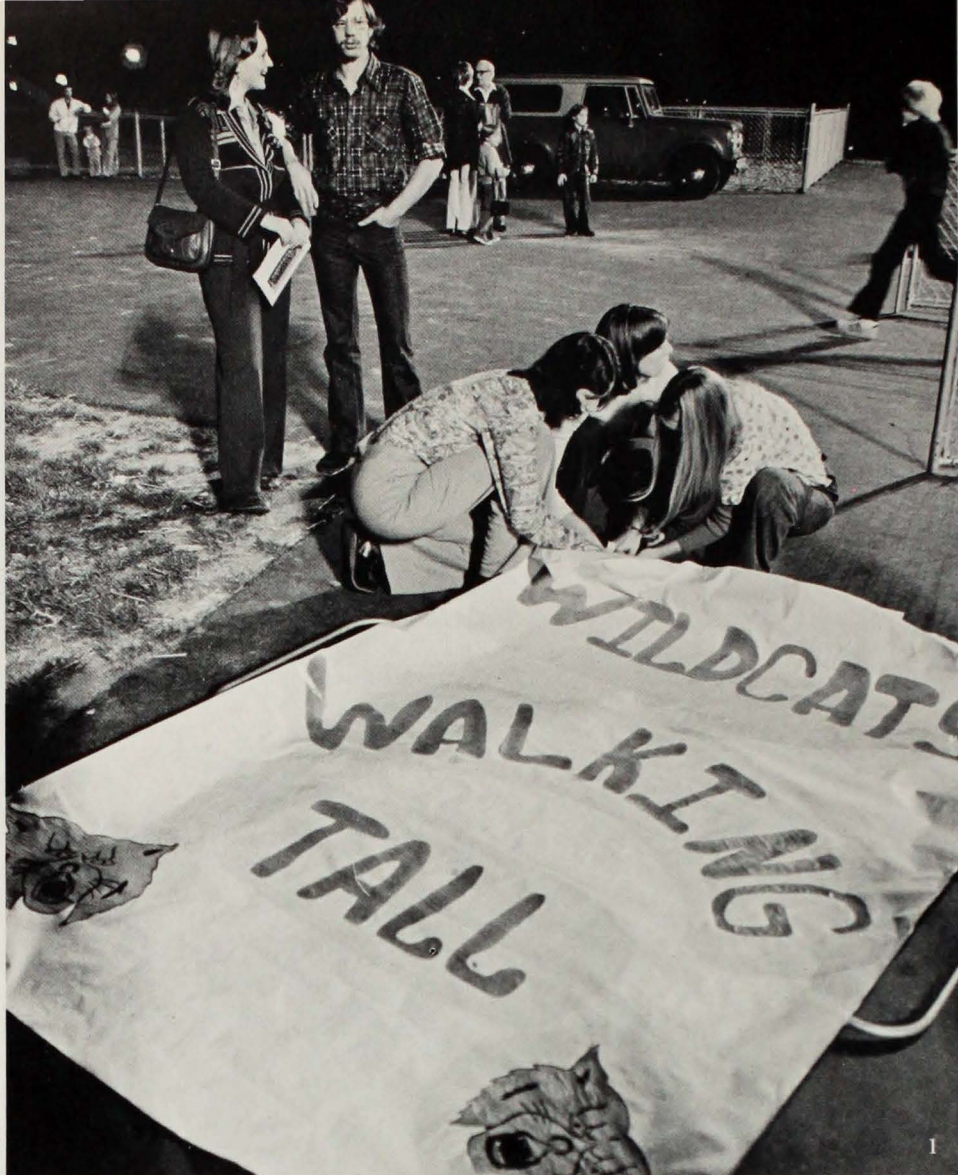

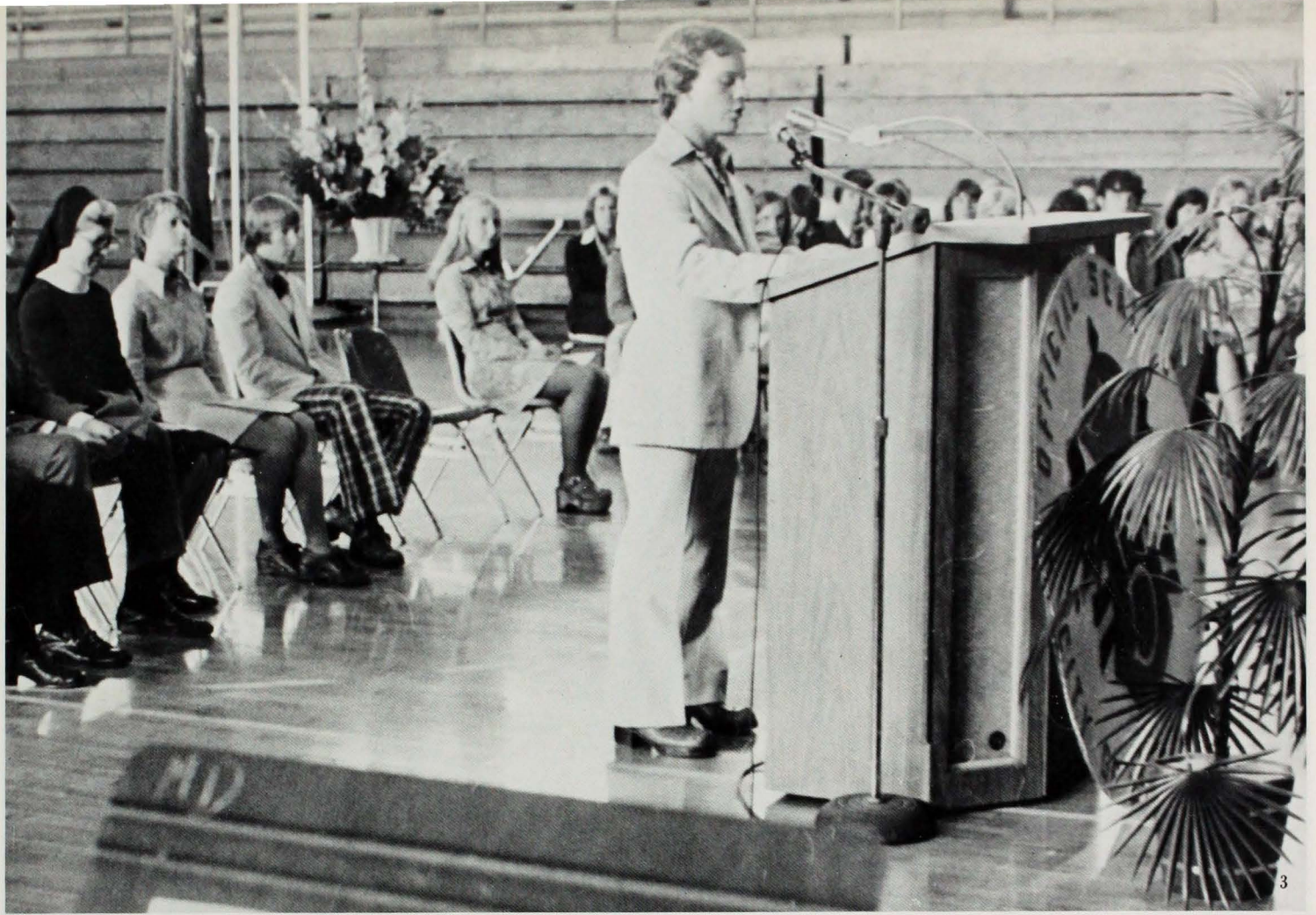

