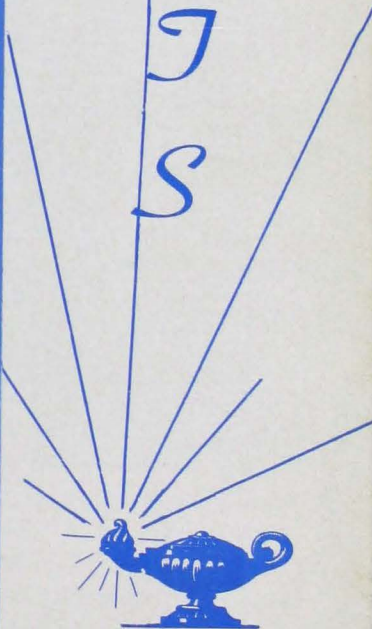

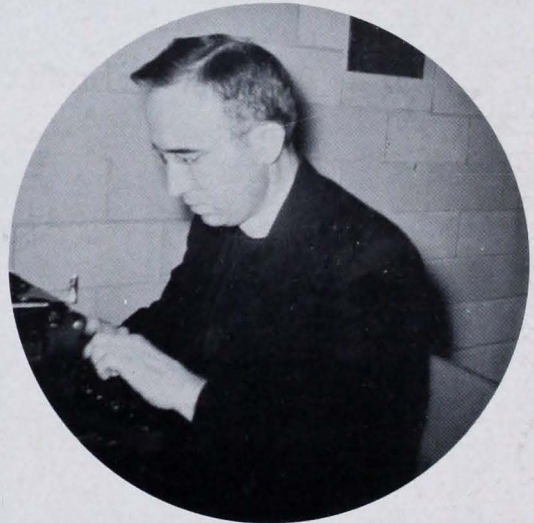
Without their help in deciding on the textbooks to be used as well as such "minor things" as free days, Mater Dei High School would stand in dire need.

As an addition to class work the Homemaking club, Future Homemakers of Tomorrow, was organized. Club activities continue and broaden class work.

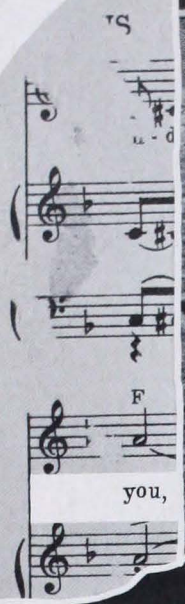
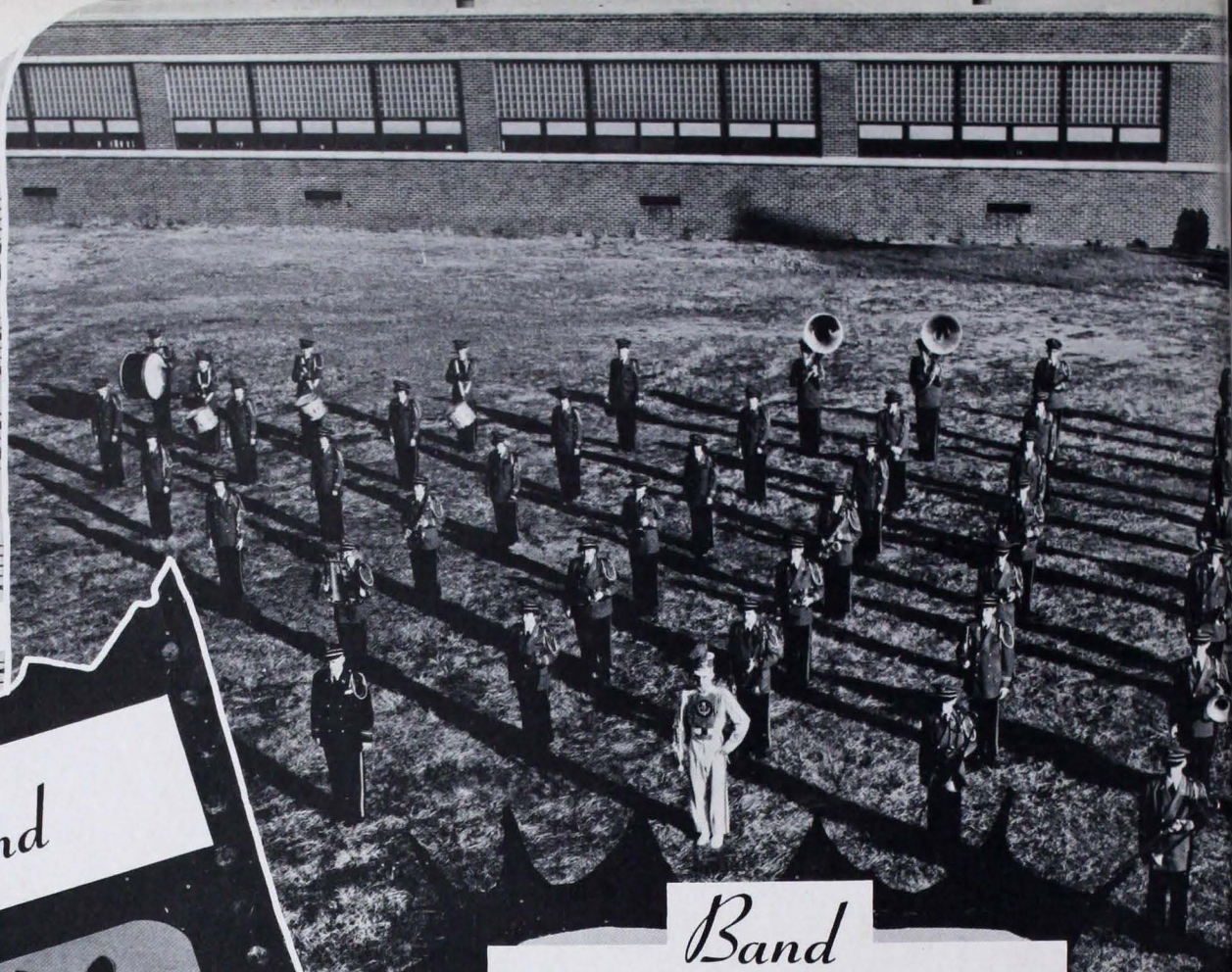

This year's Seniors again saw the birth of another of the "biggest and best yet." This time in Christmas Pageants.



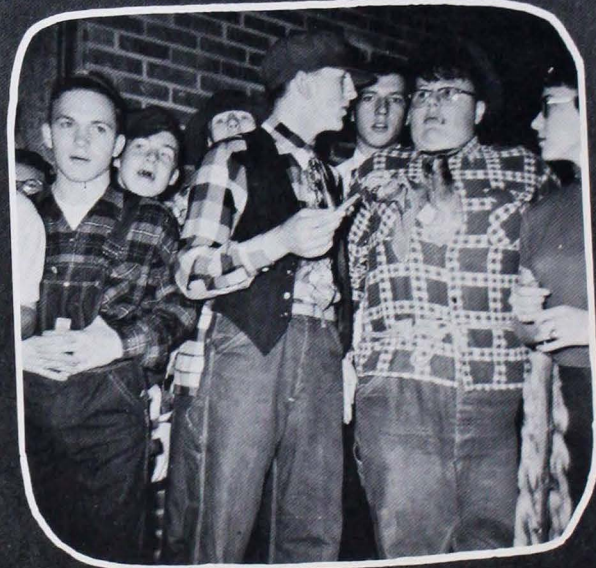