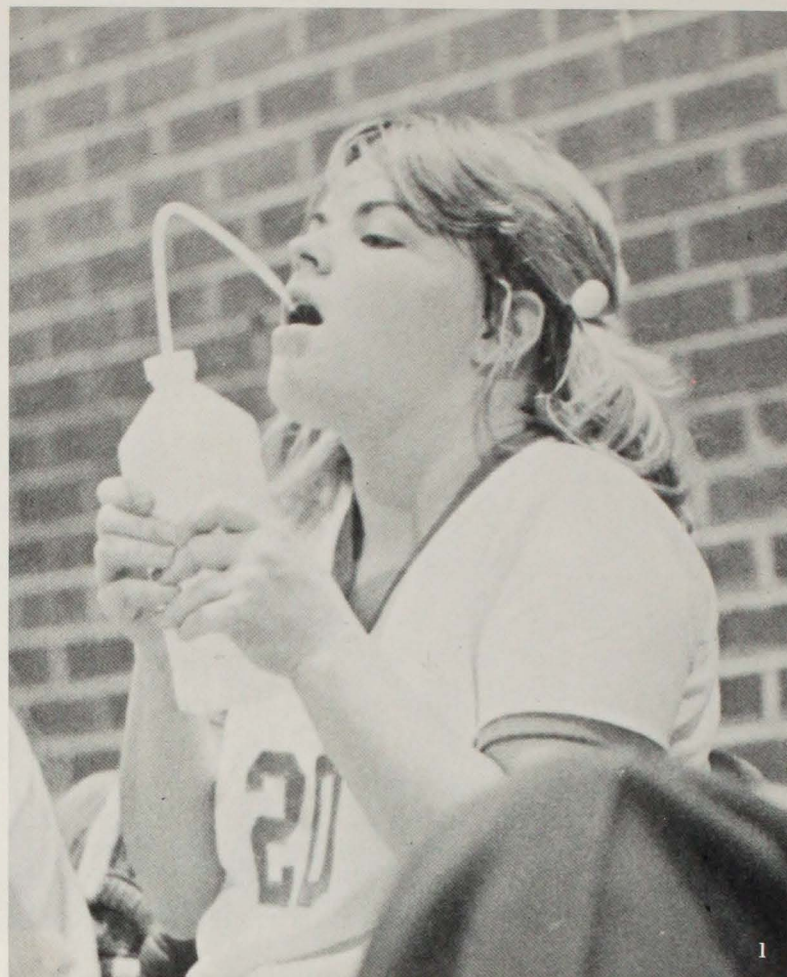

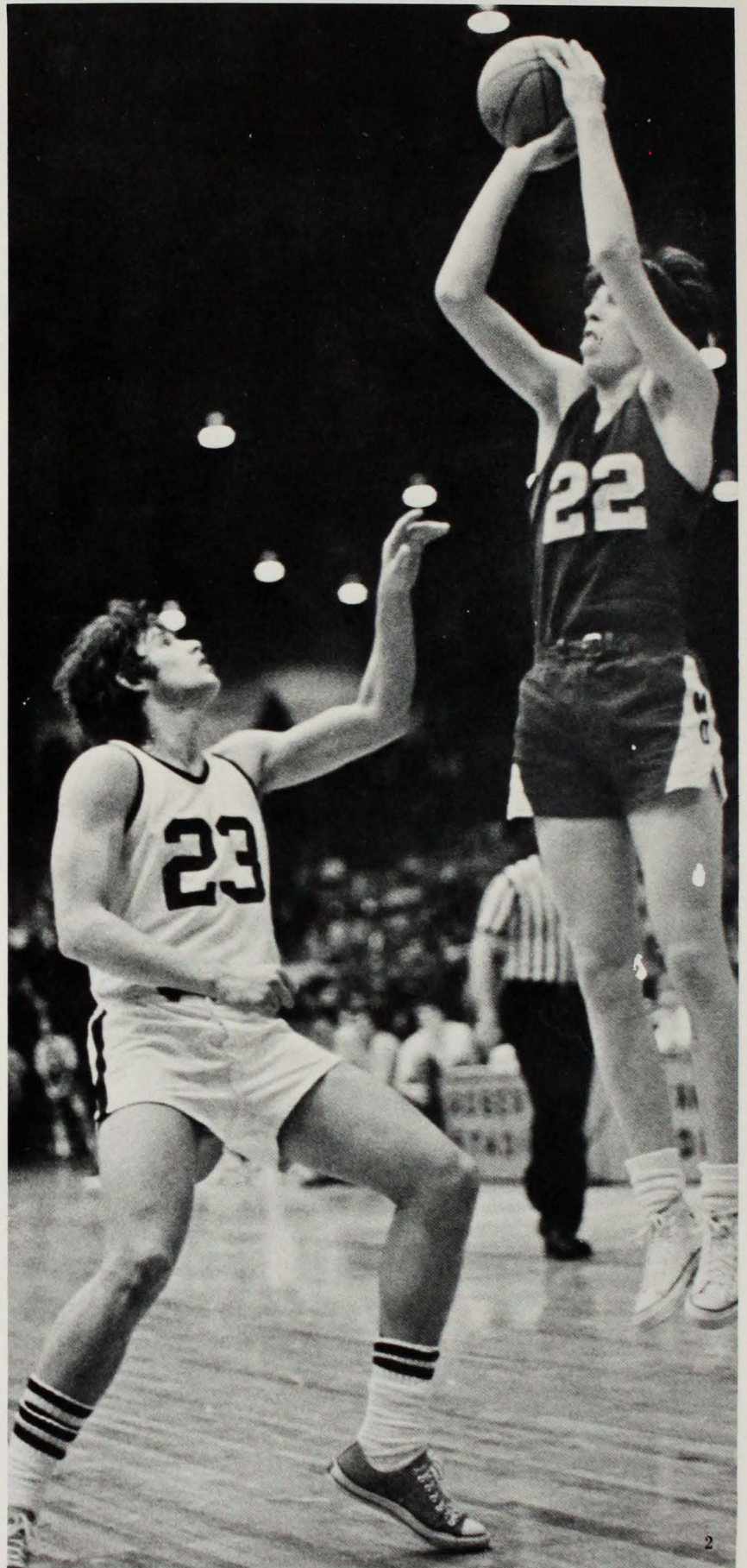

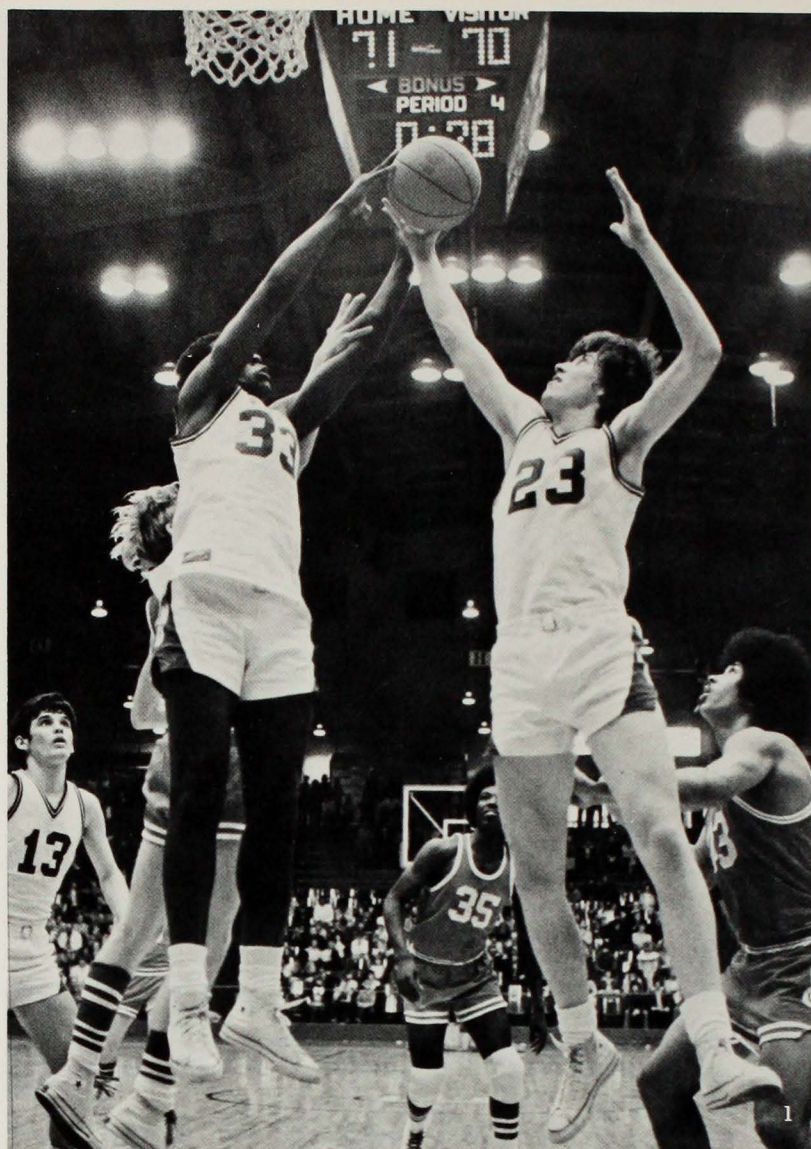

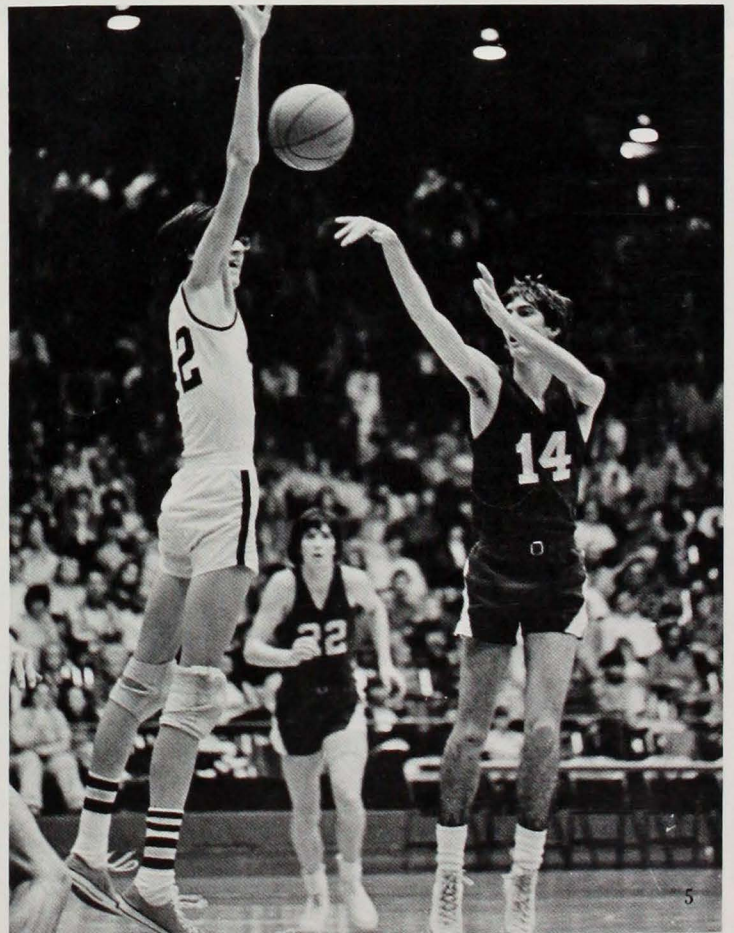
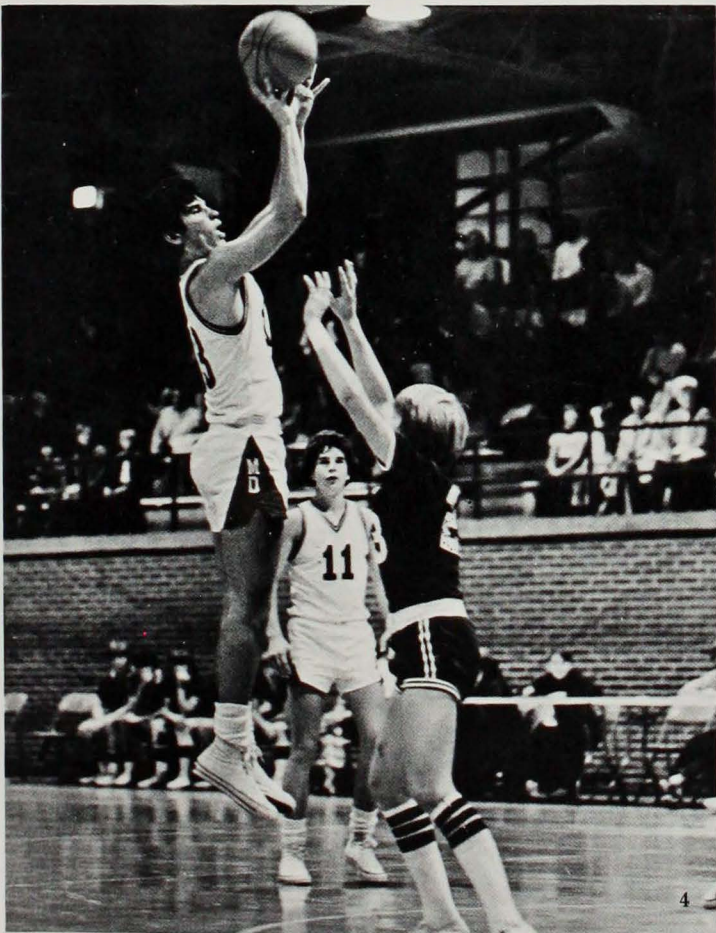

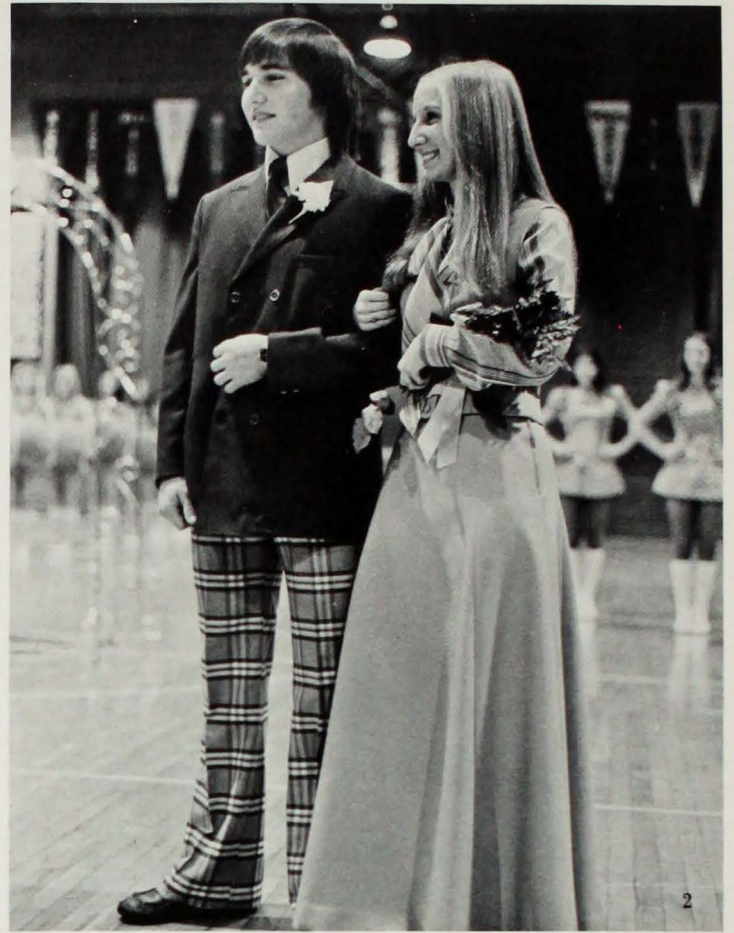

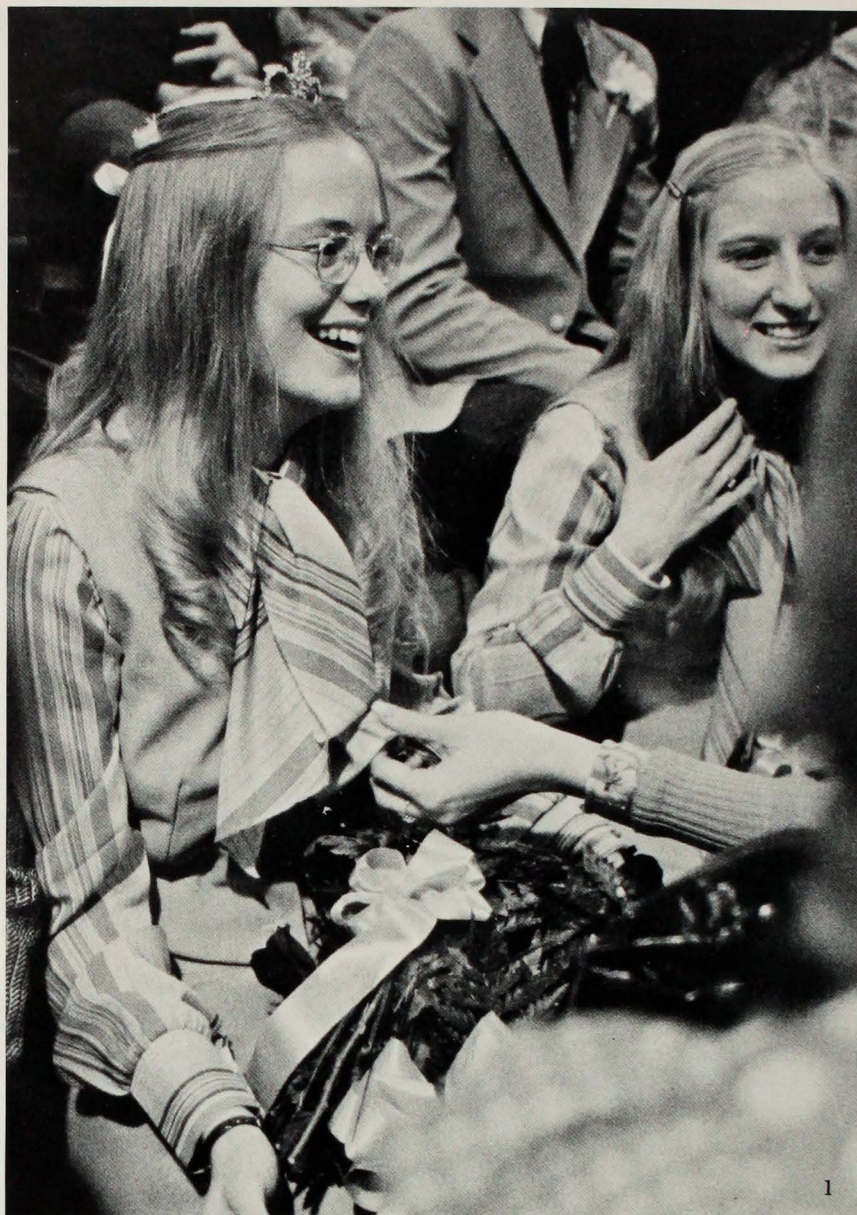

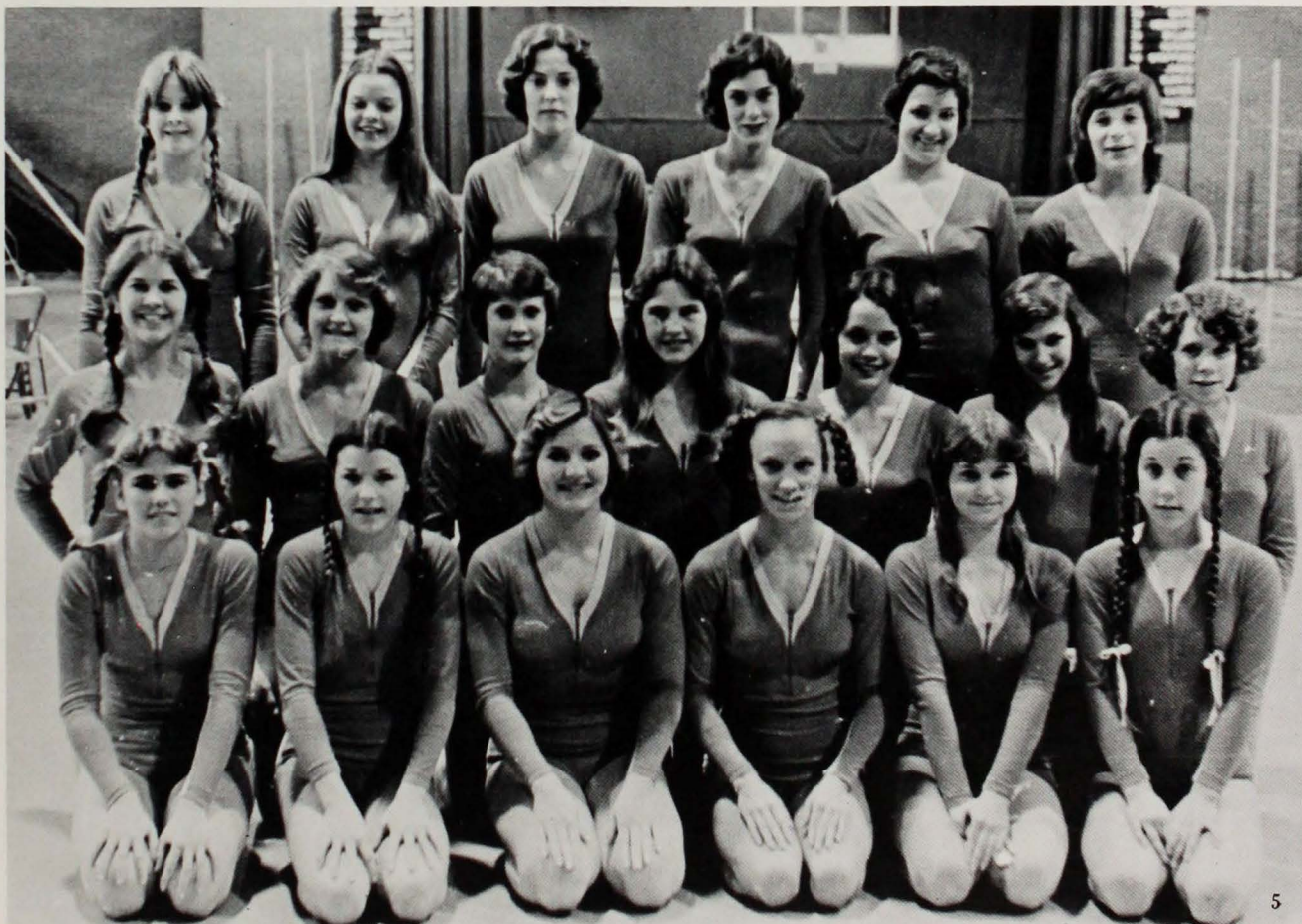

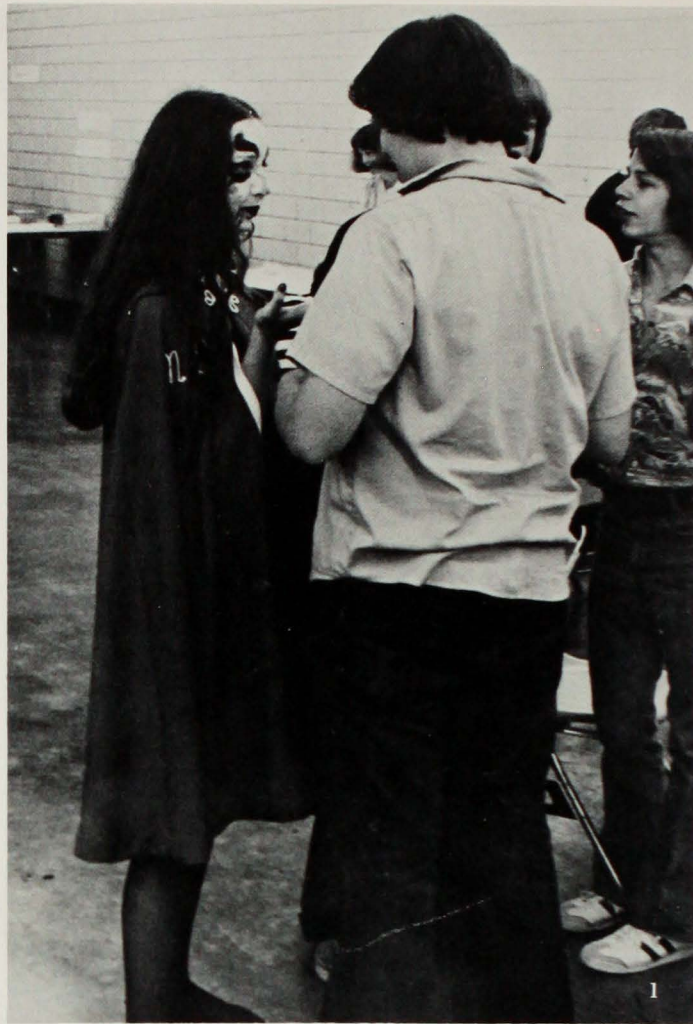
Clean Campus awards, 'The Thing' highlight Student Council year

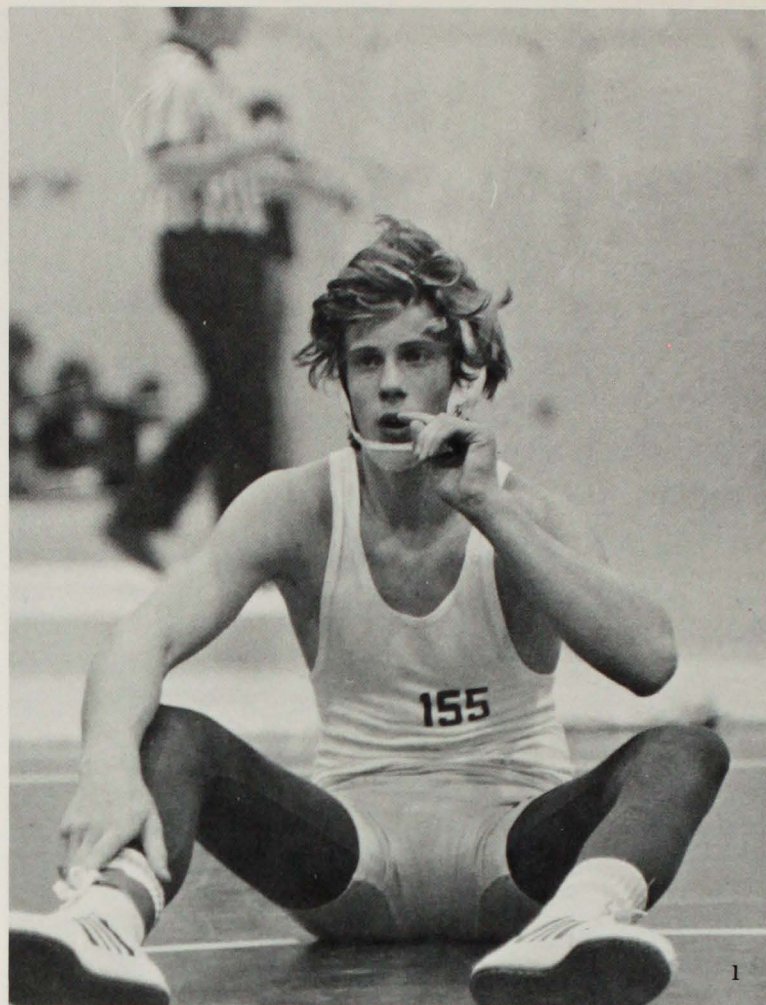

The advantages of being a senior really began to show as the class came closer

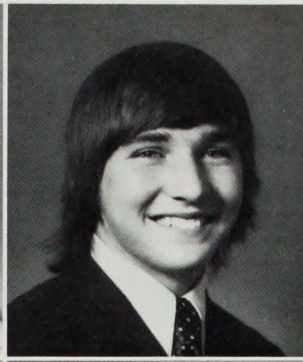
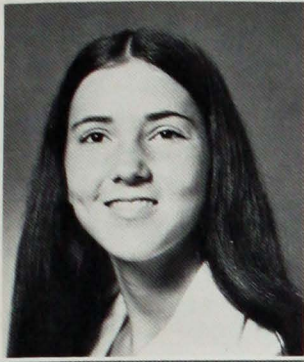

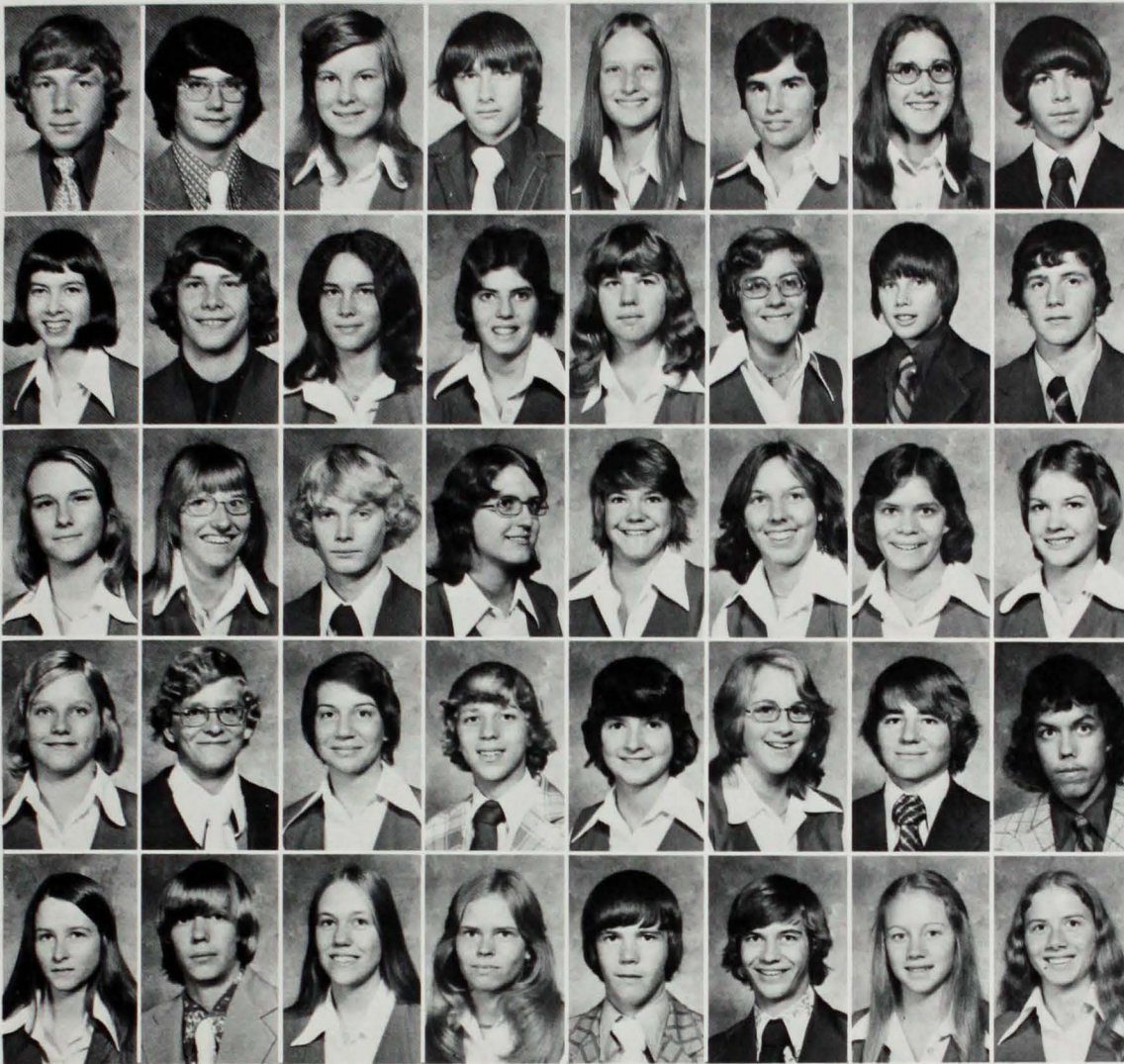
Homeroom Councilmen played an

Catholic Education Foundation

One of the most active patrons of Mater Dei High School, as well as Memorial High School, is the Catholic Education Foundation. The CEF was founded March 4, 1968 by nine persons concerned about providing quality Catholic education for high school students in the Evansville area. The Most Reverend Paul F. Leibold, at that time Bishop of Evansville, presided over the initial meeting attended by Monsignor Thomas J. Clarke, Monsignor Maurice A. Egloff, Monsignor Patrick Kilfoil, Mr. John F. Berry, Mr. John Carroll, Mr. Marvin J. Evans, Mr. Joseph E. O'Daniel and Mr. Lewis E. Rhiver. These men became the first Board of Directors and they elected Mr. O'Daniel the first president.

The Catholic Education Foundation has been active since that time in promoting "educational progress, achievement, programs and development" of the Evansville Catholic high schools. Since 1971 the Foundation

has sponsored five fund-raising campaigns producing almost \$475,000 which has allowed the local high schools to enjoy a tuition rate in the lower thirty per cent of all private high schools in the United States. Since 1970 approximately 1450 students have received monetary grants for tuition assistance through the CEF. Consequently, enrollment in the Catholic high schools has increased despite a decrease in total enrollment in the city's high schools.

The members of the Catholic Education Foundation Board of Directors are firmly committed to the support of Mater Dei High School. The students, faculty, and administration are grateful to these persons for their devotion and unselfish commitment of their time, energy and money to provide the quality education for which Mater Dei is noted.

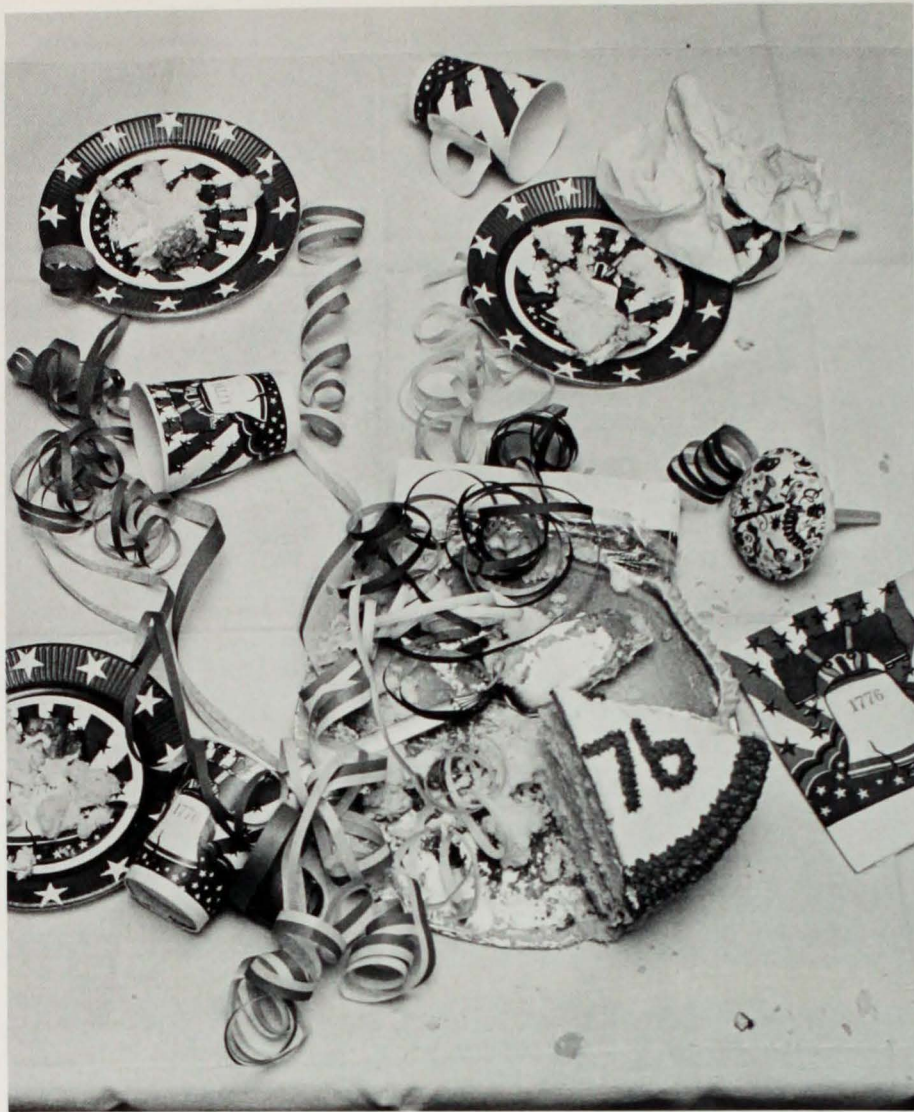






. . . a year to remember
